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Varying a Proclamation Proclaiming Tribal Districts Under the Maori Social and Economic Advancement Act 1945

COBHAM, Governor-General A PROCLAMATION

PURSUANT to section 6 of the Maori Social and Economic Advancement Act 1945, I, Charles John, Viscount Cobham, the Governor-General of New Zealand, hereby vary the Proclamation made on the 19th day of August 1948 and published in the *Gazette* on the 26th day of August 1948, at page 1047, declaring certain parts of New Zealand to be tribal districts for the purposes of the said Act, by excluding therefrom the description of the Whanganui South Tribal District and substituting therefor the description appearing in the Schedule hereto.

Whanganui North Tribal District

All that area in the Taranaki and Wellington Land Districts bounded by a line commencing at Trig. Station Mount Humphries (Whakaihuwaka); thence north-easterly along a right line in the direction of the confluence of the Tangarakau and Wanganui Rivers to the middle of the Wanganui River, and up the middle of that river to the northern boundary of Block I, Whirinaki Survey District; thence easterly along the northern boundaries of Blocks I, II, III, and IV, Whirinaki Survey District, to the middle of the Maungaroa Road; thence northwesterly along the middle of that road to a point in line with the north-western boundary of Section 4, Block XIII, Kaitieke Survey District; thence to and along that boundary and the south-western boundaries of Sections 3 and 5, Block XIII, Kaitieke Survey District, and the production of the last-mentioned boundary to the middle of that road to a point in line with the southern boundary of Section 8, Block XIII, Kaitieke Survey District; thence to and along that boundary and the western boundary of Section 3, Block II, Manganui Survey District, and its production to the middle of the Ruatiti-Erua Road; thence south-westerly along the middle of that road to a point in line with the south-western boundary of Section 3, Block II, Manganui Survey District, and the production of the last-mentioned boundary to the north-western boundary of Section 1, Block II, the south-western boundary of the last-mentioned section, and the south-western boundary of Section 1 and 2, Block VI, Manganui Survey District, thence along that boundary and the western moundary of the same section to the westernmost corner of Section 24, Block VII, Manganui Survey District; thence along that boundary of that section and its production to the middle of the Raetihi-Waimarino Road; thence along that road

to a point in line with the south-western boundary of Section 24, Block XI, Manganui Survey District; thence to and along that boundary and its production to the middle of the Manganui-a-te-Ao River; thence along that river to a point in line with the eastern boundary of Section 18, Block VIII, Manganui Survey District; thence northerly to and along that boundary, across a public road, and along the eastern boundary of Section 13, Block VIII, Manganui Survey District, to its intersection with the middle of the Makatote Stream; thence up that stream to its source, and along a right line to Te Kohatu Trig. Station; thence along a right line to Pareteationga Trig. Station; thence south-easterly along a right line to Trig. Station Ruapehu and a right line to the middle of the Waiouru-Moawhango Road at its junction with the Waiouru Road; thence southerly along the middle of that road to its intersection with the northern boundary of the Raketapauma No. 1, 1 Block; thence westerly along that boundary and the northern boundaries of Raketapauma Nos. 16, 1A and 3A 2 Blocks to the Turakina River; thence down the middle of that river to a point in line with the northern boundary of Section 4, Block II, Maungakaretu Survey District; thence to and along the northern boundaries of the said Section 4 and the northern boundaries of Sections 3, 2, and 1, Block II, Maungakaretu Survey District; thence to and along the northern boundaries of Sections 3, 2, and 1, Block II, Maungakaretu Survey District; thence southerly along the eastern boundary of Section 7, Block IV, Ngamatea Survey District, and the eastern boundaries of Sections 6 and 9, Block VIII, Ngamatea Survey District, and the eastern boundaries of Sections 6 and 9, Block VIII, Ngamatea Survey District, thence westerly along a right line to Trig. Station Maungakaretu Survey District, to a point due east of Trig. Station E; thence north-westerly along a right line to Trig. Station Tawhiwhinui in Block XI, Rarete Survey District; thence north-westerly along a right line t

A PROCLAMATION

PURSUANT to section 6 of the Maori Social and Economic Advancement Act 1945, I, Charles John, Viscount Cobham, the Governor-General of New Zealand, hereby declare the parts of New Zealand described in the Schedules hereto to be tribal districts for the purposes of the said Act, and hereby assign to the said districts the names appearing at the head of the Schedules.

The Proclamation made on the 19th day of August 1948 and published in the *Gazette* on the 26th day of August 1948, at page 1048, is hereby consequentially revoked.

Station XXIII; thence northerly along a right line to Trig. Station Ratamarumaru in Block VIII, Nukumaru Survey District, and a right line to Trig. Station Te Rewa in Block IV, Nukumaru Survey District; thence easterly along a right line to Trig. Station Te Mihi in Block II, Waipakura Survey District; thence north-easterly along a right line to Trig. Station Rimu on the northern boundary of Block IV, Waipakura Survey District, and a right line to the point of commencement.

WHEREAS by subsection (6) of section 5 of the Education Lands Act 1949 (hereinafter referred to as the said Act) it is provided that, notwithstanding anything contained in any other Act, the Governor-General may from time to time, by Proclamation, declare that any school site or part of a school site which in his opinion is no longer required for that purpose shall be vested in Her Majesty, and thereupon the school site, or part thereof, as the case may be, shall vest in Her Majesty, freed and discharged from every educational trust affecting the same, but subject to all leases, encumbrances, liens, or easements affecting the same at the date of the Proclamation:

Now, therefore, pursuant to subsection (6) of section 5 of the said Act, I, Charles John, Viscount Cobham, the Governor-General of New Zealand, hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the First Schedule hereto, being an area vested in the South Auckland Education Board, and the land described in the Second Schedule hereto being an area vested in the Canterbury Education Board, as sites for public schools shall be vested in Her Majesty the Queen, freed and discharged from every educational trust affecting the same, but subject to all leases, encumbrances, liens, or easements affecting the same at the date hereof.

Section 35 of the valuers. Act 1948, A valuer who is registered and makes valuations for memoers of the public is required to note a current Annual Practising Certificate in order to retain the full rights of registration.

Column 2—This gives the postal address, either business or residential, as on the application for the Annual Practising Certificate.

Column 3—This shows the classification under which the Board has accepted the valuer's qualifications for registration. Valuing is classified only in the three main branches of rural, urban, or rural and urban. These classifications are outlined in section 20 of the Valuers' Act 1948 as follows

"20 (1) Every person entitled to be registered as a valuer under this Act whom the Board considers competent to value farm land only shall be registered as a rural valuer.

"(2) Every person so entitled whom the Board considers competent to value only land other than farm land shall be registered as an urban

"(3) Every person so entitled whom the Board considers competent to value both farm land and other land shall be entitled to be registered as both a rural valuer and an urban valuer."

"19 (1) Every person who has attained the age of twenty-five years and who immediately before the commencement of this Act was a member of the New Zealand Institute of Valuers (Incorporated) shall be entitled to be registered under this Act if he makes application for registration within three months after the commencement of this Act, and satisfies the Board that he is of good character and reputation and has not less than three years' practical experience in New Zealand in the valuing of land.

"(2) Every other person who has attained the age of twenty-five years shall be entitled to be registered under this Act if he satisfies the Board that he is of good character and reputation and:

"(a) That he holds a recognised certificate as defined in the next succeeding subsection and has had not less than three years' practical experience in New Zealand in the valuing of land within the ten years immediately preceding the making of his application; or "(b) That he has passed an examination or examinations approved by the Board and has had not less than three years' practical experience in New Zealand in the valuing of land within the ten years immediately preceding the making of his application; "Provided that the Board shall permit the registration of any other person who has attained the age of twenty-five years and who makes application for registration within one year after the commencement of this Act, and who satisfies the Board that he is of good character and reputation, that he has had three years' practical experience in New Zealand in the valuing of land within the ten years immediately preceding the making of his application, and is a fit and proper person to be registered as a valuer.

"(3) For the purpose of this section the term 'a recognised certificate' means a certificate, diploma, degree, or licence granted by a university, college, board, or other aut

Notes on the Weather for March 1958

General: March was warm and humid. Most districts enjoyed two spells of settled weather at the beginning and end of the month, and stock and crops were reported to be in very good condition. The season has been a particularly favourable one for

In parts of Marlborough and Gisborne the weather was too dry, adversely affecting growth.

adversely affecting growth.

Rainfall: Rainfall was about two-thirds of the normal value in eastern districts and also over the greater part of the Auckland Province. Marlborough (except the Sounds), northern Northland, and parts of Gisborne received only a third of their usual rainfall. On the West Coast and in the Alps it was the sixth successive month with rainfall well above normal, and some stations received twice the average amount. The total rainfall over the greater part of this area for these six months (commencing October 1957) was a record for any six-monthly period. In the Alps and Fiordland the total exceeded the annual average rainfall; Milford Sound received 253.8 in. 253 · 8 in.

Temperatures: Temperatures were above normal, mainly by 2-3 in. Departures were highest in Hawke's Bay.

Sunshine: It was cloudier than usual, except in eastern districts from Gisborne to Wairarapa. The sunshing efficiency was greatest deficiency was greatest ad, where it exceeded in western and inland districts of the So an hour a day.

Weather Seque

For the first eight days a large anticyclone extended over New Zealand from the east, and for the greater part of the country the weather was fine and warm. The passage of a deep depression far to the south-west caused rain on the West Coast and the Southland coast on the 3rd and rain continued in south Westland for arighter two days owing to the presence of a weak stationary fron

On the 9th and 10th another depression moved south-eastward on the 9th and 10th another depression moved south-eastward past western Southland, and the associated cold front crossed the country. The West Coast received heavy rain and there were light falls in other districts as far north as Ruapehu. On the following day the cold front brought a few showers to the Auckland Province but elsewhere the weather improved temporarily. From the 12th to the 16th a complete trough moved slowly north-eastward over New Academy, while two successive depressions crossed the South Leland. Zealand, while two successive depressions crossed the South Island. Rain was general except in parts of Gisborne and Hawke's Bay. Further heavy falls on the West Coast, especially on the 13th and 14th, caused flooding and a landslide at Lake Brunner.

From the 17th to the 19th a weak cold front associated with a depression to the south brought a few showers, mainly on western and southern coasts. For the next three days an anticyclone covered the whole country and the weather was fine.

On the 23rd and 24th a shallow depression moved past Southland and a second depression moved into the Tasman Sea. Light rain commenced again on the West Coast and extended at times to Cook Strait and Taranaki. During the next two days the second depression crossed the North Island giving widespread rain. There were considerable falls in some eastern districts.

On the 27th a weak ridge of high pressure brought mainly fair weather, which persisted in eastern districts north of Oamaru for the rest of the month. However, winds from a westerly quarter freshened once again in the south with the passage of a deep depression close to Campbell Island, and the West Coast received further rain. The far south, Cook Strait and western districts of the North Island also reported light falls, mainly on the 29th.
