THE RIGHT HON. W. NASH PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Public Works Act 1928 and the Electric Power Boards Act 1925, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

LICENCE

1. This order may be cited as the Thames Valley Electric Power Board Electric Lines Licence 1959.

2. Subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth, the Thames Valley Electric Power Board (hereinafter referred to as the licensee) is hereby authorised to lay, construct, put up, place, and use the electric lines, and to construct the electric works described in the First Schedule hereto.

3. The conditions directed to be implied in all licences by the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935 and the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1935 shall be incorporated herein and shall form part of this licence, except in so far as they may be inconsistent with the provisions of this licence.

4. The licence hereby conferred is subject to compliance by the licensee with the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935, the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1935, the Radio Interference Regulations 1958, and with all regulations made in amendment thereof or in substitution therefor, except in so far as they may be inconsistent with the provisions of this licence: Provided that the licensee shall not by virtue of this clause be required, except in the normal course of alteration, repair, or maintenance, to reconstruct, in conformity with the regulations hereinbefore mentioned, any existing electric line or work which conformed to the regulations in force at the time of the construction thereof and has not become a hazardous line as described in the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935.

5. The systems of supply shall be as described in paragraphs

1935.

5. The systems of supply shall be as described in paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d), (e), (f), and (j) of regulation 21-01 of the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935. The system of supply authorised under paragraph (j) shall be a single-conductor earth-return system and the use thereof shall be subject to the terms and conditions laid down by the General Manager of the New Zealand Electricity Department.

6. This licence shall, unless it is sooner lawfully determined, continue in force until the 27th day of April 1963.

7. The electric lines and works described in paragraphs 2 and 3 of the First Schedule hereto shall not be used by the licensee for the purpose of supply to retail consumers in the Boroughs of Thames and Te Aroha respectively.

8. The Orders in Council, specified in the Second Schedule hereto, authorising the licensee to construct electric works and to erect and use electric lines are hereby revoked.

Note—At stations where departures from normal have an asterisk, the temperature record has been maintained for less than 10 years, the rainfall record for less than 20 years. Rainfall normals have been revised and now refer to the standard period 1921–50. Where observations are not available for the whole period, or where the site of the rain gauge has been changed, the normals are partly interpolated.

Notes on the Weather for February 1959

General: Over most of the country February was drier than usual. In parts of Marlborough and Nelson, after two months of low rainfall, the feed position was reported to be serious. Elsewhere conditions were mainly favourable for farmers, but in the North Island lambs were still not in good condition, as they were showing the effects of abundant growth, with too soft a feed.

A southerly storm from the 21st to the 23rd was associated with

unusually cold temperatures for the time of the year and considerable snow on the ranges of both islands; a foot was recorded at the Ruapehu ski lift and 2 ins. at Lake Tekapo. Gale force winds caused some damage in the Wellington and Taranaki Provinces.

Rainfall: Rainfall was somewhat below average in the South Island (except Southland, South Otago, and mid-Canterbury), also in the Gisborne district, the King Country, and about Auckland City. In Marlborough and Nelson totals were less than a quarter of the normal value; Nelson City had its lowest February rainfall since 1939

The only considerable area with totals well above average consisted of northern Wairarapa, southern Hawke's Bay, and the Rangitikei-Wanganui district. In parts of this area rainfall was double the normal value. More than three-quarters of this rain fell between the 20th and the 23rd; in Hawke's Bay very little fell

Temperatures: Mean temperatures were above average, mainly

about a degree. Frosts were recorded in many inland districts of the South Island on the 23rd. At Naseby, in Central Otago, the air temperature dropped to 25°F, the lowest ever recorded in New Zealand in

outside the 22nd and the 23rd, during the southerly storm.

Sunshine: Sunshine was above average over most of the South Island and in western districts of the North Island. The surplus amounted to 30 hours on the West Coast, and Westport's total of 232 hours was one of the highest in the country.

It was somewhat cloudier than usual in eastern districts of the North Island and in Marlborough.

Weather Sequence: From the 1st to the 8th the weather was fair and very warm over the greater part of the country as anticyclones moved from the Tasman Sea across New Zealand to the Chatham Islands. However, on the 1st a weak trough to the north-east caused showers in Gisborne and Coromandel. On the 2nd and 3rd the passage of a deep depression close to Campbell Island was associated with gales in Stewart Island and about Foveaux Strait; rain fell in western and southern districts of the South Island. These same districts received rain again on the 5th with the passage of a weak

A more vigorous trough crossed the country on the 9th and 10th, with general rain. There were considerable falls in Westland, and some flooding was reported.

The 11th to the 18th was another period of fair weather for the greater part of the country, under the influence of a large slow-moving anticyclone. However, in Northland showers were reported on several days, partly owing to the passage of a tropical cyclone far to the north. A weak trough brought some rain to western and southern districts of the South Island on the 17th.

The 19th to the 23rd was a period of unsettled, stormy, and at times unusually cold weather. An old tropical cyclone which had first appeared off the Queensland coast on the 15th moved across the North Tasman Sea, becoming weaker. A vigorous cold front associated with a deep depression near Campbell Island moved up from the south-west and met the old tropical cyclone over the North Island on the 21st, causing it to deepen again to the east. At first the rain was general. On the 22nd southerly winds set in, reaching gale force over the Wellington and Taranaki Provinces. At the same time rain became heavier in eastern and central districts of the North Island but there was a cleared and central districts of the North Island, but there was a clearance in the west and south of the South Island. Considerable snow was reported on the ranges of both islands.

For the last five days of the month pressures were once again high over the country, and in most districts the weather remained fair. However, some light rain was reported in Bay of Plenty, Rotorua, and the central high country of the North Island on the 26th. On the two following days there was light rain at times in western and southern districts of the South Island and in Northland as a weak trough crossed the country.

Nelson Lakes National Park Bylaws

PURSUANT to the National Parks Act 1952, the Nelson Lakes National Park Board hereby makes the following bylaws:

1. Interpretation

- In these bylaws, unless inconsistent with the context—
 "Authorised person" means a person authorised by the Board:
 - "Board" means the Nelson Lakes National Park Board having the control and management of the park by virtue of the said Act:
 - "Camping site" means any area that may from time to time be set aside under section 28 (1) (i) of the said Act:
 - "Chairman" means the Chairman of the Board:
 - "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Crown Lands for the Land District of Nelson:
 - "Park" means the Nelson Lakes National Park, being a national park under and subject to the National Parks Act 1952:
 - "Park Ranger" or "Park Warden" means any person appointed as such by the board under the powers of section 27 of the said Act:
 - "Secretary" means the Secretary of the Board.

2. CAMPING

All persons wishing to camp in the park shall apply to the Secretary or a Park Warden or Ranger or to an authorised person for assignment of camping-sites, and shall pay such fees or charges as may from time to time be fixed by the board, and shall not change camp sites without permission from the Secretary or a Park Warden or Ranger or other authorised person as aforesaid.

The following conditions shall be strictly observed in connection with camp sites:

- (a) Subject generally to the provisions of bylaw No. 4 relating to fires, combustible rubbish must be burned on camp fires, and all other garbage and refuse of all kinds, including broken glass, bottles, tin cans, etc., must be placed in garbage cans if available, or otherwise must be buried not less than 1 ft deep by the campers in a place hidden from sight sight.
- (b) No person, whether camping in the park or otherwise being therein, shall pollute in any manner the waters of the park, nor bathe in any of the streams near the regularly travelled thoroughfares in the park without suitable bathing clothes.
- (c) No person shall take any wood for fuel except from dead trees or from trees which have been cut for that purpose by the board's employees.
- (d) No person shall remove, disturb, cut names, letters, words, figures, or devices on, or deface any building, gates, bridges, natural features, or trees or any object natural or otherwise, within the limits of the park.
- (e) No person shall in any building in the park act or use the same otherwise than in a cleanly and decent manner.

3. Huts

- (a) Any person desiring the use of any huts or other buildings the property of the Board and erected in the park shall apply to the Secretary or a Park Warden or Ranger or to an authorised person, who may, in his discretion, grant to such applicant usage of the hut or building as he shall deem advisable, either exclusively or together with any other person or persons. advisable, either person or persons.
- (b) The restrictions on and conditions of usage of any such huts or buildings shall be as fixed by the board by resolution from time to time.
- (c) A Park Warden, or Ranger, or other officer of the board is empowered to terminate any usage of any such hut or building where the user has departed from the terms and conditions upon which usage was granted or where the user acts in such a manner as in the opinion of the Park Warden, or Ranger, or other officer of the board is likely to cause damage to the board's property or to give offence to other persons, or to cause them annoyance.
- (d) No person shall use, or attempt to use, any such hut or building without the permission of the Secretary, or a Park Warden, or Ranger, or of an authorised person.
- (e) Should any organisation be empowered to erect any buildings for accommodation of its members within the park it shall be subject to the condition that if such accommodation is not in the opinion of the board being made reasonable use of by such members, then other persons may be authorised by the board to make use of such accommodation under whatever conditions the board may determine.

4. Fires

No person shall light any fire, except at camping-sites or picnic places, without the express permission of the Secretary or a Park Warden, or Ranger, or of an authorised person. C

No person shall kindle a fire near trees or dead wood, moss, dry leaves, grass, tussock, forest mould, or other vegetation, but a fire may be lit in a specially prepared open place on rocks or earth. Should camps or picnic places be located in a locality where no such open place exists, or is provided, any dead wood, moss, dry leaves, grass, tussock, forest mould, or other vegetation must be scraped away down to the rock or earth over an area considerably larger than that required for the fire. Fires shall be lighted only when necessary, and when no longer needed shall be completely extinguished by covering all embers and the bed with earth and water so that there remains no possibility of the fire reviving.

No person shall light a fire in any position where it is likely to present a fire hazard.

Once a fire is lighted, the person lighting the fire, or such other person as is detailed by him, shall remain in attendance on the fire until it is completely extinguished.

No match (lighted or not lighted), cigarette, or other lighted matter shall be dropped, thrown, or otherwise placed in any grass or other inflammable material.

Nothing in this bylaw shall exempt an offender from liability under the National Parks Act 1952, or any other Act, with respect to the lighting of fires.

5. Trading and Intoxicating Liquors

No person shall reside permanently, engage in any business, sell or offer for sale any article or food or merchandise, intoxicating liquor, or any kind of drink, or carry on any other pursuit or calling within the park without the written consent of the board given subject to such terms and conditions as it deems fit.

6. MISBEHAVIOUR

Within the park no person shall wilfully obstruct, disturb, or interfere with any other person in the use or enjoyment of the park or use foul, abusive, indecent, or obscene language, or be intoxicated, noisy, or riotous, or in any way misbehave.

7. Animals

No person shall take any dog or cat into the park without the written permission of the board, or abandon in the park any dog, cat, or animal.

A Park Ranger or an authorised person is empowered to destroy any dog or cat found in the park without authority

and not being under proper control.

8. Notices

No person shall interfere with any placard, sign, or notice erected by the board in or relating to the park.

9. AIRCRAFT

No person shall make use of any part of the park for the purpose of the landing thereon or flying therefrom of any aeroplane or of any kind of aircraft or glider, except in case of emergency or in accordance with the prior written permission of the board.

The board shall be entitled at any time to prohibit the entry by the public to any part or parts of the park the use of which as aerodromes or landing grounds is permitted by the board.

10. ENTRY INTO SPECIAL AREAS

For the purposes of this bylaw a special area means a special area set apart by the Governor-General under section 12 of the National Parks Act 1952.

No person shall enter a special area except with the written permission of the board or Commissioner, as the case may require, given subject to such terms and conditions as may be deemed fit. Every such permit shall include the following particulars and conditions:

- (1) The duration of the permit shall be specifically stated therein.
- (2) The names of all persons covered by the permit shall be set out.
- (3) The area covered by the permit shall be specified therein.
- (4) No permit shall include a right to camp or remain overnight, or light camp fires unless the permit so states.
- (5) Each permit shall be revocable at the pleasure of the board or Commissioner as the case may be.

11. GENERAL

The bylaws made by the National Parks Authority on the 20th day of March 1957, and published in the Gazette of 23 May 1957, No. 39, page 873, are hereby revoked.

Nothing in these bylaws shall be deemed to limit or prevent the taking of proceedings under any Act in respect of any offence committed within the park.
