A PROCLAMATION

PURSUANT to the Electric Power Boards Act 1925, I, Lieutenant-General Sir Charles Willoughby Moke Norrie, the Governor-General of New Zealand, hereby alter the boundaries of the Wanganui-Rangitikei Electric Power District so as to include therein the areas described in the First Schedule hereto; and, further, pursuant to the said Act, I hereby alter the boundaries of the Wanganui-Rangitikei and Manawatu-Oroua Electric Power Districts by excluding the areas described in the Second Schedule hereto from the Manawatu-Oroua Electric Power District and including such areas in the Wanganui-Rangitikei Electric Power District, and I hereby declare that the altered boundaries of the Wanganui-Rangitikei and Manawatu-Oroua Electric Power Districts shall be those described in the Third and Fourth Schedules hereto respectively.

FIRST SCHEDULE

(a) ALL that area in the Wellington Land District comprising a portion of Wanganui County situated in Blocks VI, VII, X, and XI, Ngamatea Survey District, and bounded by a line commencing at the confluence of the Auraki Stream and the Mangawhero River, and proceeding in a north-easterly direction along the middle of the said Auraki Stream to a point opposite the south-western boundary line of Lot 1 on Plan 4978, deposited in the office of the District Land Registrar at Wellington, being part of Ohotu Subdivision 4B No. 2; thence along the south-western and northern boundaries of the said Lot 1 and the northern boundary of Lot 2 on plan 4978 aforesaid to the western boundary of Ohotu Subdivision 6B; thence again towards the north-east generally by the north-eastern boundary of the said Ohotu 6B, the western and northern boundaries of Ohotu Subdivision 6A No. 1B, and the Paokaramu Stream, to the middle of Field's Track; thence by the middle of Field's Track to its intersection by the Rangitatau Stream; thence along the middle of the said Rangitatau Stream to the middle of the Mangawhero River; thence by the middle of the said Mangawhero River to its confluence with the Auraki Stream, the place of commencement. As the same is more particularly delineated on the plan marked S.H.D. 332 deposited in the office of the State Hydro-electric Department at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

(b) All that area in the Wellington Land District comprising a portion of Rangitikei County bounded by a line commencing at a point being Trig. 28 (Manukaiapu), Block VI, Kaimanawa Survey District, being also a point on the boundary of Rangitikei County described in *New Zealand Gazette* 1953, page 536; thence proceeding southerly and westerly by a right line to Trig. 24 (Te Rotete), a right line to Trig. C (Auahitotara), a right line to Trig. A (Totem),

and a right line in the direction of Trig. Tunutara to the western side of the Waiouru-Turangi State Highway, being also the boundary of Rangitikei County described as aforesaid; thence northerly and easterly along the said County boundary to Trig. 28 (Manukaiapu), the point of commencement. As the same is more particularly delineated on the plan marked S.H.D. 333 deposited in the office of the State Hydro-electric Department at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

SECOND SCHEDULE

(a) ALL that area in the Wellington Land District bounded by a line commencing at a point being the south-western corner of Section 14, Block XII, Hautapu Survey District; thence proceeding westerly and southerly generally along the southern boundary of Block XI, Hautapu Survey District, and along Cross Road to the south-eastern boundary of Section 39A, Block XV, Hautapu Survey District; thence north-easterly along that south-eastern boundary to Mangawharariki Road and along a right line to the south-western corner of Section 14 aforesaid, the point of commencement. As the same is more particularly delineated on the plan marked S.H.D. 334 deposited in the office of the State Hydro-electric Department at Wellington, and thereon coloured yellow.

(b) All that area in the Wellington Land District, being a portion of the County of Kiwitea, bounded by a line commencing at a point in the middle of the Pourangaki River opposite the south-eastern boundary of Section 14, Block IX, Ruahine Survey District; thence proceeding south-easterly up the middle of that river to a point opposite the eastern boundary of Block XIII, Ruahine Survey District; thence north-easterly by a right line to Trig. Station I (Ruahemi); thence north-westerly by a right line to a point in the middle of Hikurangi Stream opposite the eastern boundary of Section 20, Block IX, Ruahine Survey District; thence down the middle of that stream to a point opposite the south-eastern boundary of Section 13, Block IX aforesaid; thence south-westerly to and along the said south-eastern boundary, across Mangakoheke Road, the south-eastern boundary of Section 14 aforesaid, and the production of the last-mentioned boundary to the point of commencement. As the same is more particularly delineated on the plan marked S.H.D. 335 deposited in the office of the State Hydro-electric Department at Wellington, and thereon bordered green.

THIRD SCHEDULE

WANGANUI-RANGITIKEI ELECTRIC POWER DISTRICT

ALL that area in the Taranaki, Hawke's Bay, and Wellington Land Districts, comprising the Counties of Rangitikei and Wanganui, parts of the Counties of Waitotara, Waimarino, Kiwitea, and Patea, the City of Wanganui, the Boroughs of Merton and Taihape, and the Town Districts of Hunterville, Bulls, Mangaweka, and Waverley, bounded by a line commencing at a point on the sea coast in the middle of the

mouth of the Rangitikei River; thence proceeding up the middle of the said river to a point in line with the south-western boundary of Block XIV, Hautapu Survey District; thence to and along the said south-western boundary to Peka Road; thence generally north-easterly along Peka Road to the southern boundary of Section 7, Block XIV, Hautapu Survey District; thence along the southern and south-eastern boundaries of the said Section 7 to the south-western boundary of Section 6, Block X, Hautapu Survey District; thence along the south-western boundaries of Sections 6 and 62, Block X, the southern boundary of the said Section 62, the southern boundaries of Sections 4 and 3, Block XI, Hautapu Survey District, to Cross Road; thence south-easterly along Cross Road to the south-eastern boundary of Section 39A, Block XV, Hautapu Survey District; thence north-easterly along that south-eastern boundary to Mangawharariki Road and along a right line to the south-western corner of Section 14, Block XII, Hautapu Survey District; thence easterly along the southern boundary of Block XII, Hautapu Survey District, and northerly along the eastern boundary of the said Block XII to Mangatohu Road; thence across the said road and in a south-easterly direction along the south-western boundary of Section 7, Block IX, Ruahine Survey District, the south-western and south-eastern boundaries of Section 8, Block IX, the south-western boundary of Section 4, Block IX, the south-western and south-eastern boundaries of Section 5, Block IX aforesaid, and the production of the last-mentioned boundary to the middle of the Pourangaki River; thence up the middle of that river to a point opposite the eastern boundary of Block XIII, Ruahine Survey District; thence north-easterly by a right line to Trig. Station I (Ruahemi); thence north-westerly by a right line to a point in the middle of Hikurangi Stream opposite the eastern boundary of Section 20, Block IX, Ruahine Survey District; thence northerly to and along the eastern boundary of the said Section 20 and the production of that boundary to the middle of the Kawhatau River, being also a point on the boundary of the County of Rangitikei as described in *New Zealand Gazette* 1953, at page 536; thence easterly, northerly, westerly, and southerly generally along the boundaries of Rangitikei County described as aforesaid to its intersection with a right line from Trig. A (Totem), situated in Block X, Moawhango Survey District, to Trig. Tunutara, situated in Block XII, Karioi Survey District; thence north-westerly along the said right line to the western boundary of Moawhango Survey District; thence southerly along the said western boundary to the northern boundary of Rangitikei County described as aforesaid; thence westerly along that County boundary to the north-eastern corner of Section 7, Block IV, Ngamatea Survey District, this being the intersection of the boundaries of Rangitikei and Wanganui Counties; thence generally westerly, south-westerly, north-westerly, and south-westerly along the northern boundary of the County of Wanganui as described in *New Zealand Gazette* 1926, at page 2500, to the middle of the Wanganui River at a point opposite the north-west boundary of Ohoutahi Block; thence generally southerly along the middle of the said river to a point opposite the north-east corner of the Tunahaere Block, Section 282N, Block IX, Waipakura Survey District; thence in a north-westerly direction along the northern boundaries of the Tunahaere Block and Koatunui and Kaiwhatu Blocks to a point on the Karemu Stream in the north-west corner of the Koatunui and Kaiwhatu Blocks, Block XII, Nukumarū Survey District; thence in a northerly direction along the Karemu Stream to the north-east corner of Rangitatau No. 1c No. 1 Block; thence in a westerly direction along the northern boundaries of Rangitatau No. 1c Nos. 1 and 2 Blocks; thence north-west along the northern boundary of Rangitatau No. 1A and part Rangitatau No. 1B Blocks to a point on the Upper Pakaraka Road in the north-west corner of part Rangitatau No. 1B Block; thence north along the Upper Pakaraka Road to a point in the north-east corner of Lot 2A, Rangitatau Block, Block VI, Nukumarū Survey District; thence in a north-westerly direction along the northern boundaries of said Lot 2A, Rangitatau Block, and Section 17, Block V, Nukumarū Survey District, to the Waitotara River; thence up the said Waitotara River to the boundary between the Wellington and Taranaki Land Districts; thence south-westerly along that boundary to a point on the eastern corner of part Section 456, Block V, Carlyle Survey District; thence along Okotuku Road in a northerly direction generally to the northern boundary of Section 458, Block XV, Opaku Survey District; thence along the northern boundary of the said Section 458 to Okahutini Road; thence along the said road in a southerly direction; thence along the northern boundary of Section 3, Block XV, Opaku Survey District, to the Whenuakura River; thence down the middle of that river to the sea coast, and south-easterly generally along the sea coast to the middle of the mouth of the Rangitikei River, the point of commencement. As the same is more particularly delineated on the plan marked S.H.D. 336 deposited in the office of the State Hydro-electric Department at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

FOURTH SCHEDULE

MANAWATU-OROUA ELECTRIC POWER DISTRICT

ALL that area in the Wellington Land District comprising the City of Palmerston North, the Borough of Feilding, the Counties of Oroua and Pohangina, and portions of the Counties of Kairanga, KIWITEA, Woodville, Manawatu, and Pahiatua, bounded by a line commencing at a point on the sea coast at the mouth of the Rangitikei River, being also a point on the boundary of the Wanganui-Rangitikei Electric Power District hereinbefore described; thence north-easterly generally along the south-eastern boundary of the said district to the middle

Station; thence along the eastern boundaries of Blocks II and IV, Gorge Survey District, to the middle of the Manawatu River; thence down the middle of that river to the eastern boundary of Kairanga County as described in *New Zealand Gazette* 1916, page 780; thence south-westerly and westerly generally along the south-eastern and south-western boundaries of Kairanga County described as aforesaid to the middle of the Manawatu River; thence down the middle of the river to a point in line with the south-western boundary of Section 4, Himatangi Block, Blocks II and III, Mount Robinson Survey District; thence to and along that boundary to the Palmerston North-Foxton Road; thence across that road along the eastern boundary of Section 332, Block I, Mount Robinson Survey District, to its south-eastern corner; thence along the southern boundaries of Sections 332 and 329, Block I aforesaid, to the south-western corner of the last-mentioned section; thence along the northern boundary of Block I, Moutere Survey District, to the sea coast; thence along the sea coast to the mouth of the Rangitikei River, the place of commencement. As the same is more particularly delineated on the plan marked S.H.D. 337 deposited in the office of the State Hydro-electric Department at Wellington, and thereon bordered red.

Gazette*, 1935, page 1742; thence along the southern, eastern, and northern boundaries of the Borough of Eastbourne aforesaid to the mean high-water mark of Port Nicholson; thence northerly along the mean high-water mark to the southern boundary of the City of Lower Hutt as described in the First Schedule; thence along the southern, eastern, northern, and western boundaries of the City of Lower Hutt to and along the northern boundaries of the Borough of Petone, as described in *N.Z. Gazette*, 1888, page 740, to the north-eastern corner of Section 78, Horokiwi Road District; thence along the northern boundary of Section 78, aforesaid to its north-western corner; thence northerly generally along the western boundary of Section 39, Maungaraki Settlement, the western boundaries of Subdivisions 3, 6, 4, 5, and 7 of the Maungaraki Native Reserve, the western boundaries of Sections 41 and 40, Normandale Settlement, and the western boundaries of Sections 329, 330, 331, 339, 340, and 343, Hutt District, to the north-western corner of the last-mentioned section; thence along the northern boundary of Section 343 aforesaid, the eastern boundaries of Sections 344 and 348, Hutt District, to the southern boundary of Lot 12 on Deposited Plan 3138; thence along the southern boundaries of Lots 12, 11, 10, and 9 on Deposited Plan 3138, being subdivisions of Section 352, Hutt District, and Sections 39, 37, and 35, Takapu District, to the south-western corner of the last-mentioned lot; thence along the western boundary of Lot 9 aforesaid and the south-western boundaries of Lots 3 and 1 on Deposited Plan 3138, being subdivisions of Sections 33, 31, and 30, Takapu District, to the eastern boundary of Section 99, Block VIII, Paekakariki Survey District; thence along the eastern and northern boundaries of Section 99 aforesaid to the Porirua Harbour; and thence along the shore of Porirua Harbour and the sea coast to a point in the middle of the Waikanae River, the point of commencement; and excluding therefrom the Borough of Upper Hutt, as described in *N.Z. Price Order No. 1612 (Main Crop Potatoes)

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act 1947, the Price Tribunal, hereby makes the following Price Order:

PRELIMINARY

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1612, and shall come into force on the 17th day of June 1955.

2. (1) Price Orders Nos. 1597* and 1601† are hereby revoked.

(2) The revocation of the said Price Orders shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.

3. (1) In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires,—

“The said Act” means the Control of Prices Act 1947:

“Distributor”, in relation to any lot of potatoes, means a wholesaler, as defined in the said Act, who sells those potatoes otherwise than to a retailer for purposes of retail sale:

“Grower”, in relation to potatoes, means a person engaged in the business of growing potatoes for sale:

“Grower’s station”, in relation to any grower, means the railway-station that is nearest or most convenient of access to the grower’s premises:

The expression “Good table” in reference to any lot of potatoes means potatoes of good shape according to variety, not more than 15 per cent of which can be passed through a square the sides of which have an inside measurement of 2 in.; the lot shall be free from green potatoes, from second growth, from dry or wet rots (including late blight or frost damage); the lot shall be practically free from earth, which shall not in any case exceed 3 per cent by weight of the lot; the weight of the lot affected by mechanical injury (including bruises and cuts) shall not exceed 2 per cent; and the lot shall be practically free from scab or other defects not herein mentioned:

The expression “f.a.q.” in reference to any lot of potatoes means potatoes of fair average quality, being potatoes not more than 15 per cent of which can be passed through a square the sides of which have an inside measurement of 2 in.; not more than 2 per cent by weight of the lot shall be affected by dry or wet rots (including late blight or frost damage) or by severe mechanical injury (including severe bruises and cuts); and not more than 4 per cent by weight of the lot shall be affected as aforesaid or by second growth or by other defect; and the lot shall be reasonably free from earth or from rough or unshapely tubers or from scab:

The expression “Under-grade” in reference to any potatoes: means potatoes that are not “good table” or “f.a.q.” potatoes:

The expression “f.o.b.s.e.” means “free on board, sacks or other containers extra”, and the expression “f.o.r.s.e.” means “free on rail, sacks or other containers extra”.

(2) Terms and expressions defined in the said Act, when used in this Order, have the meanings severally assigned thereto by that Act.

4. Subject to any general or specific directions that may be given by or on behalf of the Tribunal, any expenses that are reasonably incurred by a wholesaler or retailer in undertaking the transport of any potatoes at his own expense may be regarded for the purposes of this Order as if they were transport charges paid by him, and the maximum price of the potatoes shall be determined accordingly.

5. The provisions of this Order shall apply notwithstanding that any potatoes to which this Order is applicable are sold otherwise than by weight.

6. The several prices, allowances, and margins of profit fixed by this Order apply with respect to sales by auction as well as to other sales.

7. (1) The growers’ prices fixed by this Order do not include the cost of sacks or other containers.

(2) The maximum price that may be charged or received by a grower for the sacks in which any lot of potatoes to which this Order applies are packed shall be computed as follows:—

For sacks or bags of a size 48 in. by 26½ in., 46 in. by 26½ in., 44 in. by 28½ in., 46 in. by 23 in., 41 in. by 23 in., or 29 in. by 18 in.:

At the rate of 17s. 6d. per ton of potatoes:

For all other sacks or bags: No extra charge.

(3) Where any potatoes to which this Order applies are packed in sacks the maximum price that may be charged or received for the potatoes shall be computed on the gross weight of the potatoes and the sacks.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

8. (1) This Order applies to potatoes, including imported potatoes, that are intended for human consumption.

(2) All potatoes sold or delivered to a purchaser during the currency of this Order shall be deemed to be intended for human consumption unless they are sold for some other specific purpose.

9. (1) The provisions of this Order fixing growers’ prices shall apply only with respect to potatoes grown in New Zealand (a) that are the produce of seed potatoes planted on or before 31 January 1955; or (b) that are the produce of seed potatoes planted after 31 January 1955 and that are delivered to the purchaser after the commencement of this Order and on or before 31 May 1955.

(2) For the purposes of the last preceding subclause no potatoes sold on the basis of f.o.b.s.e. or f.o.r.s.e. shall be deemed to be delivered to the purchaser after the commencement of this Order if—

(a) In the case of sales f.o.b.s.e., the vessel on which the potatoes are laden leaves the port of shipment at any time before midnight of the 28th day of February 1955; or

(b) In the case of sales f.o.r.s.e., the trucks on which the potatoes are laden leave the grower’s station at any time before midnight of the said date.

(3) Except as provided in the last preceding subclause potatoes sold f.o.b.s.e. or f.o.r.s.e. shall be deemed to be delivered to the purchaser after the commencement of this Order notwithstanding that they may have been actually laden on board any vessel or trucks before the commencement of this Order.

10. (1) With respect to potatoes grown in New Zealand, the provisions of this Order as to distributors’ prices, wholesalers’ prices, and retailers’ prices respectively shall apply only with respect to potatoes (a) that are the produce of seed potatoes planted on or before 31 January 1955; or (b) that are the produce of seed potatoes planted after 31 January 1955, and that are sold on or before 31 May 1955.

(2) Except as provided in the last preceding subclause, the provisions of this Order as to distributors’ prices, wholesalers’ prices, and retailers’ prices respectively shall apply with respect to all potatoes intended for human consumption (whether grown in New Zealand or imported into New Zealand) that are sold by a distributor, wholesaler, or retailer (as the case may be) for delivery at any time after the coming into force of this Order.

FIXING PRICES OF POTATOES THAT ARE SUBJECT TO THIS ORDER
Growers’ Prices

11. (1) Subject to the foregoing provisions of this Order and to the following provisions of this clause the maximum price that may be charged or received by any grower for any potatoes to which this Order applies shall be determined in accordance with the following scale, namely:—

(a) For Sutton’s Supreme, King Edward, Sebago, Katahdin, or Chippewa potatoes grown in the South Island and sold for delivery in the months of March to June 1955 and thereafter pending the issue of any amending Price Order.

(2) Where any potatoes grown in the South Island are delivered by a grower otherwise than f.o.b.s.e. a port in the South Island the price that may be charged by the grower shall be the appropriate price in terms of the foregoing provisions of this clause, increased by the amount of the charges (if any) incurred by him in effecting delivery and then reduced by the amount of the charges that would have been incurred by him if he had delivered the potatoes f.o.b.s.e. a port in the South Island.

(3) Where any potatoes grown in the North Island are delivered by a grower otherwise than f.o.r.s.e. the grower’s station, the price that may be charged by the grower shall be the appropriate price in terms of the foregoing provisions of this clause, increased by the amount of the charges (if any) incurred by him in effecting delivery and then reduced by the amount of the charges that would have been incurred by him if he had delivered the potatoes f.o.r.s.e. the grower’s station.

(4) Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this clause, where any extraordinary charges beyond the control of the grower are reasonably incurred by him in or in the course of delivering any potatoes at the place specified in any contract as the place of delivery, the amount of such charges may, with the approval of the Tribunal, be added to the price to be paid to the grower for those potatoes.

Distributors' Prices

12. (1) Subject to the provisions of the next succeeding clause, the maximum price that may be charged or received by any distributor for any potatoes other than imported potatoes shall not exceed the sum of the following amounts:

- (a) The price actually paid or payable to the grower by the same or any other distributor for the potatoes, but not exceeding in any case the appropriate price set out in clause 11 of this Order;
- (b) The price actually paid or payable to the grower by the same or any other distributor for the sacks, but not exceeding in any case the appropriate price set out in clause 7 of this Order;
- (c) The sum of 4s. 2d. per ton to cover any grading and branding charges where actually incurred by the same or any other distributor;
- (d) The sum of 11s. 6d. a ton to cover transport, or other charges that may be incurred by the same or any other distributor;
- (e) Any disbursements actually incurred and paid by the same or any other distributor by way of brokerage but not exceeding in the aggregate 2s. 6d. a ton;
- (f) An amount computed at the rate of 15s. a ton.

(2) Subject to the provisions of the next succeeding clause, the maximum price that may be charged or received by any distributor for any potatoes imported into New Zealand by the distributor or any other person shall not exceed the sum of the following amounts:

- (a) The landed cost of the potatoes to the importer at the port of discharge;
- (b) Any disbursements actually incurred and paid by the same or any other distributor by way of brokerage in New Zealand (not exceeding in the aggregate 2s. 6d. a ton) together with any grading, transport, or other charges incurred in New Zealand and actually paid by the same or any other distributor;
- (c) An amount computed at the rate of 15s. a ton.

13. Where any wholesaler who does not normally carry on business as a distributor sells any potatoes to another wholesaler (thus becoming a distributor in respect of that transaction) the price to be charged by the vendor may exceed the maximum price determined in accordance with the last preceding clause by such amount as may be mutually agreed to by the parties to the transaction: Provided that in any such case the maximum price that may be charged by the purchasing wholesaler in accordance with the next succeeding clause shall be determined as if he had bought those potatoes at the price paid by the wholesaler from whom he bought them.

Wholesalers' Prices

14. (1) Subject to the provisions of clause 13 hereof, the maximum price that may be charged or received by any wholesaler for any potatoes other than imported potatoes and sold by him to a retailer for purposes of retail sale shall not exceed the sum of the following amounts:

- (a) The price actually paid or payable by the wholesaler to the grower or any other person for the potatoes, but not exceeding in any case the appropriate price set out in clause 11 or fixed by the provisions of clause 12 of this Order whichever is applicable;
- (b) The price actually paid or payable by the wholesaler to the grower or any other person for the sacks, but not exceeding in any case the appropriate price set out in clause 7 of this Order;
- (c) An amount (not exceeding 5s. 4d. a ton) in respect of any potatoes actually received into and delivered from the wholesaler's store, together with any grading, transport, or other charges actually paid by the wholesaler;
- (d) An amount equal to 2½ per cent of the sum of the amounts specified in paragraphs (a) and (c) hereof (to cover the estimated loss due to shrinkage and other natural causes), and, in the case of potatoes that have been actually received into the wholesaler's store, a further amount equal to 1½ per cent of the aforesaid sum;
- (e) An amount computed at the rate of £1 17s. 6d. a ton for lots of less than a half-ton, and at the rate of £1 10s. a ton in all other cases.

(2) Subject to the provisions of clause 13 hereof, the maximum price that may be charged or received by any wholesaler for any potatoes imported into New Zealand by the wholesaler or any other person and sold by the wholesaler to a retailer for purposes of retail sale shall not exceed the sum of the following amounts:

- (a) The price actually paid or payable by the wholesaler;
- (b) An amount (not exceeding 5s. 4d. a ton) in respect of any potatoes actually received into and delivered from the wholesaler's store, together with any grading, transport, or other charges incurred in New Zealand and actually paid by the wholesaler;
- (c) In respect of potatoes that have been actually received into the wholesaler's store, an amount equal to 1½ per cent of the sum of the amounts specified in paragraphs (a) and (b) hereof;
- (d) An amount computed at the rate of £1 17s. 6d. a ton for lots of less than a half-ton, and at the rate of £1 10s. a ton in all other cases.

Computation of Distributors' and Wholesalers' Prices by Reference to Average Prices

15. In computing the maximum price that may be charged by any distributor or by any wholesaler for potatoes that have been acquired by him in different lots at different prices, the appropriate maximum price may, with the general or special approval of the Tribunal, and subject to any conditions that may be imposed by the Tribunal, be computed by reference to the average of the several prices paid for such potatoes.

Distributors and Wholesalers to Specify Weights and Grades of Potatoes on Relevant Invoices

16. (1) Every distributor or other wholesaler who sells any potatoes to which this Order applies shall specify in the relevant invoices, with respect to each item, the weight and the grade of the potatoes comprised in the item.

(2) For the purposes of this clause the term "grade" with respect to any lot of potatoes means, as the case may require, "good table" or "f.a.q." or "under-grade."

(3) Where no grade is specified in any invoice, the potatoes referred to in the invoice shall, for the purpose of this Order, be deemed to be "under-grade."

Retailers' Prices

17. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause, the maximum price inclusive of the container that may be charged or received by any retailer for any potatoes to which this Order applies, shall not exceed the sum of the following amounts:

- (a) The price actually paid or payable by the retailer for the potatoes, but not exceeding the appropriate price fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order;
- (b) Any grading, transport, or other charges actually paid or payable by the retailer;
- (c) An amount equal to 33½ per cent of the sum of the amounts specified in paragraphs (a) and (b) hereof.

(2) The retail price of any potatoes, computed in accordance with the last preceding subclause, shall be calculated by reference to the prices and weights disclosed in the appropriate invoices.

(3) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the foregoing provisions of this clause, but subject to the provisions of subclauses (4) and (5) hereof, the retail price of potatoes inclusive of the container to which this Order applies shall not in any case exceed the appropriate price set out in the Schedule hereto.

(4) Where any potatoes to which this Order applies are sold by retail in lots of 14 lb. or 28 lb. or 56 lb. or 112 lb., the maximum retail price inclusive of the container shall not in any case exceed:

(5) For the purposes of this subclause, the term "specified weight" means 14 lb., 28 lb., 56 lb., or 112 lb. Where any potatoes to which this Order applies are sold by retail in any lot exceeding 14 lb., a maximum price for the lot, inclusive of the container, shall be calculated at the rate fixed in respect of the nearest specified weight to the weight of the lot sold.

(6) If in respect of any lot of potatoes sold by a retailer the maximum price, calculated in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this clause, is not an exact number of pence or half-pence (in the case of a lot less than 5 lb.) or is not an exact number of pence (in the case of a lot of 5 lb. or more), the maximum price of the lot shall be the next highest halfpenny or the next highest penny, as the case may be. The provisions of this subclause shall apply notwithstanding that in any case the retailer purports to sell any potatoes otherwise than by weight.

(7) For the purposes of this clause the price paid or payable by a retailer for any lot of potatoes and the grading, transport, and other charges paid or payable by him in respect of the same lot, shall be apportioned evenly over the whole lot, and the price and charges paid or payable by the retailer for each 1 lb. of potatoes included in the lot shall be determined accordingly.

18. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this Order and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any retailer, may authorize special maximum retail prices in respect of any potatoes to which this Order applies where special circumstances exist or, for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are incurred by the retailer in obtaining delivery from the source of supply that is nearest or most convenient of access to him. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a specified lot or consignment of potatoes or may relate generally to all potatoes to which this Order applies sold by the retailer while the approval remains in force.

Retailers to Exhibit Prices

19. Every retailer who offers or exposes any potatoes to which this Order applies for sale in any shop shall keep in a prominent position in such proximity to the potatoes to which it relates as to be obviously descriptive thereof a ticket, placard, or label on which shall be stated in legible and prominent characters the retail price per pound of potatoes.

BRANDING OF GOOD TABLE POTATOES

20. Every grower, distributor, or wholesaler who grades any potatoes as "good table" shall affix to every sack so graded a tag on which shall be written the words "Good Table Grade" and the name and address of the person so grading the potatoes: Provided, however, that where a grower so grading potatoes is a member of a growers' association approved by the Minister of Agriculture his registered number may be given in place of his name and address.

Notice of Adoption Under Part IX of the Maori Affairs Act 1953

PURSUANT to the Maori Affairs Act 1953, the Maori Land Court has made the Order of Adoption set out in the Schedule hereto.

"That, for the purpose of providing for the payment of principal, interest, and other charges on a loan of three thousand five hundred pounds (£3,500) authorized to be raised by the Bay of Islands County Council under the above-mentioned Act for the purposes of erecting a garage and installing equipment, the Bay of Islands County Council hereby makes and levies a special rate of one-sixteenth of one penny ($\frac{1}{16}$ d.) in the pound on the rateable value (on the basis of the unimproved value) of all rateable property in the whole of the County of the Bay of Islands, and that such special rate shall be an annually recurring rate during the currency of such loan and shall be payable yearly on the 1st day of April in each and every year during the currency of such loan, being a period of fifteen (15) years, or until the loan is fully paid off."
