PURSUANT to the Forest and Rural Fires Act 1955, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. This order may be cited as the Mangawhai Rural Fire District Order 1966.

2. This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

3. The area specified in the Schedule to this order is hereby constituted and declared to be a rural fire district, to be known as the Mangawhai Rural Fire District.

4. The trees and other plants on State forest land situated in the said area are hereby specified as the property for the protection of which this district is constituted.

5. The Mangawhai Rural Fire District shall, for the purposes of the Forest and Rural Fires Act 1955, be administered by the Minister of Forests.

6. The period between the 1st day of October in any year and the 30th day of April in the following year is hereby specified and declared to be a closed fire season in the said district.

NORTH AUCKLAND LAND DISTRICT—AUCKLAND CONSERVANCY *Mangawhai Rural Fire District*

ALL that area in the North Auckland Land District, Rodney County, containing approximately 6,464 acres and bounded generally as follows:

Plan 44304 as land to be taken for road, through Allotments 30, W. 22, and 23 Mangawhai Parish, crossing an intervening public road, to Arai Point Road, and along the south-western side of that road to the north-eastern corner of Lot 2, D.P. 11345; thence along a right line across the said road to and along the generally eastern boundary of Lot 1, D.P. 11345, to the angle in that boundary distant 1703.6 links from the northern side of the last-mentioned road, and along a right line to the north-eastern corner of Section 15, Block IV, Mangawhai Survey District; thence along the north-eastern boundary of that section, to and along the generally eastern and northern sides of Black Swamp Road, to and along the western boundary of Section 28 of Block IV aforesaid, and the last-mentioned boundary produced across a public road to its northern side; thence along the south-western and north-western boundaries of Section 2 of the said Block IV, to and along the south-western boundary of Allotment 107, Mangawhai Parish, to the point of commencement.
