PURSUANT to section 8A of the Harbours Act 1950, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Chatham Islands Harbour Control Order 1967. (2) This order shall come into force on the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.

2. In this order-

"The Act" means the Harbours Act 1950:

- "The Council" means the Chatham Islands County Council:

"Minister" means the Minister of Marine; and includes any officer, person, or authority, acting by or under the direction or authority of the Minister.
3. There is hereby granted to the Council for a period of 21 years from the commencement of this order, subject to the provisions of section 8A of the Act and to the conditions specified in the Second Schedule to this order, the control of the waters specified in the First Schedule to this order.

FIRST SCHEDULE

All the waters contained within the Harbours at Chatham Island and Pitt Island, defined in the Order in Council made on 16 November 1966*.

SECOND SCHEDULE

1. Subject to the provisions of section 8A of the Act, the Council for and within the waters described in the First Schedule hereto-

- (a) May by bylaw do anything which a Harbour Board may do by bylaw under section 232 of the Act:
 (b) May appoint harbourmasters and/or other officers, and define or limit their powers and duties:
 (c) Shall have all the powers, functions, duties, and authorities of a Harbour Board under the Act as if it were constituted a Harbour Board.

2. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the Council six calendar months' notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at, or posted to the last known address of the Council in New Zealand.

DECISION OF THE TRIBUNAL

THE Tribunal has been called upon to consider whether the book, the subject of this application, is indecent or not or alternatively for a decision as to its classification.

alternatively for a decision as to its classification. The application is made with the consent of the Minister of Justice. The book is a "paper back" similar in content and language to other "paper back" publications which we have held not to be indecent. But we take a different view in respect of this book. The main theme is an account of the sexual activities of an American airman, related with much detail; he is depicted as being brutal in his approach to women and girls and to have shown some violence. We think it warrants condemnation. The book contains too, some account of the code of life of the American Air Force which in our opinion cannot be regarded as an honest and faithful portrayal.

Applying the principles enumerated in section 11 of the statute, we think the book may fairly be held to be indecent and we decide accordingly.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

4. This order applies with respect to retail sales of sugar, whether purchased by a retailer in 70 lb bags or in any other pack.

Fixing Maximum Prices of Sugar to Which This Order Applies

Retail Prices

5. (1) Subject to the provisions of this order, the maximum price that may be charged or received by any retailer for sugar to which this order applies shall be the sum of the following amounts:

(a) The prevailing wholesale price as defined in clause 3 of this order.
(b) Freight and other charges incurred by the retailer in obtaining delivery into store.
(c) A mark-up of 13³/₄ percent on (a) plus (b):

Provided that nothing in this order shall authorise the addition of transport costs in excess of those that would have been incurred had the sugar been purchased from a distributor nearest or most convenient of access to the re-tailer's store and transported by a common carrier at current freight rates.

(2) In calculating the price payable under this clause, no account shall be taken of any additional amount chargeable by a distributor to a retailer in respect of the packaging of the sugar in amounts of less than 70 lb.

(3) Where delivery by the retailer of any sugar is effected otherwise than over the counter or, where the sale is not for cash, the maximum price of that sugar shall be the appropriate maximum price as determined by the foregoing provisions of this clause increased by $\frac{1}{4}$ cent per pound or $\frac{1}{4}d$, per pound, provided that where both such conditions apply the appropriate maximum price shall not be increased by more than $\frac{1}{4}$ cent per pound or $\frac{1}{4}d$, per pound.

(4) If in respect of any lot of sugar sold by a retailer the maximum price calculated in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this clause is not an exact number of pence or halfpence or cents, the maximum price of the lot shall be calculated to the next upward halfpenny or to the next upward cent.

(2) In this clause the terms "decimal currency", "existing currency", and "transitional period" shall have the same meaning as in the Decimal Currency Act 1964.

FIXING MAXIMUM WHOLESALE AND RETAIL PRICES FOR NAILS TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

Wholesalers' Prices

5. The maximum price that may be charged or received by any wholesaler for any nails to which this order applies shall be determined as follows:

(a) For nails sold by a wholesaler whose place of business is situate in any of the cities of Auckland, Wellington, Christchurch, or Dunedin, the maximum wholesale price shall be the appropriate price fixed in the Schedule hereto:

(b) For nails sold by any other wholesaler, the maximum wholesale price shall be the appropriate price fixed in the Schedule hereto increased by a proportionate part of any freight charges incurred by the wholesaler in obtaining delivery into his premises.

Retailers' Prices

6. The maximum price that may be charged or received by any retailer for any nails to which this order applies shall be determined as follows:

(a) For nails sold by a retailer whose place of business is situate in any of the cities of Auckland, Wellington, Christchurch, or Dunedin, the maximum retail price shall be the appropriate price fixed in the Schedule hereto:

(b) For nails sold by any other retailer, the maximum retail price shall be the appropriate price fixed in the Schedule hereto increased by a proportionate part of any freight charges paid by the retailer to the wholesaler from whom the nails were purchased or incurred by the retailer in obtaining delivery into his premises.

7. If in respect of any lot of nails sold by a retailer the maximum retail price calculated in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this order is not an exact number of pence or halfpence or cents, the maximum price of the lot shall be calculated to the next upward halfpenny, or to the nearest whole cent.

Special Prices Where Extraordinary Charges Incurred

8. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this order and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any wholesaler or retailer, may authorise special maximum prices in respect of any nails to which this order applies where special circumstances exist, or for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are incurred by the wholesaler or retailer. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a specified lot or consignment of nails, or may relate generally to all nails to which this order applies sold by the wholesaler or retailer while the approval remains in force.

DUTY IMPOSED ON WHOLESALERS

1. This order may be cited as Price Order No. 2041 and shall come into force on the 10th day of July 1967.

This order applies in respect to all sales in New Zealand whether wholesale or retail, of eggs of domestic fowls or ducks, but does not apply to eggs transferred between licensed distributors or used in the manufacture of egg pulp or to the sale of eggs which the vendor proves were sold for the pur-poses of hatching.

CLASSIFICATION OF EGGS FOR PURPOSES OF THIS ORDER

Hen Eggs

Hen Eggs 5. (1) For the purposes of this order, every lot of hen eggs sold by a producer, or licensed distributor, or retailer shall be classified in the following sizes as "Large Grade", "Standard Grade", "Medium Grade", "Pullet Grade", or "Mixed". (2) With respect to hen eggs that have been graded in accordance with the Egg Marketing Authority Regulations 1953, the classification of such eggs for the purposes of this order shall correspond to the grading under those regulations. (3) With respect to hen eggs that have not been graded in accordance with the said regulations, the following special provisions shall apply: (a) Any lot of eggs sold or offered for sale may be classified

- (a) Any lot of eggs sold or offered for sale may be classified for the purposes of this order as "Large Grade", "Standard Grade", "Medium Grade", or "Pullet Grade" as the case may be, if all the eggs in the lot would be of the corresponding grade if they had been graded under the said regulations.
 (b) Any lot of eggs sold or offered for sale consisting of eggs which, if graded under the said regulations, would be graded in more than one grade shall be classified for the purposes of this order as "Mixed Eggs": Provided that if the average weight of the eggs in the lot is less than 2 oz the lot shall be classified as "Pullet Grade" eggs.

Duck Eggs

buck Eggs
6. (1) For the purposes of this order, every lot of duck eggs sold by a producer, licensed distributor, or retailer shall be classified as "Large", "Small", or "Mixed".
(2) With respect to the classification of duck eggs—

(a) All eggs of a weight not less than 2⁴/₁₅ oz shall be classified as "Large".
(b) All eggs of a weight less than 2⁴/₁₅ oz shall be classified as "Small".

(c) If any lot of eggs comprises some eggs classifiable as

- (c) If any lot of eggs comprises some eggs classifiable as "Large" and some classifiable as "Small", all the eggs in the lot shall be classified as "Mixed".

FIXING MAXIMUM WHOLESALE PRICES OF EGGS TO WHICH THIS Order Applies

7. (1) The prices that may be charged or received by any licensed distributor for any eggs to which this order applies shall not exceed the appropriate maximum price specified in the First Schedule beseto the First Schedule hereto.

(2) Every licensed distributor (including a producer selling otherwise than by way of retail) who sells any eggs to which this order applies shall specify in the relevant invoices with respect to each item the classification of the eggs comprised in the item.

FIXING MAXIMUM RETAIL PRICES OF EGGS TO WHICH THIS Order Applies

ORDER APPLIES 8. (1) The maximum retail price that may be charged or received by any retailer (including a producer) for any eggs to which this order applies shall be the appropriate maximum price specified in the Second Schedule hereto. (2) Where, in this price order, retail prices are expressed both in decimal currency and in existing currency, the prices expressed in decimal currency shall be the prices applicable from 10 July 1967, unless, because of difficulties relating to machine conversion, a trader continues to deal during the transitional period exclusively or principally in existing currency, in which case the prices applicable shall be those expressed in existing currency.

Retailers to Exhibit Prices

Every retailer who offers or exposes any eggs to which this order applies for sale in any shop shall keep in a prominent position in such proximity to the eggs to which it relates as to be obviously descriptive thereof a ticket, placard, or label on which shall be stated in legible and prominent characters the classification of the eggs according to whether they are "Large Grade", "Standard Grade" "Medium Grade", "Pullet Grade", or "Mixed" (in the case of hen eggs), or "Large", "Small", or "Mixed" (in the case of duck eggs), and the retail price per dozen of the eggs.

FIXING MAXIMUM WHOLESALE AND RETAIL PRICES FOR CARTONED AND LOOSE CHILLED HEN EGGS TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

10. The maximum wholesale or retail price that may be charged or received by any licensed distributor or retailer for cartoned or loose chilled hen eggs to which this order applies shall be the appropriate maximum price specified in the Schedules hereto, reduced by 6d. per dozen, or 5 cents per dozen.

PROVISION FOR SPECIAL PRICES

PROVISION FOR SPECIAL PRICES 11. (1) Subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Price Tribunal, on application by any licensed distributor or retailer, may authorise an addition to the maximum prices fixed from time to time in respect to any eggs to which this order applies where special circumstances exist or for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or other-wise) are incurred by the licensed distributor or retailer. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a specified lot or consignment of eggs or may relate generally to all eggs to which this order applies sold by the licensed distributor or retailer while the approval remains in force. (2) Where in terms of clause 11 (1) hereof the Price Tribunal has authorised an addition to the maximum First Schedule prices for eggs a retailer, on being notified in writing to this effect by the licensed distributor, may add the extra amount so authorised to the maximum Second Schedule prices for cartoned eggs. 

1. This order may be cited as Price Order No. 2043 and shall come into force on 10 July 1967.

(1) The revocation of the said order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this order.

(3) Notwithstanding the revocation of Price Order No. 2026 any approvals given under clause 11 of that price order shall con-tinue to have effect as if the said order had not been revoked.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

3. This order applies to all bread referred to in clauses 4, 5, and 6 of this order sold in New Zealand by a wholesaler or by a retailer, but does not apply to bread sold on Stewart Island or to bread sold as part of a meal.

FIXING MAXIMUM WHOLESALE AND RETAIL PRICES OF BREAD TO WHICH THIS ORDER APPLIES

Subject to the provisions of this order, the prices set out in the First Schedule to this order shall be the maximum prices which may be charged or received for any bread to which this order applies and which is customarily known as:

(a) Standard white bread.
(b) Standard brown bread.
(c) Wholemeal bread.
(d) Vienna bread.
(e) Wheat-germ bread.

5. Subject to the provisions of this order, the prices set out in the Third and Fourth Schedules to this order shall be the maximum prices which may be charged or received for any bread to which this order applies and which is customarily known as starch reduced bread, that is, bread in the making of which there is for each sack of flour (160 lb) used not less than 6 lb of dry gluten, or 18 lb of wet gluten, and no less than 6 lb of fat with either dried milk or condensed milk.

6. Subject to the provisions of this order, the prices set out in the Second and Fourth Schedules to this order shall be the maximum prices which may be charged or received for any bread described in clauses 4 and 5 of this order which is sliced or unsliced and enclosed and securely wrapped at the bakehouse in clean unused paper.

7. The wholesale prices fixed by this order apply to bread de-livered to the retailer's premises. In any case where bread is not so delivered the prices shall be such as are agreed upon between the baker and the retailer, or failing such agreement, as may be approved by the Tribunal.

10. The maximum retail selling prices provided for in this order shall include the service of wrapping where this service is provided by the retailer.

SPECIAL PRICES WHERE EXTRAORDINARY CHARGES INCURRED



(c) For "First" grade, 92 points or over but under 93 points, the price of 24.44 cents per pound:
(d) For "First" grade, 90 points or over but under 92 points, the price of 23.94 cents per pound:
(e) For "Second" grade, the price of 19.59 cents per pound:

2. In the case of whey butter to which is assigned one or other of the following grades under the said regulations-

(a) For "First" grade, the price of 22.94 cents per pound:(b) For "Second" grade, the price of 22.59 cents per pound.

3. Butter shall be packed in boxes each containing a net weight of 56 lb 2 oz of actual butter, excluding wrapping

paper.

4. In computing the weight of butter for which payment is to be made by the Board the weight of all butter com-prised in any consignment submitted for grading under the said regulations shall be ascertained as follows:

- (a) Each box of butter containing a net weight of 56 lb 2 oz of actual butter, excluding wrapping paper, shall, subject as hereinafter provided, be computed at 56 lb.
- (b) The weight of all butter in any such consignment shall be determined on the basis of the weight as ascertained by the grader of the several boxes selected by him for weighing and set out in the Grader's Certificate issued in respect of that consignment, and the boxes of butter so weighed shall be taken as fixing the average weight for the whole quantity of butter comprised in such certificate, overweights being averaged with underweights in each such certificate in relation to the prescribed weight of 56 lb 2 oz per box:
- (c) If the average weight ascertained as aforesaid of the butter comprised in any Grader's Certificate be less than 56 lb 2 oz per box, such deficiency shall be deducted from a weight of 56 lb per box for the purpose of computing payment therefor:
- (d) If the average weight ascertained as aforesaid of the butter comprised in any Grader's Certificate exceeds the prescribed weight of 56 lb 2 oz per box, then the amount of such excess shall not be taken into account for the purpose of computing payment therefor.

5. The prices fixed by the Authority shall not be paid for any butter manufactured otherwise than in compliance with the said regulations.

6. The price to be paid by the Board for any butter which, with the approval or at the request of the Board, is manufactured, prepared, or packed in special containers, or in special quantities, or otherwise in any special manner, shall be the appropriate price payable for that butter as herein-before provided adjusted by such appropriate addition or reduction as corresponds with the additional costs or the reduced costs incurred in such special manufacture, prepara-tion, or packing. Any such approval or request of the Board may include a stipulation limiting the additional cost to be incurred and may dispense with the requirements of para-graphs 3 and 4 hereof, and, in that event, payment shall be made for the actual net weight of the butter exported. The adjustment to prices referred to in this paragraph shall be computed by the Board and the computation of the Board shall be final. shall be final.

(2) The maximum wholesale prices specified in the said Schedule shall be reduced by a discount equal to 5 percent thereof where payment is made on or before the 20th day of the calendar month next following the calendar month in which delivery is made by the wholesaler.

(3) The maximum prices fixed by the foregoing provisions of this clause are exclusive of sales tax.

Fixing Special Prices for Sales to Local Authorities

6. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause, the maximum price that may be charged or received by any person for any tyres or tubes sold to a local authority shall be the appropriate wholesale price (including discount) specified in the Schedule hereto, increased by an amount equal to:

(a) 23 percent in the case of car tyres;
(b) 21.5 percent in the case of truck and bus tyres;
(c) 24.25 percent in the case of tubes; and
(d) 21.625 percent in the case of tractor tyres when such tyres are subject to sales tax, and 1.625 percent when such tyres are exempt from sales tax.

(2) The maximum price fixed in the preceding subclause is inclusive of sales tax where applicable and is not subject to any discount.

Retailers' Prices

7. (1) Subject to the following provisions of this clause, the maximum price that may be charged or received at any place in New Zealand by a retailer for any tyres or tubes to which this order applies shall be the appropriate price specified in the Schedule hereto.
(2) With respect to tyres, the maximum prices specified in the said Schedule shall be reduced by the amount of the discount specified in the Schedule, where payment is made in cash or on or before the 20th day of the calendar month next following the calendar month in which delivery is made by the retailer.
(3) With respect to tubes the maximum prices specified in the said Schedule are not subject to any discount.
(4) With respect to car tyres, the maximum prices fixed as aforesaid are inclusive of the cost of fitting the tyres, except in the case of fitting tubeless tyres when a fitting fee not exceeding 12s. 6d. or \$1.25 per tyre may be made.

Special Prices for "Factory Seconds"

8. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this order, the maximum prices which may be charged or received by any person for any tyres to which this order applies known as "factory seconds" shall be:

- (a) Wholesale Price—The gross wholesale selling price shall be the gross wholesale selling price shown in the Schedule hereto for first-grade tyres of the same kind reduced by 26.5 percent.
 (b) Retail Price—The maximum retail price which may be charged shall be computed by adding to the wholesale selling price calculated in accordance with the provisions of subclause (a) of this clause the same retail margin between the gross wholesale selling price and the gross retail selling price as provided in the Schedule hereto for first-grade tyres of the same kind. Retail discounts for "factory seconds" are to be the same as for the corresponding first-grade tyres.

SPECIAL PRICES WHERE EXTRAORDINARY CHARGES INCURRED

9. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this order and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks, fit, the Tribunal, on application by any wholesaler or retailer, may authorise special prices in respect of any tyres or tubes to which this order applies where special circumstances exist or for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are incurred by the wholesaler or retailer. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a specified lot or consignment of tyres or tubes to which this order applies sold by the wholesaler or retailer while the approval remains in force.

Advance Prices for Cheese Intended for Export

PURSUANT to the Dairy Board Act 1961, the New Zealand Dairy Board has fixed the prices to be paid for all cheese manufactured from milk or cream delivered to a dairy factory in the season commencing on the 1st day of June 1967, and acquired by the New Zealand Dairy Board, pursuant to Part II of the said Act, at the several prices and upon the terms, stipulations, and conditions follow-ing that is to sav: ing, that is to say:

1. In the case of New Zealand waxed cheddar cheese to which is assigned one or other of the following respective grades and which is allotted points in grading within the range of the following respective grade points under the said regulations-

- (a) For "Finest" grade, 94 points or over, the price of 16.77 cents per pound:
- (b) For "Finest" grade, 93 points or over but under 94 points, the price of 16.57 cents per pound:
- (c) For "First" grade, 92 points or over but under 93 points, the basic price of 15.72 cents per pound:
- (d) For "First" grade, 91 points or over but under 92 points, the price of 15.52 cents per pound:
 (e) For "Graded", 88 points or over but under 91 points, the price of 14.67 cents per pound:
 (f) For "Seconds", 80 points or over but under 88 points, the price of 12.62 cents per pound.

2. In the appropriate cases there shall be deducted from the prices fixed in paragraph 1 hereof the following amounts where cheese finish points have been deducted in the Grader's prices fixed Certificate:

- point deduction—0.10 cents per pound.
 point deduction—0.15 cents per pound.
 points deduction—0.25 cents per pound.
 points deduction—0.40 cents per pound.
 points deduction—0.65 cents per pound.

3. In the appropriate cases the following amounts shall be added to or deducted from the prices fixed in paragraph 1 hereof where cheese has been classified by the Department of Agriculture in respect of cheese sediment test:

- Classification A—an addition of 0.10 cents per pound. Classification B—no alteration. Classification C—a deduction of 0.05 cents per pound. Classification D—a deduction of 0.10 cents per pound.

4. Cheese shall be packed two cheeses to each crate. Every cheese shall weigh not less than 70 lb and not more than 90 lb.

5. In computing the weight of cheese for which payment is to be made by the Board, the weight of all cheese com-prised in any consignment submitted for grading under the said regulations shall be ascertained as follows:

(a) The weight of all cheese in any such consignment shall be determined on the basis of the weight as ascer-tained by the grader of several crates of cheese selected by him for weighing and set out in the

Grader's Certificate issued in respect of that con-signment, and the crates of cheese so weighed shall be taken as fixing the average weight for the whole quantity of cheese comprised in such certificate, over-weights being averaged with underweights in relation to the respective packed weights as set out in such certificate. certificate:

- (b) If the average weight ascertained as aforesaid of the crates of cheese comprised in any Grader's Certifi-cate be less than the average of the marked weights thereof as set out in such certificate, then payment shall be made for the cheese comprised in that certifi-cate on the basis of the average weight so ascer-tained. tained:
- (c) If the average weight ascertained as aforesaid of the crates of cheese comprised in any Grader's Certificate exceeds the average of the marked weights thereof as set out in such certificate, then the amount of such excess shall not be taken into account for the purposes of computing payment therefor:
- (d) From the total weight computed as aforesaid of the cheese comprised in any Grader's Certificate there shall be deducted by way of shrinkage allowance such amount in respect of any particular brand or class of cheese as the Board may from time to time determine determine.

6. The prices fixed by the Board shall not be paid for any cheese manufactured otherwise than in compliance with the said regulations.

7. The price to be paid by the Board for unwaxed cheese shall be the appropriate price payable for waxed cheese as hereinbefore provided reduced by such amount as corre-sponds with the reduced costs incurred in the manufacture of such unwaxed cheese and the allowance for loss in weight due to shrinkage. The reduction referred to in this paragraph shall be computed by the Board and the computation of the Board shall be final.

Board shall be final. 8. The price to be paid by the Board for any cheese which, with the approval or at the request of the Board, is manu-factured, prepared, or packed in special containers, or in special quantities, or otherwise in any special manner, shall be the appropriate price payable for that cheese as herein-before provided adjusted by such appropriate addition or reduction as corresponds with the additional costs or the reduced costs incurred in such special manufacture, prepara-tion, or packing. Any such approval or request of the Board may include a stipulation limiting the additional cost to be incurred and may dispense with the requirements of para-graphs 4 and 5 hereof, and, in that event payment shall be made for the actual net weight of the cheese exported.
