The Westland County Council Water Power and Electric Lines Licence 1958

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL PURSUANT to the Public Works Act 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following

LICENCE

1. This order may be cited as the Westland County Council Water Power and Electric Lines Licence 1958.

2. Subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth, the Westland County Council (hereinafter referred to as the licensee) is hereby granted a licence to obstruct, impound, or divert the waters of Lake Wahapo (hereinafter referred to as the said lake), situated in the County of Westland, and to take and use therefrom for the purpose hereinafter set forth, a stream of water not exceeding 40 cubic ft per second and to lay, construct, put up, place, and use the electric lines described in the First Schedule hereto.

3. The conditions directed to be implied in all licences by the Water Power Regulations 1934 and the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935 shall be incorporated herein and shall form part of this licence, except in so far as they may be inconsistent with the provisions of this licence.

4. This licence is issued under the Water Power Regulations 1934, and is subject thereto and to the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935, the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1935, the Radio Interference Regulations 1958 and to all regulations made in amendment thereof or in substitution therefor, except in so far as they may be inconsistent with the provisions of this licence.

5. Water shall be used under this licence solely for the purpose of generating electricity, and shall be taken from the said lake at the point in Section R. 1017, Block XVI, Okarito Survey District, marked "Race Intake", indicated on the plan marked S.H.D. 474 deposited in the office of the State Hydro-electric Department at Wellington.

6. The licensee is hereby authorised, subject to the conditions hereof, to construct, maintain, and use the works described in the Second Schedule hereto for the purpose of this licence, the positions of the said works being indicated on the said plan S.H.D. 474.

7. The system of supply shall be as described in paragraphs (a), (d), (e), and (f)

SECOND SCHEDULE

CONDITIONS

1. In these conditions the term:

"Foreshore" means such parts of the bed, shore, or banks

of a tidal water as are covered and uncovered by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring tides. "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act 1952, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

- 2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to those parts of the foreshore as defined in the First Schedule hereto.
- 3. Her Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, out of, and over the said foreshore without payment.
- 4. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the Council to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or with any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provision of the Harbours Act 1950 or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, and that are or may hereafter be in force. in force.
- 5. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall not apply to those portions of the foreshore required for securing the shore ends of any telegraph cables that are at present or may be at any time laid down within the said areas of foreshore.
- 6. The Council may, subject to the provisions of section 178 of the Harbours Act 1950, erect or license or permit the erection of baths, bathhouses, boatsheds, boat-building sheds, jetties, and slipways on the foreshore described in the First Schedule hereto, and may make bylaws regulating the use thereof, and may fix charges for such use, provided that the funds so received shall be expended in improving the foreshore for the benefit of the inhabitants of the district shore for the benefit of the inhabitants of the district.
- 7. The Council may enclose any part or parts of the shore described in the First Schedule hereto for the purpose of holding athletic sports or games, and may by bylaw fix a charge for admission to such enclosed part or parts, provided that the total number of days on which such enclosures are made shall not exceed six in any one year.
- 8. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the Council to remove or cause to be removed any stone, sand, shingle, or shells without the consent of the Minister being first obtained.
- 9. Bylaws made by the Council under the said Act in respect of the foreshore shall not have effect unless and until approved in writing by the Minister. 9. Bylaws
- 10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for 21 years from the 3rd day of February 1958 unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority.
- 11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the Council six calendar months' previous notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister, and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the Council in New Zealand. Zealand.

"That, for the purpose of providing the interest and other charges on a loan of £236,000, to be known as the High Pressure Water Supply Loan 1958, authorised to be raised by the Paparua County Council under the above-mentioned Act for the purpose of providing a high pressure water supply system for the urban districts of Upper Riccarton, Sockburn, Hornby, and Islington, including the purchase from Government of the existing water supply system in the Hornby new housing block, the said Paparua County Council hereby makes and levies a special rate of 6264 pence in the pound (£) on the rateable value (on the basis of capital value) on all rateable properties comprised within the boundaries of the Sockburn County Town, the Hornby County Town, and the Islington Township; and that such special rate shall be an annual-recurring rate during the currency of such loan and be payable yearly on the 1st day of April in each and every year during the currency of the said loan, being a period of 35 years, or until the loan is fully paid off."
