*Granting Control of the Foreshore at Mowhanau Beach, Wanganui, to the Nukumar Domain Board*

THE RIGHT HON. KEITH HOLYOAKE, C.H., PRESIDING IN COUNCIL  
PURSUANT to section 165 of the Harbours Act 1950, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby grants to the Nukumar Domain Board (hereinafter called the Board) control of the foreshore as described in the First Schedule hereto, subject to the terms and conditions set forth in the Second Schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE

DESCRIPTION OF AREA

ALL that area in the Wellington Land District, being the foreshore in Blocks XIVA and XVA, Nukumar Survey District, between the right bank of the Kai Iwi Stream and the left bank of the Mowhanau Stream. As illustrated on a plan deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington and marked M.D. 12236.

SECOND SCHEDULE

CONDITIONS

1. In these conditions the term—

“Foreshore” means such parts of the bed, shore, or banks of a tidal water as are covered and uncovered by the flow and ebb of the tide at ordinary spring tides:

“Minister” means the Minister of Marine as defined by the Shipping and Seamen Act 1952, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction of such Minister.

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall extend and apply only to those parts of the foreshore as described in the First Schedule hereto.

3. Her Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, over, and out of the said foreshore without payment.

4. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the Board to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or with any provision of the Harbours Act 1950 or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder that are or may hereafter be in force.

5. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by the Order in Council shall not apply to those portions of the foreshore required for securing the shore ends of any telegraph cables that are at present or may be at any time laid down within the said area of foreshore.

6. The Board may make such bylaws as are necessary for the proper preservation and control of the said foreshore and for the proper conduct and clothing of persons bathing on that foreshore or in the vicinity of that foreshore.

7. The Board may, subject to the provisions of sections 176 to 182 of the Harbours Act 1950:

(a) Erect or license or permit the erection or continuance on the foreshore described in the First Schedule hereto, or on the bed of the harbour or of the sea immediately contiguous to that foreshore, of baths, bathhouses, boatsheds, boatbuilding sheds, jetties, slipways, or, with the approval of the Minister, any structures relating to the convenience of shipping or of the public or to any local enterprise or object:

(b) Use or license or permit the use of the foreshore described in the First Schedule hereto, or the bed of the harbour or of the sea immediately contiguous to that foreshore, for any purpose approved by the Minister relating to the convenience of shipping or of the public or to any local enterprise or object.

(c) Make bylaws regulating the use of any things erected or continued pursuant to clause (a) of this condition and the use for any purpose approved pursuant to clause (b) of this condition, and fixing charges for those uses.

Provided that the Board shall not erect or grant a licence or permit for the erection or continuance of any structures on foreshore adjoining land under the control of a National Park Board or Scenic Board, except with the consent of such Board.

8. The Board may enclose any part or parts of the foreshore described in the First Schedule hereto for the purpose of holding athletic sports or games, and may by bylaw fix a charge for admission to such enclosed part or parts: Provided that the total number of days on which such enclosures are made shall not exceed six in any one year.

9. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the Council to remove or cause to be removed any stone, shingle, shells, or other material without the consent of the Minister being first obtained.

10. Bylaws made by the Board under the authority of this Order in Council shall not come into force until they have been approved by the Minister by notice in the *Gazette*.

11. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by or under this Order in Council shall be in force for 21 years from the day following the date of its notification in the *Gazette* unless in the meantime such rights, powers, and privileges shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority.

12. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the Board six calendar months' notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the Board in New Zealand.

ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Otahuhu College Board of Governors Order 1966.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 1st day of October 1966.

2. The Board of Governors of Otahuhu College shall be constituted as follows:

- (a) One member appointed by the Auckland Education Board;
- (b) Six members elected by the parents of the pupils attending the school, of which members at least two shall be women;
- (c) One member elected by the members of the school committees of the Otara Intermediate School, the Otahuhu Intermediate School, the Mangere Intermediate School, and the Papatoetoe Intermediate School;
- (d) One member appointed by the Otahuhu College Old Students Association;
- (e) Two members co-opted by the Board of Governors itself, if and when it thinks fit;

3. The Minister of Education may from time to time, by notice in the *Gazette*, amend the list of schools to which paragraph (c) of clause 2 of this order applies.

4. The Order in Council constituting the Board of Managers of Otahuhu College made on the 27th day of August 1958\* and the Order in Council amending the constitution of the Board of Managers of Otahuhu College made on the 29th day of August 1962† are hereby revoked.

PURSUANT to sections 50 and 51 of the Education Act 1964, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the King Edward Technical High School Board of Governors Order 1966.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 1st day of August 1966.

2. The Board of Governors of the school formerly known as King Edward Technical College and now known as King Edward Technical High School shall be constituted as follows:

- (a) Two members appointed by the Otago Education Board;
- (b) Five members elected by the parents of the pupils attending the school;
- (c) Two members elected by the Dunedin City Council, the Green Island Borough Council, the Mosgiel Borough Council, the Peninsula County Council, the Port Chalmers Borough Council, the St. Kilda Borough Council, the Taieri County Council, and the Waikouaiti County Council;

(d) One member elected by the associations of employees in local industries;

(e) One member elected by the associations of employers in local industries;

(f) One member appointed by the Otago Polytechnic Council.

3. The Minister of Education may, from time to time, by notice in the *Gazette*, amend the list of local bodies to which paragraph (c) of clause 2 of this order applies.

The heads must not be further worked except that a pilot hole may be drilled in the shank, such hole to be reamed and the shank to be tapered in New Zealand. Heads in the rough but without pilot holes, being instead lightly ground or lightly turned on the shank, are to be admitted under the above decision)

Golf club heads, wooden, rough turned but not further manufactured

Overlays, being small pieces of timber shaped or bent to fit the throat portion of tennis and similar racquets

Rectangular sheets of pimpled rubber, backed or faced with sponge rubber, on declaration by a manufacturer for use by him only in making table tennis bats

Timber, sawn or bent into strips, but otherwise unworked declared by a manufacturer for use by him, only in making bends or frames for tennis, badminton, and similar racquets (SPECIFIC KIND OF TIMBER MUST BE SHOWN ON APPLICATIONS)

Willow clefts or billets, being pieces of willow split from the log in lengths, each sufficient to make one cricket bat

Wooden billets, rough sawn but not otherwise worked, specially suited for making heads for golf clubs

## Springs—

Bushes of the following kinds declared by a manufacturer for use by him only in making laminated undercarriage springs for motor vehicles—

(a) Steel and rubber

NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR MAY 1966

**General:** Barometers were low over and to the east of the North Island during May, and there was an unusually high frequency of southerly to easterly winds. It was a cold month but conditions were particularly pleasant on the West Coast. Farmers found it a good month for stock, though in some areas growth was affected by frosts and in Northland and Auckland the ground was becoming rather too wet.

**Rainfall:** On the West Coast it was by far the driest May on record, with less than a quarter of the average rainfall. It was also exceptionally dry in the Alps, the Canterbury high country, and Central Otago. Rainfall was also somewhat below average in Southland and Nelson and in the North Island west of the main ranges from Hamilton and Opotiki to Levin.

In eastern districts from Oamaru to East Cape, about Cook Strait, and in Northland and Auckland rainfall was above average. The surplus exceeded 50 per cent in Wairarapa, Wellington, most of Marlborough, and the North Canterbury coast, also in Coromandel. Over most of Marlborough more than two-thirds of the month's rain, amounting to 4-10 in. fell on the 23rd during the passage of a deep depression across the North Island. Flooding disrupted road and rail transport between Blenheim and Kaikoura.

**Temperature:** Temperatures were mainly below average by about 1-2 degrees, highest departures being in Manawatu. On the West Coast they were close to average.

The second half of the month was much colder than the first half. Two spells of cold southerlies brought snow to the ranges and some of the North Island high country from 17-20th and on 25, 26th respectively.

**Sunshine:** Northern and western districts of both Islands together with parts of Southland were favoured with more sunshine than usual, mainly by 20-30 hours. Eastern districts from Balclutha to East Cape received less than average by a similar amount.

**Weather Sequence:** There was widespread rain on the 1st as a depression from the North Tasman Sea crossed the North Island and another depression passed far to the south. The weather cleared over most of the South Island on the following day but remained unsettled in the north with the depression near Auckland. Rain persisted for two more days in Gisborne, Coromandel, and parts of Northland as the depression departed to the north-east; but elsewhere the weather was fine under the influence of a ridge of high pressure extending from an anticyclone over the Tasman Sea.

As this anticyclone moved slowly eastward over the country from the 5th to the 7th, isolated showers persisted in Northland and Gisborne.

By the 8th the anticyclone was centred to the south-west of the South Island and two depressions were centred to the east and west of Northland respectively. During this and the next three days the second depression moved eastward, with rain in northern districts, also in Gisborne and Hawke's Bay, and light falls later in other eastern districts. During the 12th and 13th another depression from the Central Tasman Sea crossed Northland. Rain persisted in northern districts and spread to some other areas, including parts of the South Island.

A spell of generally fair weather was experienced on the 14th and 15th with a ridge of high pressure over the South Island, except for some deterioration on the West Coast and in Southland late on the 15th with the approach of a trough of low pressure.

The trough crossed the country during the 16th and 17th with fairly general rain, soon clearing however over most of the South Island with the advance of a ridge of high pressure. Southerlies developed over the North Island and temperatures became colder, with snow on the high country. These cold southerlies persisted for three more days as a depression formed to the east and remained stationary near the Chatham Islands. Rain affected most eastern districts from Christchurch to East Cape (except for parts of Hawke's Bay) and also the area about Cook Strait. However, a ridge of high pressure extending from the north brought better weather on the 21st.

From the 22nd to the 24th a depression from the North Tasman Sea crossed the North Island with widespread rain except on the West Coast. Some very heavy falls were recorded in Marlborough, with flooding on the Kaikoura coast. For the next two days the depression remained almost stationary east of Hawke's Bay and cold southerlies brought rain to most eastern districts and the Cook Strait area and snow again to the high country. From the 27th to the 29th the depression moved southward, another trough crossed the country, and a second centre developed north-east of East Cape. There was some more general rain, followed by cold southerlies once again with rain mainly about Cook Strait and in Northland.

The last two days of the month were favoured with improved weather as an anticyclone moved on to the North Island.
