6. This licence shall, unless it is sooner lawfully determined, continue in force until the 31st day of March 1987.

Revocation of General Court Martial Warrant Given Under Section 6 of the Visiting Forces Act 1939

To the General Officer Commanding Land Forces, Hong Kong.

WHEREAS, I am empowered by the New Zealand Army Act 1950 to authorise and empower you from time to time and as occasion may require to convene general Courts Martial for the trial of any person subject to military law who is charged with an offence for which such person may be tried by general Court Martial and to confirm the findings and sentences of such Courts Martial, and also to authorise and empower you to delegate such of these powers as you may think fit to any officer under your command or jurisdiction not below the rank of field officer:

And whereas, by my Warrant dated the 17th day of July 1956, the power and authority as aforesaid was granted to you:

And whereas the reasons which gave rise to that Warrant no longer exist:

Now, therefore, I, Brigadier Sir Bernard Edward Fergusson, the Governor-General of New Zealand, do hereby cancel and revoke the said Warrant dated the 17th day of July 1956 and all Warrants issued thereunder.

General Court Martial Warrant Under Section 6 of the Visiting Forces Act 1939

BERNARD FERGUSON, Governor-General

To the Director of Operations/Commander Land Forces, Borneo, or the officer for the time being acting as Director of Operations/Commander Land Forces, Borneo.

WHEREAS, by section 6 (4) (b) of the Visiting Forces Act 1939 (New Zealand), it is provided that, when a home force and another force are acting in combination, any officer of the other force duly appointed to command the combined force, or any part thereof, shall be treated and shall have over members of the home force the like powers of command and punishment, and may be invested with the like authority to convene and confirm the findings and sentences of Courts Martial as if he were an officer of the home force of relative rank and holding the same command:

And whereas, by the New Zealand Army Regular Force (Visiting Forces) Order 1955, issued pursuant to section 6 (5) of the aforesaid Act, it was declared that the portion of the New Zealand Army Regular Force that is for the time being serving as part of the Far East Land Forces is serving together and acting in combination with the portions of the military forces of Her Majesty, other than those raised in New Zealand, to which section 6 of the Visiting Forces Act 1939 applies, and with which the said portion of the New Zealand Army Regular Force is for the time being serving as part of the Far East Land Forces:

And whereas the aforesaid order remains in full force and effect:

And whereas you have been for the time being appointed to be Director of Operations and to command that part of the Far East Land Forces being the Land Forces, Borneo.

Now, therefore, pursuant to the New Zealand Army Act 1950 and the Visiting Forces Act 1939, I, Brigadier Sir Bernard Edward Fergusson, the Governor-General of New Zealand, hereby authorise and empower you, from time to time and as occasion may require, to convene general Courts Martial for the trial of such persons subject to military law as members of the aforesaid portion of the New Zealand Army Regular Force as are for the time being under or within the territorial limits of your command who shall be charged with any offence against the New Zealand Army Act for which they may be tried by Court Martial, whether such offence shall have been committed before or after the date of this Warrant or the date you shall have taken upon yourself the command, and I do hereby authorise and empower you to confirm the findings and sentences of district Courts Martial, but not the power to confirm the findings and sentences of general Courts Martial nor to confirm any sentence of discharge with ignominy from Her Majesty's service, and imprisonment or detention exceeding 12 months, or any greater punishment, and to cause any sentence thereof to be put into execution so far as you may lawfully so do under New Zealand military law:

And I do hereby further authorise and empower you to delegate to any officer under your command or jurisdiction not below the rank of field officer a general authority to convene general Courts Martial for the trial of such persons subject to military law as members of the aforesaid portion of the New Zealand Army Regular Force as are for the time being under or within the territorial limits of his command, whether the offences shall have been committed before or after such officer shall have taken upon him his command, but not the power to confirm the findings and sentences of such Courts Martial:

I direct that the proceedings of every general Court Martial, or of every district Court Martial, where power to confirm is restricted by the terms of this Warrant, convened by you or by that last-mentioned officer, shall be reserved for confirmation by the General Officer Commanding-in-Chief, Far East Land Forces, or by the Adjutant-General of the New Zealand Army, in accordance with this Warrant:

And lastly I authorise and empower you to appoint and to delegate to any qualified officer as aforesaid the power of appointing a fit and proper person from time to time for executing the office of Judge Advocate at any such Court Martial for the more orderly proceedings of the same:

And for executing the several powers, matters, and things herein expressed, this Warrant shall be to you, and to others whom it may concern, a sufficient Warrant and authority:

And I declare that this Warrant shall, without ratification, extend to and invest with the aforesaid authorities and powers your successors and any officer for the time being appointed as Acting Director of Operations/Commander Land Forces, Borneo.

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THE CHARITABLE TRUSTS ACT 1957

NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR APPROVAL OF SCHEME

NOTICE is hereby given that the Public Trustee, as trustee of the will of Daniel Kennedy, late of Dannevirke, retired farmer, deceased, has filed in the office of the Supreme Court at Wellington an application for approval of a scheme under this Act.

By his will Daniel Kennedy gave his residuary estate to the Public Trustee upon trust for the Roman Catholic Convent School at Dannevirke and directed that the residuary estate, both income and capital, should be expended in the erection or purchase of buildings, in the purchase of land, in the purchase of food, clothes and books for the scholars, and in the purchase of other articles required for the proper and efficient working of the school.

The scheme is designed to widen the charitable purposes of the trust by authorising the application of income and capital not only in the ways mentioned above but also for or towards the maintenance, repair, renovation, improvement, extension or alteration of the premises, equipment, sporting and recreational facilities, and other property of the school or the formation, laying out, construction or restoration of playing fields, pitches, courts, and other facilities for games and recreation in connection with the school.

The scheme retains the provisions of the will appointing the Reverend Mother Superior for the time being of the school and the Parish Priest for the time being of the Parish of Dannevirke to be advisory trustees. The scheme provides for the Public Trustee to have, in addition to other powers conferred on him by the will or by law, power to purchase land, to demolish or erect buildings or improve or develop trust property and to set aside reserve funds from the trust income. The scheme declares that the trustee shall have all of the powers conferred on him by the will and by law and also certain additional powers.

Copies of the application, the scheme, and the report of the Attorney-General may be inspected, free of charge, at the office of the Registrar of the Supreme Court, Wellington, and at the Public Trust Offices, Dannevirke and Wellington. The date proposed for the hearing of the application is 4 May 1966. Any person desiring to oppose the scheme is hereby required to give written notice of his intention to do so to the Registrar of the Supreme Court at Wellington and to the Public Trustee, Wellington, and to the Attorney-General at least seven clear days before that date.

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
