Notes on the Weather for June 1958

Dannevirke, April, 1958 .. | 685 | 59.9 | 43.8 | 51.8 |

General: In contrast to May, June was a sunny month with comparatively low rainfall. A spell of settled weather from the 9th to the 22nd was particularly appreciated. Conditions generally were very favourable for stock.

Gales were reported in many districts on the 1st.

Rainfall: Rainfall was less than half the average value over the greater part of the country. In Gisborne, Hawke's Bay, South Canterbury, and North Otago, totals were mainly less than an inch, and between 10 and 25 per cent of the normal value. For parts of the Gisborne - East Cape area it was the driest June or record. on record.

Totals were not far below average in Taranaki, western districts of the Wellington Province, about Christchurch, and in Southland and South Otago. However, the only areas which received appreciably more rain than usual were Fiordland and Stewart

Temperatures: Temperatures were above normal in most districts. In Southland and inland districts of Otago and South

Canterbury it was 2 to 3 degrees warmer than usual.

Snow was reported to low levels on the 7th and 8th over most of the South Island and the central plateau of the North Island.

Sunshine: The greater part of the country was favoured with more sunshine than usual. Highest departures of 30 to 60 hours were recorded about Cook Strait and also in eastern districts

were recorded about Cook Strait and also in eastern districts from Gisborne to Christchurch. It was the sunniest June on record for Masterton, Wellington, and Blenheim.

In the Auckland Province and Taranaki and in western and southern districts of the South Island (from Timaru southward) sunshine was close to the average.

Weather Sequence: The first eight days saw a continuation of the stormy westerly weather of May. At first an extremely deep depression lay far to the south-east of the South Island and a strong westerly to south-westerly airstream covered the country. Rain affected mainly the West Coast, but there were light falls also in the far south, in Taranaki, and on the west coast of the Auckland the far south, in Taranaki, and on the west coast of the Auckland Province. Many gales were reported. The passage of an anti-

cyclone across the North Island on the 4th brought one day of fair weather generally, but conditions soon deteriorated again in most districts as a very deep depression passed to the south. The associated trough of low pressure crossed New Zealand from the 5th to the 7th; there were some considerable falls on the West Coast. On the following day a vigorous cold front brought snow to low levels over the greater part of the South Island and on the central plateau of the North Island.

The next fortnight, from the 9th to the 22nd, was a period of settled, sunny weather for most of the country, with widespread frosts. For the first four days of this period an anticyclone, centred at first over Tasmania, moved slowly eastward; some rain was recorded at times on the West Coast and the Southland coast. From the 13th to the 16th a depression, which had formed to the north of Noumea about a week previously, thoved south-eastward past North Cape, affecting Northland. For the next three days depressions passed far to the south, and western and southern districts of the South Island received rain. From the 20th to the 22nd an anticyclone covered the whole country, and the weathern 22nd an anticyclone covered the whole country, and the weather was fine, apart from some rain in the Waikato - Bay of Plenty area on the 21st.

By the 23rd the anticyclone had moved away to the east and pressures were low to the north-west causing rain in Northland, Taranaki, Fi to the south-west, d, and Southland. from the north-During the next three days a complex dewest Tasman Sea crossed the North Isla king rain to most districts. Some heavy falls were report and U Cook Strait. Temperatures became colder, with snow wer down on the Alps. Conditions improved on the 27th with rising pressures, but a few showers were still reported from the Auckland Province, Taranaki, and the far south.

During the last three days of the month an anticyclone was moving on to the South Island from the South Tasman Sea, while a deep depression was developing over the North Tasman Sea. The weather was fine, apart from rain on the 30th in Northland.

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act 1947, the Price Tribunal hereby makes the following Price Order:

PRELIMINARY

- 1. This order may be cited as Price Order No. 1748, and shall come into force on the 1st day of August 1958.
 - 2. (1) Price Order No. 1739* is hereby revoked.
- (2) The revocation of the said price order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this order.
- 3. (1) In this order, unless the context otherwise requires,—
 "the said Act" means the Control of Prices Act 1947; "the said regulations" mean the Butter and Cheese Marketing Regulations 1948+ lations 1948†.
- (2) Terms and expressions defined in the said Act, or in the said regulations, when used in this order, have the meanings severally assigned thereto by the said Act or by the said regulations, as the case may be.
- 4. The grades referred to in this order shall, as the case requires, mean:
 - (a) Grades assigned at a grading store; or
- (b) Grades assigned in a manufacturing dairy as prescribed by regulation 26 of the said regulations; or
- (c) Grades constructively assigned pursuant to subclause (4) of regulation 26 of the said regulations.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

- 5. This order applies with respect to all sales in New Zealand by way of wholesale, or retail, of any butter within the meaning of the said regulations, except butter sold for use in the manufacture of ice-cream or ice-cream mix or butter sold as ships' stores for vessels sailing beyond New Zealand
- MAXIMUM PRICES FOR SALES OF BUTTER BY WAY OF WHOLESALE, OR BY A MANUFACTURER TO A WHOLESALE DISTRIBUTOR, TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES
- 6. Subject to the provisions of this order, the several maximum prices at which butter prepared in 1 lb. pats or smaller portions may be sold by way of sale by wholesale shall be the following:
- (a) In the case of salted creamery butter the standard of quality of which is not lower than First Grade, the price of 22½d. per pound:
- (b) In the case of salted creamery butter, the standard of quality of which is Second Grade, the price of 22¼d. per pound.
- (c) In the case of whey butter the standard of quality of which is not lower than Second Grade, the price of 21½d. per pound.
- 7. The price of butter sold in bulk by way of sale by wholesale, being butter of one of the kinds and standards of quality set out in clause 6 of this order, shall be \$\frac{1}{2}d\$, per pound less than the respective price prescribed for butter of that kind and standard of quality by the said clause 6 hereof.
- 8. The price of unsalted creamery butter the standard of quality of which is not lower than First Grade, and which is sold, whether in bulk or pats, by way of sale by wholesale as aforesaid shall be ½d. per pound more than the respective price prescribed for salted creamery butter by the foregoing provisions of clause 6 of this order.
- 9. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions on this order, the price for any parcel or butter sold, whether in bulk or in pats, in a quantity of less than 48 lb., by way of sale by wholesale as aforesaid, being butter of one of the kinds and standards of quality set out in clause 6 of this order, may (at the option of the vendor) be the sum of 6d, per parcel more than the appropriate price prescribed for butter of that kind and standard of quality by the foregoing provisions of this order, and the said sum of 6d, shall be added to the rates of 0.775d, per pound or portion of a pound referred to in clause 10 of this order for the purpose of that clause.
- 10. In the case of sales by a manufacturer to a wholesale distributor, the prices at which butter shall be so sold shall be 0.775d. per pound or portion of a pound less than the respective prices hereinbefore specified.
- 11. Any butter sold in pursuance of the provisions of clauses 6, 7, 8, 9, or 10 of this order shall be delivered freight free into the purchaser's premises.

MAXIMUM RETAIL PRICE OF BUTTER TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

- 12. (1) The maximum retail price of butter to which this order applies shall be computed at the rate of:
 - (i) 2s. a pound for salted creamery butter.
 - (ii) 2s. 0½d. a pound for unsalted creamery butter.
 - (iii) 1s. 11d. a pound for whey butter.
 - (iv) 1s. 10d. a pound for dairy butter.
- (2) If, in respect of any lot of butter sold by a retailer, the maximum price calculated in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this clause is not an exact number of pence or halfpence, the maximum price of the lot shall be computed to the next upward halfpenny.

SPECIAL PRICES WHERE EXTRAORDINARY CHARGES INCURRED

13. "That, for the purpose of providing the annual charges on a loan of £5,000 authorised to be raised by the Lower Mangapiko Drainage Board under the above-mentioned Act for the purpose of effecting improvements to the Mangapiko Stream, the said Lower Mangapiko Drainage Board hereby makes a special rate of 6½d, in the pound on land classed A, 4¾d, in the pound on land classed B, and 3¼d, in the pound on land classed C, upon the rateable value of all rateable property of the Lower Mangapiko Drainage District comprised in the Te Rahu subdivision; and that the special rate shall be an annually recurring special rate during the currency of the loan and be payable yearly on the 1st day of October in each and every year during the currency of the loan or until the loan is fully paid off."
