NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR JULY 1966

General: July was somewhat wetter than usual over the North Island, but drier than usual over the South Island. In parts of the North Island the ground was rather too wet. Generally, however, it was a good month for stock, and lambing commenced under favourable conditions. A deep depression crossed the North Island during the 18th and 19th, bringing the most inclement weather to date this year. Strong gales caused considerable damage, especially in South Auckland, where trees were blown down, disrupting power supplies. Snow was reported well down on the hills of the southern half of the North Island, and also in parts of the South Island high country.

Rainfall: Rainfall was above average by about 50 per cent over most of the North Island, also in Marlborough and South Canterbury. Over the remainder of the South Island it was below average, mainly by 25 per cent. It was a dry month in Central Otago and Northland, with less than half an inch at some stations. Alexandra's rainfall was only .04 in., the lowest in July for 34 years; and Milford Sound's 3.32 in. was the lowest in July in 37 years of record.

Temperatures: Temperatures were mainly close to average. The period from the 21st to the 26th was particularly frosty in the South Island, and several stations reported as much as 30 degrees of ground frost. Molesworth, in the Marlborough high country, had 30 degrees of ground frost on the 24th.

Sunshine: Northland and most eastern districts received 10-35 hours less sunshine than average. Parts of Manawatu received a similar amount above average.

Weather Sequence: The month started with a day of settled weather, as an anticyclone was centred west of the North Island. However, on the 2nd and 3rd a weak trough brought some rain to Southland and Otago.

A deep depression soon passed far to the south-west, and the associated trough of low pressure crossed the South Island, with rain mainly on the West Coast, on the 4th and 5th. A depression developed on the trough over the North Tasman Sea and crossed

the North Island, bringing rain there and over the northern half of the South Island from the 6th to the 8th. The rain was heavy in Taranaki and Bay of Plenty and about Cook Strait. An anticyclone was centred west of Tasmania, and as the depression moved away to the east, south-westerlies set in. From the 9th to the 11th rain affected many districts, especially Southland, the West Coast, and most of the North Island. By the 12th the anticyclone had moved into the North Tasman Sea, but showers still persisted in Southland, Waikato, Auckland, and Northland.

From the 13th to the 15th a large anticyclone covered the country, with centres west of the North Island and south of the South Island; and fair weather prevailed.

There was a general deterioration during the 16th and 17th, with rain as a depression crossed the South Island. An anticyclone was centred to the south of Tasmania. A second depression which had formed near Noumea crossed the North Island during the 18th and 19th with very inclement weather there—strong gales, especially in South Auckland and Bay of Plenty; cold temperatures, with snow well down on the hills; and considerable rain, extending also to eastern districts of the South Island. For the next three days an anticyclone was centred to the south-west of the South Island, while pressures remained low to the east and north. Cold southerlies continued, with showers in eastern districts from Christchurch to East Cape and also in eastern Northland. In most of these areas the showers gradually died out. However, as the anticyclone moved across the South Island and to the east from the 23rd to the 25th pressures remained low to the north of the country; and there was light rain at times in eastern Northland, Coromandel, and Gisborne.

The 26th and 27th were marked by the passage of a depression far to the south-west, while the associated trough brought rain to western and northern districts of both islands. During the last three days of the month a complex depression from the North Tasman Sea crossed the North Island causing general rain, heavy in Bay of Plenty and South Canterbury.

TOTALISATOR AGENCY BOARD

RULES RELATING TO INVESTMENTS AT OR THROUGH TOTALISATOR AGENCIES

PURSUANT to the authority of section 7 (1) (d) of the Gaming Amendment Act 1949, the Totalisator Agency Board, by resolution, has amended the rules as follows:

By deleting rule 10B (ii) (a) and substituting the following

"Rule 10B (ii) (a)—If a horse, including a bracketed horse, is scratched from the second race, the investor may, at his option, and at the totalisator agency where the investment was made, accept a refund up to 15 minutes before the advertised time of closing for the receipt of investments for the double, or, if the investment was made against a telephonic deposit account, nominate a substitute up to 15 minutes before the advertised starting time for the first race, or, if the investment was made by cash, nominate a substitute up to 15 minutes before the advertised starting time for the first race, provided that the totalisator agency at which the investment was made is still open for receiving cash investments.
