Note—At stations where departures from normal have an asterisk, the temperature record has been maintained for less than 10 years, the rainfall record for less than 20 years. Rainfall normals have been revised and now refer to the standard period 1921-50. Where observations are not available for the whole period, or where the site of the rain gauge has been changed, the normals are partly interpolated.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR JANUARY 1960

General: Over the whole country January was a warm, windy month and except for west coast districts south of Hokitika, generally very dry.

The effect of rain which had fallen during the month was largely nullified in most areas by the drying effect of persistent winds from a westerly quarter. By the end of the month pastures were in many places badly in need of rain. Fruit crops, however, were being harvested under good conditions.

Rainfall: Rainfall was below average in the North Island except in Waitomo and northern Hawke's Bay where it was about average.
In eastern districts of North Auckland only about one-quarter of the normal rain fell. Over most of the rest of the North Island

of the normal rain fell. Over most of the rest of the North Island it was about one-half the usual.

Westland, the Southern Alps, and parts of Southland had up to one and a half times the average, but in all other South Island areas the rainfall was deficient, being only about one-half the average in Canterbury, the Wairau Valley of Marlborough, and Nelson.

Thunderstorms were reported in many parts of the North Island on the 6th. A rather violent thunderstorm affected western and southernmost districts of the South Island on the 28th and 29th, with 13½ in. of rain in the two days at Milford Sound.

Temperatures: Temperatures were everywhere above average. In Nelson it was 4-5 degrees warmer than usual, while Central Otago and parts of Canterbury had departures of 3-4 degrees. Over the rest of the country it was generally 1-2 degrees warmer. Strong NW winds brought very high temperatures to Canterbury

in the mid-month. Christchurch having a maximum of 97 on the

In the North Island temperatures over 90 were recorded during the 28th-30th at several places in the Bay of Islands, Bay of Plenty, and Hawke's Bay.

Snow fell on some of the higher North Island mountains from

the 5th to the 7th.

Sunshine: Sunshine was below average except in North Auckland, Nelson, Otago, and parts of inland Canterbury. Greatest deficits of 40-60 hours were reported in Taranaki and in inland areas from Taupo to Palmerston North.

Weather Sequence: At the beginning of the month an anticyclone centred west of Auckland covered most of the country giving predominately fair weather. A cold front which moved on to the South Island on the 2nd gave heavy rain on the west coast but only scattered light rain in east coast districts. A small depression formed on this front over the North Island on the 4th bringing some heavy falls from Taupo to the Waikato, but only scattered light rain elsewhere.

By the 5th the frontal systems had moved away and there was a weak south-west flow with scattered light showers over most of the country as an anticyclone over south-east Australia began to advance onto the Tasman. On the front which had become slow moving to the north-east of New Zealand a depression formed in the Bay of Plenty giving rain over most of the North Island on the 6th, the falls being moderate in central districts.

The anticyclone which now covered the Tasman moved on to New Zealand and by the 11th had split into two centres, one to the east and the other to the west of the country. A series of weak fronts moving in the westerly flow to the south of the South Island passed over the country with scattered light rain in west coast districts.

The high pressure centre in the Tasman remained almost stationary and until the 17th the air flow over New Zealand was mainly from the south-west.

On the 18th a depression which had formed near Tasmania moved eastwards and intensified while the associated front moved on to the South Island bringing some heavy falls to the west coast. On the east coast of the South Island and in the North Island the frontal passage caused little rain.

With the advance of another anticyclone across the South Tasman a south-west flow was again established over New Zealand.

A depression which formed near Lord Howe Island moved south-east and by the 24th was centred west of Westland. As the centre crossed Otago and the associated front moved over the

centre crossed Otago and the associated front moved over the country, the accompanying rain was general except for east coast districts from Canterbury to Gisborne.

With the anticyclone centred to the north of the North Island a number of weak fronts quickly crossed New Zealand in the next few days giving light scattered rain in western districts only. On the 27th-30th a more vigorous, but slow-moving front crossed the country, but the rain was heavy only on the west coast of the South Island. During this period also some exceptionally high temperatures were recorded in the Auckland Province.

As the front moved off New Zealand an anticyclone was approaching from the west and by the 31st fair weather prevailed over most of the country.

NGARUAWAHIA RACING CLUB (INC.) RESOLUTION

AT a special general meeting of the Ngaruawahia Racing Club (Inc.) held on the 30th day of October 1959 at Ngaruawahia, it was duly resolved as follows:

"In pursuance and exercise of the powers under section 33 of the Gaming Act 1908, it is hereby resolved that the following regulations shall be regulations under the said section 33 controlling the admission of persons to that part of the Ngaruawahia Racecourse Reserve, situated in the District of South Auckland, and known as the Ngaruawahia Racecourse, or to any other racecourse used or occupied by the club for race meetings. race meetings:

NGARUAWAHIA RACING CLUB (INC.) REGULATIONS (Under the Gaming Act 1908)

1. These regulations shall come into force on the date of the same being published in the Gazette.

2. In these regulations the words "bookmaker," "racing club," and "race meeting" shall have the meanings ascribed to those terms respectively by section 2 of the Gaming Act

1908.

3. The following persons shall be and are hereby excluded from the racecourse above described or any other racecourse while the same is used or occupied by the said club for a race meeting, namely:

(a) Bookmakers.(b) Bookmakers' clerks, bookmakers' assistants, and book-

makers' agents.

(c) All persons under disqualification imposed under the

makers' agents.

(c) All persons under disqualification imposed under the New Zealand rules of racing or the New Zealand rules of trotting or by the racing or trotting authorities in any country outside New Zealand which have reciprocal agreements in matters of racing or trotting with the New Zealand Racing Conference or the New Zealand Trotting Conference.

(d) Common prostitutes, idle and disorderly persons within the meaning of the Police Offences Act 1927.

(e) Professional tipsters, persons convicted of house breaking, burglary, or pocket picking, forgery, uttering or possessing counterfeit coin, theft, false pretences, receiving stolen goods, mischief, assault, or any offence or crime of any kind under the Crimes Act 1908, and persons convicted under the Police Offences Act 1927 of conversion or attempted conversion of a motorcar or other vehicle or of being idle and disorderly persons or of being a rogue and vagabond and persons convicted of an offence under the Gaming Act 1908, or persons having a criminal record in countries outside New Zealand and the references to the foregoing Acts shall be deemed to apply to any subsequent Act consolidating or in substitution therefor. in substitution therefor.
