And in exercise of such powers and authorities as aforesaid and with the like advice and consent I do hereby appoint you, the said Stanley Logan Paterson, to be the Chairman of the said Commission:

And for the better enabling you to carry these presents into effect you are hereby authorized and empowered to make and conduct any inquiry under these presents at such times and places as you deem expedient with power to adjourn from time to time and from place to place as you think fit, and so that these presents shall continue in force and the inquiry may at any time and place be resumed although not regularly adjourned from time to time or from place to place:

And using all due diligence you are required to report to me in writing under your hands not later than the 9th day of December 1955 your findings and opinions on the matters aforesaid, together with such recommendations as you think fit to make in respect thereof:

NOTE.—At stations where departures from normal are in parentheses, the temperature record has been maintained for less than ten years, the rainfall record for less than twenty years. Rainfall normals have been revised and now refer to the standard period 1921-50. Where observations are not available for the whole period, or where the site of the rain-gauge has been changed, the normals are partly interpolated.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR AUGUST 1955

General: August was a mild, cloudy month, and provided reasonably favourable conditions for lambing in most districts. By the end of the month pastures were showing some growth except in Southland, where the weather was still rather frosty.

On the first three days of the month south-easterly winds, which had been so frequent in July, again covered the North Island. As a result, on the 1st heavy rain in Gisborne and Hawke's Bay caused flooding in some areas, especially near Waipukurau.

On the evening of the 9th a number of thunderstorms were reported from Auckland and Taranaki Provinces, and at Auroa in South Taranaki six cows were killed by lightning. On the 10th no less than three small tornadoes were reported in New Plymouth, Waitara, and Whakatane respectively. All three caused some local damage.

Rainfall: Rainfall was above normal over the provinces of Hawke's Bay, Taranaki, Wellington, Marlborough, and Nelson; also in parts of the Canterbury high country. Greatest departures were recorded from Napier to Castlepoint and in north-western Nelson; in these areas rainfall was about twice the normal value. For the city of Gisborne, with a total of 7.5 in., it was the wettest August for 30 years.

It was drier than usual over the Auckland Peninsula, in most eastern districts of the South Island from Kaikoura to Invercargill, and also in parts of the high country between the Bay of Plenty and Gisborne. Banks Peninsula and parts of Central Otago received less than half the normal rainfall.

Temperatures: Over most of the country it was about two degrees warmer than usual. However, in coastal districts of Otago and Southland temperatures were only slightly above normal.

There has not been a warmer August in Christchurch in the last 50 years.

Sunshine: Sunshine was close to normal over most of the Auckland Province, including the Gisborne district, but elsewhere the weather was cloudier than usual. In South Canterbury, parts of Central Otago, and Nelson City, it was one of the dullest Augusts on record, with total sunshine 35-50 hours below normal.

Weather Sequence: At the beginning of the month depressions were centred over the eastern Tasman Sea and east of the North Island. From the 1st to the 3rd strong south-easterly winds brought

heavy rain to Gisborne and Hawke's Bay, with some flooding. Other North Island districts and the east coast of the South Island received light rain.

With rising pressures the weather improved on the 4th, except on the West Coast, where showers developed with the approach of a trough of low pressure over the Tasman Sea. This trough crossed the country on the 5th and 6th, accompanied in most districts by rain, which was heavy in the Bay of Plenty. There followed six days of westerly weather, pressures remaining low to the south-west and south while a series of troughs passed across the country. It was a period of pleasant mild weather in eastern districts, but elsewhere conditions were unsettled with frequent rain. During the passage of a trough on the 9th and 10th there were thunderstorms in Taranaki and Auckland Provinces, and no less than three small tornadoes were reported.

On the 13th a complex depression moved on to the South Island from the west, and for the next four days the weather was generally unsettled, with heaviest falls mainly about central districts. Pressures remained low over the whole country, and on the 17th another depression passed in the far north. Meanwhile a deep depression had been developing to the south-east, and during the next two days there were frequent showers in the far south and in western districts north of Greymouth. Showers became less frequent on the 20th as a weak ridge of high pressure passed rapidly across the country.

Conditions deteriorated in northern and western districts of the South Island during the next two days with the approach of a trough from the west. From the 23rd to the 28th westerly conditions again predominated, with deep depressions passing to the south-west. Eastern districts again experienced a spell of fair weather, but elsewhere there were frequent periods of rain.

Barometers commenced to rise in the south on the 28th, and by the following day an extensive belt of high pressure covered the South Island and most of the Tasman Sea. At the same time a depression developed over Northland, and it later moved south-eastward. For the last three days of the month easterly winds covered the country from Christchurch northward, bringing moderate rain in eastern districts and about Cook Strait and lighter falls in other parts of the North Island.

Price Order No. 1627 (Basic Poultry Ration)

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act 1947, the Price Tribunal hereby makes the following Price Order :

PRELIMINARY

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1627, and shall come into force on the 23rd day of September 1955.
2. (1) Price Order No. 1573* is hereby revoked.
- (2) The revocation of the said Price Order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.
3. In this Order :
 - "Auckland Metropolitan Area" means the City of Auckland, the Boroughs of Birkenhead, Devonport, Ellerslie, Mount Albert, Mount Eden, Mount Roskill, Mount Wellington, New Lynn, Newmarket, Northcote, Onehunga, One Tree Hill, Otahuhu, and Takapuna.
 - "Wellington Metropolitan Area" means the Cities of Wellington and Lower Hutt, the Boroughs of Eastbourne and Petone, and the district known as Stokes Valley.
 - "Christchurch Metropolitan Area" means the City of Christchurch and the Boroughs of Riccarton and Lyttelton.
 - "Dunedin Metropolitan Area" means the City of Dunedin and the Boroughs of Green Island, Port Chalmers, St. Kilda, and West Harbour.
 - "Basic Poultry Ration" means a poultry food that has been manufactured to conform to the formula set out in the First Schedule to this Order, provided that no poultry food shall be deemed to be basic poultry ration for the purposes of this Order unless the container in which it is sold, exposed, or offered for sale is clearly marked with the words "Basic Poultry Ration".
 - "Merchant" means a person who in the customary course of his business sells basic poultry ration both to retailers and to consumers, and with respect to sales made by a manufacturer to a retailer or to a consumer includes a manufacturer.
 - "Retailer" means a person who sells basic poultry ration to consumers only.
 - "Ton" means 2,000 lb.
 - "Bushel" means 20 lb.
 - The expression "f.o.r." means "free on rail", and the expression "f.o.b." means "free on board".
 - "Delivered" means delivered to the premises of the purchaser.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

4. This Order applies with respect to any basic poultry ration, and to any other poultry food consisting of more than one ingredient sold in New Zealand.

FIXING MAXIMUM PRICES OF BASIC POULTRY RATION TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

Manufacturers' Prices

5. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this Order the maximum price that may be charged or received by any manufacturer carrying on business at one of the places specified in the Second Schedule hereto for any basic poultry ration to which this Order applies, shall be the appropriate price specified in the said Schedule, and with respect to any other poultry food consisting of more than one ingredient shall be the appropriate price fixed in the Second Schedule hereto reduced at the rate of £7 per ton unless a Price Order or a special approved price is in force with respect to such other poultry food.

(2) Subject to the following provisions of this Order the maximum price that may be charged or received by any manufacturer carrying on business elsewhere than at one of the places specified in the Second Schedule hereto for any basic poultry ration to which this Order applies, shall be the price that may be charged by the manufacturer carrying on business at the nearest specified place increased by the amount of the freight charges that would have been incurred had the basic poultry ration been conveyed at current rates from such nearest place to the premises of the manufacturer.

- (3) The prices fixed by the foregoing provisions of this clause are fixed as for delivery at the premises of the manufacturer.

Merchants' Prices

6. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this Order the maximum price that may be charged or received by any merchant carrying on business at one of the places specified in the Second Schedule hereto for any basic poultry ration to which this Order applies, shall be the appropriate price specified in the said Schedule, and with respect to any other poultry food consisting of more than one ingredient, shall be the appropriate price fixed in the Second Schedule hereto reduced at the rate of £7 per ton unless a Price Order or a special approved price is in force with respect to such other poultry food.

(2) Subject to the following provisions of this Order the maximum price that may be charged or received by any merchant carrying on business elsewhere than at one of the places specified in the Second Schedule hereto for any basic poultry ration to which this Order applies, shall be the price that may be charged by the merchant carrying on business at the nearest specified place increased by the amount of any freight charges actually incurred between the place of purchase and the merchant's store.

Retailers' Prices

7. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this Order the maximum price that may be charged or received by any retailer carrying on business at one of the places specified in the Second Schedule hereto for any basic poultry ration to which this Order applies, shall be the appropriate price specified in the said Schedule, and with respect to any other poultry food consisting of more than one ingredient, shall be the appropriate price fixed in the Second Schedule hereto reduced at the rate of £7 per ton unless a Price Order or a special approved price is in force with respect to such other poultry food.

(2) Subject to the following provisions of this Order the maximum price that may be charged or received by any retailer carrying on business elsewhere than at one of the places specified in the Second Schedule hereto for any basic poultry ration to which this Order applies, shall be the price that may be charged by the retailer carrying on business at the nearest specified place increased by the appropriate proportion of any freight charges actually incurred between the place of purchase and the retailer's store.

General

8. (1) With respect to basic poultry ration the maximum prices fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order are fixed in relation to quantities, packed by a manufacturer, comprising less than twenty sacks to the ton.

(2) Where basic poultry ration is packed by a manufacturer in quantities comprising twenty or more sacks to the ton, the maximum prices fixed by the foregoing provisions of this Order may be increased by an amount not exceeding 7s. 6d. per ton, provided that any such increase added by any merchant or any retailer shall not exceed the amount of the increase added in accordance with the provisions of this subclause by the manufacturer from whom the basic poultry ration was purchased.

- (3) The prices fixed by this Order are net and include the cost of sacks or bags.

Provision for Special Prices

9. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the foregoing provisions of this Order, and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any manufacturer, merchant, or retailer, may authorize special maximum prices in respect of any basic poultry ration to which this Order applies where special circumstances exist, or for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are incurred by the manufacturer, merchant, or retailer. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a specified lot or consignment of basic poultry ration, or may relate generally to all basic poultry ration to which this Order applies sold by the manufacturer, merchant, or retailer while the approval remains in force.

10. Where the price computed in accordance with the provisions of this Order is in the case of a manufacturer or merchant not an exact number of pence, it may be computed to the next upward penny, and where in the case of a retailer it is not an exact number of pence or half-pence, it may be computed to the next upward halfpenny.

Duty Imposed on Vendors of Basic Poultry Ration

11. Every vendor of basic poultry ration to which this Order applies shall state in the appropriate invoice relating to the sale (1) that the sale relates to basic poultry ration, and (2) the size of the container in which the basic poultry ration was packed by the manufacturer.

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act 1947, the Price Tribunal hereby makes the following Price Order:

1. This Order may be cited as Price Order No. 1629, and shall come into force on the 23rd day of September 1955.

2. (1) Price Order No. 1563* is hereby revoked.

(2) The revocation of the said Order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

3. This Order applies with respect to all milking machine rubberware specified in the Schedule hereto that has been manufactured in New Zealand.

FIXING MAXIMUM WHOLESALE AND RETAIL PRICES OF RUBBERWARE TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

Wholesalers' Prices

4. The maximum price that may be charged or received by any wholesaler (including a manufacturer) for any rubberware to which this Order applies shall be the appropriate retail price specified in the Schedule hereto in relation to the rubberware reduced as follows:

(a) In respect of sales made to a retailer: By 16 per cent of that price:

(b) In respect of sales made to a member of the Dairy Machinery Traders' Association or to a milking machine manufacturer: By 16 per cent of the said appropriate retail price and the amount so calculated by a further 7½ per cent of that amount.

Retailers' Prices

5. (1) The maximum price that may be charged or received by any retailer for any rubberware to which this Order applies shall be computed at the appropriate price specified in the Schedule hereto in relation to the rubberware.

(2) Where a retailer sells a portion of a 60 ft. length of claw, air, or milk tubing, the maximum price that may be charged for the portion sold shall be such proportion of the fixed price for the 60 ft. length as the length of the part sold bears to 60 ft.: provided that the price so calculated may be increased by 5 per cent thereof.

(3) If the retail price charged in accordance with the provisions of this clause is not an exact number of pence or halfpence the maximum price shall be computed to the next upward halfpenny.

(2) The revocation of the said Price Order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

3. This Order applies only with respect to sales by way of retail of 42 in. woolpacks.

FIXING MAXIMUM RETAIL PRICE OF WOOLPACKS TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

4. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause, the maximum price that may be charged or received by any retailer for any woolpacks to which this Order applies shall be:

- (a) For woolpacks sold by a retailer carrying on business at one of the ports of Auckland, Wellington, Lyttelton, or Dunedin: 12s. 10d. each.
- (b) For woolpacks sold by a retailer carrying on business elsewhere than at one of the ports mentioned in paragraph (a) hereof: 12s. 10d. each, increased by the appropriate proportion of the freight charges incurred by the retailer in obtaining delivery from such one of the said ports as is most convenient of access to his store:

Provided that where any woolpacks to which this paragraph applies are obtained by the retailer elsewhere than from such one of the said ports as is most convenient of access to his store, the increase authorized by this paragraph shall not exceed the appropriate proportion of the freight charges that would have been incurred by the retailer if the woolpacks had been obtained from that port and if delivery had been effected at current freight rates.

- (2) The maximum prices fixed by the last preceding subclause are fixed as for delivery f.o.r. or f.o.b. as the case may require.

(3) Where any woolpacks are delivered by a retailer otherwise than f.o.r. or f.o.b., the price that may be charged by the retailer shall be the appropriate price in terms of the foregoing provisions of this clause increased by the amount of the freight charges incurred by him in effecting delivery and then reduced by the amount of those charges that would have been incurred by him if he had delivered the woolpacks f.o.r. or f.o.b. as aforesaid.

(4) Any freight charges imposed by a retailer pursuant to the foregoing provisions of this clause shall be shown separately on the appropriate invoice.

5. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this Order, and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any retailer, may authorize special maximum retail prices in respect of any woolpacks to which this Order applies where special circumstances exist, or for any reason extraordinary charges (freight

or otherwise) are incurred by the retailer. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a specified lot or consignment of woolpacks or may relate generally to all woolpacks to which this Order applies sold by the retailer while the approval remains in force.
