(a) By deleting from the first sentence thereof the words "In the event of new shares being created and offered to the share-holders in any company during the currency of a time bar-gain, or pending the delivery of shares sold for cash," and substituting therefor the following words:

"In the event of existing shareholders being given the right to apply for new shares, notes, debentures, or other secur-ities offered to shareholders during the currency of a time bargain or pending delivery of shares sold for cash, and where such right is not transferable then".

(b) By adding at the end thereof the following clause:

"Where such right is transferable the seller shall either:

- where such right is transferable the selfer shall either:
  1. Renounce in favour of the buyer the 'rights' he has been offered in respect of the shares comprised in the time bargain, or sale for cash, and deliver such renunciation to the buyer in time for it to be completed and registered with the company before the offer closes; or
  2. Where (1) is impracticable, take up on behalf of the buyer his due proportion of new shares. When requested by the seller to do so, the buyer shall supply to the seller sufficient funds in time to enable the seller to fulfil this obligation."

Rule 135 is amended by adding at the end thereof the following proviso:

"Provided however that members may, if they pay due regard to the dignity of the association and of themselves and to the desirability of maintaining honourable dealings between members, initiate business or communicate with any of the under-mentioned bodies, or other such bodies as may be advised by the association from time to time:

#### NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR AUGUST 1960

General: The changeable weather of July continued until after the middle of August, but a spell of settled weather in the last 10 days was greatly appreciated, especially as it coincided with the school holidays. On the whole it was not as wet as usual; and the near normal temperatures seemed rather cool after the mildness of July in the South Island. Spring growth was beginning to appear, but in some areas it was a little slow in getting under way. Con-ditions were favourable for lambs in most districts. At Campbells Bay, Auckland, a small local tornado wrecked several houses on the 14th.

Rainfall: Rainfall was about two-thirds of the average value over most of the country. In north Westland, Buller, Nelson and southern Marlborough, and also in Bay of Plenty it was only half. Rainfall was a little above normal around Gisborne and Dunedin; also in Fiordland and in parts of Southland. Flooding was reported in coastal districts west of Invercargill on the 4th following 24 hour falls of up to 2½ in. on the 3rd.

Temperatures: Temperatures were mainly close to or slightly below average. The first five days of the month were unusually warm.

Snow was reported in the North Island high country on the 6th and the 14th; and it fell to low levels in parts of Southland and Otago on the 10th and 11th.

Sunshine: Sunshine was above average over almost the whole of Substitute Substitute was above average over almost the whole of the North Island and in northern and western districts of the South Island. The surplus was mainly 15–20 hours, but it exceeded 30 hours from Manawatu through Taranaki to Hamilton. It was cloudier than usual in Otago and South Canterbury, with sunshine totals 20–40 hours below normal.

Weather Sequence: At the beginning of the month anticyclones were centred to the north and east, and a depression formed over the Tasman Sea and moved rapidly towards Campbell Island. Northerly winds freshened, and the weather became unusually warm for August. At first rain was confined to western districts and the far south. However, another depression soon developed over 22 September

the south Tasman Sea, and when this crossed Southland and Otago from the 3rd to the 5th some rain fell in all districts. Floods were reported in parts of Southland and the rain was also heavy in Westland.

The second depression persisted for some time to the south-east, and another depression over the north Tasman Sea moved across the North Island from the 6th to the 8th. Temperatures became much cooler, with winds from a southerly quarter, and rain affected not only the North Island but also Marlborough, Banks Peninsula, and Southland. For the next two days pressures remained low to the south-east, and south-westerlies brought rain to Southland, Westland, Taranaki, and the greater part of the Auckland Province. The weather improved in most districts as an anticyclone moved on to the South Island. However, on the 11th and 12th a small depression crossed Northland, with rain there and also in Gisborne and Wairarapa.

Wairarapa. Further rain was received in Northland with the approach of a depression across the Tasman Sea, and the rain became more or less general as the depression crossed the South Island from the 14th to the 16th. However, the weather remained fair in Southland and it cleared rapidly in Central Otago and on the West Coast. Snow was reported on the high country of the North Island. Pressures rose rapidly over the eastern Tasman Sea and the South Island, but the depression persisted to the east, drifting slowly north-eastward from the Chatham Islands. Winds turned to south-easterlies, with rain at first affecting mainly Canterbury, the Kaikoura coast, and the southern half of the North Island. The weather soon cleared in Canterbury and from Manawatu to Taranaki but showery conditions persisted on the Kaikoura coast and about Cook Strait until the 20th and in the Gisborne district until the 22nd. The anticyclone proved as slow moving as the previous depression

until the 22nd. The anticyclone proved as slow moving as the previous depression had been, and it remained to the east for the rest of the month, with a ridge of high pressure extending over New Zealand. For most of the country there was a spell of settled weather, in some districts commencing as far back as the 17th. However, depressions passing to the north caused unsettled conditions at times in Northland, Bay of Plenty, and Gisborne; while depressions passing to the south-west caused rain at times in Fiordland and South Westland.
