(hereinafter called the Company, which term shall include its successors or assigns unless the context requires a different construction) the exclusive right to dredge sand, shingle, silt, and other like material (hereinafter referred to as material), from all those areas of foreshore and land below low-water mark described in the First Schedule hereto, subject to the terms and conditions set out in the Second Schedule hereto.

If in any year of the term of this licence the Company fails to dredge any material the deposit hereinbefore referred to shall be appropriated by the Minister as if flat rent in respect of that year; but if during any year the Company dredges any material the said deposit shall be applied during the last quarter of that year as royalty prepaid and as to any balance towards the deposit for the next year, but so that the minimum annual amount payable as royalty and/or flat rent in each year of the term of this licence shall be £100.

6. The Company shall keep a strictly accurate record of all material dredged whether from above or below low-water mark and of all material sold and shall submit same for inspection, within seven days after the end of June, September, December, and March, to the Marine Department at Wellington, and shall within the same time pay to the Department the amount of any royalty due.

7. All persons in the service of the Government acting in the execution of their duties shall at all reasonable times have the right to inspect the workings, plant, and dumps being operated by the Company.

8. Nothing herein contained shall be deemed to authorise the Company to do or suffer or cause to be done anything in breach of or repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs or any regulation of the Minister of Customs or any provisions of the Harbours Act 1950, or its amendments, or any regulation including the General Harbour Regulations 1954 that are now or may hereafter be in force in respect of the Porirua Harbour, and the Company shall at all times strictly observe all such laws and regulations.

(a) The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this licence shall be deemed to have terminated on the 1st day of March 1964 if no material has been dredged by the Company hereunder before that date, but otherwise shall continue in force for a term of five years from the date on which the Company commences dredging operations unless in the meantime the licence or any of such rights, powers, and privileges are altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority.

  - The expression "f.o.r." means "free on rail the grower's station".
- The provisions of this order shall apply notwithstanding that any wheat to which this order is applicable is sold otherwise than by weight. The several prices fixed by this order apply with respect to sales by auction as well as to other sales.

  Where any wheat to which this order applies is sold on the basis of sacks extra the maximum prices that may be charged or received
- for the wheat shall be computed on the weight of the wheat without the sacks.

  7. Where any wheat to which this order applies is sold on the basis of sacks included the maximum prices that may be charged or received for the wheat shall be computed on the total weight of the wheat and the sacks.

# APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

- (4) Any freight charges imposed by a retailer pursuant to the foregoing provisions of this clause shall be shown separately on the appropriate invoice.

### PROVISION FOR SPECIAL PRICES WHERE EXTRAORDINARY CHARGES INCURRED

5. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this order and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any retailer, may authorise special maximum prices for any cornsacks to which authorise special maximum prices for any cornsacks to which this order applies, where special circumstances exist, or for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are incurred by the retailer. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a specified lot or consignment of cornsacks or may relate generally to all cornsacks to which this order applies sold by the retailer while the approval remains in force.

# Notes on the Weather for November 1963

General: November was a cool month. In many parts of the Auckland Province it was also very dry until the last three days when some of these areas received good rain. Growth was retarded by the dry, cold weather, and in some areas dairy production was affected. Late frosts damaged some crops, especially in Canterbury on the 6th and 7th.

Strong gales buffeted the country from Auckland to Nelson and Marlborough on the 8th, and damage was reported in many districts.

Rainfall: Rainfall was less than two-thirds the average value in Kainfall: Rainfall was less than two-thirds the average value in northern Northland, western Waikato, and most of the Taupo-Bay of Plenty area; also in parts of Nelson, Marlborough, and Central Otago. Elsewhere it was mainly close to normal; but in southern Northland and parts of southern and central Hawke's Bay, northern Manawatu, and Buller it was more than 50 per cent above above.

Temperatures: Temperatures were mainly cooler than normal, Imperatures: Temperatures were fraining cooler than normal by 1-2 degrees in the North Island and by 2-3 degrees in the South Island. However, in Northland, Auckland, North Taranaki, Nelson, and Marlborough they were close to average. In many parts of the South Island November was cooler than October—in inland Canterbury by 2 degrees.

Snow was reported to low levels in parts of the South Island and the New Yell with each street on the 6th.

the North Island high country on the 6th.

Sunshine: Sunshine was mainly close to normal. However, Wellington was favoured with 40 hours above average and Nelson and Blenheim 24 above average; while Dunedin had 40 hours less than average.

Weather Sequence: During the first three days of the month an anticyclone extended on to New Zealand from the Tasman Sea and the weather was mainly fair or fine. However, on the 1st it rained in Northland, in the Gisborne district, and on the Southland coast.

From the 4th to the 6th a very deep depression passed to the south of Campbell Island, while the associated trough of low pressure crossed the country. Some rain was reported in all districts except parts of Gisborne and Hawke's Bay; and the southwesterly change on the 6th brought unusually low temperatures, with snow to low levels in parts of the South Island and the North Island high country. Further general rain occurred during the next three days as a complex depression passed over Cook Strait; and strong gales buffeted the country from Auckland to Nelson and Marlborough.

With rising pressures the weather improved during the 10th and with rising pressures the weather improved during the 10th and 11th. South-westerlies prevailed with showers still in quite a few districts and some unseasonable frosts. A trough of low pressure which crossed New Zealand during the 12th and 13th brought rain, mainly coastal in the South Island, but more general in the North Island.

The period from the 14th to the 20th was one of westerly weather.

North Island.

The period from the 14th to the 20th was one of westerly weather, with pressures high to the north and low to the south. Rain persisted on the West Coast and on the Southland coast; but elsewhere the weather was mainly fair, except on the 17th, when western districts of the North Island, Wairarapa, and most eastern districts of the South Island received some rain with the passage of a trough of low pressure. This fine spell for most districts persisted for another three days as an anticyclone crossed the North Island, but some showers were still reported on the West Coast.

From the 24th to the 26th a small depression crossed the South Island with light rain, except in Bay of Plenty, Gisborne, and Hawke's Bay. However, these districts benefited from rain brought by a southerly change during the next two days, while the weather cleared in the west.

During the last two days of the month Northland received considerable rain from a small depression; while elsewhere it was mainly fine.

# Price Order No. 1925 (Amendment No. 8 of Price Order No. 1901) (Eggs)

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act 1947, I, Alan Brown McLauchlan, pursuant to a delegation from the Secretary of Industries and Commerce acting under a delegation from the Price Tribunal, hereby make the following Price Order:

1. This order may be cited as Price Order No. 1925 and shall be read together with and deemed part of Price Order No. 1901\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal order).

2. This order shall come into force on the 4th day of January 1964.

3. The principal order is hereby amended by revoking the First and Second Schedules thereto, and substituting the following Schedules.
