PURSUANT to the Trustee Savings Banks Act 1948, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

O R D E R

1. Title—This order may be cited as the Hawke's Bay Savings Bank Order 1962.

2. Interpretation—In this order, unless the context otherwise requires,—

"The Act" means the Trustee Savings Banks Act 1948;
"The Bank" means the Hawke's Bay Savings Bank;
"Board" means the Board of Trustees of the Bank;
"Minister" means the Minister of Finance.

3. Establishment of Bank—Consent is hereby given to the establishment under the Act of a Trustee savings bank under the name of the Hawke's Bay Savings Bank, having its head office in the City of Hastings.

4. Application of Act—The provisions of the Act shall apply to the Bank, subject to the provisions of this order.

5. Term of office of trustees—Notwithstanding anything in section 7 (1) of the Act, the following provisions shall apply with respect to the first appointed members of the Board, namely:

(a) In the year nineteen hundred and sixty-five and in each succeeding year until all those trustees have retired or otherwise vacated their offices, two of the trustees or, as the case may be, the last one of those trustees, shall retire from office;

(b) The trustees to retire in any year shall be determined by agreement of the trustees for the time being in office who are required to retire under this clause or, failing agreement, shall be determined by lot.

6. First President and Deputy President—Notwithstanding anything in section 9 (1) of the Act, at the first meeting of the Board the Board shall elect from among the trustees a President and Deputy President of the Bank, each of whom, so long as he continues to be a trustee, shall hold office until his successor is elected in the month of May in the year nineteen hundred and sixty-three in accordance with the provisions of section 9 (1) of the Act.

7. First meeting of Board—Notwithstanding anything in section 10 (1) of the Act, the first meeting of the Board shall be held at such time and place as the Minister appoints, by notice in the *Gazette*.

8. Remuneration of trustees—Notwithstanding anything in section 12 of the Act, the trustees of the Bank shall not be entitled to any remuneration by way of salary, fees, or allowances (except travelling allowances and expenses) until a date to be fixed in writing by the Minister.

9. Appointment of officers—Notwithstanding anything in section 14 of the Act, the Board shall not appoint the senior executive officer of the Bank except with the consent of the Minister and at a remuneration and subject to such conditions as the Minister approves.

10. Banking of deposits—Notwithstanding anything in section 20 (1) of the Act, all money received in the Bank by way of deposits, realisation of investments, and income from investments shall, with all convenient speed, be deposited in a trading bank to the credit of an account in the name of the Hawke's Bay Savings Bank, and, except with the prior consent in writing of the Minister, shall not be withdrawn from that account otherwise than for the purpose of meeting depositors' demands or anticipated depositors' demands or for investment purposes.

11. Investments—Notwithstanding anything in section 24 of the Act, but subject to subsection (4A) thereof, the Bank may invest any money deposited in or belonging to the Bank in the following manner only:

(a) Not less than 90 per cent thereof shall be invested in New Zealand Government securities (including National Savings Bonds issued under the National Savings Act 1940);

(b) Any amount not so invested in New Zealand Government securities (excluding the amount required by section 24 (3) of the Act to be kept immediately available) may be invested as follows:

(i) In any of the ways specified in paragraphs (c), (d), and (e) of section 24 (1) of the Act;

(ii) With the prior consent in writing of the Minister, on mortgages of estates or interests in land occupied or to be occupied by officers of the Bank for residential purposes.

12. Application of profits—Notwithstanding anything in section 25 of the Act, the profits of the Bank for any financial year (after providing for taxation) shall be applied by the Board as follows:

(a) Not more than one-half may be paid by way of grant in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (a) of section 25 (1) of the Act;

(b) The balance shall be credited to the Reserve Fund and, unless the Minister of Finance otherwise consents, shall be applied in reduction of any bank overdraft owing by the Bank.

13. Bank premises—Notwithstanding anything in the proviso to section 28 of the Act, the Bank shall not, without the prior consent in writing of the Minister, incur any expenditure exceeding in the aggregate £2,000 in respect of the purchase or other acquisition or improvement of any land or buildings or the erection of any building for the purpose of providing any one office for the Bank.

SECOND SCHEDULE

CONDITIONS

1. In these conditions the term:

"Foreshore" means such parts of the bed, shore, or banks of a tidal water as are covered and uncovered by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring tides.
"Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act 1952, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to those parts of the foreshore as described in the First Schedule hereto.

3. Her Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, over, and out of the said foreshore without payment.

4. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the Council to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or with any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provision of the Harbours Act 1950 or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, that are or may hereafter be in force.

5. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall not apply to those portions of the foreshore required for securing the shore ends of any telegraph cables that are at present or may be at any time laid down within the said area of foreshore.

6. The Council may, subject to the provisions of sections 176 to 182 of the Harbours Act 1950,—

(a) Erect or license or permit the erection or continuance on the foreshore described in the First Schedule hereto, or on the bed of the harbour or of the sea immediately contiguous to that foreshore, of baths, bathhouses, boat sheds, boat-building sheds, jetties, slipways, or, with the approval of the Minister, any structures relating to the convenience of shipping or of the public or to any local enterprise or object:

- (b) Use or license or permit the use of the foreshore described in the First Schedule hereto, or the bed of the harbour or of the sea immediately contiguous to that foreshore, for any purpose approved by the Minister relating to the convenience of shipping or of the public or to any local enterprise or object:
- (c) Make bylaws regulating the use of any things erected or continued pursuant to clause (a) of this condition and the use for any purpose approved pursuant to clause (b) of this condition, and fixing charges for those uses.

7. The Council may enclose any part or parts of the foreshore described in the First Schedule hereto for the purpose of holding athletic sports or games, and may by bylaw fix a charge for admission to such enclosed part or parts: Provided that the total number of days on which such enclosures are made shall not exceed six in any one year.

8. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the Council to remove or cause to be removed any stones, sand, shingle, or shells without the consent of the Minister being first obtained.

9. Bylaws made by the Council under the authority of this Order in Council shall not come into force until they have been approved by the Minister, by notice in the *Gazette*.

10. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall be in force for 21 years from the day following the date of its notification in the *Gazette* unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority.

11. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the Council six calendar months' notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the Council in New Zealand.

“The Act” means the Exhibitions Act 1910:

“The promoter” means the Auckland Manufacturers' Association and the Auckland Agricultural and Pastoral Association:

“The exhibition” means a public exhibition of boats and caravans to be conducted by the promoter at the Epsom Showgrounds, Auckland, from the 29th day of September 1962 to the 6th day of October 1962 (both inclusive) and to be known as the Boat and Caravan Show 1962.

3. The exhibition is hereby authorised, and declared to be an exhibition within the meaning of the Act.

4. Subject to the conditions set out in the Schedule hereto, the following provisions are hereby suspended in so far as they relate to work done or business conducted or services rendered in the said premises during the period of the exhibition, by or on behalf of the promoter, or by or on behalf of any exhibitor at the exhibition, or by any person employed in or about the exhibition, namely—such of the provisions of—

(a) The Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act 1954 and all awards and industrial agreements in force thereunder;

(b) The Shops and Offices Act 1955; and

(c) The Factories Act 1946,—

as relate to the hours of commencing or ceasing work, or to the issue of permits, or to the payment for overtime, or extended hours, or to holidays, and half-holidays, or to the closing of shops.

SCHEDULE

1. Eight hours shall constitute a day's work in or about the exhibition, and, with the exception set out in clause 2 hereof, the hours shall be worked consecutively.

2. No person shall be employed in or about the exhibition for more than four hours without an interval of at least three-quarters of an hour for a meal.

3. Any person employed during any day in or about the exhibition who is employed on that day for more than eight hours, or before the hour of 8 a.m., or after the hour of 10.30 p.m. (whether the excess employment is in or about the exhibition or otherwise) shall be paid for the excess employment at not less than half as much again as the ordinary rate for the first two hours and at not less than twice the ordinary rate thereafter, and any person employed in or about the exhibition on any day that would, but for the provisions of this order, have been a whole holiday for that person by virtue of any Act or of any award or industrial agreement shall be paid for all work done on that day at not less than twice the ordinary rate whether the work is performed wholly in or about the exhibition, or otherwise.

4. No male under 18 years of age and no female shall be employed in or about the exhibition after the hour of 10.30 p.m.

5. For the purposes of the enforcement of an award or industrial agreement any provision of which has been suspended by this order, any officer of the industrial union or association concerned who is authorised in writing in that behalf by the union or association shall be entitled to interview at his place of employment any person employed in or about the exhibition under that award or industrial agreement at such time or times as may be agreed upon between the officer and the employer of that person, and for this purpose any such officer shall be entitled at any time to have access to the Register of Passes issued by the promoter.

Price Order No. 1894 (Honey)

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act 1947, I, Alan Brown McLauchlan, pursuant to a delegation from the Secretary of Industries and Commerce acting under a delegation from the Price Tribunal, hereby make the following price order:

PRELIMINARY

1. This order may be cited as Price Order No. 1894, and shall come into force on the 28th day of September 1962.

2. (1) Price Order No. 1878* is hereby revoked.

(2) The revocation of the said order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this order.

3. (1) In this order, unless the context otherwise requires,—
“The said Act” means the Control of Prices Act 1947:

“Packer” means a wholesaler who sells to another wholesaler honey packed in retail containers, and includes a producer who sells to a wholesaler honey packed in retail containers as aforesaid:

“Producer” means a beekeeper whose apiary is registered pursuant to the Apiaries Act 1927:

“Retail container” means a jar, carton, or tin supplied by the vendor of the honey and containing not more than 10 lb. net weight of honey:

“Standard case” means a case or other outer container containing in the aggregate approximately 60 lb. of honey packed in retail containers:

“Wholesale free delivery area” means any area within which any wholesaler normally undertakes the free delivery of goods to retailers.

(2) Terms and expressions defined in the said Act when used in this order have the meanings severally assigned thereto by that Act, unless the context otherwise requires.

4. For the purpose of this order, and notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the said Act, any person who sells by retail to any one purchaser for delivery at any one time not less than two standard case lots of honey shall, in respect of the sale, be deemed to be a wholesaler, and the provisions of this order as to maximum wholesale prices shall apply accordingly with respect to every such sale.

5. The maximum prices fixed by this order apply with respect to sales by auction as well as to other sales.

FIXING MAXIMUM PRICES FOR HONEY SOLD IN RETAIL CONTAINERS

6. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause and of clauses 8 and 9 hereof, the maximum price that may be charged or received for honey packed in retail containers of the kinds described in the first column of the Schedule hereto shall be the appropriate price fixed in the second, third, or fourth column of that Schedule.

(2) Where the quantity of honey sold by a packer to a wholesaler or to a retailer in any one transaction is six standard case lots or more the cost involved in effecting delivery to the port (where carriage by sea is entailed) or railway station (where carriage by sea is not entailed) that is nearest or most convenient of access to the wholesaler's or to the retailer's place of business shall be borne by the packer.

(3) Where honey produced in the South Island is sold in the North Island or where honey produced in the North Island is sold in the South Island the appropriate price fixed in the Schedule hereto for any such honey may be increased by an amount not exceeding $\frac{1}{4}$ d. per pound in respect of freight.

(4) The maximum prices fixed in the fourth column of the Schedule hereto are fixed in respect of supplies of honey available to the retailer free of freight for delivery at his store from any source whatever.

(5) Where supplies of honey are delivered to a retailer (other than a retailer situated within a wholesale free delivery area) otherwise than free of freight charges as aforesaid the price that may be charged by the retailer shall be the appropriate price fixed as aforesaid, increased by a proportionate part of the freight charges incurred by him in obtaining delivery: Provided that the amount added to the price in respect of freight, pursuant to this subclause, shall not in any case exceed $\frac{1}{4}$ d. per pound.

(6) The several prices fixed by this clause include the price of the containers.

FIXING MAXIMUM PRICES FOR HONEY SOLD OTHERWISE THAN IN RETAIL CONTAINERS OF A KIND DESCRIBED IN THE SCHEDULE HERETO

7. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause and of clauses 8 and 9 hereof, the maximum prices that may be charged or received for honey sold otherwise than in retail containers of a kind described in the first column of the Schedule hereto shall be determined as follows:

(2) The maximum retail prices fixed by the last preceding subclause are fixed in respect of supplies of honey available to the retailer free of freight charges for delivery at his store from any source whatever.

(3) Where supplies of honey are delivered to the retailer otherwise than free of freight charges as aforesaid, the price that may be charged by the retailer shall be the appropriate price fixed as aforesaid, increased by a proportionate part of the freight charges incurred by him in obtaining delivery: Provided that the amount added to the price in respect of freight, pursuant to this subclause, shall not in any case exceed $\frac{1}{4}$ d. per pound.

(4) The several prices fixed by this clause include the price of the containers.

GENERAL

8. If in respect of any honey the retail price charged in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this order is not an exact number of pence or halfpence, the maximum price shall be computed to the next upward halfpenny.

9. Subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any person concerned, may authorise special prices or margins of profit in respect of any honey to which this order applies where special circumstances exist or for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are incurred by any producer, packer, wholesaler, or retailer. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a specified lot or consignment of honey or may relate generally to all honey to which this order applies sold while the approval remains in force.
