Commission of Inquiry—Accident at Auckland Fari Freezing Co. Ltd. Premises, Kings Wharf, Auckland

It is hereby notified that a Commission of Inquiry has been appointed to inquire into and report upon the accident which occurred at the Kings Wharf premises at Auckland of the Auckland Farmers Freezing Co. Ltd. on the 3rd day of September 1959, and matters incidental thereto, viz:

- (a) The cause or causes of the accident in which, as the result of an escape of ammonia, two members of the public were killed, four members of the public were injured, and other members of the public were, or might have been, exposed to risk of death or
- (b) The adequacy and suitability of the design, materials, and construction of—
 - (i) the pipe from which the said ammonia escaped, and (ii) the piping installed elsewhere in the said premises for carrying ammonia;
- (c) The sufficiency from the point of view of safety of the inspection and maintenance systems in operation in respect of the ammonia refrigeration plant in the said premises;
- (d) The working of any existing law in its relation to industrial ammonia refrigeration plants;
- (e) Whether any legislation is necessary or expedient for the safety of workers employed in industrial premises equipped with ammonia refrigeration plants or other persons lawfully in or in the vicinity of such premises.

The Commission will commence the inquiry at the Magistrate's Court (Court Room No. 7, Fifth Floor), Kitchener Street, Auckland, on Monday, the 2nd day of November 1959, at 10 a.m.

All persons desiring to give evidence are requested to communicate in writing with Mr J. W. Bain, counsel assisting the Commission, whose address is at the Crown Law Office, Wellington, as soon as possible. To facilitate the work of the Commission it is requested that prepared statements be sub-mitted where possible. These prepared statements may be supported and supplemented by oral evidence given personally before the Commission if desired.

Notes on the Weather for September 1959

General: September was a mild month. The spell of dry, settled weather which had commenced in about mid-August was broken in many districts by welcome rains in mid-September, and in these areas pasture growth was satisfactory. However, in parts of Canterbury the dry weather persisted also in the second half of the month, seriously affecting pastures. As in August, conditions were particularly favourable for lambing; and generally it was a good month for stock apart from a few reports of bloat in the Auckland Province. On the 15th and 16th porth-westerly gales raged from Wellington

On the 15th and 16th north-westerly gales raged from Wellington to Otago, causing damage in parts of Westland and Canterbury.

Rainfall: Rainfall was only half the average value in Canterbury and Otago and two-thirds in Southland and in northern and western districts of the Auckland Province. In the Christchurch-Ashburton area and on Banks Peninsula totals were mainly below half an inch.

area and on Banks Peninsula totals were mainly below half an inch.

For August and September combined, the Christchurch total of 0.78 in, was the lowest in nearly 100 years of record.

On the other hand, it was wetter than usual in western and northern districts of the South Island and also in Wellington and South Manawatu.

Heavy rain was reported about Cook Strait from the 17th to the 19th, with disruption of rail and road transport just north of Wellington. In Nelson and Marlborough for the 17th and 18th some stations reported 8–9 in.; while Kowhai Ridge (near Paekakariki) received 7·21 in. for the 18th and 19th.

Temperatures: Temperatures were above average, mainly by 1 to 2 degrees.

Snow fell on the ranges of both islands about the end of the month.

Sunshine: Sunshine was below average in western and northern districts of the South Island and in the North Island south of Hamilton, mainly by about 30 hours. For Nelson, with a total of 155 hours of sunshine, it was one of the cloudiest Septembers on record.

Otago was favoured with 30-40 hours more sunshine than usual; and sunshine was also appreciably above average in Southland and Northland.

Weather Sequence: The first 11 days was a period of dry, settled weather, except at times in western and far southern districts of the South Island. From the 1st to the 3rd an anticyclone moved across the North Island, but a weak trough of low pressure brought considerable rain to the West Coast and some rain also to Otago and Southland; a few showers were reported in Northland, Gisborne, and Hawke's Bay. For the next three days an extensive belt of high pressure covered New Zealand and the weather was fair. The passage of a weak trough across the South Island on the 7th brought some rain to Westland, Southland, and parts of the Otago and Canterbury high country. However, from the 8th to the 11th the weather was again mainly fine, under the influence of a large anticyclone. Some showers occurred in Northland, Coromandel, and Gisborne.

From the 12th to the 17th north-westerly winds prevailed, with considerable rain on the West Coast. During the first half of this period a weak trough moved northward over the country, with rain in western districts of both islands and also in northern districts of the South Island. From the 15th to the 17th pressure was high to the north-east, and two depressions in succession moved south-eastward past Southland. North-westerly gales were

reported in Cook Strait and in parts of the South Island. Rain became heavy on the West Coast and affected also Nelson, Marlborough, Wellington, and Southland.

borough, Wellington, and Southland.

A vigorous cold front associated with the last depression brought rain to most of the North Island and the Marlborough Sounds on the 18th and 19th. Southerly winds reached gale force about Cook Strait, and some heavy falls of rain were reported in Wellington and Wairarapa. Showers persisted on parts of the east coast of the North Island on the 20th, but otherwise this and the following day were fair, under the influence of a small anticyclone. From the 22nd to the 24th a deep depression moved southward from the central Tasman Sea past Southland; rain affected northern and western districts of both islands. On the following day a southerly

change brought a clearance in Westland, but there was further rain in many other areas.

From the 26th to the 28th a deep depression moved eastward from the North Tasman Sea over the North Island. Rain spread southward as far as Greymouth and the Kaikouras. On the last two days of the month a very deep depression passed far to the south, and the associated trough of low pressure crossed the country, with general rain. However, only light falls were experienced in eastern districts of both islands and over the greater part of the Auckland



(c) All persons under disqualification imposed under the New Zealand rules of racing or the New Zealand rules of trotting or by the racing or trotting authorities in any country outside New Zealand which have reciprocal agreements in matters of racing or trotting with the New Zealand Racing Conference or the New Zealand Trotting Conference.

(d) Common prostitutes, idle and disorderly persons within the meaning of the Police Offences Act 1927.

(e) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house breaking, burglary, or pocket picking, forgery, uttering or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act 1908, and persons convicted under the Police Offences Act 1927 of conversion or attempted conversion of a motorcar or other vehicle or of being idle and disorderly persons or of being a rogue and vagabond and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act 1908, or persons having a criminal record in countries outside New Zealand and the references to the foregoing Acts shall be deemed to apply to any subsequent Act consolidating or in substitution therefor.
