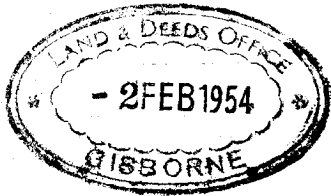

NOTE.—At stations where departures from normal are in parentheses, the temperature record has been maintained for less than ten years, the rainfall record for less than twenty years. Rainfall normals have been revised and now refer to the standard period 1921-50. Where observations are not available for the whole period, or where the site of the rain-gauge has been changed, the normals are partly interpolated.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR DECEMBER 1953

General.—For the greater part of the country December was cloudy and rather warm. As in the previous month, the weather was unusually dull, wet, and rather unsettled in Westland. In parts of Canterbury a spell of dry weather which lasted a month was brought to an end by heavy rain on the 7th. On the other hand, in the Bay of Plenty, Gisborne, and Hawke's Bay many farmers were complaining of very dry conditions following three successive months of deficient rainfall. Elsewhere the season has been more favourable, and stock was reported to be in good health and condition.

The Buller River was in flood on the 11th; and a local downpour in Sherry Valley, Nelson, caused some flooding in that area on the 24th. The phenomenal flood in the Wangapehu River, which was responsible for the railway disaster at Tangiwa on the 24th, was not due to meteorological causes. A small tornado caused local damage at Palmerston North on the 19th.

Rainfall.—Rainfall was below normal over the provinces of Auckland and Hawke's Bay, and also over Central Otago. The deficiency was greatest between Dargaville and Kaitiaki, where the rainfall was barely one-quarter of the normal value. There was a moderate surplus in an area extending northward from Foxton and Wanganui to National Park and Taumarunui, and also over Westland.

Temperatures.—Temperatures were near to or above normal over the whole country. The departure exceeded 2° F. over almost the whole of the provinces of Auckland and Hawke's Bay.

A heavy fall of snow occurred in the Southern Alps on the 8th.

Sunshine.—As in the previous month, sunshine was below normal over the greater part of the country. In Westland the deficiency was equivalent to an hour and a half a day. Northland, the Coromandel Peninsula, and the Bay of Plenty were favoured with a small surplus.

Weather Sequence.—On the 1st the provinces of Auckland and Hawke's Bay received some rain as a trough of low pressure moved slowly north-eastwards off the country. For the next four days an anticyclone centred over the North Island covered the greater part of the country. Showers were reported from the West Coast and also at times in coastal districts from Invercargill to Timaru, but elsewhere the weather was fair or fine. On the 6th a trough of low pressure which was moving north-eastwards became almost

stationary near Cook Strait. Rain spread to the remainder of the South Island and was exceptionally heavy in parts of Westland, causing slips and washouts on the Greymouth-Westport highway. There was also a heavy fall of snow in the Alps, while light rain extended to southern and eastern districts of the North Island.

On the 7th the weather commenced to clear from the south. On the 8th and 9th, however, many eastern and northern districts of the North Island were still experiencing showery conditions. Rain then set in again on the West Coast as a very deep depression, the first of a series of three, passed far to the south. During the next three days the other depressions passed to the south-west, while a trough of low pressure moved slowly eastwards across the country accompanied by a band of moderate rain in most districts; in Otago and Canterbury, however, falls were mainly light.

By the 13th showers were confined mainly to Gisborne, Hawke's Bay, and coastal Otago. The 14th was temporarily fair throughout the whole country, but on the 15th there was a period of general rain accompanying a south-westerly change. On the following day the weather again cleared temporarily, except on the West Coast. On the 17th there was another general south-westerly change, associated with depressions to the south and east of the South Island, and all parts of the country again received some rain. South-westerly winds persisted for three more days. On the 18th cool showery weather prevailed over the whole country, but on the 19th and 20th showers were confined mainly to Westland, Otago, and Southland, while temperatures became considerably warmer in eastern districts of the North Island. On the following day a depression to the south of Southland moved north-eastwards. The associated trough of low pressure became almost stationary across Westland and Marlborough for a time and remained over the country for several days. This was a period of unsettled weather in most districts. There were some considerable falls in Westland and the central provinces on Christmas Day as a depression moved across the South Island, and the Buller River was soon in flood. Conditions improved from the south during the 26th as pressures rose.

For the last five days of 1953 an anticyclone covered the greater part of the country, and the weather was fair or fine in most districts. However, two weak disturbances brought light rains to parts of Otago and Southland on the 28th and 31st.

Price Order No. 1522 (Cocoa)

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act 1947, the Price Tribunal hereby makes the following Price Order:

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1522, and shall come into force on the 29th day of January 1954.

2. (1) Price Order No. 1507* is hereby revoked.

(2) The revocation of the said Order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

3. This Order applies with respect to all cocoa, except "Van Houten's" sold in New Zealand.

FIXING MAXIMUM PRICES OF COCOA TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

Wholesalers' Prices

4. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause, the maximum price that may be charged or received by any wholesaler (which term in this order shall be deemed to include a manufacturer selling to a retailer) for any cocoa to which this Order applies shall be the appropriate price set out in the Schedule hereto.

(2) The prices fixed by the foregoing provisions of this clause are fixed subject to the continuance of the practice in the cocoa trade with respect to cash and other discounts and with respect to freight arrangements existing immediately prior to the coming into force of this Order.

Retailers' Prices

5. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause, the maximum price that may be charged or received by any retailer for any cocoa to which this Order applies shall be the appropriate price set out in the Schedule hereto.

(2) If in respect of any lot of cocoa sold by a retailer the maximum price calculated in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this clause is not an exact number of pence or halfpence, the maximum price of the lot shall be calculated to the next upward halfpenny.

GENERAL

6. Notwithstanding the provisions of this Order, the maximum price that may be charged by any wholesaler or by any retailer for cocoa to which this Order applies, bought by the wholesaler or by the retailer before the date of coming into force of this Order and unsold by him at that date, shall not exceed the appropriate price authorized pursuant to the Control of Prices Act 1947, to be charged immediately before that date. In the case of cocoa to which this Order applies bought by a wholesaler or by a retailer after the coming into force of this Order at the appropriate price authorized pursuant to the Control of Prices Act 1947, to be charged immediately before that date, such cocoa shall not be resold at prices in excess of those so authorized prior to the coming into force of this Order.

PROVISION FOR SPECIAL PRICES

7. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this Order, and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any wholesaler or retailer, may authorize special maximum wholesale or retail prices in respect of any cocoa to which this Order applies where special circumstances exist, or for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are incurred by the wholesaler or retailer. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a specified lot or consignment of cocoa or may relate generally to all cocoa to which this Order applies sold by the wholesaler or retailer while the approval remains in force.

Price Order No. 1523 (Barley)

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act 1947, the Price Tribunal hereby makes the following Price Order :

PRELIMINARY

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1523, and shall come into force on the 29th day of January 1954.
2. (1) Price Order No. 1437* is hereby revoked.
- (2) The revocation of the said Order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.
3. In this Order—
 - “Grower”, in relation to barley, means a person engaged in the business of growing barley for sale;
 - “Grower’s station”, in relation to any grower, means the railway station that is nearest or most convenient of access to the grower’s premises;
 - “Wholesale distributor”, in relation to barley, means any person who purchases barley from a grower for sale to a merchant distributor or who acts as the agent of the grower in the sale of his barley to a merchant distributor;
 - “Merchant distributor”, in relation to barley, means any person who purchases barley from a grower or a wholesale distributor and who sells barley or any product containing barley either whole or processed to a retailer or to a consumer;
 - “Retailer”, in relation to barley means any person who purchases barley from a merchant distributor for sale to a consumer;
 - The expression “f.o.r.s.e.” means “free on rail, sacks extra”, and the expression “f.o.b.s.e.” means “free on board, sacks extra”;
 - The expression “f.o.r.s.i.” means “free on rail, sacks included” and the expression “f.o.b.s.i.” means “free on board, sacks included”.
4. The provisions of this Order shall apply notwithstanding that any barley to which this Order is applicable is sold otherwise than by weight.
5. The several prices fixed by this Order apply with respect to sales by auction as well as to other sales.
6. In computing the weight of any lot of barley to which this Order applies that is sold on the basis of sacks extra the weight of the sacks shall be excluded.
7. In computing the weight of any lot of barley to which this Order applies that is sold on the basis of sacks included the weight of the sacks shall be included.
8. Where any barley to which this Order applies is sold on the basis of sacks extra the maximum amount that may be charged for the sacks, shall be : For 48 in. by 26½ in. sacks, 2s. 2½d. each ; for 46 in. by 23 in. sacks, 1s. 9d. each.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

9. (1) This Order does not apply to—
 - (a) Malting barley, that is barley sold for malting purposes;
 - (b) Black skinless barley or white skinless barley ; or
 - (c) Any machine-dressed barley that is sold by a distributor or a reseller for seed purposes.
- (2) Except as provided in the last preceding subclause, this Order applies with respect to all barley grown in New Zealand.
- (3) The provisions of this Order fixing growers’ prices shall apply only with respect to barley grown from seed sown on or after the 1st day of March 1953.

FIXING MAXIMUM PRICES OF BARLEY TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

Growers’ Prices

10. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause, the maximum price that may be charged or received by any grower for any barley to which this Order applies shall be determined as follows :
 - When grown in the South Island : 8s. 4½d. per bushel f.o.r.s.e. the grower’s station.
 - When grown in the North Island : 9s. 4½d. per bushel f.o.r.s.e. the grower’s station.
- (2) Where any barley is delivered by a grower otherwise than f.o.r.s.e. the grower’s station, the price that may be charged by the grower shall be the appropriate price in terms of the foregoing provisions of this clause, increased by the amount of the charges (if any) incurred by the grower in effecting delivery and then reduced by the amount of the charges that would have been incurred by him if he had delivered the barley f.o.r.s.e. the grower’s station.

Wholesale Distributor’s Prices

11. (1) The maximum price (sacks included) that may be charged or received by any wholesale distributor for any barley to which this Order applies that has been grown in the South Island and is sold to a merchant distributor in the North Island shall be the sum of the following amounts :
 - (a) The price actually paid or payable to the grower ;
 - (b) The amount of any transport, grading, or branding charges actually incurred by the wholesale distributor ;
 - (c) An amount not exceeding ½d. per bushel on account of brokerage actually incurred ;
 - (d) An amount calculated at the rate of 4½d. per bushel ;
 - (e) An amount calculated at the rate of 5d. per bushel with respect to sacks of the size 48 in. by 26½ in. or 5½d. per bushel with respect to sacks of the size 46 in. by 23 in. ;
- Provided, that the total amount calculated in accordance with paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d), and (e) shall not in any case exceed an amount equivalent to the appropriate f.o.b.s.i. price set out hereunder, where the barley is sold in sacks of the size 48 in. by 26½ in. or that amount increased by ½d. per bushel where the barley is sold in sacks of the size 46 in. by 23 in.

- (f) An amount calculated at the rate of 1d. per bushel in respect of each of the months June to September and at the rate of ½d. per bushel in respect of each of the months October to December (in all cases exclusive of the month in which the barley was delivered to the wholesale distributor) during which the barley is held by the wholesale distributor undelivered : Provided that for the purposes of this paragraph a part of a month shall be deemed to be a complete month ; provided, further, that a wholesale distributor shall be entitled to an amount under this paragraph only in respect of each of the aforesaid months that first fall within a period of twelve months following the date on which the barley was harvested ;
 - (g) The amount of any through store charges actually incurred by the wholesale distributor but not more in any case than an amount calculated at the rate of 3½d. per bushel with respect to barley taken into store on or before the 31st day of May or 2½d. per bushel with respect to barley taken into store after the 31st day of May : Provided that where any through store charges have previously been incurred any subsequent through store charges shall not in any case exceed 2½d. per bushel irrespective of the date on which the barley was taken into store ;
 - (h) In any case where through store charges are incurred at any point beyond the grower’s station and before the point of f.o.b., an amount not exceeding 1½d. per bushel to cover the cost of any transport charges actually incurred in excess of those that would have been incurred had delivery been effected direct from the grower’s station to the point of f.o.b.
- (2) The maximum price (sacks included) that may be charged or received by any wholesale distributor for any other barley to which this Order applies shall be the sum of the following amounts :
- (a) The price actually paid or payable to the grower ;
 - (b) An amount calculated at the rate of 5d. per bushel with respect to sacks of the size 48 in. by 26½ in. or 5½d. per bushel with respect to sacks of the size 46 in. by 23 in.

- (c) The amount of any transport, grading, or branding charges actually incurred by the wholesale distributor :
 - (d) An amount not exceeding ½d. per bushel on account of brokerage actually incurred :
 - (e) The amount of any through store charges actually incurred by the wholesale distributor but not more in any case than an amount calculated at the rate of 3½d. per bushel with respect to barley taken into store on or before the 31st day of May or 2½d. per bushel with respect to barley taken into store after the 31st day of May : Provided that where any through store charges have previously been incurred any subsequent through store charges shall not in any case exceed 2½d. per bushel irrespective of the date on which the barley was taken into store :
 - (f) An amount calculated at the rate of 1d. per bushel in respect of each of the months June to September and at the rate of ½d. per bushel in respect of each of the months October to December (in all cases exclusive of the month in which the barley was delivered to the wholesale distributor) during which the barley is held by the wholesale distributor undelivered : Provided that for the purpose of this paragraph a part of a month shall be deemed to be a complete month ; provided, further, that a wholesale distributor shall be entitled to an amount under this paragraph only in respect of such of the aforesaid months that first fall within a period of twelve months following the date on which the barley was harvested :
 - (g) An amount calculated at the rate of 3d. per bushel :
- (3) Where with respect to any barley sold by a wholesale distributor the purchaser desires full details of the various charges comprised in the total amount payable, full details of each such charge shall be made available to him by the wholesale distributor : Provided that where any charges are incurred pursuant to paragraph (g) of subclause (1) or paragraph (e) of subclause (2) of this clause the amount of such charges shall be stated separately on the relevant invoice.

Merchant Distributors' Prices

12. The maximum price (sacks included) that may be charged or received by any merchant distributor for any barley to which this Order applies shall not exceed the sum of the following amounts :

- (a) The price actually paid or payable to the grower (exclusive of the price paid for the sacks) or to the wholesale distributor (sacks included) :
- (b) Any transport, branding, dressing, or insurance in transit charges actually and reasonably incurred by the merchant distributor :
- (c) With respect to barley grown in the South Island and transported to the North Island, an amount not exceeding 1 per cent. of the sum of the amounts calculated in accordance with paragraphs (a) and (b) hereof (to cover the estimated loss due to shrinkage and other causes) :

15. (1) Every wholesale distributor who sells any barley to which this Order applies on the basis of sacks extra shall state separately in the appropriate invoice relating to such sale the price charged for the barley and the price charged for the sacks.

(2) Every merchant distributor who sells for purposes other than seed purposes any barley that has been machine dressed by him shall keep for a period of two years a detailed record of the charges incurred by him in machine dressing the barley and of the weight of barley lost in the process of machine dressing.
