*Declaring Lands in North Auckland, Taranaki, Wellington, and Canterbury Land Districts Vested in the Auckland, Taranaki, Wellington, and Canterbury Education Boards as Sites for Public Schools to be Vested in Her Majesty the Queen*

A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, by subsection (6) of section 5 of the Education Lands Act 1949 (hereinafter referred to as the said Act), it is provided that, notwithstanding anything contained in any other Act, the Governor-General may from time to time, by Proclamation, declare that any school site or part of a school site which in his opinion is no longer required for that purpose shall be vested in Her Majesty, and thereupon the school site, or part thereof, as the case may be, shall vest in Her Majesty, freed and discharged from every educational trust affecting the same, but subject to all leases, encumbrances, liens, or easements affecting the same at the date of the Proclamation:

Now, therefore, pursuant to subsection (6) of section 5 of the said Act, I, Lieutenant-General Sir Charles Willoughby Moke Norrie, the Governor-General of New Zealand, hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the First Schedule hereto, being an area vested in the Auckland Education Board, the land described in the Second Schedule hereto, being an area vested in the Taranaki Education Board, the land described in the Third Schedule hereto, being an area vested in the Wellington Education Board, and the lands described in the Fourth Schedule hereto, being areas vested in the Canterbury Education Board, as sites for public schools, shall be vested in Her Majesty the Queen, freed and discharged from every educational trust affecting the same, but subject to all leases, encumbrances, liens, or easements affecting the same at the date hereof.

A PROCLAMATION

PURSUANT to section 14 of the Wildlife Act 1953, I, Lieutenant-General Sir Charles Willoughby Moke Norrie, the Governor-General of New Zealand, hereby revoke the Warrants notifying and declaring the areas described in the First Schedule hereto to be sanctuaries under the Animals Protection and Game Act 1921-22, and hereby proclaim and declare the areas described in the Second Schedule hereto to be wildlife refuges for the purposes of the Wildlife Act 1953; and I hereby further declare that the restriction as to the use of boats set out in the Third Schedule shall apply in the Southern Lakes Acclimatisation District and that the Secretary for Internal Affairs is authorised to grant exemptions from the restriction set out in the said Third Schedule.

FIRST SCHEDULE

AREAS REVOKED AS SANCTUARIES UNDER THE ANIMALS PROTECTION AND GAME ACT 1921-22

1. Lake Hayes, Queenstown: The fresh-water lake known as Lake Hayes, near Queenstown, Wakatipu, and an area half a mile in width surrounding the said lake.

2. Part of Lake Wanaka: All that area in the Land District of Otago, being the southern part of Lake Wanaka, lying south of a right line running from the mouth of Waterfall Creek to Eely Point, including the reserve along the shore of that part of the said lake.

3. Part of Lake Wakatipu and Surrounding Land (Queenstown, etc.): All that area in the Otago Land District, containing by admeasurement 4,400 acres, more or less, being part of the waters of Lake Wakatipu and land in the vicinity, commencing at Trig. Station I, near Refuge Point, in Block VII, Coneburn Survey District; thence bounded towards the south-west by a line to the southern corner of Section 28, Block I, Mid-Wakatipu Survey District; thence towards the north-west by said Section 28; thence by a line from the south-eastern corner of aforesaid section to the southern corner of Section 73, Block XX, Shotover Survey District; thence towards the north-west generally by Sections 19, 22, 8, by the crossing of a road, by said road, and by Section 11, said Block XX; thence towards the east and north-east generally by Sections 75 and 32, said Block XX, to the southern side of Frankton Road; again towards the north-west by said road to the eastern boundary of the Town of Frankton; thence again towards the north-east generally by the eastern boundary of said town to the Kawarau River; thence across said river to the most northern corner of Block XII, Coneburn Survey District; thence by part of that block to a road; thence towards the south-east generally by said road to the most southern corner of Section 2, Block I, Coneburn Survey District; thence by a right line to Trig. Station I, being the commencing point.

4. All that area in the Otago Land District containing by admeasurement 287 acres, more or less, being Section 41, Block I, Section 13, and part of Recreation Reserve C, Block II, Upper Wakatipu Survey District, and bounded as follows: Towards the north by the southern side of Barra Street, Town of Kinloch, 1292 links; towards the west generally by the eastern side of Armadale Street, Town of Kinloch, 2010 links; towards the north by the southern side of Skye Street, Town of Kinloch, 3699.1 links; towards the east by the eastern boundary of Section 41, Block I, and 13, Block II, Upper Wakatipu Survey District, 6167.3 links; towards the south by the southern boundary of Section 13, Block II, and the production of that line, 5094 links; towards the west by the production of the western side of Islay Street, Town of Kinloch, 4170.5 links. Be all the aforesaid linkages more or less.

As the same is more particularly shown on plan marked L. and S. 23/807 deposited in the Head Office of the Department of Lands and Survey at Wellington, and thereon edged purple.

5. Area between Milford Sound and Te Anau: All that area in the Land District of Otago bounded as follows: Commencing at a point on the west coast bearing north 45° west from Mount Sutherland; thence by a right line to the said Mount Sutherland; thence by the summit of the Darran Mountains to Mount Christina; thence by the watershed over Mount Anau to Skelmorlie Peak; thence by a right line bearing south 75° west to the summit of the Franklin Mountains; thence by the summit of the said Franklin Mountains and the watershed of the Arthur River to a point on the south shore of Milford Sound opposite Dale Point; thence by a right line to the said Dale Point; and thence by the sea to the place of commencement.

PURSUANT to section 35 of the Local Government Commission Act 1953, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby declares that, as on and from the 1st day of April 1957, the areas described in the Schedule hereto shall be excluded from the County of Hawke's Bay and included in the City of Hastings, and, with the like advice and consent, hereby also declares that the alteration of the boundaries of the said city and the said county hereinbefore made shall be deemed to have been effected under the Municipal Corporations Act 1954.

Where observations are not available for the whole period, or where the site of the rain gauge has been changed, the normals are partly interpolated.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR JANUARY 1957

**General:** January was unusually dry and sunny. The long spell of settled weather was welcomed by holiday-makers and farmers alike. Shearing and haymaking were in full swing after numerous set-backs in previous months. Fruit ripened quickly and was harvested under excellent conditions. By the end of the month, however, pastures were drying up and this was adversely affecting dairy production.

**Rainfall:** Rainfall was less than a quarter of the normal value over most of the Auckland Province, also over the greater part of Taranaki and Marlborough. The greatest deficiency was in Northland, where few stations received even half an inch.

Only in Otago and Southland did totals reach the average value.

Thunderstorms affected parts of Southland and Canterbury on the 6th. In the Methven district of inland Canterbury the thunderstorm was associated with heavy hail, which caused serious damage to crops.

**Temperature:** Temperatures were mainly above normal by about a degree. On the Canterbury coast and about Cook Strait it was warmer than usual by 2 to 3 degrees.

**Sunshine:** Except in Otago and Southland, sunshine was well above normal, mainly by about 50 hours. For Auckland, Palmerston North, Nelson, and Blenheim it was the sunniest January in some 35 to 50 years of records. The highest total was 335 hours, at Blenheim.

**Weather Sequence:** A deep depression centred to the south moved eastward on the first two days of the month, giving generally unsettled weather, with rather cool temperatures. Fair weather accompanied the passage of a ridge of high pressure on the 3rd, but more rain came to many districts from the 4th to the 6th as a trough of low pressure moved slowly north-eastward over the country. Thunderstorms affected parts of Southland and Canterbury on the 6th.

From the 7th to the 26th pressures remained high in the New Zealand area, especially over the North Island. However, from the 11th to 13th a tropical cyclone which had formed about a week earlier near New Caledonia moved southward past East Cape, bringing rain to Gisborne and Hawke's Bay and also unusually heavy seas from Tauranga to Napier. In addition a number of depressions passed far to the south of the country, bringing rather unsettled conditions to western and far southern districts of the South Island. Most other parts of the country had very warm, sunny weather over this twenty-day period.

A trough of low pressure moved on to the country on the 27th and soon became stationary. The whole of the southern half of the South Island received some rain, with substantial falls in Westland. A few northern and western districts of the North Island also benefited on the 28th and 29th, but the falls were very light. On the last two days of the month pressures were again high in the New Zealand area, but a depression was approaching from the north-west. Rain came once again to the West Coast, and some light falls also affected parts of the Auckland Province.
