Notes on the Weather for July 1966

General: July was somewhat wetter than usual over the North land, but drier than usual over the South Island. In parts of the orth Island the ground was rather too wet. Generally, however, it of the stand the ground was rather too wet. Generally, however, it as a good month for stock, and lambing commenced under vourable conditions. A deep depression crossed the North land during the 18th and 19th, bringing the most inclement eather to date this year. Strong gales caused considerable damage, pecially in South Auckland, where trees were blown down, dispeting power supplies. Snow was reported well down on the hills the southern half of the North Island, and also in parts of the puth Island high country. outh Island high country.

Rainfall: Rainfall was above average by about 50 per cent over ost of the North Island, also in Marlborough and South Canter1919. Over the remainder of the South Island it was below average, ainly by 25 per cent. It was a dry month in Central Otago and ordland, with less than half an inch at some stations. Alexandra's infall was only '04 in., the lowest in July for 34 years; and fillford Sound's 3.32 in. was the lowest in July in 37 years of cord. cord.

Temperatures: Temperatures were mainly close to average. The priod from the 21st to the 26th was particularly frosty in the South land, and several stations reported as much as 30 degrees of ound frost. Molesworth, in the Marlborough high country, had degrees of ground frost on the 24th.

Sunshine: Northland and most eastern districts received 10-35 ours less sunshine than average. Parts of Manawatu received a milar amount above average.

nilar amount above average.

Weather Sequence: The month started with a day of settled eather, as an anticyclone was centred west of the North Island. owever, on the 2nd and 3rd a weak trough brought some rain Southland and Otago.

A deep depression soon passed far to the south-west, and the sociated trough of low pressure crossed the South Island, with in mainly on the West Coast, on the 4th and 5th. A depression veloped on the trough over the North Tasman Sea and crossed

the North Island, bringing rain there and over the northern half of the South Island from the 6th to the 8th. The rain was heavy in Taranaki and Bay of Plenty and about Cook Strait. An anticyclone was centred west of Tasmania, and as the depression moved away to the east, south-westerlies set in. From the 9th to

cyclone was centred west of Tasmania, and as the depression moved away to the east, south-westerlies set in. From the 9th to the 11th rain affected many districts, especially Southland, the West Coast, and most of the North Island. By the 12th the anticyclone had moved into the North Tasman Sea, but showers still persisted in Southland, Waikato, Auckland, and Northland.

From the 13th to the 15th a large anticyclone covered the country, with centres west of the North Island and south of the South Island; and fair weather prevailed.

There was a general deterioration during the 16th and 17th, with rain as a depression crossed the South Island. An anticyclone was centred to the south of Tasmania. A second depression which had formed near Noumea crossed the North Island during the 18th and 19th with very inclement weather there—strong gales, especially in South Auckland and Bay of Plenty; cold temperatures, with snow well down on the hills; and considerable rain, extending also to eastern districts of the South Island. For the next three days an anticyclone was centred to the south-west of the South Island, while pressures remained low to the east and north. Cold southerlies continued, with showers in eastern districts from Christichurch to East Cape and also in eastern Northland. In most of these areas the showers gradually died out. However, as the anticyclone moved across the South Island and to the east from the 23rd to the 25th pressures remained low to the north of the country; and there was light rain at times in eastern Northland. The 26th and 27th were marked by the passage of a depression far to the south-west, while the associated trough brought rain to western and northern districts of both islands. During the last three days of the month a complex depression from the North Tasman Sea crossed the North Island causing general rain, heavy in Bay of Plenty and South Canterbury.
