(5) Whether, and to what extent, the Government should take any steps in relation to the powers or actions of local authorities in respect of any of the foregoing matters: matters;

and generally to inquire into and report upon such other questions coming to your notice in the course of your inquiries into the foregoing matters as you consider should be investigated in connection therewith:

And with the like advice and consent I hereby appoint you, the said Wilfred Fosberrey Stilwell, to be Chairman of the said

And, using all due diligence, you are required to report to me in writing under your hands, not later than the 15th day of February 1957, your findings and opinions on the matters aforesaid, together with such recommendations as you think fit to make in respect thereof:

And you are hereby strictly charged and directed that you shall not at any time publish or otherwise disclose, except to me in pursuance of these presents or by my direction, the contents or purport of any report so made or to be made by
