The Lake Wanaka Order 1966

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 28th day of September 1966

PURSUANT to sections 8A and 165 of the Harbours Act 1950, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and, in relation to clause 3 (b) of this order, on the request of the Lake County Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Lake Wanaka Order 1966.

(2) This order shall come into force on the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.

2. In this order—

“The Act” means the Harbours Act 1950:

“The Council” means the Lake County Council:

“Lakeshore” means the bed of the lake to a distance of 66 ft from the margin of the lake at its ordinary level:

“Minister” means the Minister of Marine; and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction or authority of the Minister.

3. There is hereby granted to the Council, for a period of 21 years from the commencement of this order, subject to the provisions of sections 8A and 165 of the Act, and to the conditions specified in the Third Schedule to this order—

(a) The control of the lakeshore described in the First Schedule to this order:

(b) The control of the waters specified in the Second Schedule to this order.

FIRST SCHEDULE

DESCRIPTION OF AREA OF LAKESHORE

ALL that part of the bed of Lake Wanaka to a distance of 66 ft from the margin of the said lake at its ordinary level, and 66 ft from the boundaries of Section 60, Block XIV, Lower Wanaka Survey District, hereinafter described, and commencing at a line bearing 45° from Trig. Station D, in Section 7, Block XVIII, Lower Wanaka Survey District, and proceeding generally south-westerly, south easterly, and northerly along the north-western, south-western, and eastern shores of the said lake to the southern corner of the said Section 60; thence generally northerly and easterly along the western and northern boundaries of that section to a line due north from the north-eastern corner of the said Section 60, and as shown on plan M.D. 12394 deposited at the office of the Marine Department at Wellington.

SECOND SCHEDULE

DESCRIPTION OF WATERS

ALL the waters of Lake Wanaka southwards and westwards of a right line drawn between the intersection, at the margin of the said lake at ordinary lake level, of a right line bearing 45° from Trig. Station D, in Section 7, Block XVIII, Lower Wanaka Survey District, and the intersection at the margin of the said lake of a right line drawn due north from the north-eastern corner of Section 60, Block XIV, Lower Wanaka Survey District; as shown on plan M.D. 12394 deposited at the office of the Marine Department at Wellington.

THIRD SCHEDULE

CONDITIONS

1. Her Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall, at all times, have free ingress, passage, and egress into, over, and out of the foreshore described in the First Schedule and Second Schedule to this order, without payment.

2. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the Council to do, or cause to be done, anything repugnant to, or inconsistent with, any law relating to the Customs, or with any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provision of the Harbours Act 1950 or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder that are, or may hereafter be, in force.

3. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall not apply to those portions of the lakeshore required for securing the shore ends of any telegraph cables that are at present, or may be at any time, laid down within the said area of lakeshore.

4. The Council may enclose any part or parts of the lakeshore described in the First Schedule hereto for the purpose of holding athletic sports or games and may, by bylaws, fix a charge for admission to such enclosed part or parts:

Provided that the total number of days on which such enclosures are made shall not exceed six in any one year.

5. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the Council to remove, or cause to be removed, any stone, sand, shingle, or shells without the consent of the Minister being first obtained.

6. Subject to the provisions of section 8A of the Act, the Council for and within the area of waters described in the Second Schedule hereto—

(a) May, by bylaw, do anything which a Harbour Board may do by bylaw under section 232 of the Act:

(b) May appoint harbourmasters and officers, and define or limit their powers or duties:

(c) Shall have all the powers, functions, duties, and authorities of a harbour board under the Act as if it were constituted a harbour board.

7. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment or any compensation whatever, on giving to the Council six calendar months' notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at, or posted to, the last-known address of the Council in New Zealand.

The Auckland Electric Power Board Electric Lines Licence 1966

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 28th day of September 1966

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Public Works Act 1928 and the Auckland Electric Power Board Act 1921-22, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. This order may be cited as the Auckland Electric Power Board Electric Lines Licence 1966.

2. Subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth, the Auckland Electric Power Board (hereinafter referred to as the licensee) is hereby authorised to lay, construct, put up, place, and use the electric lines, and to construct the electric works described in the Schedule hereto.

3. The conditions directed to be implied in all licences by the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935 and the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1961 shall be incorporated herein and shall form part of this licence, except in so far as they may be inconsistent with the provisions of this licence.

4. The licence hereby conferred is subject to compliance by the licensee with the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935, the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1961, the Radio Interference Regulations 1958, and with all regulations made in amendment thereof or in substitution thereof, except in so far as they may be inconsistent with the provisions of this licence.

5. The systems of supply shall be described in paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d), (e), (f), (h), (i), and (j) of regulation 21-01 of the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935. The system of supply authorised under the said paragraph (j) shall be a two-wire direct current system, at a pressure normally rated at 550 volts, with neither pole earthed for supply in connection with the trackless trolley-omnibus system of the Auckland Transport Board.

6. Seaward from high-water mark at ordinary spring tide, the minimum horizontal distance separating the submarine cable to Pakihi Island, described in the Schedule hereto, from the existing private submarine telephone cable of Messrs McCallum Bros. shall be 200 ft.

7. This licence shall, unless it is sooner lawfully determined, continue in force until the 31st day of March 1987.

8. The Order in Council dated the 10th day of August 1960, and published in the *Gazette* on the 18th day of the same month, at page 1232, authorising the licensee to erect and use electric lines and to construct electric works, is hereby revoked.

5. Electric lines and electric works which may from time to time be required for the distribution and supply of electrical energy on and about Waiheke Island, situated in the Hauraki Gulf.

6. Electric lines and electric works which may from time to time be required for the distribution and supply of electrical energy leading from the boundary of the Auckland Electric Power District in a generally southerly direction to a house and woolshed situated near the intersection of Ardmore Quarry Road, Creighton's Road, and Welsh's Road, in Section 177, Block I, Opaheke Survey District, in the Manukau County; the said electric lines being shown by means of red lines and green lines on the plan marked S.H.D. 482, deposited as aforesaid.

A submarine cable for the transmission of electrical energy leading from Pakihi Island, in the Hauraki Gulf, from a point on the southernmost extremity of Pakihi Island, in Block 15, Wairoa Survey District to a point on the northernmost extremity of Karamuramu Island, in Block 15, Wairoa Survey District; the said cable being shown by means of a broken red line on the plan marked N.Z.E.D. 723, deposited as aforesaid.
