PURSUANT to the Rabbits Act 1955, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Waitemata Rabbit District Order 1966.

(2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

2. The boundaries of the Waitemata Rabbit District, which was constituted by Order in Council on the 12th day of April 1951* are hereby altered and redefined and, as from the commencement of this order, the boundaries of the said district shall be those specified in the Schedule hereto.

Gazette*, 1930, page 3748, all the aforesaid allotments being of Paremoremo Parish, to and along the northern and western sides of a public road forming the northern boundary of Section 3, Block VI aforesaid and of part Allotment 69, Paremoremo Parish, the northern and western boundaries of Section 2, Block VI aforesaid, and the northern and western boundaries of Allotment 222, Paremoremo Parish, to the easternmost corner of Section 65H, Riverhead Homestead Settlement; thence along the generally eastern and southern boundaries of Section 65H, the southern boundary of Section 64H, the northern end of a public road, the southern boundary of Section 63H, the eastern and south-western boundaries of Section 66H and the southern boundary of Section 62H, crossing a public road, all the aforesaid sections being of the Riverhead Homestead Settlement, and along the southern boundary of that part Allotment 160, Paremoremo Parish, taken for State forest by Proclamation published in *N.Z. Gazette*, 1929, page 2415, the southern and western boundaries of part Allotment 48 to and along the southern boundaries of parts Allotments 88 and 80, the eastern and southern boundaries of part Allotment 64, and the southern and western boundaries of part Allotment 61, all the aforesaid allotments being of Paremoremo Parish and taken for State forest by Proclamation published in *N.Z. Gazette*, 1930, page 737, and along the southern boundary of Section 60H, Riverhead Homestead Settlement, to the eastern boundary of Lot 7, D. P. 19511; thence southerly along that eastern boundary and its production to the left bank of the Kumeu River; thence westerly generally along that left bank to and along the left bank of the Kaipara River to and along the south-western boundary of Lot 1, D.P. 13290, and the production of that boundary across the North Auckland Railway to and still westerly along the generally northern side of State Highway No. 16 to and down the middle of the Waipatukahu Stream in Block VI, Kumeu Survey District to and down the middle of the Kaipara River to a point in the middle of that part of the said river adjoining the south-western corner of the Borough of Helensville as described in *N.Z. Gazette*, 1947, page 157, in line with the western part of the southern boundary of that borough; thence easterly to and along that southern boundary, and then northerly and westerly along the generally eastern and northern boundaries of the said borough, to and northerly along the right bank of the Kaipara River to and still northerly and then easterly and southerly generally along the boundary of the Waitemata County as described in *N.Z. 1. In the case of creamery butter to which is assigned one or other of the following respective grades and which is allotted points in grading within the range of the following respective grade points under the Dairy Produce Regulations 1938—

- (a) For "Finest" grade, 94 points or over, the price of 31·261d. per pound.
- (b) For "Finest" grade, 93 points or over but under 94 points, the basic price of 31·061d. per pound:
- (c) For "First" grade, 92 points or over but under 93 points, the price of 30·861d. per pound:
- (d) For "First" grade, 90 points or over but under 92 points, the price of 30·311d. per pound:
- (e) For "Second" grade, the price of 29·061d. per pound:
- (f) For "Third" grade, the price of 25·061d. per pound:

2. In the case of whey butter to which is assigned one or other of the following grades under the said regulations—

- (a) For "First" grade, the price of 29·061d. per pound:
- (b) For "Second" grade, the price of 28·561d. per pound.

3. Butter shall be packed in boxes each containing a net weight of 56 lb 2 oz of actual butter, excluding wrapping paper.

4. In computing the weight of butter for which payment is to be made by the Board the weight of all butter comprised in any consignment submitted for grading under the said regulations shall be ascertained as follows:

- (a) Each box of butter containing a net weight of 56 lb 2 oz of actual butter, excluding wrapping paper, shall, subject as hereinafter provided, be computed at 56 lb:
- (b) The weight of all butter in any such consignment shall be determined on the basis of the weight as ascertained by the grader of the several boxes selected by him for weighing and set out in the Grader's Certificate issued in respect of that consignment, and the boxes of butter so weighed shall be taken as fixing the average weight for the whole quantity of butter comprised in such certificate, overweights being averaged with underweights in each such certificate in relation to the prescribed weight of 56 lb 2 oz per box:
- (c) If the average weight ascertained as aforesaid of the butter comprised in any Grader's Certificate be less than 56 lb 2 oz per box, such deficiency shall be deducted from a weight of 56 lb per box for the purpose of computing payment therefor:
- (d) If the average weight ascertained as aforesaid of the butter comprised in any Grader's Certificate exceeds the prescribed weight of 56 lb 2 oz per box, then the amount of such excess shall not be taken into account for the purpose of computing payment therefor.

5. The prices fixed by the Authority shall not be paid for any butter manufactured otherwise than in compliance with the said regulations.

6. The price to be paid by the Board for any butter which, with the approval or at the request of the Board, is manufactured, prepared, or packed in special containers, or in special quantities, or otherwise in any special manner, shall be the appropriate price payable for that butter as hereinbefore provided adjusted by such appropriate addition or reduction as corresponds with the additional costs or the reduced costs incurred in such special manufacture, preparation, or packing. Any such approval or request of the Board may include a stipulation limiting the additional cost to be incurred and may dispense with the requirements of paragraphs 3 and 4 hereof, and, in that event, payment shall be made for the actual net weight of the butter exported. The adjustment to prices referred to in this paragraph shall be computed by the Board and the computation of the Board shall be final.

- (a) For "Finest" grade, 94 points or over, the price of 20·521d. per pound:
- (b) For "Finest" grade, 93 points or over but under 94 points, the price of 20·271d. per pound:
- (c) For "First" grade, 92 points or over but under 93 points, the basic price of 19·271d. per pound:
- (d) For "First" grade, 91 points or over but under 92 points, the price of 19·021d. per pound:
- (e) For "Graded", 88 points or over but under 91 points, the price of 18·021d. per pound:
- (f) For "Seconds", 80 points or over but under 88 points, the price of 15·521d. per pound.

2. In the appropriate cases there shall be deducted from the prices fixed in paragraph 1 hereof the following amounts where cheese finish points have been deducted in the Grader's Certificate:

- $\frac{1}{2}$ point deduction—1s. 8d. per crate.
- 1 point deduction—2s. 6d. per crate.
- $1\frac{1}{2}$ points deduction—4s. 2d. per crate.
- 2 points deduction—6s. 8d. per crate.
- $2\frac{1}{2}$ points deduction—10s. per crate.

3. In the appropriate cases the following amounts shall be added to or deducted from the prices fixed in paragraph 1 hereof where cheese has been classified by the Department of Agriculture in respect of cheese sediment test:

Classification A—an addition of 0.125d. per pound.

Classification B—no alteration.

Classification C—a deduction of 0.0625d. per pound.

Classification D—a deduction of 0.125d. per pound.

4. Cheese shall be packed two cheeses to each crate. Every cheese shall weigh not less than 70 lb and not more than 90 lb.

5. In computing the weight of cheese for which payment is to be made by the Board, the weight of all cheese comprised in any consignment submitted for grading under the said regulations shall be ascertained as follows:

- (a) The weight of all cheese in any such consignment shall be determined on the basis of the weight as ascertained by the grader of several crates of cheese selected by him for weighing and set out in the Grader's Certificate issued in respect of that consignment, and the crates of cheese so weighed shall be taken as fixing the average weight for the whole quantity of cheese comprised in such certificate, overweights being averaged with underweights in relation to the respective packed weights as set out in such certificate:
- (b) If the average weight ascertained as aforesaid of the crates of cheese comprised in any Grader's Certificate be less than the average of the marked weights thereof as set out in such certificate, then payment shall be made for the cheese comprised in that certificate on the basis of the average weight so ascertained:
- (c) If the average weight ascertained as aforesaid of the crates of cheese comprised in any Grader's Certificate exceeds the average of the marked weights thereof as set out in such certificate, then the amount of such excess shall not be taken into account for the purposes of computing payment therefor:

(d) From the total weight computed as aforesaid of the cheese comprised in any Grader's Certificate there shall be deducted by way of shrinkage allowance such amount in respect of any particular brand or class of cheese as the Board may from time to time determine.

6. The prices fixed by the Board shall not be paid for any cheese manufactured otherwise than in compliance with the said regulations.

7. The price to be paid by the Board for unwaxed cheese shall be the appropriate price payable for waxed cheese as hereinbefore provided reduced by such amount as corresponds with the reduced costs incurred in the manufacture of such unwaxed cheese and the allowance for loss in weight due to shrinkage. The reduction referred to in this paragraph shall be computed by the Board and the computation of the Board shall be final.

8. The price to be paid by the Board for any cheese which, with the approval or at the request of the Board, is manufactured, prepared, or packed in special containers, or in special quantities, or otherwise in any special manner, shall be the appropriate price payable for that cheese as hereinbefore provided adjusted by such appropriate addition or reduction as corresponds with the additional costs or the reduced costs incurred in such special manufacture, preparation, or packing. Any such approval or request of the Board may include a stipulation limiting the additional cost to be incurred and may dispense with the requirements of paragraphs 4 and 5 hereof, and, in that event payment shall be made for the actual net weight of the cheese exported. The adjustment to prices referred to in this paragraph shall be computed by the Board and the computation of the Board shall be final.

Price Order No. 2013 (Phosphatic Fertilisers)

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act 1947, the Price Tribunal hereby makes the following price order:

1. This order may be cited as Price Order No. 2013, and shall come into force on the 1st day of July 1966.
2. (1) Price Order No. 1988* is hereby revoked.
(2) The revocation of the said order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this order.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

3. (1) Subject to the next succeeding subclause, this order applies with respect to phosphatic fertilisers of the following kinds manufactured or prepared in New Zealand and sold for use in New Zealand.

- (a) Superphosphate, including granular.
 - (b) Serpentine superphosphate comprising 15 cwt of superphosphate and 5 cwt of ground serpentine rock per ton.
 - (c) Reverted superphosphate comprising 15 cwt of superphosphate and 5 cwt of carbonate of lime per ton.
 - (d) Aerial superphosphate comprising 18 cwt of superphosphate and 2 cwt of serpentine rock per ton.
 - (e) Finely ground rock phosphate.
- (2) Nothing in this order shall apply with respect to any phosphatic fertilisers sold in a quantity of less than one ton.

FIXING MAXIMUM PRICES OF PHOSPHATIC FERTILISERS TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

4. (1) The prices for phosphatic fertilisers fixed by this order are fixed in respect of sales of the following classes, namely:
 - (a) Sales to a user—that is to say, to a person purchasing for his own use and not for the purpose of resale.
 - (b) Sales to a storekeeper—that is to say, to a person (not being a merchant, dairy company, or farmers' organisation as hereinafter mentioned) purchasing solely for resale to users.
 - (c) Sales to a merchant—that is to say, to a person purchasing for resale to storekeepers or to users.
 - (d) Sales to a dairy company, as defined in section 2 of the Dairy Industry Act 1952, purchasing solely for resale to persons being suppliers of milk or cream to the company.
 - (e) Sales to an incorporated farmers' organisation, having a retail department conducted on a cooperative basis, and purchasing phosphatic fertilisers solely for the purpose of resale to its members.
- (2) The prices for phosphatic fertilisers fixed by this order are fixed in respect of sales for cash or for credit until a date not later than the 20th day of the month next following the month of delivery.
- (3) Where any sale is made on terms allowing credit for a longer period than that mentioned in the last preceding subclause, the purchaser shall be entitled, notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the contract of sale, to the benefit of the prices fixed by this order if in fact payment is made not later than the 20th day of the month next following the month of delivery.
5. (1) Where any phosphatic fertilisers manufactured in the South Island are sold for delivery "ex works" or "free on rail" at Burnside, or Ravensbourne, the maximum price that may be charged or received shall be the appropriate price specified in the First Schedule hereto.
(2) Where any phosphatic fertilisers manufactured in the South Island at Hornby are sold for delivery "ex works" or "free on rail" at that place, the maximum price that may be charged or received shall be the appropriate price specified in the Second Schedule hereto.
(3) Where any phosphatic fertilisers manufactured in the North Island are sold for delivery "ex works" or "free on rail" at Otahuhu, Smart Road (New Plymouth), Te Papapa, or Westfield, the maximum price that may be charged or received shall be the appropriate price specified in the Third Schedule hereto.

(4) Where any phosphatic fertilisers manufactured in the North Island at Aramoho are sold for delivery "ex works" or "free on rail" at that place, the maximum price that may be charged or received shall be the appropriate price specified in the Fourth Schedule hereto.

(5) Where any phosphatic fertilisers manufactured in the North Island at Awatoto are sold for delivery "ex works" or "free on rail" at that place, the maximum price that may be charged or received shall be the appropriate price specified in the Fifth Schedule hereto.

(6) Where any phosphatic fertilisers manufactured in the North Island at Morrinsville are sold for delivery "ex works" or "free on rail" at that place, the maximum price that may be charged or received shall be the appropriate price specified in the Sixth Schedule hereto.

(7) Where any phosphatic fertilisers manufactured in the South Island at Awarua are sold for delivery "ex works" or "free on rail" at that place, the maximum price that may be charged or received shall be the appropriate price specified in the Seventh Schedule hereto.

(8) Where any phosphatic fertilisers manufactured in the North Island at Whangarei are sold for delivery "ex works" or "free on rail" at that place, the maximum price that may be charged or received shall be the appropriate price specified in the Eighth Schedule hereto.

(9) Where any phosphatic fertilisers manufactured in the North Island at Mount Maunganui are sold for delivery "ex works" or "free on rail" at that place, the maximum price that may be charged or received shall be the appropriate price specified in the Ninth Schedule hereto.

(10) Where any phosphatic fertilisers are sold for delivery elsewhere than at one of the places mentioned in subclauses (1), (2), (3), (4), (5), (6), (7), (8), and (9) of this clause, the maximum price that may be charged or received shall be the appropriate price fixed in the First, Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth, Sixth, Seventh, Eighth, or Ninth Schedule hereto, whichever is appropriate, increased by the amount of the freight charges between the place of manufacture and the place of delivery: Provided that the amount added to the price in respect of freight charges shall not in any case exceed the amount that would have been incurred had delivery been effected by the holder of a goods-service licence under the Transport Act 1962 at authorised rates.

(11) In every invoice, debit note, or similar document issued by the vendor to a user in respect of the sale of any phosphatic fertiliser, there shall be shown separately:

- (a) The price of the phosphatic fertilisers fixed in accordance with this order; and
(b) The additional amount (if any) payable by the purchaser in respect of freight charges.

SPECIAL PRICES WHERE EXTRAORDINARY CHARGES INCURRED

6. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this order and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any vendor of phosphatic fertiliser to whom this order applies, may authorise special prices in respect of any phosphatic fertiliser to which this order applies where special circumstances exist or for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are incurred by such vendor. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a specified lot or consignment of phosphatic fertiliser or may relate generally to all phosphatic fertiliser to which this order applies sold by such vendor while the approval remains in force.

Wholesalers' Prices

4. The maximum price that may be charged or received by any wholesaler for any nails to which this order applies shall be determined as follows:

- (a) For nails sold by a wholesaler whose place of business is situate in any of the cities of Auckland, Wellington, Christchurch, or Dunedin, the maximum wholesale price shall be the appropriate price fixed in the Schedule hereto:
- (b) For nails sold by any other wholesaler, the maximum wholesale price shall be the appropriate price fixed in the Schedule hereto increased by a proportionate part of any freight charges incurred by the wholesaler in obtaining delivery into his premises.

Retailers' Prices

- (b) For nails sold by any other retailer, the maximum retail price shall be the appropriate price fixed in the Schedule hereto increased by a proportionate part of any freight charges paid by the retailer to the wholesaler from whom the nails were purchased or incurred by the retailer in obtaining delivery into his premises.

6. If in respect of any lot of nails sold by a retailer the maximum retail price calculated in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this order is not an exact number of pence or halfpence, the maximum price of the lot shall be calculated to the next upward halfpenny.

Special Prices Where Extraordinary Charges Incurred

7. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this order and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any wholesaler or retailer, may authorise special maximum prices in respect of any nails to which this order applies where special circumstances exist, or for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are incurred by the wholesaler or retailer. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a specified lot or consignment of nails, or may relate generally to all nails to which this order applies sold by the wholesaler or retailer while the approval remains in force.

DUTY IMPOSED ON WHOLESALERS

8. Every wholesaler who sells any nails to which this order applies shall specify in the relative invoice with respect to each lot of nails sold the quantity, the gauge, and the length of the nails.
