Varying Proclamations Proclaiming Tribal Districts Under the Maori Social and Economic Advancement Act 1945

C. W. M. NORRIE, Governor-General [L.S.] A PROCLAMATION

PURSUANT to section 6 of the Maori Social and Economic Advancement Act 1945, I, Lieutenant-General Sir Charles Willoughby Moke Norrie, the Governor-General of New Zealand, Willoughby Moke Norrie, the Governor-General of New Zealand, hereby vary the Proclamation made on 13 January 1949, and the Proclamation made on 13 February 1951, declaring certain parts of New Zealand to be tribal districts for the purposes of the said Act by excluding from the Schedule thereto the descriptions of the Whakatohea-Ngaitai Tribal District and the Horouta No. 2 Tribal District and substituting therefor the descriptions of these districts appearing in the Schedule hereto.

Station Arowhana in Block IV, Arowhana Survey District; thence north-westerly along a right line to Trig. Station 1316 (Maungawaru) in Block XIV, Maungawaru Survey District, and a right line to the point of commencement. ALL that area in the Gisborne Land District bounded by a

Station 1316 (Maungawaru); thence along a right line to Arowhana Trig. Station, in Block IV, Arowhana Survey District; thence along a right line to Tuanui-o-te-Kahakaha Trig. Station, in Block X, Arowhana Survey District; thence along a right line and its production through Trig. Station 140 to the middle of the Motu River; thence up the middle of the Motu River to its confluence with the Whakapaupakihi Stream, in Block II, Motu Survey District; thence up the middle of the Whakapaupakihi Stream, to and along the southern boundary of the Whakapaupakihi No. 2 Block to Trig. Station 149A; thence along a right line to Trig. Station Pokaikiri; thence south-westerly along the north-western boundaries of Section 2, Block V, Motu Survey District, Sections 2, 1, and 4, Block IX, Motu Survey District, Sections 3 and 2, Block XII, Moanui Survey District, Small Congruence 20, and 80, and the production of the last. District, Sections 2, 1, and 4, Block IX, Motu Survey District, Sections 3 and 2, Block XII, Moanui Survey District, Small Grazing-runs 90 and 89, and the production of the lastmentioned boundary to the western boundary of Tahora Block; thence northerly along a right line to Kaharoa Trig. Station, in Block II, Waioeka South Survey District; thence along the south-western boundary of the Tahora 2Ad 2 Block to its intersection with the middle of the Waimana River, in Block XII, Waimana Survey District; thence down the middle of the Waimana Survey District; thence along the south-western and eastern boundaries of Waimana No. 1D Block to the north-eastern corner of Section 21, Block IV, Waimana Survey District; thence along the north-eastern boundary of the aforesaid Section 21, the southern boundaries of Allotments 273, 269, and 268, Waimana Parish, across the Whakatane-Opotiki Main Highway to the south-eastern corner of Allotment 223, Waimana Parish; thence in a northerly direction generally along the western side of the Whakatane-Opotiki Main Highway to its junction with the generally western side of the Wainui Road, in Block XI, Whakatane Survey District; thence along the western side of the Wainui Road to a point due west of the southernmost corner of Lot 4 on the Land Transfer Plan numbered 14254, lodged in the office of the District Land Registrar at Auckland; thence north-easterly along a right line to a point in the middle of the entrance of the Ohiwa Harbour, being the point of commencement.

- (d) Plugs and cord-connector sockets which are submitted for my opinion as to their compliance with the above requirements, or for my approval, shall be accompanied by an acceptable report of tests conducted by a recognized testing authority, for example, the Department of Scientific and Industrial Research.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR OCTOBER 1955

General: For the third consecutive month the weather was un-

General: For the third consecutive month the weather was unusually mild. Rainfall was considered adequate in most districts and growth was reported to be particularly good. Conditions were favourable for lambing, especially in the South Island.

On the 5th unusual thunderstorm activity in Northland caused damage to power and telephone lines, and heavy rains resulted in the flooding of thousands of acres of farm lands in the Dargaville-Kaikohe area. Early on the 18th local heavy rain caused serious flooding at Hunterville in the Rangitikei district and the Main Trunk Railway was blocked for over 24 hours.

Rainfall: Rainfall was appreciably below normal over the greater part of Hawke's Bay and Wairarapa, also over the South Island apart from eastern districts of Otago and Southland. Greatest departures were recorded in the Lakes District and in Marlborough. It was wetter than usual in Northland and also in Hauraki Plains, Bay of Plenty, and western Taranaki. For central Northland it was an exceptionally wet month, with totals ranging from 14 to over 20 inches. Three-quarters of this rain fell in the first six days. Twenty-four-hourly rainfalls on the 5th in the Dargaville-Kaikohe area ranged from 5 to over 8 inches.

Temperatures: Temperatures were above normal over the whole country, mainly by about two degrees. Departures of over three degrees were reported from the Invercargill-Gore-Queenstown area, which had one of the warmest Octobers on record.

An unusual feature of the month was that in many districts the first half was warmer than the second mainly owing to the higher

frequency of northerly winds.

Sunshine: The Wellington Province and eastern districts of the South Island were favoured with somewhat more sunshine than usual. In the Christchurch-Ashburton area totals exceeded the average by over 40 hours, making it one of the sunniest Octobers on record in that area. on record in that area.

Sunshine was below normal over the northern half of the North Island—by the equivalent of an hour a day in Gisborne, the Bay of Plenty, and parts of Northland.

Weather Sequence: On the first two days of the month the weather was fair and warm over the greater part of the country under the influence of an anticyclone centred to the east. In Northland, however, a depression caused heavy rain, and some lighter falls also extended over the remainder of the Auckland Province. Conditions

remained unsettled in Northland with the approach of a deep depression from the west, and as it passed just to the north on the 5th there was further very heavy rain, leading to widespread flooding, and also considerable thunderstorm activity. The remainder of the country north of Christchurch also received an appreciable amount of rain from the 3rd to the 6th, partly on account of the activity of a trough which became stationary through the centre of the North Island. Substantial falls were reported from the Bay of Plenty and from North Taranaki.

from North Taranaki.

From the 7th to the 11th an anticyclone covered most of the country, and the weather was fine apart from some light rain at first in the far south. During the next week, however, a deep and extensive depression over the South Tasman Sea moved slowly across the South Island, while a small depression crossed the North Island. This was a period of unsettled weather, expecially in the North Island and northern and western districts of the South Island. Heavy rain was again reported from Northland on the 12th, and local heavy downnous occurred in Aughland and Now Plymouth

Heavy rain was again reported from Northland on the 12th, and local heavy downpours occurred in Auckland and New Plymouth on the 14th. Early on the 18th heavy rain over a period of a few hours led to serious flooding in Hunterville, Marton, and Wanganui. The weather improved rapidly during the 18th under the influence of a weak ridge of high pressure, but on the two following days some light rain was reported as far north as the Manawatu district during the passage of a complex depression across the South Island. Rather similar conditions were associated with the eastward passage of a trough of low pressure on the 21st and 22nd, but the rain was more general. On the next two days pressure remained rather low to the east and southerly winds predominated, with showers on the east coast of the South Island. On the 25th and 26th rain was again reported from many districts during the passage of a complex depression across the South Island, but the weather was mainly fair on the east coast from Kaikoura to East Cape and in the far north. A few showers were still reported in the south-westerlies on the 27th. For the last four days of the month the weather was mainly fair, under the influence of an anticyclone over and later to the east of

under the influence of an anticyclone over and later to the east of the country. However, the passage of a depression to the north caused unsettled conditions in Northland, and on the 31st the weather deteriorated on the West Coast with the approach of a trough of low pressure from the west.
