Note—At stations where departures from normal have an asterisk, the temperature record has been maintained for less than 10 years, the rainfall record for less than 20 years. Rainfall normals have been revised and now refer to the standard period 1921–50. Where observations are not available for the whole period, or where the site of the rain gauge has been changed, the normals are partly interpolated.

#### Notes on the Weather for May 1960

General: May was mild and cloudy. The comparative absence of cold spells proved beneficial for growth, which was regarded as particularly good for the time of the year in most districts. Stock were also reported to be doing well.

Rainfall: Rainfall was appreciably below average in eastern districts of both Islands. In most of Canterbury it was less than half the normal value. In coastal districts of north Canterbury and about Christchurch it was one of the driest Mays on record.

It was 50 per cent wetter than usual in northernmost districts of both Islands and also in parts of Bay of Plenty and Taumarunui.

Many thunderstorms were reported in western districts of the North Island on the 9th.

In northern and eastern Northland some flooding was reported following 24-hour rainfalls of 2 to 6 in. on the 15th.

Temperatures: Temperatures were 1-3 degrees above average over the greater part of the North Island and also in northern and western districts of the South Island. The highest departures were recorded in Westland.

Sunshine: It was somewhat cloudier than usual, except in parts of Southland and Otago, Nelson, and Taranaki, where the duration of sunshine was about average. The deficiency amounted to 30 hours

in Northland, Bay of Plenty, South Canterbury, and parts of the Wellington Province.

The only station favoured with appreciably more sunshine than average was Invercargill.

Weather Sequence: May started with four days of settled weather over the greater part of the country as an anticyclone centred to the south of Southland moved eastward. However, in eastern districts from Canterbury to Gisborne and in Northland these days were cloudy with light rain

from Canterbury to Gisborne and in Northland these days were cloudy with light rain.

A change occurred on the 5th with the deepening of a depression near Tasmania so that its influence extended on to New Zealand. At the same time a trough moved over Northland during this and the following day with rain in northern districts of both islands and on the West Coast. Rain became general from the 7th to the 11th as the deep depression near Tasmania moved just to the south of Campbell Island and another centre developed over Southland. On the 9th thunderstorms were reported in many western districts of the North Island; and on the 11th snow fell in the far south and on Mount Ruapehu following a change to south-westerlies. In eastern districts from Canterbury to Gisborne the rain was mainly light.

On the 12th an anticyclone centred to the north brought a brief fine spell except in South Westland and Fiordland. During the next two days another deep depression was almost stationary over Tasmania, and rain spread to Southland and Otago, to other 1

western districts, and also to Northland. From the 15th to the 17th the depression moved over the South Tasman Sea, with a second centre developing to the east of the South Island. This was another period of general rain, except in eastern districts from Timaru to Gisborne. In Northland the rain was heavy on the 15th, with some flooding. During the passage of an anticyclone over the country from the 18th to the 20th the weather was mainly fine, but a few light showers were reported at first in some areas.

During the 21st and 22nd the passage of a depression across the North Island was accompanied by gales in Cook Strait and fairly general rain. On the following day the weather improved in the south with the passage of a small centre over the North Island. On the 24th and 25th an anticyclone covered the Tasman Sea and south-westerlies prevailed over New Zealand, with showers in southern and western districts of the South Island.

A change occurred on the 26th as the anticyclone moved on to the South Island and a depression off the Queensland coast commenced to move southward. Most districts experienced three days of settled weather, but the easterlies brought light rain to Northland and at times also to Gisborne. By the 29th the depression was over the North Tasman Sea, now moving towards western Southland while, at the same time, yet another very deep depression was centred to the south of Tasmania. For two days north-easterly winds prevailed, with rain except in Southland, Otago, and parts of Canterbury; there were some heavy falls in Northland and the Bay of Plenty. On the last day of the month winds changed to north-westerlies, but the distribution of rainfall remained very similar.

#### NOTICE OF PRIVATE BILL

In the matter of the Standing Orders of the House of Representatives relating to Private Bills and in the matter of a Private Bill to amend the Church of England Trusts Act 1913.

NOTICE is hereby given that it is the intention of the undersigned to present a petition to the House of Representatives, in Parliament assembled, for leave to bring in a Bill under the Short Title of "The Church of England Trusts Amendment Act 1960" during the ensuing session of Parliament to commence on the 22nd day of June 1960.

The objects of the Bill are:

(1) To confer upon incorporated Diocesan Boards of Trustees the same powers of selling, exchanging, mortgaging, and leasing lands conveyed directly to them by donors or vendors as they have under sections 8 and 9 of the Church of England Trusts Act 1913, and its amendments (namely the Church of England Trusts Amendment Act 1937 and the Church of England Trusts Amendment Act 1945) in respect of lands originally conveyed to other trustees and later transferred to incorporated Diocesan Boards of Trustees.

(2) To confer upon the Standing Committee of the Diocese.

Diocesan Boards of Trustees.

(2) To confer upon the Standing Committee of the Diocese of Wellington power to appoint trustees of the Wellington Diocesan Maori Endowment Trust Board when the Synod of the Diocese of Wellington is not in session.

The promoters of the Bill are Herbert Edgar Evans, of Wellington, barrister, Edward Westwood Henderson, of Auckland, barrister, Wybrants Olphert, of Wellington, barrister, and Stuart Tichborne Campbell Sprott, of Wellington, diocesan secretary, being the members of a commission set up by the Standing Committee of the Church of the Province of New Zealand, commonly called the Church of England, with power to promote a Bill having the objects above set forth. forth.
