

Proclaiming Tribal Districts Under the Maori Social and Economic Advancement Act 1945 and Consequential Revocations

COBHAM, Governor-General A PROCLAMATION

PURSUANT to section 6 of the Maori Social and Economic Advancement Act 1945, I, Charles John, Viscount Cobham, the Governor-General of New Zealand, hereby proclaim and declare the parts of New Zealand described in the First Schedule hereto to be tribal districts for the purposes of the said Act with the respective names therein set out, and do hereby revoke the earlier Proclamations enumerated in the Second Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE

RANGINUI TRIBAL DISTRICT

ALL that area in the Tauranga County bounded by a line commencing at the south-eastern corner of Maurihoro A (Crown land) on the western boundary of Block XI, Aongatete Survey District, and proceeding north-easterly along a right line to a point in the middle of the Waipapa River on the production north-westerly of the north-eastern boundary of Allotment 72, Te Puna Parish, in Block VI, Aongatete Survey District; thence north-easterly down the middle of Waipapa River to the middle of Tauranga Harbour; thence south-easterly generally along the middle of the Tauranga Harbour, excluding Motuhoa Island, to and along the middle of the south-east arm of the said harbour, to and along the middle of the bay north of the Matapihi Peninsula to a point in line with the north-western boundary of Hungahunga-Toroa Is, in Block XI, Tauranga Survey District; thence south-westerly to and along the last-mentioned boundary, along a right line to the northernmost corner of Puwhariki Block, along the north-western boundary of that block to and along the north-western boundary of Te Ngaio No. 2 and its production across the said south-east arm of the Tauranga Harbour to the shore of Maungatapu Peninsula; thence south-western boundary of Maungatapu Block in Block XIV, Tauranga Survey District; thence south-easterly along the north-western shore of that peninsula to the south-western boundary of Maungatapu Block and its production to the middle of Ohauiti Stream; thence up the middle of that stream to a point in line with the south-eastern boundary of Kaitimako D; thence southerly along a right line to the northernmost corner of Section 3, Block XVI, Otanewainuku Survey District, and a right line to Trig. Station 1039 (Otanewainuku); thence westerly along the production of a right line from the north-eastern corner of Section 2, Block XI, Waihi South Survey District, to its intersection with a right line between Trig. Station 27 (Puwhenua), being the eastern corner of Block VI, Tapapa East Survey District, and Trig. Station 146 (Te We ALL that area in the Tauranga County bounded by a line

All that area in the Tauranga County bounded by a line commencing at the northernmost corner of Section 3, Block XVI, Otanewainuku Survey District, being a point on the boundary of the Ranginui Tribal District hereinbefore described; thence proceeding northerly generally along the eastern boundary of that district to the middle of the Tauranga Harbour and along the middle of that harbour to its entrance; thence due north-east to the sea coast; thence northeasterly and south-easterly generally along the sea coast to the northernmost corner of Section 1, Block IV, Te Tumu Survey District; thence south-westerly along a right line to Trig. Station K, in Block IV aforesaid, a right line to Trig. Station Otara in Block V, Maketu Survey District, a right line to the southernmost corner of Waitaha 1B 3 in Block V aforesaid, and a right line to the point of commencement, and including Moturiki and Motuotau Islands.

And whereas the Trade Practices Appeal Authority heard the said appeal and by its decision bearing date the 22nd day of August 1960 directed the Trade Practices and Prices Commission to reconsider its said orders, which the Trade Practices and Prices Commission has duly done.

And whereas the said agreement or arrangement between members of the New Zealand Council of Registered Hairdressers in respect of male hairdressing charges was found by the Trade Practices and Prices Commission to consist of a recommendation as to the charges to be made for male hairdressing made to all members of the said Council pursuant to a resolution of the Executive of the said Council passed on the 30th day of May 1959, together with the acceptance and adoption of that recommendation by a substantial number of the members of the said Council.
