PURSUANT to the Trustee Savings Banks Act 1948, His Excel-lency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

### ORDER

1. Title-This order may be cited as the Canterbury Savings 2. Interpretation—In this order, unless the context otherwise

requires,-

"The Act" means the Trustee Savings Banks Act 1948: "The Bank" means the Canterbury Savings Bank: "Board" means the Board of Trustees of the Bank: "Minister" means the Minister of Finance.

3. Establishment of Bank—Consent is hereby given to the establishment under the Act of a trustee savings bank under the name of the Canterbury Savings Bank, having its head office in the City of Christchurch.
4. Application of Act—The provisions of the Act shall apply to the Bank, subject to the provisions of this order.
5. Term of office of trustees—Notwithstanding anything in section 7 (1) of the Act, the following provisions shall apply with respect to the first appointed members of the Board, namely:

- (a) In the year nineteen hundred and sixty-five and in each succeeding year until all those trustees have retired or otherwise vacated their offices, two of the trustees or, as the case may be, the last one of those trustees, shall retire from office:
  (b) The trustees to retire in any year shall be determined by agreement of the trustees for the time being in office who are required to retire under this clause or, failing agreement, shall be determined by 10t.
  6 First President and Deputy President—Notwithstanding

or, falling agreement, shall be determined by lot. 6. First President and Deputy President—Notwithstanding anything in section 9 (1) of the Act, at the first meeting of the Board the Board shall elect from among the trustees a President and Deputy President of the Bank, each of whom, so long as he continues to be a trustee, shall hold office until his successor is elected in the month of May in the year nineteen hundred and sixty-three in accordance with the pro-visions of section 9 (1) of the Act. 7. First meeting of Board—Notwithstanding anything in sec-tion 10 (1) of the Act, the first meeting of the Board shall be held at such time and place as the Minister appoints, by notice in the Gazette.

be held at such time and place as the Minister appoints, by notice in the Gazette. 8. Remuneration of trustees—Notwithstanding anything in section 12 of the Act, the trustees of the Bank shall not be entitled to any remuneration by way of salary, fees, or allow-ances (except travelling allowances and expenses) until a date to be fixed in writing by the Minister. 9. Appointment of officers—Notwithstanding anything in section 14 of the Act, the Board shall not appoint the senior executive officer of the Bank except with the consent of the Minister and at a remuneration and subject to such conditions as the Minister approves.

Banking of deposits—Notwithstanding anything in sec-tion 20 of the Act, all money received in the Bank by way of deposits, realisation of investments, and income from in-vestments shall, with all convenient speed, be deposited in a trading bank to the credit of an account in the name of the Canterbury Savings Bank, and, except with the prior consent in writing of the Minister, shall not be withdrawn from that account otherwise than for the purpose of meeting depositors' demands or anticipated depositors' demands or for investment nurnoses. purposes.

11. Investments-Notwithstanding anything in section 24 of the Act, the Bank may invest any money deposited in or belonging to the Bank in the following manner only:

(a) Not less than 90 per cent thereof shall be invested in New Zealand Government securities (including National Savings Bonds issued under the National Savings Act 1940):

Savings Act 1940):
(b) Any amount not so invested in New Zealand Government securities (excluding the amount required by section 24 (3) of the Act to be kept immediately available) may be invested as follows:

(i) In any of the ways specified in paragraphs (c),
(d), and (e) of section 24 (1) of the Act:
(ii) With the prior consent in writing of the Minister, on mortgages of estates or interests in land occupied or to be occupied by officers of the Bank for residential purposes.

12. Application of profits—Notwithstanding anything in sec-tion 25 of the Act, the profits of the Bank for any financial year (after providing for taxation) shall be applied by the Board as follows:

- (a) Not more than one-half may be paid by way of grant in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (a) of section 25 (1) of the Act:
  (b) The balance shall be credited to the Reserve Fund and, unless the Minister of Finance otherwise consents, shall be applied in reduction of any bank overdraft owing by the Bank.

13. Bank premises—Notwithstanding anything in the proviso to section 28 of the Act, the Bank shall not, without the prior consent in writing of the Minister, incur any expenditure exceeding in the aggregate £2,000 in respect of the purchase or other acquisition or improvement of any land or buildings or the erection of any building for the purpose of providing any one office for the Bank.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR MAY 1962

*General:* May was exceptionally mild, with unusually good pasture growth. It was also a good month for stock, except in parts of the Auckland Province, Nelson, and Marlborough, where the ground was too wet after excessive rain. Some effects of the unusually mild autumn include plants flowering out of season, raspberries producing an extra crop, very slow sales of winter clothing, and no snow for the start of the skiing season in the North Island.

skiing season in the North Island. Rainfall: Rainfall was above average over nearly the whole of the provinces of Auckland, Nelson, Marlborough, Westland, and Canterbury. In Bay of Plenty, Nelson, and Marlborough it was mainly at least double the average value. Rotorua with 18.25 in. had its wettest May in over 75 years of records, and in the surround-ing area totals reached 32 in. in places. Both in Bay of Plenty and the Nelson-Marlborough area nearly all the rain fell in three periods, the 3rd, 17th-20th, and 30th, 31st. The second period caused flooding in the Rangitaiki Plains of the eastern Bay of Plenty, and the period at the end of the month caused flooding in this same area and also in parts of Nelson and Northland.

Northland.

It was appreciably drier than usual in the North Island south of Hawera and Gisborne (except in Southern Manawatu and Wel-lington) and also over most of Ot2go and Southland.

Temperatures: Temperatures were above normal over the whole country, mainly by about 4 degrees. Highest departures, exceeding 5 degrees, were recorded in Bay of Plenty, about Cook Strait, and in Canterbury from Christchurch northward. In some of these areas it was the warmest May on record. Frosts were much less frequent than usual.

Sunshine: Sunshine was below average over nearly the whole of the Auckland Province by 20 to 50 hours; also in Canterbury, by 20 to 30 hours. The only areas favoured with more than 20 hours above average were Wanganui and southern Hawke's Bay, with parts of northern Manawatu and Central Otago.

*Weather Sequence:* The month opened with an anticyclone lying to the east of the country and a depression over the Tasman Sea. The whole system showed little change or movement at first. Winds were northerly and scattered light rain was reported, mainly in the Auckland Province and Nelson. On the 3rd and 4th the

depression deepened and crossed the South Island. Rain became general, with some considerable falls in Bay of Plenty. As the depression moved away to the east south-westerlies prevailed, bringing showers to some coastal districts on the 5th.

bringing showers to some coastal districts on the 5th. From the 6th to the 10th deep depressions passed to the south and winds were mainly from a westerly quarter, with some rain in most districts, but especially on the West Coast. A small depression to the north also affected the Auckland Province on the 8th. With rising pressures conditions improved on the 11th, but showers were still reported on the Southland coast and in parts of the Auckland Province. For the next four days the weather was generally fair as an anticyclone moved slowly across New Zealand. From the 16th to the 18th the anticyclone was centred to the

generally fair as an anticyclone moved slowly across New Zealand. From the 16th to the 18th the anticyclone was centred to the east and pressures were low over the Tasman Sea. North-easterly to northerly winds again prevailed, with rain spreading over the Auckland and Taranaki Provinces and all of the South Island except Canterbury. A small depression developed to the north, and during the 19th and 20th a trough was almost stationary extending north to south over the North Island. Rain continued in much the same districts, apart from a clearance in Otago; but it became very heavy in Bay of Plenty, with some flooding, especially on the Rangitaiki Plains and about and south of Rotorua. Rotorua.

Rotorua. From the 21st to the 24th an anticyclone was centred close to Southland, while a depression to the north moved south-eastward past East Cape. Rain affected mainly Northland, Gisborne, and Hawke's Bay; parts of the east coast of Northland were also buffeted by south-easterly gales and heavy seas. For the next three days pressure was rather low, with troughs crossing the country from west to east, bringing rain mainly to the West Coast. On the 28th rain became general with the passage of a small depression across Nelson and Marlborough. There was a temporary clearance in many districts on the 29th, but the last two days were wet, except in Southland and Central Otago. An anticyclone was again centred to the east of New Zealand, and a depression covered the eastern Tasman Sea. North-easterly winds brought particularly heavy rain to Bay of Plenty, Taranaki, Nelson, and Northland, with flooding again in the Rangitaiki River. (N.Z. Met, S. Misc. Pub. 107)

4. For the purpose of this order, and notwithstanding any-thing to the contrary in the said Act, any person who sells by retail to any one purchaser for delivery at any one time not less than two standard case lots of honey shall, in respect of the sale, be deemed to be a wholesaler, and the provisions of this order as to maximum wholesale prices shall apply accordingly with respect to every such sale.

5. The maximum prices fixed by this order apply with respect to sales by auction as well as to other sales.

### FIXING MAXIMUM PRICES FOR HONEY SOLD IN RETAIL CONTAINERS

6.
