



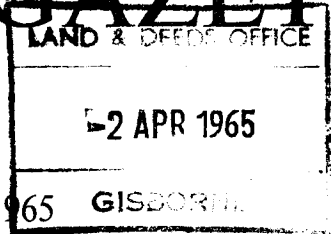

*Open Season for Game in Certain Acclimatisation Districts*

**IMPORTANT**—The information published in this *Gazette* will be published in like form in 1970. In the intervening years this *Gazette* will contain details of the Minister's decision relating to game that may be hunted, the dates and shooting hours between which such game may be hunted, decoy limits, bag limits, and any amendments to the special conditions, possession limit, and closed game areas published in this *Gazette*. Acclimatisation societies are asked to ensure that all purchasers of shooting licences are placed in possession of a comprehensive statement of their rights, duties, and obligations during the shooting season.

PURSUANT to the Wildlife Act 1953, the Minister of Internal Affairs declares an open season for game of the kinds specified and in the acclimatisation districts specified in the First Schedule hereto except in the closed game areas specified in the Second Schedule hereto, during the periods and shooting hours set forth in relation to each district, subject to the decoy limits and the special conditions specified in relation to each district; and hereby calls the attention of sportsmen and others to the daily game possession limits set forth in the Third Schedule hereto and to the provisions and matters set forth or referred to in the Fourth Schedule hereto. Any person hunting or killing game otherwise than in the terms of this notification (including the special conditions specified in relation to any acclimatisation district) is liable on conviction to a fine of £50.

1. A licence issued subject to this notification to hunt or kill game shall entitle the holder thereof to hunt or kill game on that portion of the bank and bed of the Rakaia River which lies within the North Canterbury Acclimatisation District during the period and subject, *mutatis mutandis*, to the conditions prescribed in this notification fixing an open season for game in that district.

2. A licence issued subject to this notification shall entitle the holder thereof to hunt or kill game on that portion of the flood bed of the Rangitata River which lies within the South Canterbury Acclimatisation District during the period and subject, *mutatis mutandis*, to the conditions prescribed in this notification fixing the open season for that district.

1. No person shall use or cause to be used for the hunting or killing of game on Lake Waikare any fixed stand, pontoon, hide, maimai, or loo, except within 200 yd of the margin of the said lake.

2. No person shall use or cause to be used for the hunting or killing of game on Lake Ngaroto any fixed stand, pontoon, hide, maimai, or loo, except within 90 yd of the margin of the said lake.

3. No person shall claim any stand, hide, shelter, maimai, mud-hole, loo, louvre, or position, except by the planting thereon of a stake having attached thereto either a board or an identifying label being plainly marked with the name and address of the claimant, and also having attached thereto a metal marker issued to the claimant with his licence.

4. It shall be an offence for any person to wilfully leave any swans shot or the mutilated bodies of any swans shot, in the Auckland Acclimatisation District.

A licence issued pursuant to this notification to hunt or kill game shall entitle the holder thereof to hunt or kill game on that portion of the bank and bed of the Rakaia River which lies within the Ashburton Acclimatisation District, and on that portion of the bank and bed of the Conway River which lies within the Marlborough Acclimatisation District, during the period and subject, *mutatis mutandis*, to the conditions prescribed in the notification fixing an open season for game in those districts respectively.

A licence issued pursuant to this notification to hunt or kill game shall entitle the holder thereof to hunt or kill game in the Southland Acclimatisation District during the period and subject, *mutatis mutandis*, to the conditions prescribed in the notification fixing an open season for game in that district.

S. and A in Block II, Te Anau Survey District; thence north-easterly generally along the summit of the range between the Fredburn and the Upukerora River to Snowdon; thence northerly generally along the summit of the Livingstone Mountains, passing through Mount Richmond, Winton Peak, Countess Peak, Moffat Peak, and David Peaks, to the summit of the range between Lake Fergus and Lake Howden; thence south-westerly generally along the summit of the range to Mount Anau; thence southerly along the summit of the range passing through Skelmorlie Peak and Largs Peak to a point due north of Mount Eglinton; thence due south by a right line through Mount Eglinton to the Eglinton River; thence south-westerly generally by the said river to Lake Te Anau and by the eastern shore of that lake to the Waiiau River, down that river to Lake Manapouri, and by the eastern shore of that lake to the Waiiau River; thence by a right line in the direction of the Monowai River where it flows out of Lake Monowai to a point due west of Paddock Hill; thence due east to the summit of Paddock Hill, the place of commencement, excepting the area of cultivated land approximately 2 miles long by half a mile wide in the Retford Valley on either side of the Retford River extending approximately 1 mile on either side of the two bridges across the Retford River on the Milford Sound Road.

### THIRD SCHEDULE

#### Daily Game Possession Limit

Except where all game is labelled with the following details:

- (a) The name and address of the person by whom the game was taken;
  - (b) The number of the licence to hunt or kill game held by the person by whom the game was taken;
  - (c) The name of the acclimatisation society by which that licence was issued; and
  - (d) The date on which the game was taken,
- no person shall have in his possession on any one day game in excess of the following numbers:

*Saturday, 1 May 1965:* A number of game corresponding to the number specified in this notification as the daily bag limit in respect of grey, mallard, shoveler (or spoonbill), and paradise ducks.

*Sunday, 2 May 1965:* Twice the number of game specified for Saturday, 1 May 1965.

*Every Subsequent Day:* As for Saturday, 1 May 1965.

### FOURTH SCHEDULE

THE attention of sportsmen and others is directed especially to the under-mentioned provisions of the Wildlife Act 1953 and the Wildlife Regulations 1955.

(NOTE—"Secretary" means the Secretary for Internal Affairs, and includes his deputy.)

#### MEANING OF POSSESSION

##### Wildlife Act 1953, Section 2a

"2A. (1) Subject to the provisions of subsections (2) and (3) of this section, any animal or thing shall be deemed to be in the possession of any person when that person has, alone or jointly or in association with any other person, possession of or control over the animal or thing, or possession of or control over any vessel, vehicle, container, package, or place in or on which the animal or thing is.

"(2) In any proceedings for an offence against this Act or any regulations under this Act, being an offence relating to the possession by the defendant of more than a specified number of animals, then, in any case where the defendant is acting jointly or in association with one or more other persons, the number of animals deemed pursuant to subsection (1) of this section to be in the possession of the defendant for the purposes of those proceedings shall be ascertained by dividing by the number of persons acting jointly or in association the total number of animals found in the possession or under the control of the defendant and the other person or persons or in or on any vessel, vehicle, container, package, or place in the possession or under the control of the defendant and the other person or persons.

"(3) In any proceedings for an offence against this Act or any regulations under this Act, being an offence relating to the possession of any animal or thing found in or on any vessel, vehicle, container, package, or place in the possession or under the control of the defendant, alone or jointly or in association with any other person, it shall be a good defence if the defendant satisfies the Court that—

"(a) He did not know and had no reasonable opportunity of knowing that the animal or thing was in or on the vessel, vehicle, container, package, or place;

or

"(b) In the case of any animal or thing found in or on any vessel or vehicle or place, the animal or thing was in the possession or under the control of some other person in or on that vessel or vehicle or place; or

"(c) In the case of an offence relating to the possession of more than a specified number of animals, he did not know and had no reasonable opportunity of knowing that the number of those animals in or on any vehicle, vessel, container, package, or place exceeded that specified number."

### WILDLIFE REFUGES (PREVIOUSLY KNOWN AS SANCTUARIES)

#### Wildlife Act 1953, Section 14

(1) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the Land Act 1948, the Government Railways Act 1949, the Forests Act 1949, or any other Act affecting lands of the Crown, the Governor-General may from time to time, by Proclamation, declare any area described in the Proclamation and available for the purpose, subject in the case of any land other than unoccupied land of the Crown to the consent of the occupier, to be wildlife refuge for the purposes of this Act, and may in like manner revoke or amend any such Proclamation.

(1A) Where a wildlife refuge has been declared under subsection 1 of this section, the Governor-General may, by the Proclamation or Order in Council declaring the wildlife refuge, or by a subsequent Proclamation or Order in Council, prohibit or restrict the use of boats (including any launch, boat, canoe, or other similar craft, whether propelled by mechanical power or not) in the wildlife refuge or in any portion thereof, and by any person or classes of persons, as may be specified in the Proclamation or Order in Council.

(1B) Any prohibition or restriction under subsection 1A of this section may be absolute or conditional, and the Proclamation or Order in Council may authorise the Minister of Internal Affairs or the Secretary to grant exemptions from the prohibition or restriction.

(1C) Every person commits an offence against this Act who does any act that is for the time being prohibited by a Proclamation or Order in Council under subsection one A of this section or fails to comply in any respect with any condition imposed in any such Proclamation or Order in Council.

(3) While any Proclamation or Order in Council under subsection one of this section remains in force, it shall not be lawful for any person, except as provided in subsection two or subsection two A of this section or in subsection two of section five of this Act or pursuant to an authority granted under section fifty-three or section fifty-four of this Act, to hunt or kill for any purpose, or molest, capture, disturb, harry, or worry any wildlife in the wildlife refuge, or to take, destroy, or disturb the nests, eggs, or spawn of any such wildlife, or for any person to bring onto the wildlife refuge or have in his possession or discharge in the wildlife refuge any firearm or explosive, or have in his possession or control in the wildlife refuge any dog or cat, or to do anything likely to cause any wildlife to leave the wildlife refuge.

(5) Every sanctuary constituted at the commencement of this Act by a Warrant under section six of the Animals Protection and Game Act 1921-22 shall be deemed to be a wildlife refuge for the purposes of this Act.

### OPEN SEASON NOTIFICATIONS

#### Wildlife Act 1953, Section 16

(1) The Minister, in notifying an open season for game, shall specify—

(b) The number of decoys that may be used by any person for the purposes of hunting or killing any game.

(c) The number of game which may be had in possession by any one person on any one day; but different numbers may, in the Minister's discretion, be so specified in respect of different days in the open season.

(2) No person shall hunt or kill game, or during any open season have in his possession any game, otherwise than in terms of such a notification:

Provided that it shall be lawful for any person to have in his possession a number of game in excess of the number specified in such a notification, if the excess game were taken by some other person or persons and all the game in the possession of the first-mentioned person have affixed or tied thereto a label on which the following particulars are legibly written:

(a) The names and addresses of the persons by whom the game were taken; and

(b) The numbers of the licences to hunt or kill game held by those persons; and

(c) The name of the society by which those licences were issued; and

(d) The date or dates on which the game were taken:

Provided also that nothing in this subsection relating to the possession of game shall apply with respect to game placed in any freezing chamber or cool store in accordance with regulations made under this Act.

### FEEDING OF GAME AREAS PROHIBITED

#### Wildlife Act 1953, Section 17

(1) No person shall, with the intention of attracting any game for the purpose of hunting or killing that game,—

(a) Cast, throw, or place, or cause or permit to be cast, thrown, or placed, or assist in casting, throwing, or placing, in or near the margin of any water (including any river, stream, lake, lagoon, pond, estuary, swamp, or other water, whether natural or artificially constructed) any corn, wheat, barley, maize, or other grain, or any products of grain, or any peas or any other food; or

(b) Plant or place in or on any land any corn, wheat, barley, maize, or other grain, or any products of grain, or any peas or other food and thereafter flood that land to form an artificial lake, lagoon, or pond.

(2) Where any society has reason to believe that food of any of the kinds referred to in subsection one of this section has been cast, thrown, placed, or planted in any place referred to in that subsection within the period of one month immediately preceding an open season for game in that place, the society, with the consent of the occupier, may erect or affix a notice in, or in the near vicinity of, that place to the effect that food has been so cast, thrown, placed, or planted, and on any such notice there shall be displayed the date of the erection or affixing of that notice. If the occupier does not consent to the erection or affixing of any such notice, the society may serve written notice upon him requiring him to inform all persons entering on his land for the purpose of hunting or killing game that food has been cast, thrown, placed or planted in that place.

(3) Every person commits an offence against this Act who during any open season hunts or kills game in any place—

(a) In which, or in the near vicinity of which, there is a notice under subsection two of this section erected or affixed during that open season or within the period of one month immediately preceding that open season; or

(b) In which the occupier of the land has informed him that any such food has been cast, thrown, placed, or planted during that open season or within the period of one month immediately preceding that open season; or

(c) In which he otherwise knows any such food has been cast, thrown, placed, or planted during that open season or within the period of one month immediately preceding that open season.

(4) Every person commits an offence against this Act who destroys, defaces, or in any way tampers with any notice erected or affixed under the provisions of subsection two of this section.

(5) Every person commits an offence against this Act who, being an occupier of land and having been served with a notice under subsection two of this section requiring him to inform other persons that food has been cast, thrown, placed, or planted in any place on that land, fails to comply with the terms of the notice.

#### METHOD OF TAKING RESTRICTED

##### *Wildlife Act 1953, Section 18*

(1) Save as otherwise expressly provided in this Act, no person shall—

(a) Trap game in any manner whatever or take any game by means of traps or by any means other than by shooting with a shotgun:

Provided that a dog may be used in conjunction with a shotgun for the purpose of finding, flushing, or retrieving any game:

(b) Erect or set any trap, net, snare, or other device for the purpose of taking any game:

(c) Hunt or kill any game with—

(i) Any swivel gun or punt gun; or

(ii) Any rifle; or

(iii) Any automatic, auto-loading, or repeating shotgun, unless the magazine has been so adjusted in accordance with regulations under this Act that the gun is incapable of holding more than two shells; or

(iv) Any shotgun other than a shoulder gun; or

(v) Any shotgun the gauge of which is greater than that known as twelve gauge:

(d) Use with any shotgun used for the purpose of hunting or killing game—

(i) Any apparatus used for the purpose of silencing the report of a shotgun; or

(ii) Any cartridge of a length exceeding two and three quarter inches:

(e) In hunting or killing any game from any stand, hide, shelter, maimai, mudhole, boat, louvre, or other contrivance, use more than one shotgun:

Provided that any person so engaged may have one, and not more than one, further shotgun in a condition not immediately suitable for use and held for use only in the event of the first shotgun becoming damaged or otherwise unfit for use:

(f) For the purpose of hunting or killing any game use—

(i) Any live decoy; or

(ii) More than ten decoys; or

(iii) Any cylinder or mudhole or similar device in any lake, lagoon, pond, river, estuary, or other open water, whether natural or artificially constructed, unless the sides of the cylinder or mudhole or device project not less than two feet above the surface of water; or

(iv) Any aircraft, motor vehicle, or other vehicle propelled by mechanical power.

Provided that nothing in this subparagraph shall be deemed to prevent any person from using any aircraft or vehicle for the purpose of travelling generally or to any place where he intends to hunt or kill game or of returning from any such place; or

(v) On any lake, lagoon, pond, river, estuary, or other water (whether natural or artificially constructed), any vessel (other than a rowboat) in driving, chasing, unduly disturbing, putting to flight, or stalking any game, whether by himself or by any other person;

Provided that nothing in this subparagraph shall be deemed to prevent any person from using any vessel for camping purposes or for the purpose of travelling generally or to any place where he intends to kill or hunt game or of returning from any such place, or, subject to the foregoing provisions of this paragraph and to the provisions of subparagraph (vi) of this paragraph, to prohibit shooting from a moored vessel or to prohibit the use of any vessel for the purpose of retrieving game that has been killed or wounded:

(vi) Any unmoored floating stand, hide, shelter, maimai, or louvre, or any unmoored boat artificially dressed or covered in any way:

(g) By any means spread oil on any water for the purpose of hunting or killing any game or for the purpose of preventing game from alighting on that water or any part thereof:

(h) Use any light for the purpose of hunting or killing any game.

(2) For the purposes of paragraph (f) of subsection one of this section—

“Decoy” includes any dead game that is so placed or arranged as to simulate the appearance of live game:

“Row boat” means any vessel that for the time being is wholly propelled by oars or paddles or poles:

“Vessel” includes any launch, boat, canoe, punt, or other similar craft, whether propelled by mechanical power or not.

#### LICENCES

##### *Wildlife Act 1953, Section 19*

(1) No person shall hunt or kill game of any species during an open season in any district unless he is the holder of a licence under this Act to hunt or kill game of that species available in that district during that season.

(2) Except as provided in subsection three of this section, every person commits an offence against this Act who, not being the holder of such a licence, hunts or kills any game during any open season.

(3) Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this section, the occupier of any land, and the wife or husband and any one son or daughter of the occupier, may, during an open season, hunt or kill on that land without a licence (but subject to all other restrictions imposed by or under this Act) any game that may lawfully be hunted or killed under a licence in the district within the boundaries of which that land is situated.

##### *Wildlife Act 1953, Section 20*

Nothing in any licence to hunt or kill game shall authorise the holder to hunt or kill game on any land actually and exclusively used by any society for the purposes of this Act or on any wildlife sanctuary, wildlife refuge, or closed game area or on any public domain or recreation reserve within the meaning of the Reserves and Domains Act 1953 or on any reserve within the meaning of Part IV of the Reserves and Domains Act 1953.

##### *Wildlife Act 1953, Section 21*

Except as otherwise expressly provided in this Act, nothing in any licence or other authority under this Act shall entitle the holder to enter upon any land without the consent of the occupier of the land.

#### SHOOTING OF GAME NOT IN FLIGHT PROHIBITED

##### *Wildlife Act 1953, Section 22*

(1) Subject to the provisions of sections fifty-three and fifty-four of this Act, no person shall shoot at or attempt to shoot at any game bird not in flight:

Provided that nothing in this section shall prohibit the killing by shooting when not in flight of any game bird already wounded by shooting.

(2) For the purposes of this section—

(a) A bird shall be deemed to be not in flight at any time when it is alighting on or rising from any water or land or any vegetation or structure in or on any water or on any land and any part of the bird is in contact with the water or land or vegetation or structure:

(b) Subject to paragraph (a) of this subsection, a bird shall be deemed to be in flight at all times when it is airborne including times when it is soaring or banking or swooping, and whether its wings are in motion or not.

(Sections 53 and 54 of the Act referred to in (1) above empowers the Secretary to, among other things, authorise the taking or killing of game for certain purposes during the period when it is not otherwise permitted.)

#### SALE OF GAME OR EGGS OF GAME PROHIBITED

##### *Wildlife Act 1953, Section 23*

(1) Except with the prior consent of the Secretary, no person shall—

(a) Buy or sell any game or the eggs of any game:

(b) For sale or for hire, gain, or reward, or hope thereof, hunt or kill any game or have any game or the eggs of any game in his possession:

(c) Induce any other person to hunt or kill game for the purposes of sale or have any game or the eggs of any game in his possession for the purposes of sale.

Provided that it shall be lawful for any person, pursuant to the prior written authority of the Secretary, and subject to such conditions as may be prescribed therein, to propagate game or to buy or sell game held for the purpose of propagating game or reared pursuant to any such authority, or to take and sell or to buy the eggs of any game to which any such authority relates.

SALE OF SHOOTING RIGHTS PROHIBITED  
*Wildlife Act 1953, Section 23*

(2) No person shall sell or let for fee or reward any right to hunt or kill game on any land or on any water on or adjoining any land.

(3) Where any person for rent or other valuable consideration grants a lease or licence of any duration of land on which or on water adjoining which game is usually prevalent, he shall be deemed for the purposes of subsection two of this section to have let the right to hunt or kill game on that land or on that water, as the case may be, if the Court, having regard to all the circumstances of the case, is satisfied that the sole or principal purpose of the lease or licence was to confer on the lessee or licensee the right to hunt or kill game on that land or water.

DISTURBING STOCK

*Statutes Amendment Act 1947, Section 66 (1)*

(1) Every person commits an offence and is liable to a fine of fifty pounds who, without the authority of the occupier, goes upon any private land with dog or firearm and disturbs any stock depastured thereon.

THE WILDLIFE REGULATIONS 1955

*Licences and Licence Fees*

6. Every applicant for a licence shall furnish his true full name and usual address to the person to whom the application is made, and that information shall be set out in the licence.

7. Every licence shall before issue be signed by the issuing agent by whom the licence is issued or by some person authorized by him to sign on his behalf.

8. No licence shall be valid unless it is in the proper form and has been completed in accordance with regulations 6 and 7 hereof and signed by the applicant, who shall, when those conditions have been complied with, become the licence holder for the purposes of the Act and of these regulations.

9. (1) Where any person commits a breach of the Act or of these regulations or of any notification by the Minister under the Act, the Court in its discretion may, in addition to imposing a fine, declare void and of no effect any licence of that person, and the convicted person shall in such a case forthwith surrender the licence to the Court.

(2) The Court in its discretion may also, in addition to any other penalty, make an order prohibiting the issue of a licence to that person for any period not exceeding two years, and the person in respect of whom any such order is made shall not apply for or otherwise obtain any licence during that period. Any licence obtained by any such person during that period shall be void and of no effect.

12. Where under the provisions of section 61 (2) of the Act any person purporting to be the holder of a licence under these regulations has produced the licence to an authorized person (as defined in section 61 (3) of the Act), he shall, if required by that authorized person, make and give legibly and clearly a specimen signature for comparison with the signature of the holder as shown on the licence.

*Restrictions on Methods of Taking Game*

18. (1) No person shall use any artificial decoy for the purpose of hunting or killing game, unless that decoy is securely anchored.

(2) No person shall place any artificial decoy within 60 yards of any other artificial decoy already set out by any other person.

(3) Every person using artificial decoys shall prevent them from spreading over an area greater than 30 yards square and shall prevent any of them coming within 60 yards of any other artificial decoys already set out by any other person in conformity with subclauses (1) and (2) of this regulation.

19. No person shall hunt or kill game while occupying any stand, hide, shelter, maimai, mudhole, loo, louvre, or position (hereinafter referred to as a stand) which has been duly claimed by any other licence holder in accordance with the following provisions:

(a) A stand may be claimed by the planting thereon, subsequent to such time on such day as is decided by the society, of a stake having either a board or an identifying lable attached having plainly marked thereon the name and the address of the claimant and the number of his licence:

(b) No person shall claim more than one stand:

(c) No stand shall be claimed within 100 yards of a stand which has already been duly claimed by any other person, except with the consent of the last mentioned person:

Provided that any stand not occupied by the claimant within one hour after the opening hour of shooting in that district as prescribed by the Minister's notification may be occupied on that day by any other licence holder:

Provided further that nothing in this regulation shall be deemed to affect in any way whatsoever the rights of the occupier of the land as defined in section 19 (4) of the Act.

20. No person other than the occupier shall shoot within 100 yards of an occupied stand, except with the consent of the occupier.

21. For the purposes of section 18 (1) (c) (iii) of the Act, the magazine of every automatic or auto-loading or repeating shotgun used for hunting or killing game shall be so adjusted that the gun is incapable of holding more than two shells, as follows:

(a) In the case of an automatic or semi-automatic or auto-loading shotgun with a tubular magazine—

(i) By inserting a metal or wooden filler at the muzzle end of the magazine of such dimensions that it cannot be removed without prior removal of a metal pin set transversely through the magazine and riveted at both ends: or

(ii) By inserting a metal pin set transversely through the magazine and riveted at both ends:

(b) In the case of a repeating shotgun with a tubular magazine, by inserting a metal or wooden filler at the muzzle end of the magazine of such dimensions that it cannot be removed without the prior removal of a metal pin set transversely through the magazines and riveted at both ends:

(c) In the case of a repeating shotgun with a box magazine, by inserting a metal pin riveted at both ends and set transversely across and through the magazine:

(d) In the case of any automatic, semi-automatic, autoloading or repeating shotgun of any type other than those specified in paragraphs (a), (b), and (c) of this regulation, it shall be rendered incapable of holding more than two shells by a method which will not allow of a change in the field.

*Freezing Chambers and Canneries*

22. In this Part of these regulations—

“Freezing chamber” means any freezing chamber, cool store, refrigerating works, cannery, or other plant or premises (not being a private dwellinghouse) where any game is frozen, canned, or otherwise preserved or treated or stored:

“Open season” includes the first three days next following the close of an open season.

24. No person shall place, or cause to be placed, in any freezing chamber any game except during the open season for that game in the district in which that game was hunted or killed.

25. No person shall place or keep, or cause to be placed or kept, any game in any freezing chamber except in accordance with the following conditions:

(a) The number of game which may at any one time be so placed or kept, or caused to be so placed or kept, by any one person shall not exceed twenty head in the aggregate:

(b) No game from which the legs have been removed shall be so placed or kept, or be caused to be so placed or kept:

(c) No game shall be so placed or kept, or caused to be so placed or kept, unless there is affixed or tied thereto a lable on which the following particulars are legibly written:

(i) The name and the address of the owner of the game:

(ii) The date on which the game was placed in the freezing chamber:

(iii) The number of the game licence (if any) of the owner of the game:

(iv) If the owner of the game is not the holder of a game licence, such particulars as will indicate the means or manner in which ownership was acquired:

(v) The name of the acclimatisation district in which the game was taken.

*Taxidermists*

29. No person shall hold in possession for the purpose of mounting, preserving, or curing any wildlife included in the First Schedule or Third Schedule to the Act, unless the wildlife has been taken or killed in the open season only for that wildlife or under the written authority of the Secretary. That authority shall be retained by the person in possession of the wildlife, and shall be produced on demand to any officer of the Department.

NOTE: The wildlife included in the First Schedule or Third Schedule of the Wildlife Act 1953 means all the game birds.

*General*

44. Every person commits an offence who commits a breach of or fails to comply with any provision of these regulations, and is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding £50, in addition to any other penalty to which he may be liable.
