HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to sections 8A and 165 of the Harbours Act 1950, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby grants to the Rotorua County Council (hereinafter called the Council) control of the waters and lake beds within the Rotorua County as described in the First Schedule hereto, subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Second Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE

DESCRIPTION OF AREA

All the waters of the lakes within the County of Rotorua and including the Ohau Channel, the Tarawera River for a distance of one half mile down stream from Lake Tarawera, the Kaituna River down stream to the footbridge across same between State Highway 30 and Okere Road, and the area of the Waikato River and its tributaries from the Ohakuri Dam to the confluence of the Paetaetaramoa Stream and the bed of such lakes to a distance of 66 ft from the edge of the lakes at (a) ordinary lake level; or, in respect of waters or lake bed now or hereafter used for hydro-electric purposes, at (b) the maximum design operating level, excepting thereout the bed of Lake Ohakuri and the bed of Lake Rotorua adjoining the Rotorua City boundary and the bed of Lake Rotorua adjoining Whakatane County boundary.

SECOND SCHEDULE

CONDITIONS

- 1. In these conditions the term
 - "Minister" means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act 1952, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

 - "Act" means the Harbours Act 1950.
 "Council" means the Rotorua County Council.
- 2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to those parts of the bed of the lakes as described in the First Schedule hereto.
- 3. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the Council to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any provision of the Harbours Act 1950 or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder, that are or may hereafter be in force.

- 4. The Council may make such bylaws as are necessary for the proper preservation and control of the above-described lake beds and for the proper conduct and clothing of persons bathing in those parts of the lakes or in the vicinity of those parts.
- 5. The Council may, subject to the provisions of sections 176 to 182 of the Harbours Act 1950:
 - (a) Erect or license or permit the erection or continuance on the beds of the lakes described in the First Schedule hereto, or on the beds of the lakes immediately contiguous to that part, of baths, bathhouses, boatsheds, boatbuilding sheds, jetties, slipways, or, with the approval of the Minister, any structure relating to the convenience of shipping or of the public or to any local enterprise or object;
 - (b) Use or license or permit the use of the beds of the lakes described in the First Schedule hereto, or the beds of the lakes immediately contiguous to that part, for any purpose approved by the Minister relating to the convenience of shipping or of the public or to any local enterprise or object;
 - (c) Make bylaws regarding the use of any things erected or continued pursuant to clause (a) of this condition and the use for any purpose approved pursuant to clause (b) of this condition and fixing charges for those uses.
- 6. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the Council to remove or cause to be removed any stones, sand, shingle, or shells without the consent of the Minister being first obtained.
- 7. Subject to the provisions of section 8A of the Act, the Council for and within the area of the waters described in the First Schedule hereto—
 - (a) May, by bylaw, do anything which a Harbour Board may do by bylaw under section 232 of the Act;
 - (b) May appoint harbourmasters and or officers and define or limit their powers or duties;
 - (c) Shall have all the powers, functions, duties, and authorities of a Harbour Board under the Act as if it were constituted a Harbour Board;
 - (d) May expend money out of its general fund or account for the purpose of exercising and performing the control, powers, functions, duties, and authorities conferred by this Order in Council.
- 8. Bylaws made by the Council under the authority of this Order in Council shall not come into force until they have been approved by the Minister, by notice in the Gazette.
- 9. No authority conferred by this Order in Council shall be exercised by the Council in respect of waters or lake bed now or hereafter used for hydro-electric installations, except with the approval of the New Zealand Electricity Department.
- 10. The rights, powers, privileges, control, functions, duties, and authorities conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for 21 years from the day following the date of its notification in the *Gazette*, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, privileges, control, functions, duties, and authorities shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority.
- 11. The said rights, powers, privileges, control, functions, duties, and authorities may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the Council six calendar months' notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the Council in New Zealand.

Provided that, where any woolpacks to which this paragraph applies are obtained by the retailer elsewhere than from such one of the said ports as is most convenient of access to his store, the increase authorised by this paragraph shall not exceed the appropriate proportion of the freight charges that would have been incurred by the retailer if the woolpacks had been obtained from that port and if delivery had been effected at current freight rates.

(2) The maximum prices fixed by the last preceding subclause are fixed as for delivery f.o.r. or f.o.b. as the case may require.

(3) Where any woolpacks are deliverd by a retailer otherwise than f.o.r. or f.o.b., the price that may be charged by the retailer shall be the appropriate price in terms of the foregoing provisions of this clause increased by the amount of the freight charges incurred by him in effecting delivery and then reduced by the amount of those charges that would have been incurred by him if he had delivered the woolpacks f.o.r. or f.o.b. as aforesaid.

(4) Any freight charges imposed by a retailer pursuant to

fo.b. as aforesaid.

(4) Any freight charges imposed by a retailer pursuant to the foregoing provisions of this clause shall be shown separately on the appropriate invoice.

5. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this order, and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any retailer, may authorise special maximum retail prices in respect of any woolpacks, to which this order applies where special circumstances exist, or for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are incurred by the retailer. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a specified lot or consignment of woolpacks or may relate generally to all woolpacks to which this order applies sold by the retailer while the approval remains in force.

Price Order No. 1985 (Nails)

Pursuant to the Control of Prices Act 1947, I, Alfred Gaynor Beadle, pursuant to a delegation from the Secretary of Industries and Commerce, acting under a delegation from the Price Tribunal, hereby make the following price order:

- 1. This order may be cited as Price Order No. 1985, and shall come into force on the 20th day of August 1965.
- 2. (1) Price Order No. 1956* is hereby revoked
- (2) The revocation of the said order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this order.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

3. This order applies with respect to nails of the kinds and gauges specified in the Schedule hereto.

FIXING MAXIMUM WHOLESALE AND RETAIL PRICES FOR NAILS TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

Wholesalers' Prices

- 4. The maximum price that may be charged or received by any wholesaler for any nails to which this order applies shall be determined as follows:
 - (a) For nails sold by a wholesaler whose place of business is situate in any of the cities of Auckland, Wellington, Christchurch, or Dunedin, the maximum wholesale price shall be the appropriate price fixed in the Schedule hereto:
 - (b) For nails sold by any other wholesaler, the maximum wholesale price shall be the appropriate price fixed in the Schedule hereto increased by a proportionate part of any freight charges incurred by the wholesaler in obtaining delivery into his premises.

Retailers' Prices

- 5. The maximum price that may be charged or received by any retailer for any nails to which this order applies shall be determined as follows:
 - (a) For nails sold by a retailer whose place of business is situate in any of the cities of Auckland, Wellington, Christchurch, or Dunedin, the maximum retail price shall be the appropriate price fixed in the Schedule hereto:
 - (b) For nails sold by any other retailer, the maximum retail price shall be the appropriate price fixed in the Schedule hereto increased by a proportionate part of any freight charges paid by the retailer to the wholesaler from whom the nails were purchased or incurred by the retailer in obtaining delivery into his premises.
- 6. If in respect of any lot of nails sold by a retailer the maximum retail price calculated in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this order is not an exact number of pence or halfpence, the maximum price of the lot shall be calculated to the next upward halfpenny.

Special Prices Where Extraordinary Charges Incurred

7. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this order and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any wholesaler or retailer, may authorise special maximum prices in respect of any nails to which this order applies where special circumstances exist, or for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are incurred by the wholesaler or retailer. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a specified lot or consignment of nails, or may relate generally to all nails to which this order applies sold by the wholesaler or retailer while the approval remains in force.

DUTY IMPOSED ON WHOLESALERS

8. Every wholesaler who sells any nails to which this order applies shall specify in the relative invoice with respect to each lot of nails sold the quantity, the gauge, and the length of the nails.

The "normal" refers to the present site of the instruments. The standard periods for normals are: for temperature 1931-60, for rainfall 1921-50, and for sunshine 1935-60. No normals are available for stations with only short records.

Notes on the Weather for July 1965

General: July was unusually cold, especially in the North Island. It was also notable for the amount of snowfall. The severe winter weather caused a shortage of feed in parts of the North Island but stock remained in good condition.

Rainfall: Rainfall was mainly close to the average value. However, in Gisborne and Hawke's Bay, about the Southern Alps, and in coastal Otago it was only three-quarters of the average. On the other hand, in parts of Manawatu and coastal Canterbury it was more than 50 per cent wetter than usual.

Temperatures: Temperatures were mainly 1-2 degrees below average. However, departures of 2-4 degrees were recorded in two areas, namely, Waikato with western Bay of Plenty, and

southern Hawke's Bay with parts of Manawatu and central Hawke's Bay. For Te Aroha, Hastings, Palmerston North, and Wellington it was the coldest month since July 1939.

The main snowfall was in the last two to three days of the month, when many parts of the North Island high country were affected, as far north as Waitekauri, near Waihi. About the southern Purples and t ern Ruahines falls of up to a foot were reported, with snow still falling at the beginning of August. In inland Canterbury and parts of Otago considerable snow was also reported from the 7th to the 11th. In parts of inland Canterbury snow was lying for nearly the whole month.

Sunshine: Sunshine was 15 to 30 hours below average in the North Island from Wanganui and Waipukurau southward, also in Northland and Central Otago. Elsewhere it was mainly close to average. However, the Auckland district and South Westland were favoured with a surplus of more than 20 hours.

Weather Sequence: During the first two days of the month a large anticyclone covered most of the Tasman Sea and extended on to the South Island. However, a large depression was centred to the north-east and pressures were also low to the south of the Chatham Islands. The cold southerlies and south-easterlies which had commenced in the last week of June persisted at first in July, with rain from Wellington to East Cape. As the depressions moved away on the 3rd and 4th the anticyclone covered the whole country, with fine but frosty weather.

with fine but frosty weather.

Conditions deteriorated on the 5th on the West Coast and in parts of Southland as a depression passed not far to the south and the associated trough of low pressure moved on to the South Island.

During the next two days a depression moved on to the North During the next two days a depression moved on to the North Island and rain became fairly general, though still missing some eastern districts. A change to south-easterly winds behind another trough of low pressure brought colder temperatures from the 8th to the 11th, with rain extending to eastern districts, while a clearance occurred soon on the West Coast and later in Taranaki. Snow was reported in the MacKenzie country of inland Canterbury and on the North Island high country. A brief respite occurred for most of the country on the 12th under the influence of a ridge of high pressure.

most of the country on the 12th under the influence of a ridge of high pressure.

During the next two days light rain set in over the Auckland Province and on the West Coast with the approach of a depression across the North Tasman Sea. As the depression crossed the country on the 15th rain became general, though mainly light in eastern districts, and conditions remained unsettled, especially in western districts, on the following day with the depression to the east of the North Island. Further rain was reported from most districts during the passage of a trough of low pressure on the 17th and 18th. However, Northland, Bay of Plenty, and Canterbury were not affected. affected.

An anticyclone moved from the Tasman Sea across New Zealand and to the east from the 19th to the 22nd. This was welcomed as a period of mainly fair weather. However, rain was reported at times on the West Coast and in Southland.

There was a general deterioration in the weather as a depression

moved from the Tasman Sea on to the North Island during the 23rd and 24th. The rain was heavy in some northern and western districts of both Islands. As the depression moved slowly southeastward during the next two days the weather cleared in Northland, Central Otago, and most of Fiordland. A weak ridge brought fair

Central Otago, and most of Fiordland. A weak ridge brought fair weather on the 27th, except on the West Coast.

General rain set in, except in eastern districts of the North Island, with the passage of a trough of low pressure and associated small depression on the 28th. During the last three days of the month this depression deepened to the east while pressures rose over the South Tasman Sea. Strong southerlies set in, with very cold temperatures and snow in many districts, especially in the North Island high country. Precipitation was general at first, but a clearance soon occurred on the West Coast. The cold snowy weather was to persist for several days of August in central and eastern districts of the North Island.
