This Order applies with respect to all raw-leaf tobacco grown in New Zealand during the 1953-54 season: Provided that the Tribunal may, in any case where it considers it proper to do so and subject to such conditions (if any) as it thinks fit, exempt any such tobacco from the operation of this Order.

# Fixing Average Prices of Raw-leaf Tobacco to Which This Order Applies

- 4. (1) The average price to be paid by any tobacco manufacturer for raw-leaf tobacco to which this Order applies shall be not less than-
  - (a) For flue-cured leaf: 3s. 10½d. per pound.
    (b) For air-dried leaf: 3s. 7½d. per pound.
- (2) For the purpose of this clause the weight of any raw-leaf tobacco shall be deemed to be its weight at the time and place of delivery by the grower to the manufacturer or to his agent in the district in which it is grown: Provided, that in any case where the grower and the manufacturer or his agent agree that the moisture-content of the leaf in any lot of tobacco is excessive, then, for the purposes of calculating the value of the lot, the weight of the lot shall be deemed to be reduced by a reasonable amount to make allowance for the excessive moisture. excessive moisture.

No raw tobacco shall be sold by the grower thereof or purchasel from him at less than 1s. 6d. per pound free on board ship Motueka or Nelson in the case of tobacco grown in the Nelson Provincial District, and in the case of tobacco grown in any other district at less than 1s. 6d, per pound free on board ship or free on rail at the port or railway-station which is nearest to the place at which such tobacco is

No raw tobacco shall be sold by any person other than the grower thereof, or purchased from such other person at less than 1s. 6d. per pound free on board ship or free on rail at the port or railway-station which is nearest to the place at which such tobacco is at the time of sale thereof being held or stored.
