NOTE—At stations where departures from normal have an asterisk, the temperature record has been maintained for less than ten years, the rainfall record for less than twenty years. Rainfall normals have been revised and now refer to the standard period 1921–50. Where observations are not available for the whole period, or where the site of the rain gauge has been changed, the normals are partly interpolated.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR JUNE 1957

**General:** June was marked by an unusually high frequency of south-westerly winds, especially in the first half. In many districts it was appreciably drier than usual and this, combined with comparatively mild temperatures, made it a favourable winter month for stock and crops. By contrast, in Southland the unusually wet conditions which had prevailed in May persisted in June and became worse, with flooding at times, especially in the lower Mataura River.

**Rainfall:** Rainfall was about two-thirds of the normal value over the greater part of the country. It was unusually dry in Nelson and Marlborough, where many stations recorded totals below half an inch. For Nelson City with 0.22 in. of rain it was the driest June in seventy-five years of observation.

It was wetter than usual by 50 to 100 per cent in south-western areas of the South Island, that is, Southland and most of South Otago and South Westland. Similar excesses were recorded in eastern districts of the North Island from Gisborne to Waipukurau.

**Temperatures:** It was warmer than usual by 1 to 3 degrees except in the provinces of Auckland and Westland, where temperatures were about normal.

Snow was reported at times in inland districts of Southland and on the high country of the North Island during a spell of south-westerly weather covering the first half of the month.

**Sunshine:** Sunshine was mainly about normal. Inland and western districts of the North Island from Hamilton to Wanganui recorded totals 15 to 25 hours below average; while Northland, the Wairarapa-Wellington area, Canterbury, and Otago were favoured with somewhat sunnier weather than usual.

**Weather Sequence:** A south-westerly airstream which had covered New Zealand on the last four days of May persisted for the first

fortnight of June. An anticyclone remained centred over south-east Australia, while pressure was low to the east and south of New Zealand. The weather was continuously unsettled in Southland, with some flooding, especially in the lower Mataura River. Showers also affected parts of the Auckland and Taranaki Provinces. In addition, from the 9th to the 12th the West Coast and Otago received substantial rain as a result of the passage of a deep depression past Campbell Island and the development of a secondary centre off the east coast of the South Island. For many districts sheltered from south-westerlies this fourteen-day period was sunny and rather settled, though at times frosty.

A depression which had formed near the Kermadec Islands moved southward. By the 15th it lay to the north-east of Auckland. At the same time pressure was rising rapidly to the south behind a vigorous cold front which had moved onto the South Island. The weather cleared over Southland for a few days, but the south-easterly airstream which soon covered the country from Canterbury northward brought considerable rain, with some heavy falls in southern and eastern districts of the North Island on the 16th and 17th. A belt of high pressure developed over the South Island and on the 18th and 19th the weather was fair or fine except from Castlepoint to East Cape. Freshening westerlies in the south soon caused a deterioration in western and southern districts of the South Island; on the 21st and 22nd the passage of a trough of low pressure affected these districts and also the North Island.

During the next two days a deep depression moved from the North Tasman Sea across the North Island, with considerable rain, especially in Bay of Plenty and Hawke's Bay. For the last six days of the month depressions were passing to the south and westerly conditions prevailed. Rain was reported from the West Coast and Southland and at times from western districts of the North Island.

PURSUANT to section 16 of the Counties Act 1956, the Secretary for Internal Affairs hereby defines, as set out in the Schedule hereto, the boundaries of the County of Akaroa and the Wainui Riding of that county, the previous boundaries having been altered by Order in Council made on 20 February 1957 and published in *Gazette*, 28 February 1957, No. 15, page 316.

**SCHEDULE**

**BOUNDARIES OF COUNTY OF AKAROA**

ALL that area in the Canterbury Land District commencing at a point on the mean high-water mark of the sea, at the head of Big Bay, Block III, Pigeon Bay Survey District, and in line with the western boundary of a road passing through Rural Sections 27872, 33229, 24754, 24758, and 24762; thence south-easterly, southerly, and south-westerly generally along the mean high-water mark of the sea to Truini Point, Block XII, Akaroa Survey District; thence south-westerly along a right line to Timutimu Head; thence westerly along the mean high-water mark of the sea to a point in line with the south-eastern boundary of Rural Section 22707, Block XI, Akaroa Survey District; thence north-easterly generally to and along the south-eastern and north-eastern boundaries of the said Rural Section 22707, the south-eastern boundary of Rural Section 22755, the south-western, north-western, and north-eastern boundaries of Rural Section 23314 and the production of the last-mentioned boundary to the middle of Maginnes Road; thence north-easterly along the middle of Maginnes Road to a point in line with the south-western boundary of Rural Section 4547; thence north-westerly to and along that boundary to the westernmost corner of the said Rural Section 4547; thence northerly along a right line to Trig. Station C (Bossu), Block VII, Akaroa Survey District; thence north-westerly and northerly generally along the summit of the range passing through Carews Peak, Saddle Hill, Wainui Pass, and French Hill, to the south-eastern side of the Christchurch-Akaroa State Highway No. 74, at Barrys Pass (Hill Top); thence south-westerly generally along the south-eastern side of the said State highway to a point opposite the southernmost corner of Reserve 1259; thence northerly generally along a right line to the said point; thence along the western boundary of Reserve 1259 aforesaid and its production to the northern side of a road forming the northern boundary of the said reserve (Harmans Track); thence easterly generally along the northern side of that road, the Christchurch-Akaroa State Highway No. 74, and the Little River to Pigeon Bay Summit Road, to the eastern boundary of Lot 1, D.P. 11894; thence north-easterly generally along that boundary, the eastern boundary of part Lot 11, D.P. 4902, and the south-eastern boundary of Lot 5, D.P. 4902, and the production of the last-mentioned boundary to the middle of Purau or Summit Road; thence north-westerly along the middle of that road to a point in line with the western side of a road passing through Rural Sections 32152, 33405, 24203, and 28291; thence northerly to and along that roadside to the northern boundary of Rural Section 28291; thence northerly and north-easterly generally to and along the eastern boundary of Rural Section 26939, the crossing of a public road, to and along the western and northern boundaries of Lot 3, D.P. 8086, to the western side of a road passing through Rural Sections 24762, 24758, 24754, 33229, and 27872; thence northerly generally along that roadside and its production to the mean high-water mark of the sea at the head of Big Bay, being the point of commencement.

**BOUNDARIES OF WAINUI RIDING**

(2) The maximum prices fixed by the last preceding sub-clause are fixed as for delivery f.o.r. or f.o.b. as the case may require.

(3) Where any woolpacks are delivered by a retailer otherwise than f.o.r. or f.o.b., the price that may be charged by the retailer shall be the appropriate price in terms of the foregoing provisions of this clause increased by the amount of the freight charges incurred by him in effecting delivery and then reduced by the amount of those charges that would have been incurred by him if he had delivered the woolpacks f.o.r. or f.o.b. as aforesaid.

(4) Any freight charges imposed by a retailer pursuant to the foregoing provisions of this clause shall be shown separately on the appropriate invoice.

5. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this order, and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any retailer, may authorise special maximum retail prices in respect of any woolpacks to which this order applies where special circumstances exist, or for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are incurred by the retailer. (e) For sales in original case or in naked tins .....	7½d.

(2) Where containers are supplied by a retailer he may add to the selling price of the illuminating kerosene, computed in accordance with the provisions of subclause (1) of this clause, the cost of such container.

(3) If in respect to any lot of illuminating kerosene sold by a retailer the maximum price calculated in accordance with the provisions of subclause (1) of this clause is not an exact number of pence or halfpence, the maximum price of the lot shall be the next upward halfpenny.

CHARGES FOR FREIGHT

4. Where freight charges are incurred by a retailer, carrying on business outside of an oil company's free delivery area, in obtaining delivery of any illuminating kerosene the maximum retail price of such kerosene calculated in accordance with the provisions of clause 3 of this order may be increased by a proportionate part of the freight charges that would have been incurred if delivery had been effected by a common carrier at current freight rates.
