PURSUANT to subsection (2) of section 19 of the Forests **PURSUANT** to subsection (2) of section 19 of the Forests Act 1949, I, Lieutenant-General Sir Charles Willoughby Moke Norrie, the Governor-General of New Zealand, acting on the joint recommendation of the Minister of Lands and of the Minister of Forests, hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the Schedule hereto, being portion of a reserve acquired for provisional State forest purposes and notified in New Zealand Gazette, No. 14, of the 9th day of March 1950, is required for settlement purposes; and in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, such land shall, from and after the day of the gazetting hereof, cease to be provisional State forest land, and shall become Crown land available for sale, lease, reservation, or other disposition under the provisions of the Land Act 1948.

WHEREAS it is intended to discontinue the use of adhesive stamps for the purpose of stamping instru-ments required to be stamped by the Inland Revenue Department and to use in substitution therefor impressed stamps to be created by special accounting and stamping machines situated at the offices of District Commissioners of Stamp Duties:
