The hunting or killing, taking for any purpose, molesting, capturing, disturbing, harrying or worrying of any living creature in the sanctuary, the taking, destruction, or disturbance of the eggs or spawn of any such creature, the taking for any purpose or interference with vegetation of any description in the sanctuary, the introduction or liberation in the sanctuary of any living creature or the eggs or spawn of any living creature, or the introduction or planting in the sanctuary of any vegetation of any description or the spores or seeds of any vegetation of

any description is hereby prohibited except pursuant to an authority issued by the Secretary for Internal Affairs for that purpose: Provided that members of the Aotea Tribe, Great Barrier Island, shall be permitted to take the young of the grey-faced petrel (*Pterodroma macroptera*) subject to such conditions as the Minister of Internal Affairs may impose in any notification issued under section 6 of the Wildlife Act 1953.

3. The burning or clearing by any means whatsoever of any trees, shrubs, grasses, or other plant life on the sanctuary is hereby prohibited except pursuant to an authority issued by the Secretary for Internal Affairs for that purpose.

4. Camping in the sanctuary is hereby prohibited except pursuant to an authority issued by the Secretary for Internal Affairs for that purpose: Provided that members of the Aotea Tribe, Great Barrier Island, may camp in the sanctuary while exercising their rights under any permits for the taking of the young of the grey-faced petrel (*Pterodroma macroptera*) issued under section 6 (2) (a) of the Wildlife Act 1953.

5. The lighting of fires or the doing of anything likely to cause a fire on the sanctuary is hereby prohibited except pursuant to an authority issued by the Secretary for Internal Affairs for that purpose: Provided that members of the Aotea Tribe, Great Barrier Island, may light camp fires in the sanctuary only for the purpose of exercising their rights under any permits for the taking of the young of the grey-faced petrel (*Pterodroma macroptera*) issued under section 6 of the Wildlife Act 1953.

6. The taking of firearms or explosives on or onto the sanctuary or the use of firearms or explosives in the sanctuary is hereby prohibited except pursuant to an authority issued by the Secretary for Internal Affairs for that purpose.

7. The taking or keeping of domestic animals or domestic birds into or in the sanctuary is hereby prohibited except pursuant to an authority issued by the Secretary for Internal Affairs for that purpose.

8. The depositing of rubbish or the leaving of litter in the sanctuary is hereby prohibited.

Standard Scheme of Control for Secondary Schools 1961

PART I—PRELIMINARY

1. This scheme may be referred to as the Standard Scheme of Control for Secondary Schools 1961.

2. In this scheme, unless the context otherwise requires,—

"The Board", in relation to any secondary school, means the governing body however described of that school:

"The Education Acts" means the Education Act 1914, and includes the amendments thereof and all regulations lawfully made thereunder and for the time being in force:

"Member", in relation to any Board, means a member of that Board:

"The Minister" means the Minister of Education:

"Parent", in relation to any pupil, includes the pupil's guardian and the householder in whose family the child resides:

"Pupil", in relation to a secondary school, means a pupil whose name is on the school roll, including a pupil of a junior high school forming an intermediate department of the school, but does not include a pupil in any lower department:

"The School Acts" includes the Education Acts and any special Acts constituting the school or affecting the constitution thereof and all regulations made under any such Act and for the time being in force:

"Secretary" includes the Registrar, Clerk, acting Secretary, and any other person appointed permanently or temporarily to discharge the duties of a secretary to the Board.

3. If more than one separate educational establishment is maintained by the Board, all such establishments shall be deemed one "school" for the purpose of this scheme, but in any such case for the purposes of this scheme the term "Principal" means the rector, headmaster, headmistress, or other principal of each separate establishment.

4. This scheme shall in all respects be read subject to the provisions of the School Acts, and in the event of conflict between the provisions of this scheme and the provisions of the School Acts the latter provisions shall prevail.

PART II—APPOINTMENT AND ELECTION OF MEMBERS

APPOINTMENT OF MEMBERS BY EDUCATION BOARDS

5. In every case where a member is to be appointed by the Education Board of the district in which the school is situated every such member shall be appointed by a resolution of the Education Board passed in the case of a regular triennial appointment before the day on which the member so appointed is to assume office, but not more than three months before that day, and in the case of a casual vacancy within 50 days after the fact of the vacancy has been notified to the Education Board.

6. The name of every member so appointed shall forthwith be notified to the Board by writing under the hand of the Secretary of the Education Board.

APPOINTMENT OF MEMBERS BY BOROUGH COUNCILS AND COUNTY COUNCILS

7. In every case where a member is to be appointed by the Council of a city, borough, or county, every such member shall be appointed by a resolution of the Council passed in the case of a regular triennial appointment before the day on which the member so appointed is to assume office, but not more than three months before that day, and in the case of a casual vacancy within 50 days after the fact of the vacancy has been notified to the Council.

8. The name of every member so appointed shall forthwith be notified to the Board by writing under the hand of any two Councillors or the Clerk of the Council.

ELECTION OF MEMBERS BY PARENTS

9. In every case where any member is to be elected by the parents of pupils, every such member shall be elected by means of an election conducted in the manner set out in the Schedule hereto, and for the purposes of every such election the Secretary of the Board shall be the Returning Officer.

10. Such an election shall be held in the first week of the month of May in each year in which the term of office of members is due to expire in terms of clause 18 hereof.

11. Forthwith after the completion of every such election the Returning Officer shall notify to the Board the name of every person elected.

12. If at any election the number of candidates duly nominated is less than the number of vacancies to be filled, the Board shall at its next meeting select duly qualified persons to complete the number required.

FAILURE TO APPOINT OR ELECT

13. If any appointment of a member is not made within the time hereinbefore prescribed the Secretary shall give notice thereof to the Minister, and the vacancy for which no person has been appointed may be filled by appointment by the Minister, or the Minister may direct that the body charged with the duty of appointing a member may proceed to make the appointment.

14. Where anything connected with the appointment or election of members is omitted to be done or cannot be done at or by the time hereby prescribed, or is done after such time, or is otherwise irregularly done in matter of form, the Minister may, at any time before or after the time at or by which the thing is required to be done, extend the time for doing the thing to such further time as he thinks fit, or may validate anything so done after the time required or so irregularly done in matters of form, as he thinks fit.

QUALIFICATIONS OF MEMBERS

15. It shall not be necessary that the member appointed by an Education Board or by the Council of a city, borough, or county (or jointly by two or more of such Councils) shall himself be a member of the body (or bodies) nor that a member elected by parents shall himself be the parent of a pupil.

16. Retiring members shall be eligible for membership of the Board on appointment or election by either the same or another appointing or electing body.

17. No person shall be eligible to become or remain a member of the Board if he is an alien or a mentally defective person within the meaning of the Mental Health Act 1911, or a bankrupt who has not obtained his discharge or whose discharge is for the time being suspended or is subject to conditions not yet fulfilled, or if he has been convicted of any offence punishable by imprisonment unless he has received a free pardon or has served his sentence or otherwise suffered the penalty imposed on him, or if he receives any salary from the Board or holds any office or employment under the Board to which any fees, salary, or emoluments are attached.

TENURE OF OFFICE

18. Except in the case of a casual vacancy, every member shall hold office until the 31st day of May in the third year after the year of his election or appointment, and if on that 31st day of May the appointment or election of his successor has not been notified to the Board, he shall continue to hold office until the date on which that appointment or election is so notified.

19. Every person appointed or elected to fill a casual vacancy shall hold office for the residue of the term of office of the member whom he replaces.

20. Every person appointed or elected to membership otherwise than upon a casual vacancy shall assume office on the 1st day of June in the year of his appointment or election, or so soon thereafter as his appointment or election has been notified to the Board.

21. Every person appointed or elected to fill a casual vacancy shall assume office on the date on which his appointment or election is notified to the Board.

22. If any member dies or resigns his office by writing under his hand addressed to the Board or the Chairman or the Secretary thereof, or is absent without leave from the meetings of the Board for three consecutive months, or while holding office becomes ineligible to remain a member under clause 17 hereof, his office shall be thereby vacated and a casual vacancy shall be deemed to exist.

CASUAL VACANCIES

23. Subject to the provisions of clause 25 hereof, every casual vacancy shall be filled in the same manner and by the same appointing or electing authority as appointed or elected the member whose seat is to be filled.

24. Whenever a vacancy to be filled by appointment occurs it shall be the duty of the Board forthwith to notify the fact to the appointing person or body and to call upon him or it to make an appointment to fill the vacancy.

25. Whenever a vacancy to be filled by election occurs it shall be the duty of the Board to hold an election to fill the vacancy, which election shall be held on a day to be fixed by the Board, being not later than 50 days after the vacancy occurs:

Provided that the Board may in its discretion decide that no election shall be held to fill a casual vacancy if the vacancy occurs after the month of October immediately preceding the next ordinary election and before the persons elected at the ordinary election assume office.

PART III—THE GOVERNING BODY

POWERS OF THE BOARD

26. Subject to the provisions of this scheme and the Education Acts, there shall be vested in the Board the whole control and management of the school, and also the entire superintendence over all the affairs, concerns, and property thereof, with full power to appoint and suspend or dismiss all masters, teachers, lecturers, examiners, and other necessary officers and servants; and in all cases unprovided for by the Education Act or by this scheme it shall be lawful for the Board to act in such manner as shall appear to it best calculated to further the purposes intended to be served by the establishment of the school; and the Board shall, subject to the Education Acts and the regulations thereunder, and to this scheme, have full power from time to time to make, alter, and rescind bylaws and rules for defining the courses of study and education in the school, and also for regulating the discipline of the same, the conditions upon which the pupils shall be admitted, and, in general, touching all other matters, purposes, and things regarding the school.

27. The Board may establish or license hostels or boarding-houses for the accommodation of pupils, and may place such hostels or boardinghouses under the charge of teachers of the school or other suitable persons, and shall provide for the inspection of such hostels or boardinghouses.

28. No act or proceeding of the Board or of any committee of the Board or of any person acting as a member of the Board shall be invalid in consequence of there being a vacancy in the membership of the Board at the time of such act or proceeding, or by reason of there being a defect in the appointment or election of any person so acting, or by reason of his being incapable of being appointed or elected.

MEETINGS

29. The Board shall hold an annual meeting in the month of June in each year, at such time and place as the Board shall decide.

30. Except as provided by clause 37 of this scheme, at all meetings of the Board, the Chairman, or in his absence such member of the Board as the majority of the members assembled shall choose, shall preside, and the Chairman or presiding member shall have a deliberative vote, and in all cases of equality of votes shall also have a casting vote.

31. At all meetings of the Board a majority of all the members then in office shall constitute a quorum.

32. Subject to the provisions of this scheme, the Board may make, and may from time to time revoke, vary, or amend, bylaws for the conduct of business at its meetings, for determining how meetings shall be convened and where they shall be held, for the custody and use of the common seal, and for such other like matters as may be requisite for the conduct of the business of the Board.

33. Minutes of the proceedings of the Board shall be regularly entered in a proper book to be kept for that purpose, and at every regular meeting of the Board the minutes of the previous meeting and of any special meetings shall be read over and signed by the Chairman of the meeting at which the same are read and the minutes when so signed shall be held to be a true statement and record of the proceedings of the Board for all purposes whatever.

34. All things required by the School Acts or by this scheme to be done by the Board shall be done in accordance with and in pursuance of a resolution passed at a meeting of the Board.

CHAIRMAN

35. At the annual meeting the Board shall elect from its members a Chairman, who shall hold office until the commencement of the next annual meeting and who shall be eligible for re-election.

36. If the Chairman from any cause ceases to be a member of the Board or resigns the office of Chairman the Board shall, as soon thereafter as conveniently may be, elect another member of the Board to be Chairman in his stead; and the Chairman so elected shall hold office only until the commencement of the next annual meeting.

37. During any election of a Chairman the Secretary of the Board shall preside, but shall have no vote; and in the event of an equality of voting he shall determine the election by lot.

COMMITTEES

38. The Board may from time to time appoint standing or special committees of one or more of its members, and may delegate to any such committee any of the duties and powers of the Board, either subject to confirmation or in such manner as not to require subsequent confirmation by the Board:

Provided that the Board shall not delegate the power to make a permanent appointment to any position, or to dismiss any person holding a permanent appointment, or to institute an action, or to commit the Board, to any expenditure or liability in excess of £50.

39. The Board shall in all cases have and retain the right to revoke any appointment of a committee and to revoke the delegation to any committee of any duty or power of the Board.

40. Unless otherwise provided by the Board every such committee may fix and act by a quorum of its members.

41. The provisions of clause 33 of this scheme (relating to minutes of proceedings) shall apply so far as they are applicable and with the necessary modifications, to any committee appointed by the Board.

SECRETARY AND OFFICE

42. From time to time as may be necessary, the Board shall appoint a Secretary, and shall appoint him or some other person with authority to receive money on the Board's account. The Board shall forthwith inform the Minister of every such appointment. Where the Principal is appointed Secretary of the Board he shall not receive any additional remuneration in respect of that appointment.

43. Any notice or other such document given or made by or on behalf of the Board shall be sufficiently authenticated if it is signed by the Secretary, or any person acting as Secretary, of the Board.

44. The Board shall from time to time provide and maintain at some convenient place an office on the outside of which the name of the Board shall be printed or affixed.

45. Any notice or other such document shall be deemed to be served on the Board if addressed to the Board or to the Chairman or Secretary thereof and delivered at the Board's office during usual business hours to some person having charge of the office, or if sent by post in a prepaid registered letter addressed as aforesaid.

FINANCIAL PROVISIONS

46. The Board shall keep full and true accounts, in which shall be entered every sum received into and paid out of the Board fund in the order of date of each such receipt and payment, including all money received from rents or profits derived from lands or other property vested in the Board or under its control or management. All money received by or belonging to the Board shall be paid into such bank as the Board from time to time appoints to the credit of one or more accounts, and no money shall be drawn out of the bank except by authority of the Board and by cheque signed by the Secretary and by a member or members appointed by the Board for the purpose.

47. The Board shall, not later than the 31st day of March in every year, cause its accounts for the year ending with the immediately preceding 31st day of January to be balanced, and a true statement and account to be prepared, in the prescribed form, of the receipts and payments of the Board and of its assets and liabilities.

48. The Board may, out of any capital fund accumulated by it, or out of money coming into its hands by virtue of any Act or otherwise for the benefit of the school, being money for the application of which no express provision exists, expend any sum or sums in purchasing land for the benefit of the school, and in erecting and maintaining suitable buildings and premises thereon for use as school buildings, and may, subject to the approval of the Minister, expend any sum or sums in purchasing land and erecting and maintaining suitable buildings thereon for use as boardinghouses for the pupils, or as residences for the masters, teachers, or other officers employed in connection with the school.

PART IV—MANAGEMENT OF THE SCHOOL

49. There shall be provided at the school a general course of secondary education and one or more vocational courses; and every pupil enrolled for full-time instruction at the school shall be given instruction in accordance with the requirements of regulation 3 of the Education (Post-primary Instruction) Regulations 1954.*

50. The programme of each pupil shall be determined by the Principal after consultation with the parents or guardian of the pupil. No pupils shall be compelled to take Latin or to take more than one language besides English.

51. The school year shall consist of three terms of about 13 weeks each.

52. The Principal shall cause the pupils to be examined at least twice in each year.

53. Subject to the general direction of the Board, the Principal shall have the following powers:

- (a) He shall have control of the buildings and premises of the establishment, and of the apparatus and furniture thereof;
- (b) He shall have the power to recommend the appointment or dismissal of assistant teachers or of other officers of the establishment, and to allot their several duties; and no such assistant teacher or other officer shall be appointed until the Principal has been consulted as to his suitability;
- (c) He shall have the power in case of grave neglect of duty or of gross misbehaviour to suspend any assistant teacher or other officer, but shall forthwith report his action to the Chairman; and the action of the Principal shall hold good until the Board has determined the matter;
- (d) He shall be supreme over the discipline and may suspend from attendance any pupil; and in the case of every such suspension, he shall immediately notify the parents or guardian of the pupil of the suspension and the reasons therefor, and shall forward forthwith to the Board a full report of the suspension, but he shall not expel any pupil without the sanction of the Board;
- (e) He shall regulate all textbooks, methods, and organisation in accordance with clause 50 hereof, and, subject to the same clause and to the regulations under the Education Act, shall determine the course of study for each pupil:
Provided that the textbooks shall be taken from the lists selected by the Director and approved by the Minister.

SCHEDULE

RULES FOR THE CONDUCT OF ELECTION OF MEMBERS BY PARENTS

(1) In this Schedule "elector" means a person whose name duly appears on the roll at the time when it is closed for the purposes of any election.

(2) For the purposes of each election the Returning Officer shall prepare a roll, and shall enter therein the name, occupation, and address of every person qualified to be enrolled as a parent of a pupil of the school. The roll shall be closed at 5 o'clock on the fourteenth day before the day on which any election is to be held, and shall continue to be closed until the election is completed.

(3) The roll shall at all reasonable times be open to inspection in the hands of the Returning Officer by any person whose name is entered therein and by any person representing to the Returning Officer that he is entitled to have his name entered therein.

(4) Any question that arises touching the right of any person to have his name entered in or retained on the roll shall be decided by the Returning Officer, and his decision shall be final.

(5) The Returning Officer shall, by advertisement in a newspaper circulating in the locality of the school, publicly notify not less than 21 days before each election—

- (a) The day and hour for the closing of nominations;
- (b) The total number of candidates to be elected;
- (c) The day and hour for the closing of the poll.

The advertisement shall indicate generally the nature of the election which is being held.

(6) Every candidate shall be nominated in writing by one or more electors entitled to vote for his election.

(7) Every nomination paper shall be in the form or to the effect following:

1. [Name and Address], being an elector duly entered on the roll, do hereby nominate [Name and Address] as a candidate for election to the Board of Governors of the [Name of School] at the election to be held on the day of 19.....

[Signature of Nominator.]

CANDIDATE'S CONSENT

[To be subscribed at foot of nomination paper]

I hereby consent to my nomination.

[Signature of Candidate Nominated.]

(8) If the nomination paper does not bear the written consent of the candidate nominated, that consent may be given by him to the Returning Officer before the nominations are closed, and every nomination paper shall be void in so far as concerns any candidate whose written consent is not duly given as aforesaid.

(9) Nominations shall close at noon on the fourteenth day before the day of the closing of the poll; so that if a poll is to close on the fifteenth day of any month, nominations shall close on the first day of that month.

(10) Any question that arises touching the validity of a nomination paper, whether by reason of form, execution, time of receipt, or otherwise, howsoever, shall be decided by the Returning Officer, and his decision shall be final.

(11) If the number of nominations received does not exceed the number of vacancies to be filled, the Returning Officer shall forthwith declare the candidate or candidates so nominated to be duly elected.

(12) In all other cases the Returning Officer shall, as soon as the nominations are closed, prepare and post to each elector at his address as appearing on the roll a printed voting paper containing in alphabetical order of surnames a list of all the duly nominated candidates for whom the elector is entitled to vote; and the voting paper shall be in the form or to the effect following:

Voting paper for use at election to be held on the

day of 19..... of Member of the Board of Governors of the [Name of School]

CANDIDATES

[Set out in alphabetical order of surnames the full name of every duly nominated candidate.]

DIRECTIONS

The number of candidates to be elected is [Specify the number].

The voter must draw a line through the name of every candidate for whom he does not intend to vote.

The number of candidates whose names are left uncanceled must not exceed

The voting paper must be posted or delivered to the Returning Officer in a closed envelope bearing on the outside the word "Voting Paper", and on the inside of the flap of the envelope the signature of the voter. If posted to the Returning Officer it must be posted on or before the day of election, and, if delivered to him, must be delivered at his office, Street, before the day of election, or not later than 5 o'clock in the afternoon of that day.

(13) When posting any voting paper the Returning Officer shall enclose for the return of the voting paper an envelope addressed to himself with a place inside the flap for the signature of the voter.

(14) The poll shall close at 5 o'clock on the afternoon of the day of election; but all voting papers shall be included and counted which are not informal and are received by the Returning Officer in due course of post before the close of the seventh day after the day of the election.

(15) A voting paper shall be informal in any of the following cases:

- (a) If the elector votes more than once at the same election; or
- (b) If the candidates whose names are left uncanceled exceed in number the total number of candidates for whom the elector is entitled to vote; or
- (c) If in any other way the paper fails to indicate for whom the vote is intended to be given; or
- (d) If, being delivered to the Returning Officer, otherwise than by post, the sealed envelope containing the voting paper is not delivered at his office before the close of the poll; or
- (e) If, having been forwarded by post, the sealed envelope containing the voting paper is not received at the office of the Returning Officer before the close of the seventh day after the day of election, or if, from the postmark on the envelope or otherwise the Returning Officer is satisfied that it was not posted until after the day of the election; or
- (f) If there is reasonable cause to believe that it was not issued to the voter by the Returning Officer; or
- (g) If the voter fails to place his signature on the inside of the flap of the envelope.

(16) The Returning Officer shall decide whether a voting paper is invalid or informal whether by reason of the time of receipt or delivery or by reason of the fact that the voter's intention is not indicated, or for any other reason, and his decision shall be final.

(17) On the eighth day after the date of the closing of the poll, the Returning Officer shall open and examine all voting papers duly delivered to him or received by him through the post as aforesaid, and, after rejecting all informal voting papers, shall ascertain the candidates (not exceeding the total number to be elected) who have received the greatest number of votes, and shall declare those candidates to be elected.

(18) If by reason of an equality of votes given for two or more candidates the election is not complete, the Returning Officer shall decide by lot, in the presence of two members of the Board, which candidate or candidates shall be elected, and thereby complete the election.

(19) In connection with any such election:

- (a) Each candidate may, by writing under his hand, appoint one scrutineer, who may be present at the examination of the voting papers and the counting of the votes by the Returning Officer;
- (b) The Returning Officer shall, immediately after counting the votes, seal up all voting papers, and transmit the whole to the Clerk of the nearest Magistrate's Court, who shall keep the same for six months thereafter, and shall not open the packet or permit it to be opened except on the order of some Court of competent jurisdiction, and shall at the end of the six months effectually destroy the same:

(c) Forthwith after the completion of the election the Returning Officer shall, by notice exhibited on the outside of the office of the Board, and by advertisement in a newspaper circulating in the locality of the school, notify the names of the persons elected, the number of valid votes recorded for each candidate, and the total number of votes rejected as informal:

(d) The Returning Officer and every clerk or other person employed by him and every scrutineer shall be required faithfully and impartially to perform the duties of their offices, and shall not directly or indirectly make known the state of the poll or give or pretend to give any information by which the state of the poll may be known before the final declaration thereof by the Returning Officer, or make known for which candidate any voter has voted, or communicate to any person any information likely to defeat the secrecy of the ballot.

(20) If a candidate informs the Returning Officer in writing not later than three clear days before the closing of the poll that he retires from the election, the Returning Officer shall give public notice thereof; and if by such retirement the number of candidates is reduced to the number of vacancies to be filled, the Returning Officer shall publicly declare the remaining candidates to be duly elected; but if the said number of candidates is not so reduced the poll shall proceed, but the person so retiring shall not be capable of being elected.

(21) The Returning Officer shall be the sole and absolute judge of the regularity and propriety of all matters connected with an election, and no election shall be called in question on the ground that a voting paper or an addressed envelope was not posted to any elector, or that a voting paper from any elector was not received by the Returning Officer, or that a voting paper prepared by the Returning Officer was irregular in form, or that any vote was irregularly cast, or that any votes were wrongly computed, or that any other irregularity occurred in connection with the election, unless in the opinion of the Returning Officer (whose decision shall be final) the irregularity materially affected the result of the election or occurred otherwise than in good faith.

That the proceeds of the sale of the property devised and bequeathed to the Baptist Union of New Zealand under the will of Letitia Ings, of Dunedin, spinster (now deceased), for the purposes of a home for elderly women who are in need of a home and who are members of a Baptist Church; and the residue of the estate of the said Letitia Ings bequeathed to the Baptist Union of New Zealand for application to any purpose or purposes connected with such home together in each case with the accrued and future income thereof be applied by the said union for the purpose of establishing and equipping or maintaining a home at Dunedin for elderly women in need of a home.

2. That the home be vested in the Baptist Union of New Zealand and be controlled by a board of management which shall be appointed by the Otago and Southland Association of Churches of the Baptist Union or by such other body as the Baptist Union from time to time decides.

3. That the reasonable expenses of and incidental to preparing perusing and advertising this scheme including the costs of the Attorney-General in relation thereto shall be paid out of and be a charge upon the property income or money affected by this scheme.
