Price Order No. 2023 (Butter)

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act 1947, the Price Tribunal hereby makes the following Price Order:

PRELIMINARY

1. This order may be cited as Price Order No. 2023, and shall come into force on the 11th day of February 1967. 2. (1) Price Order No. 1748* is hereby revoked.

(2) The revocation of the said price order shall not affect

(3) Notwithstanding the revocation of Price Order No. 1748, any approvals given under clause 13 of that price order head participate to have offert or site action order head participate.

shall continue to have effect as if the said order had not been revoked.

3. (1) In this order, unless the context otherwise requires,— "the said Act" means the Control of Prices Act 1947; "the said regulations" mean the Butter and Cheese Marketing Regu-

lations 1948[†]. (2) Terms and expressions defined in the said Act, or in the said regulations, when used in this order, have the meanings severally assigned thereto by the said Act or by the said regulations, as the case may be.

4. The grades referred to in this order shall, as the case requires, mean:

(a) Grades assigned at a grading store; or

(b) Grades assigned at a grading store, or of the said regulation and the said regulations; or
(c) Grades constructively assigned pursuant to subclause
(4) of regulation 26 of the said regulations.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

5. This order applies with respect to all sales in New Zealand by way of wholesale, or retail, of any butter within the meaning of the said regulations, except butter sold for use in the manufacture of ice-cream or ice-cream mix or butter sold as ships' stores for vessels sailing beyond New Zealand Zealand.

MAXIMUM PRICES FOR SALES OF BUTTER BY WAY OF WHOLESALE, OR BY A MANUFACTURER TO A WHOLESALE DISTRIBUTOR, TO OR BY A MANUFACTURER TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

6. Subject to the provisions of this order, the several maxi-mum prices at which butter prepared in 1 lb pats or smaller portions may be sold by way of sale by wholesale shall be the following:

(a) In the case of salted creamery butter the standard of quality of which is not lower than First Grade, the price of

32¹/₂d. per pound: (b) In the case of salted creamery butter, the standard of quality of which is Second Grade, the price of $32\frac{1}{4}d$, per pound.

(c) In the case of whey butter the standard of quality of which is not lower than Second Grade, the price of $31\frac{1}{2}d$. per pound.

7. The price of butter sold in bulk by way of sale by whole-sale, being butter of one of the kinds and standards of quality set out in clause 6 of this order, shall be $\frac{1}{8}d$. per pound less than the respective price prescribed for butter of that kind and standard of quality by the said clause 6 hereof.

8. The price of unsalted creamery butter the standard of quality of which is not lower than First Grade, and which is sold, whether in bulk or pats, by way of sale by wholesale as aforesaid shall be $\frac{1}{2}$ d. per pound more than the respective price prescribed for salted creamery butter by the foregoing provisions of clause 6 of this order.

provisions of clause 6 of this order. 9. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this order, the price for any parcel or butter sold, whether in bulk or in pats, in a quantity of less than 48 lb, by way of sale by wholesale as aforesaid, being butter of one of the kinds and standards of quality set out in clause 6 of this order, may (at the option of the vendor) be the sum of 6d. per parcel more than the appropriate price prescribed for butter of that kind and standard of quality by the foregoing provisions of this order, and the said sum of 6d. shall be added to the rates of 0.775d. per pound or portion of a pound referred to in clause 10 of this order for the purpose of that clause. clause.

10. In the case of sales by a manufacturer to a wholesale distributor, the prices at which butter shall be so sold shall be 0.775d. per pound or portion of a pound less than the respective prices hereinbefore specified.

11. Any butter sold in pursuance of the provisions of clauses 6, 7, 8, 9, or 10 of this order shall be delivered freight free into the purchaser's premises.

MAXIMUM RETAIL PRICE OF BUTTER TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

12. (1) The maximum retail price of butter to which this order applies shall be computed at the rate of:

(i) 2s. 10d. a pound for salted creamery butter.
(ii) 2s. 10¹/₂d. a pound for unsalted creamery butter.
(iii) 2s. 9d. a pound for whey butter.
(iv) 2s. 8d. a pound for dairy butter.

(2) If, in respect of any lot of butter sold by a retailer, the maximum price calculated in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this clause is not an exact number of pence or halfpence, the maximum price of the lot shall be computed to the next upward halfpenny.

SPECIAL PRICES WHERE EXTRAORDINARY CHARGES INCURRED

13. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this order and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any trader, may authorise special maximum prices in respect of any butter to which this special maximum prices in respect of any butter to which this order applies where special circumstances exist or for any reason extraordinary charges are incurred by the trader. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a specified lot or consignment of butter or may relate generally to all butter to which this order applies sold by the trader while the approval remains in force.

Price Order No. 2024 (Bread)

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act 1947, the Price Tribunal hereby makes the following price order:

PRELIMINARY

1. This order may be cited as Price Order No. 2024 and shall come into force on the 11th day of February 1967.

2. (1) Price Order No. 1957* is hereby revoked.

(2) The revocation of the said order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this order.

(3) Notwithstanding the revocation of Price Order No. 1957 any approvals given under clause 11 of that price order shall con-tinue to have effect as if the said order had not been revoked.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

3. This order applies to all bread referred to in clauses 4, 5, 6, and 7 of this order sold in New Zealand by a wholesaler or by a retailer, but does not apply to bread sold on Stewart Island or to bread sold as part of a meal.

FIXING MAXIMUM WHOLESALE AND RETAIL PRICES OF BREAD TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

4. Subject to the provisions of this order, the prices set out in the First Schedule to this order shall be the maximum prices which may be charged or received for any bread to which this order applies and which is customarily known as:

- (a) Standard white bread.
- (b) Standard brown bread.
 (c) Wholemeal bread.
- (d) Vienna bread.(e) Wheat-germ bread.

(c) wheat-germ bread.
5. Subject to the provisions of this order, the prices set out in the Fourth, Fifth, and Sixth Schedules to this order shall be the maximum prices which may be charged or received for any bread to which this order applies and which is customarily known as starch reduced bread, that is, bread in the making of which there is for each sack of flour (160 lb) used not less than 6 lb of dry gluten, or 18 lb of wet gluten, and no less than 6 lb of fat with either dried milk or condensed milk.

6. Subject to the provisions of this order, the prices set out in the Second and Fifth Schedules to this order shall be the maximum prices which may be charged or received for any bread described in clauses 4 and 5 of this order which is enclosed and securely wrapped at the bakehouse in clean unused paper.

7. Subject to provisions of this order, the prices set out in the Third and Sixth Schedules to this order, the prices set out in the prices which may be charged or received for any bread described in clauses 4 and 5 of this order which is sliced, enclosed and securely wrapped at the bakehouse in clean unused paper.

8. The wholesale prices fixed by this order apply to bread de-livered to the retailer's premises. In any case where bread is not so delivered the prices shall be such as are agreed upon between the baker and the retailer, or failing such agreement, as may be ap-proved by the Tribunal.

GENERAL

9. An additional charge of one halfpenny (¹/₂d.) per loaf, regard-less of the size of the loaf, may be made for wrapping any bread sold by retail to which this order applies, except bakehouse wrapped bread, provided that the bread so sold is enclosed and securely wrapped in clean unused paper supplied by the vendor.

10. A booking fee at the rate of one farthing $(\frac{1}{2}d)$ per loaf for loaves of not more than i lb weight and one halfpenny $(\frac{1}{2}d)$ per loaf for loaves exceeding 1 lb weight may be made for any bread sold by a retailer to which this order applies, provided that payment for the bread so sold has not been made either prior to, or at the time of, the customer's taking delivery of the bread at the shop.

SPECIAL PRICES WHERE EXTRAORDINARY CHARGES INCURRED

SPECIAL FRICES WHERE EXTRAORDINARY CHARGES INCORRED 11. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this order, and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any wholesaler, or retailer, may authorise special maximum prices in respect of any bread to which this order applies where special circumstances exist or for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are in-curred by the wholesaler or retailer. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a specified lot or consignment of bread or may relate generally to all bread sold by the wholesaler or retailer, while the approval remains in force. force.

Price Order No. 2025 (Flour)

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act 1947, the Price Tribunal hereby makes the following Price Order:

1. This order may be cited as Price Order No. 2025 and shall come into force on the 11th day of February 1967.

2. This order applies to flour sold by a retailer.

3. (1) The maximum price that may be charged or received by any retailer for any flour to which this order applies shall be the price at which the flour was authorised to be sold immediately prior to the coming into force of this order increased at the rate of $3\frac{1}{2}d$, per pound.

(2) The price at which any lot of flour is sold shall be calculated in respect of the particular lot sold.

(3) If the price authorised by this order for any lot of flour is not an exact number of half pence the price may be calculated to the next upward halfpenny.

4. Every approval given under section 16 of the Control of Prices Act 1947, relating to the price of flour to which this order applies and in force on the coming into force of this order shall be read subject to the provisions of this order and shall be deemed to be amended accordingly.
