NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR SEPTEMBER 1956

September was a dry, warm month and also rather sunny in most districts, especially during the first three weeks. In the Auckland Province some areas had not yet recovered from the very wet winter. Elsewhere the weather was mainly favourable for farming, but in a few districts more rain would have been appreciated. Lambing conditions varied considerably; in the South Island losses occurred during cold south-westerly weather from the 13th to the 15th.

Two small local tornadoes were reported on the 12th, one at Greymouth, the other near Waitara in North Taranaki.

Rainfall: Rainfall was less than three-quarters of the normal value, except over Canterbury, North Otago, and northern and eastern districts of the Auckland Province. The greatest deficit was on the West Coast, which experienced the driest September since 1935.

For Banks Peninsula and parts of coastal Canterbury it was a comparatively wet month. A few stations in this area received double their usual rainfall.

A number of rather violent thunderstorms were reported in the North Island from the 27th to the 29th, and caused local heavy downpours in Auckland and Dannevirke on the 27th.

Temperatures: Mean temperatures were above normal, mainly by 1 to 2 degrees.

Snow fell on the high country of both Islands during a spell of south-westerly winds from the 13th to the 15th.

Sunshine: The greater part of the country received more sunshine than usual by about an hour a day. The Wellington-Manawatu-Wanganui area was particularly favoured. For Wellington city, with 221 hours, it was the sunniest September since 1910.

By contrast, it was an unusually cloudy month for Otago and Southland. Gore and Invercargill both received the lowest September sunshine in forty years of records.

Weather Sequence: For the first three days of the month the weather was fine, under the influence of an anticyclone centred at first near Cook Strait, later near the Chatham Islands. On the 4th a weak trough of low pressure affected western and southern districts of the South Island. Meanwhile a depression had been developing over the North Tasman Sea, and during the next three days it moved to the north and east of Northland, bringing rain to the Auckland Province. From the 8th to 10th another anticyclone covered the country, and the weather was again fair or fine.

There was a deterioration on the 11th as a depression over the Tasman Sea moved south-eastward past Southland and deepened rapidly. On the 12th a vigorous cold front brought a change to south-westerlies, which persisted for another three days. Showery conditions prevailed generally and snow fell on the high country of both islands. From the 16th to the 22nd an anticyclone moved slowly from the North Tasman Sea across the North Island and to the east of the country. Fine weather prevailed for the whole of this week except in Fiordland and parts of Westland, which received some rain for the first few days.

A shallow depression affected the Gisborne district on the 23rd, and at the same time rain began again on the West Coast with the approach of a trough of low pressure from the west. For the last week of the month a depression over the North Tasman Sea moved slowly eastward and on to the country. The moist northerly air-stream brought cloudy conditions, with rain at times in most districts. Some heavy falls were reported in parts of coastal Canterbury on the 26th.

PRELIMINARY

1. This order may be cited as Price Order No. 1676, and shall come into force on the 23rd day of October 1956.
2. (1) Price Order No. 1655* is hereby revoked.
- (2) The revocation of the said order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this order.
- (3) Notwithstanding the revocation of Price Order No. 1655, any approvals given under clause 9 of that price order after the 11th day of May 1956 shall continue to have effect as if the said order had not been revoked.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

3. This order applies to all bread referred to in clauses 4 and 6 of this order sold in New Zealand by a wholesaler or by a retailer, but does not apply to bread sold on Stewart Island or to bread sold as part of a meal.

FIXING MAXIMUM WHOLESALE AND RETAIL PRICES OF BREAD TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

4. Subject to the provisions of this order, the prices set out in the First Schedule to this order shall be the maximum prices which may be charged or received for any bread to which this order applies and which is customarily known as:

- (a) Standard white bread.
- (b) Standard brown bread.
- (c) Wholemeal bread.
- (d) Vienna bread.
- (e) Wheat-germ bread.

5. Subject to the provisions of this order, the prices set out in the Second Schedule to this order shall be the maximum prices which may be charged or received for any bread to which this order applies and which is customarily known as starch reduced bread, that is, bread in the making of which there is for each sack of flour (160 lb.) used not less than 6 lb. of dry gluten, or 18 lb. of wet gluten, and no less than 6 lb. of fat with either dried milk or condensed milk.

6. Subject to the provisions of this order, the prices set out in the Third Schedule to this order shall be the maximum prices which may be charged or received for any bread described in clause 4 of this order which is sliced and securely wrapped in clean unused paper supplied by the vendor.

7. The wholesale prices fixed by this order apply to bread delivered to the retailer's premises. In any case where bread is not so delivered the prices shall be such as are agreed upon between the baker and the retailer or, failing such agreement, as may be approved by the Tribunal.

GENERAL

8. An additional charge of one halfpenny ($\frac{1}{2}$ d.) per loaf, regardless of the size of the loaf, may be made for wrapping any bread sold by retail to which this order applies, except sliced wrapped bread, provided that the bread so sold is enclosed and securely wrapped in clean unused paper supplied by the vendor.

9. A booking fee at the rate of one farthing ($\frac{1}{4}$ d.) per loaf for loaves of not more than 1 lb. weight and one halfpenny ($\frac{1}{2}$ d.) per loaf for loaves exceeding 1 lb. weight may be made for any bread sold by a retailer to which this order applies, provided that payment for the bread so sold has not been made either prior to, or at the time of, the customer's taking delivery of the bread at the shop.

SPECIAL PRICES WHERE EXTRAORDINARY CHARGES INCURRED

10. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this order, and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any wholesaler, or retailer, may authorise special maximum prices in respect of any bread to which this order applies where special circumstances exist or for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are incurred by the wholesaler or retailer. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a specified lot or consignment of bread or may relate generally to all bread sold by the wholesaler or retailer, while the approval remains in force.
