A PROCLAMATION

PURSUANT to section 14 of the Wildlife Act 1953, I, Brigadier Sir Bernard Edward Fergusson, the Governor-General of New Zealand, hereby revoke that part of the proclamation issued on the 11th day of May 1957*, declaring the area of land in the Otago Acclimatisation District, described in the Schedule hereto, to be a wildlife refuge for the purposes of the Wildlife Act 1953.

1. This order may be cited as the Hauraki Plains College Board of Governors Order 1967.
2. Until the 31st day of May 1969, the Board of Governors of Hauraki Plains College shall be constituted as follows:

- (a) One member appointed by the South Auckland Education Board;
- (b) One member elected by the parents of the pupils attending the school, being parents who are resident in the Kaihere School District or the Mangatarata School District;
- (c) Two members elected by the parents of the pupils attending the school, being parents who are resident in the Kerepehi School District;
- (d) Two members elected by the parents of the pupils attending the school, being parents who are resident in the Ngatea School District;
- (e) One member elected by the parents of the pupils attending the school, being parents who are resident in the Turua School District or the Kopuarahi School District;
- (f) One member elected by the parents of the pupils attending the school, being parents who are resident in the Waitakaruru School District;
- (g) One member, appointed by the Board of Governors itself, who shall be appointed to represent those parents of the pupils attending the school who are resident in the Maramarua School District;
- (h) One member appointed by the Hauraki Plains County Council;
- (i) One member co-opted by the Board of Governors itself, if and when it thinks fit.

3. On and after the 1st day of June 1969, the Board of Governors of Hauraki Plains College shall be constituted as follows:

- (a) One member appointed by the South Auckland Education Board;
- (b) One member elected by the parents of the pupils attending the school, being parents who are resident in the Kaihere School District or the Mangatarata School District;
- (c) Two members elected by the parents of the pupils attending the school, being parents who are resident in the Kerepehi School District;
- (d) One member being elected by the parents of pupils attending the school, being parents who are resident in the Maramarua School District.
- (e) Two members elected by the parents of the pupils attending the school, being parents who are resident in the Ngatea School District;
- (f) One member elected by the parents of the pupils attending the school, being parents who are resident in the Turua School District or the Kopuarahi School District;
- (g) One member elected by the parents of the pupils attending the school, being parents who are resident in the Waitakaruru School District;
- (h) One member appointed by the Hauraki Plains County Council;
- (i) One member co-opted by the Board of Governors itself, if and when it thinks fit.

The Indecent Publications Act 1963

IN the matter of the Indecent Publications Tribunal and in the matter of a charge against J. and J. Joyce Ltd., alleging the sale of two booklets *Sam the Ceiling Needs Painting* and *Around the World with Sam* which it was claimed were indecent.

DECISION OF THE TRIBUNAL

THE prosecution was brought in the Magistrate's Court at Auckland, and the Magistrate decided to refer the question as to whether the booklets were indecent to the Tribunal.

At the hearing before the Tribunal the Crown Solicitor (Mr Birks) appeared in support of the prosecution and Mr Hardie Boys appeared for the defendant.

Apparently the booklets have been sold quite widely in America, Scandinavia, Italy, and Holland, where sales have amounted to 150,000—in New Zealand to over 20,000. The booklets have been widely sold in New Zealand.

It was contended on behalf of the prosecution that the booklets exhibited a vulgarity amounting to indecency and would tend to debase the community, in so far as they treated sexual intercourse in a frivolous way, and there were references to incest, bestiality, and sodomy. It was claimed they had no redeeming value.

For the defence it was contended they were inconsequential and that such levity as was shown regarding sexual intercourse was unlikely to have any influence on teenagers. There are some passages which are witty and there is some element of humour.

On an overall consideration of the booklets the Tribunal finds them clever and amusing, and not indecent in the hands of adults; but because the booklets deals in a trivial and vulgar manner with sex not only in its normality, but in its gross and criminal aberrations, they appear to us to be undesirable in tone for younger teenagers who could well draw debasing inferences from them. The Tribunal therefore holds these two booklets to be indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 16 years.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR JUNE 1967

General: Barometers were unusually high over New Zealand during June and it was a month of settled weather with comparatively low rainfall. Southerly winds were more frequent than usual, especially over the North Island, where temperatures were below normal. Most farmers found the weather very much to their liking. However, in parts of King Country, Waikato, and Bay of Plenty unusually frequent frosts greatly reduced growth.

Rainfall: Rainfall was less than half the average over nearly the whole of the South Island and also over the greater part of the North Island. Greatest deficiencies were recorded in the Alps together with the Canterbury high country, and parts of Central Otago; also in most of North Otago and the Dunedin district. In all these areas rainfall was less than a quarter of the average value.

The only district with rainfall above average was Hawke's Bay, where two-thirds of the total fell on the 3rd and 4th.

This was the driest June over the country as a whole since June 1958. However, in the South Island, June 1964, was drier than either June 1958 or June 1967.

Temperatures: In the North Island temperatures were 1-4 degrees below average. Greatest departures were recorded in Auckland, Waikato, Waitomo, Taumarunui, and Taupo; in these areas it was the coldest June for many years, but about equal with June 1951.

In the South Island temperatures were mainly close to or somewhat above average.

On the 21st snow was reported in Southland to low levels and elsewhere well down on the ranges.

Sunshine: Sunshine was above average over the greater part of the country. Waikato, Waitomo, Canterbury, and Westland were particularly favoured, with surpluses of 30-40 hours.

By contrast, eastern districts of the North Island and Northland received less sun than usual, mainly by 30-40 hours. For Te Pahi, in northern Northland, the total of 87 hours was the lowest recorded in any month in 37 years of observation.

Weather Sequence: On the 1st the weather was mainly settled under the influence of a weak ridge of high pressure. However, some light rain was reported in parts of the West Coast.

The period from the 2nd to the 4th was unsettled in most districts. A trough of low pressure crossed the country; and behind it a shallow depression formed over the South Island and moved north-eastward, finally crossing Northland. Rain was general except for eastern districts of the South Island. There were some heavy falls in Gisborne and Hawke's Bay on the 3rd and 4th.

From the 5th to the 11th the depression was moving away to the east, while an anticyclone was approaching slowly over the Tasman Sea. Rain soon spread to eastern districts of the South Island while persisting still in Gisborne and Northland, but elsewhere the weather cleared. However, from the 8th the rain became scattered and very light, though extending at times to other eastern districts of the North Island and the Cook Strait area.

From the 12th to the 16th the weather was settled under the influence of a large anticyclone almost stationary over New Zealand.

By contrast, from the 17th to the 21st the weather was unsettled. Rain came first to western and northern districts of both Islands in most northerly winds with the approach of a complex depression over the Tasman Sea. As a shallow depression crossed the North Island and a trough of low pressure moved over the whole country, rain became general. A southerly change on the 21st brought snow to low levels in Southland.

Two days of fair weather followed, under the influence of an anticyclone.

During the 24th and 25th a complex trough of low pressure crossed the country, while a small depression moved over the South Island. Rain affected mainly western and northern districts of both Islands, but scattered falls were reported elsewhere. With rising pressures, conditions improved on the 26th but some rain still affected North Taranaki and Buller.

The last four days of the month was another period of mainly settled weather as an extensive belt of high pressure straddled the country from west to east. However, a few showers were reported in the easterlies in Gisborne and Northland, and in the westerlies in Southland.
