A PROCLAMATION

TO THE MEMBERS OF PARLIAMENT elected to serve in the House of Representatives:

You are now hereby summoned to appear on Wednesday, the 26th day of April 1967, for the Dispatch of Business, at 2.30 p.m., in the Parliament House in the City of Wellington, there to take into consideration the state and welfare of New Zealand and therein to do as may seem necessary.
