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Varying a Proclamation Declaring Parts of New Zealand to be a Tribal District under the Maori Social and Economic Advancement Act 1945

C. W. M. NORRIE, Governor-General A PROCLAMATION

PURSUANT to subsection (2) of section 6 of the Maori Social and Economic Advancement Act 1945, I, Lieutenant-General Sir Charles Willoughby Moke Norrie, the Governor-General of New Zealand, vary a Proclamation dated 18 November 1947 and published in the *Gazette* on 8 January 1948, at page 7, declaring parts of New Zealand to be a tribal district under the Maori Social and Economic Advancement Act 1945, by excluding from the Schedule thereto the description of the Tuwharetoa No. 3 Tribal District and substituting therefor the descriptions appearing in the Schedule hereto.

Block VI, and the south-western and north-western boundaries of Section 4, Block II, and along the south-western and north-western boundaries of Section 3, Block I, Manganui Survey District, to its northernmost corner; thence due north along a straight line to a point in the middle of the Ruatiti Stream and northerly up the middle of that stream to a point in line with the south-western boundary of Section 8, Block XIII, Kaitieke Survey District; thence to and along that boundary and its production to the middle of Kokako Road; thence south-westerly along the middle of that road to a point in line with the north-eastern boundary of Section 5, Block I, Manganui Survey District; thence to and along that boundary and the north-eastern boundary of Section 4, Block XIII, Kaitieke Survey District, to the northernmost corner of the last-mentioned section; thence northerly along a straight line to Trig. Station Upokoera in Block VI, Kaitieke Survey District, a straight line to the easternmost corner of Section 8, Block VIII, Hunua Survey District, and a straight line to the easternmost corner of Section 4, Block II, Hunua Survey District; thence along the southern and western boundaries of the said Section 4 and the production of the last-mentioned boundary across a public road to and along the south-eastern boundary of Section 5, Block II, Hunua Survey District, and along the north-eastern boundary of the Said Section 5 and its production to the middle of the Wanganui River; thence up the middle of the said river to a point in line with the north-eastern boundary of the Taumarunui Borough as described in the Gazette of 1910, at page 3231; thence north-westerly to and along that boundary to the northernmost point of the said borough; thence north-easterly along a straight line to Trig. Station 1712 (Whatawhata), being the point of commencement.

The Sharebrokers Act 1908—Amendments to the Rules of the Stock Exchange Association of New Zealand

HIS Excellency the Governor-General in Council has been pleased to approve the following amendments to the rules of the Stock Exchange Association of New Zealand.

AMENDMENTS TO RULES

As passed at a special general meeting of the Committee of the Stock Exchange Association of New Zealand held at Wellington on the 26th day of February 1954.

Rule 46: The following are amended:

Subclause 1 (a) by adding after the words "On Company Bonds" and before the words "(not secured Debentures)" the words "and on note issues not carrying the right of conversion into shares".

Subclause 1 (b) by adding before the word "(Listed)" the words "and note issues carrying the option exerciseable by the holder of conversion into shares or stock".

Subclause 1 (c) by adding before the word "(Unlisted)" the words "and note issues carrying the option exerciseable by the holder of conversion into shares or stock".

Rule 63: Amended by the deletion of the words:

"either by deduction of the amount thereof from the price or otherwise as the circumstances of each particular case may require"

and by the addition of the following provision, viz:

"Where a transfer of shares stock units Bonds or Government securities is delivered on or after the 'ex dividend' date as advised by the Association the amount of the interest as announced or dividend as recommended shall be deducted from the amount payable on settlement by the

buyer.

"For the purposes of this Rule delivery shall be deemed to be made at the time the selling broker hands the documents to the buyer or to the Post Office or to a Banker or other agent for delivery."

That Rule 46 (1) (a) be amended by deleting the words:

"(c) That notwithstanding anything to the contrary hereinbefore contained a seller of Australian securities being other than Government or Local Body Stocks shall unless requested otherwise at the time of sale, make delivery in transfers each of the minimum marketable parcel of such securities at the date of sale in accordance with the Rules of the Australian Exchange nearest the Head Office of the Company concerned."

As passed at the annual general meeting of the Committee of the Stock Exchange Association of New Zealand held at Wellington on 22 and 23 February 1956.

Rule 29: That Rule 29 be deleted, and the following substi-

"29. The annual subscription of each affiliated Exchange shall be the sum of £3 per capita for each member on the roll on the 31st October in each year payable in one sum on the 1st November and such further sum as the Committee shall decide at the Annual Conference each year having regard to the accounts of the year ended on the previous 31st October such further sum being payable in two instal-

ments on the 1st March and the 1st June in each year. If payment of any instalment is not made within one month of due date a fine of 10 per cent per month from due date payment of any instalment is not made within one month of due date a fine of 10 per cent per month from due date will be due and payable. If necessary it shall be competent for the Committee of the Association to strike a levy rateably on all affiliated Exchanges in accordance with the membership of each Exchange at the time the levy is struck. The amount to be payable within thirty days of the date when the levy is struck."

Rule 57: Amended by the deletion of the word "two" in line 4 thereof, and the substitution of the word "three" in lieu
