General—(a) No article which requires for its carriage a specially constructed wagon, or any alteration to a wagon, shall be received and carried except under special arrangements. (b) The Department does not undertake to supply cranes, forklifts, or any other mechanical lifting appliance, nor does it guarantee the lifting capacity thereof, or of any equipment used in connection therewith

(c) The loading and unloading of heavy articles at stations or sidings not provided with suitable lifting appliances for the handling of such packages must be undertaken by the owners at their own risk and expense, and such articles will not be received for carriage from or to such stations or sidings unless satisfactory arrangements shall first have been made by the owners for loading or unloading or such as the case may be unloading, as the case may be.

Note-At stations where departures from normal have an asterisk, the temperature record has been maintained for less than 10 years, the rainfall record for less than 20 years. Rainfall normals have been revised and now refer to the standard period 1921-50. Where observations are not available for the whole period, or where the site of the rain gauge has been changed, the normals are partly interpolated.

### NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR FEBRUARY 1961

General: February was a cloudy month. In the North Island it was also a month of low rainfall. In most districts the soil was still reasonably moist on account of the good rains in the last half of January, and pastures were still green. However, in parts of the Manawatu the ground was reported to be very dry.

The comparatively wet weather experienced in Canterbury and Otago proved beneficial for pastures and was greatly appreciated by the sheep farmers. On the other hand, in these districts it was not a good month for harvesting, and some of the wheat crop was spoilt.

Rainfall: In the North Island rainfall was at least 25 per cent below average, except in Taranaki, parts of southern Hawke's Bay, and the islands of the Hauraki Gulf. In Bay of Plenty, Gisborne, and most of Northland it ranged from a sixth to a half of normal.

In the South Island rainfall was mainly close to average. However, most of inland Canterbury and Central Otago were wetter than usual, while Marlborough (apart from the Kaikoura coast) was drier.

Temperatures: Temperatures were mainly within about a degree of the normal value. However, in Marlborough, Nelson, and Westland they were two degrees warmer than average.

Sunshine: Sunshine was below average over the greater part of the country, and deficiencies of over 30 hours were recorded in some western districts of both islands and also in some central districts of the North Island and in Central Otago.

Wairarapa, Marlborough, and most of Canterbury were favoured with more sunshine than normal, and the surplus exceeded 40 hours in Marlborough.

in Marlborough. Weather Sequence: At the beginning of the month an anticyclone was centred to the east of the North Island, affecting at first only western and far southern districts. From the 2nd to the 4th the trough advanced slowly north-eastward over the country, and at the same time a depression moved down the west coast of both islands from Northland to Buller. Rain became general, with some considerable falls about Cook Strait. With rising pressures the weather cleared in the south during the 3rd and 4th. Four days of mainly fair or fine weather followed as a large anticyclone moved eastward across New Zealand. However, a few showers were reported in Gisborne and Hawke's Bay on the 5th, and in parts of the Auckland Province on the three following days. From the 9th to the 14th the weather remained settled over most of the North Island, but deteriorated at times in the south. At first a slow-moving trough brought rain to the West Coast, Southland, and Otago. During the 11th and 12th rain spread to most other districts of the South Island with the advance of another trough associated with a depression near Campbell Island; a few showers were also reported in western districts of the North Island.

trough associated with a depression near Campbell Island; a few showers were also reported in western districts of the North Island. A depression developed near the Chatham Islands, and a third trough from the south-west brought rain on the 13th and 14th to the West Coast and to the Southland and Otago coasts. The trough moved on to the North Island on the following day, and a small depression developed over Taranaki. Temperatures became rather cold in the south-westerlies and rain became general, except in eastern districts of the North Island and parts of Canter-bury and Otago. On the 16th rain persisted in Northland as the

trough moved off the North Island, but elsewhere the weather cleared. During the next two days an anticyclone over the north Tasman Sea brought fair weather to most of the country, but another trough affected Westland and some eastern coastal districts

of the South Island. The 19th to the 22nd was a period of settled weather for the area from New Plymouth and Gisborne to Westport, Queenstown, and from New Plymouth and Gisborne to Westport, Queenstown, and Timaru due to the influence of a large anticyclone moving slowly eastward across the North Island. In the Auckland Province a few showers were reported on the 19th and 20th, and some general light rain set in during the next two days with the approach of a depression over the north Tasman Sea. The passage of a slow-moving trough northward over the South Island caused rain in the south and west, except on the 19th. On the 23rd the depression in the north moved south-eastwards across the Auckland Province, while an anticyclone was centred

across the Auckland Province, while an anticyclone was centred near the Chatham Islands. Rain spread southward over most of the North Island; but the weather cleared in Westland, Otago, and inland Southland. The depression soon weakened, and for the next three days the weather was again mainly settled under the influence of an anticyclone to the east. Showers were still reported at times in western and southern district of the South Island and at times in western and southern districts of the South Island and in the Auckland and Hawke's Bay Provinces.

During the last two days of the month a trough associated with a depression in mid-Tasman moved slowly northward over the country, while pressures rose to the south. This trough was accom-panied by a broad belt of rain affecting the whole of the South Island. In the North Island there was only light rain outside Hawke's Day and part of Gickerre Bay and part of Gisborne.

#### Compensation for Refugees

THE Acting Minister of External Affairs has been informed that an Agreement has been concluded between the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees and the German Federal Government which could be of interest to persons in New Zealand. The Agreement is in favour of refugees who were persecuted under the national-socialist regime in dis-regard of human rights. Under the Agreement the Government of the Federal Re-public of Germany has undertaken to place at the disposal of the High Commissioner for Refugees the sum of 45 million deutschmarks for assistance to certain types of refugees. Persons eligible to apply for assistance must show that they were persecuted under the German national-socialist regime for reasons of nationality, and that their circumstances justify some assistance. They must, in addition, have been refugees on 1 October 1953; and they must not hitherto have obtained any payment under German federal measures for the indemni-fication of victims of persecution. Any persons in New Zea-land who think they may qualify for assistance under this agreement should write directly to: The United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees,
