(a) May by bylaw do anything which a harbour board may do by bylaw under section 232 of the Act;
(b) May appoint harbourmasters and/or officers and define or limit their powers or duties;
(c) Shall have all the powers, functions, duties, and authorities of a harbour board under the Act as if it were constituted a harbour board;
(d) May expend money out of its general fund or account for the purpose of exercising and performing the control, power, functions, duties, and authorities conferred by this Order in Council.
6 Rylaws made by the Council under the authority of this

6. Bylaws made by the Council under the authority of this Order in Council shall not come into force until they have been approved by the Minister, by notice in the Gazette.

7. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall be in force for 21 years from the day following the date of its notification in the Gazette unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority.

8. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the Council six calendar months' notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the Council in New Zealand.
