7. FIXING PRICES THAT MAY BE CHARGED FOR BOOT AND SHOE REPAIRS

5. (1) The maximum that may be charged anywhere in New Zealand for boot and shoe repairs of any of the kinds specified in the Schedule hereto shall be the appropriate price specified in the said Schedule.
- (2) The maximum prices fixed in the Schedule hereto apply with respect to repairs effected with plastic compounds as well as to repairs effected with leather.
