HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL
PURSUANT to section 24 of the Wildlife Act 1953, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order:

ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Waitaki Valley Acclimatisation District Order 1967.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 1st day of September 1967.

2. The area described in the Schedule to this order is hereby declared to be an acclimatisation district under the name of the Waitaki Valley Acclimatisation District, under and for the purposes of the Wildlife Act 1953.

3. The Waimate Acclimatisation District and the Waitaki Acclimatisation District (the boundaries of which are defined in the Warrant of the Governor-General, dated the 4th day of March 1925*) are hereby abolished.

SCHEDULE

ALL that area in the Canterbury and Otago Land Districts bounded by a line commencing at a point in the middle of the mouth of the Pareora River and proceeding westerly generally up the middle of that river to its source, a right line to the summit of Mount Nimrod, a right line to Trig. Station F, along the summit of the Hunter Hills to Trig. Station K, along a line due west to the Hakataramea River, up that river and Dalgety Stream to Hakataramea Pass, along a right line passing through Trig. Station N 1 to Stony Stream and down that stream to the shore of Lake Benmore; thence due south-westerly along a right line to the middle of that lake; thence northerly up the middle of that lake, the Pukaki River, Lake Pukaki and the Tasman River to the Tasman Glacier, to and along the western side of that glacier to a point on the production of a line from the summit of Mount Cook to Ball Hut, to and along that line to the summit of Mount Cook, and along the Mount Cook Range to the Southern Alps; thence south-westerly along the summit of the Southern Alps passing through Mount Sefton, Mount Burns, Mount Hopkins, Mount Williams, and Mount Jackson to Broderick Pass; thence southerly generally along the summit of the range passing through Mount Huxley and Lindis Pass to Old Man Peak; thence north-easterly generally along the summit of the range to the summit of the Wether Range; thence southerly generally along the summit of that range and the St. Bathans Range to Mount St. Bathans; thence due east along a right line to the summit of the Hawkdun Range; thence south-easterly and easterly generally along the summit of that range, passing through Mount Ida to Dansey Pass; thence southerly to and along the summit of the Kakanui Range to the source of the south branch of the Waianakarua River; thence south-easterly generally down the middle of that river to a point in line with the south-eastern boundary of Section 27, Block III, Waihemmo Survey District; thence south-westerly across a public road to and along that boundary to another public road; thence south-easterly generally along the last-mentioned road to the eastern boundary of Section 4, Block XIV, Moeraki Survey District; thence southerly along that boundary to the northern boundary of Block XII, Moeraki Survey District; thence easterly and southerly along the northern and eastern boundaries of the said Block XII, and the southern boundary of Block XI, Moeraki Survey District, to the north-western corner of Section 31, Block XI aforesaid; thence easterly along the northern boundary of that section to a public road; thence southerly generally along that road to a closed road; thence south-easterly generally along the said closed road to the southern boundary of Section 43, Block IX, Moeraki Survey District; thence easterly along the southern boundaries of Sections 43, 44, and 45, Block IX aforesaid, to the western boundary of Part 1 of Section 20, Block III, Moeraki Survey District; thence northerly along that boundary and its production to the sea coast; thence northerly along the sea coast to a point in the middle of the mouth of the Pareora River, being the point of commencement.

PURSUANT to the Local Government Commission Act 1961, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order:

ORDER

1. This order shall take effect on the 1st day of September 1967.

2. The areas described in the Schedules hereto are hereby excluded from the County of Kairanga and included in the City of Palmerston North.

3. The alteration of the boundaries of the said county and the said city hereinbefore made, shall be deemed to have been effected under the Municipal Corporations Act 1954.

FIRST SCHEDULE

(b) Any person employed in or about the exhibition on any day that would, but for the provisions of this order, have been a whole holiday for that person by virtue of any Act, or of any award or industrial agreement, shall be paid for all work done on that day at not less than twice the ordinary rate, whether the work is performed wholly in or about the exhibition or otherwise: Provided that nothing in this sub-clause shall be deemed to deprive any person of any other payment for the said holiday, to which he is entitled under any Act or award or industrial agreement.

4. No male under 18 years of age and no female shall be employed in or about the exhibition after the hour of 10.30 p.m.

5. For the purposes of the enforcement of an award or industrial agreement any provision of which has been suspended by this order, any officer of the industrial union or association concerned who is authorised in writing in that behalf by the union or association shall be entitled to interview at his place of employment any person employed in or about the exhibition under that award or industrial agreement at such time or times as may be agreed upon between the officer and the employer of that person, and for this purpose any such officer shall be entitled at any time to have access to the Register of Passes issued by the promoter.

The Rotorua Borough Bylaws Order 1962, Amendment No. 2

WHEREAS by section 8 of the Rotorua Borough Act 1922, all electric light and power works theretofore provided, erected, or constructed by the Crown in or in connection with the town of Rotorua are vested in the Tourist and Publicity Department;

And whereas in respect of these works the said Department has and may exercise all the powers for the time being conferred by law on borough councils, except the power to borrow money by way of special loan or to make and levy any rate;

And whereas by licences granted by the Governor-General in Council, as published in the *Gazette* of the 5th day of November 1931 and the 1st day of October 1936, the said Department is authorised to generate electricity and erect electric lines within the borough of Rotorua and portion of the County of Rotorua as set out in the Schedules of the said licences:

The said Department, pursuant to the powers hereinbefore recited, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Rotorua Borough Bylaws Order 1962, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Rotorua Borough Bylaws Order 1962* (hereinafter referred to as the principal order).

(2) This order shall come into force on the 2nd day of October 1967.

2. (1) The principal order is hereby amended by revoking Sections A to F of the bylaw set out in the Schedule to the principal order (as amended by the Rotorua Borough Bylaws Order 1962, Amendment No. 1), and substituting Sections A to E set out in the Schedule to this order.

(2) The Rotorua Borough Bylaws Order 1962, Amendment No. 1, is hereby revoked.

SCHEDULE

New Sections A to E of the bylaw set out in the Schedule to the principal order.

"Section A: Domestic

For domestic lighting, heating, and power, the monthly charges shall be as follows:

First 50 units	24c per 10 units.
Balance of units	10c per 10 units.

Churches, schools, and Maori meeting houses shall be included under this scale. Where commercial premises have living quarters attached and the whole is supplied with energy through one set of meters the charges shall be at commercial rates as set out in Section B of this Schedule; or where separately metered each shall be considered as a separate connection.

All thermal storage water-heaters must be controlled by means of a water heating relay, a change-over switch or, where necessary, by an approved time-switch to be supplied by the consumer.

Section B: Commercial and Farming

(i) *Lighting—*

All units	39c per 10 units.
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(ii) *Heating and Power—*

Monthly Charges—

First 1,000 units	39c per 10 units.
Balance of units	15c per 10 units.

(iii) *Water Heating—*

Where the use of energy for water heating is controlled in one of the following ways—

(a) By means of an approved time switch supplied by the consumer; or

(b) By means of a water heating relay switch; or

(c) In a cowshed by a change-over switch which prevents the water heater being used at the same time as any motor; or

(d) By means of a change-over switch under other conditions approved by the Department;

the charge shall be—

8c per 10 units.

Section C: Extraordinary Supply

In cases where an extraordinary supply is given or in cases not covered by the foregoing Sections A or B the Department may fix a charge which is considered reasonable under the circumstances.

Section D: Minimum Charge

The minimum charge shall be \$1.20 per month for each connection to the system. Where two or more consumers are supplied through the one connection the minimum charge shall be levied on each consumer.

Section E: Discount

Discounts at the rate of 10 (ten) percent will be allowed on accounts computed under Sections A, B, and D above, subject to the following conditions:

(i) That the full amount of the account, including all arrears, is paid within fourteen days of the reading of the meter:

Provided that should the last day of the period allowed for discount be a day on which the office of the Department is not open for business, discount shall be allowed if such payment is made on the first business day following.

(ii) In any case of hardship the District Manager of the Department at Rotorua may allow discount if payment is made within 14 days after the last ordinary day for the allowing of discount.

(iii) Accounts for Government Departments, local bodies, public hospitals, fire and other boards, shall not be subject to forfeiture of discount should payment not be made within the period specified in paragraph (i) of this Section."

Order No. 2 (1967) of the Trade Practices and Prices Commission

IN the matter of the Trade Practices Act 1958 and in the matter of a report by the Examiner of Trade Practices and Prices into the terms on which Kempthorne Prosser and Co.'s New Zealand Drug Company Ltd. has agreed to sell phosphatic fertiliser to the F.I.C. Group Ltd., the Marlborough Farm Trading Society Ltd., the Ashburton Trading Society Ltd., and the North Canterbury Rural Co-operative Society Ltd.

WHEREAS the Trade Practices and Prices Commission has received from the Examiner of Trade Practices and Prices (hereinafter referred to as "the Examiner") a report, pursuant to section 17 of the said Act, in which it was alleged that Kempthorne Prosser and Co.'s New Zealand Drug Co. Ltd. (hereinafter referred to as "the company") refused to accept orders from the F.I.C. Group Ltd., the Marlborough Farm Trading Society Ltd., the Ashburton Trading Society Ltd., and the North Canterbury Rural Co-operative Society Ltd. (hereinafter referred to as "the societies"), under the terms applicable to incorporated farmers' organisations, as defined in clause 4 (1) (e) of the price order relating to phosphatic fertilisers (hereinafter referred to as "the price order");

And whereas in the said report of the Examiner he stated that he had conducted conciliation proceedings with the company under the provisions of section 16A of the said Act, and that the company, while denying the Examiner's allegations that its action was a trade practice which was contrary to the public interest, nevertheless had agreed to accept orders from the societies under the terms specified in the said price order on specific terms to obviate the risk of financial loss to the company in trading with the societies, and that the societies had agreed to the specific terms as to payment for supplies;

And whereas the Examiner has recommended that the Commission should make an order under section 19 of the said Act, to direct the company to discontinue the practice of refusing to accept orders from the societies, provided the said societies conform to the procedure agreed upon by the company and the societies relating to the payment by the societies prior to delivery of the fertiliser by the company;

And whereas the Commission is satisfied that all persons who would be bound by any order made by the Commission pursuant to the recommendation by the said Examiner in the said report, have concurred with the recommendation made by the said Examiner in the said report and the Commission has dispensed with an inquiry under section 18 of the said Act;

And whereas the Commission decided that an order should be made under the said Act to give effect to the said recommendation;

Now, therefore, the Trade Practices and Prices Commission hereby orders and directs Kempthorne Prosser and Co.'s New Zealand Drug Co. Ltd., to accept orders for phosphatic fertiliser from the F.I.C. Group Ltd., the Marlborough Farm Trading Society Ltd., the Ashburton Trading Society Ltd., and the North Canterbury Rural Co-operative Society Ltd., provided that the said societies conform with the conditions for payment of supplies as set out hereunder, or on such other terms as may be agreed upon from time to time between the company and any of the said societies.

TERMS FOR PAYMENT

IN this order the word "price" means:

- (a) In the case of phosphatic fertiliser, subject to the provisions of a price order, the price stated in the price order; or
- (b) In the case of fertilisers which are subject to the approval of the Department of Industries and Commerce, under authority delegated by the Price Tribunal, the price so approved by the department in accordance with the formula approved by the Price Tribunal and duly notified to the department as directed by the Price Tribunal.

Orders will be placed by each society with the company.

Not less than five working days before delivery of the fertiliser is made or required the society concerned shall deposit into a bank account nominated by the company an amount equal to the value of the order calculated at user prices.

The fertiliser will be delivered or dispatched to the member of the society concerned.

The company will debit the account of the society with the value of the fertiliser delivered calculated at the prices fixed by the price order as applicable to farmers' organisations as defined in clause 4 (1) (e) of the current price order, or as in (b) above.

At the end of the month in which deliveries of fertiliser are made the company will credit the society's ledger account with the total amounts lodged by the society in the nominated bank account relating to those deliveries.

The company will pay the society the balance standing to its credit in its ledger account at the company as soon as practicable in the month following the month in which deliveries are made.

Ltd. has agreed to sell phosphatic fertiliser to the Otago Rural Trading Society Ltd. and the Rural Co-operative Society Ltd.

WHEREAS the Trade Practices and Prices Commission has received from the Examiner of Trade Practices and Prices (hereinafter referred to as "the Examiner") a report, pursuant to section 17 of the said Act, in which it was alleged that the Dominion Fertiliser Co. Ltd. (hereinafter referred to as "the company"), refused to accept orders from the Otago Rural Trading Society Ltd. and the Rural Co-operative Society Ltd. (hereinafter referred to as "the societies"), under the terms applicable to incorporated farmers' organisations, as defined in clause 4 (1) (e) of the price order relating to phosphatic fertilisers (hereinafter referred to as "the price order");

And whereas in the said report of the Examiner he stated that he had conducted conciliation proceedings with the company under the provisions of section 16A of the said Act, and that the company, while denying the Examiner's allegations that its action was a trade practice which was contrary to the public interest, nevertheless had agreed to accept orders from the societies under the terms specified in the said price order on specific terms to obviate the risk of financial loss to the company in trading with the societies, and that the company had been operating such agreement voluntarily since 1 June 1966; and that the societies had agreed to the specific terms as to payment for supplies;

And whereas the Examiner has recommended that the Commission should make an order under section 19 of the said Act, to direct the company to discontinue the practice of refusing to accept orders from the societies, provided the said societies conform to the procedure agreed upon by the company and the societies relating to the payment by the societies prior to delivery of the fertiliser by the company;

And whereas the Commission is satisfied that all persons who would be bound by any order made by the Commission pursuant to the recommendation by the said Examiner in the said report, have concurred with the recommendation made by the said Examiner in the said report and the Commission has dispensed with an inquiry under section 18 of the said Act;

And whereas the Commission decided that an order should be made under the said Act to give effect to the said recommendation;

Now, therefore, the Trade Practices and Prices Commission hereby orders and directs The Dominion Fertiliser Co. Ltd. to accept orders for phosphatic fertiliser from the Otago Rural Trading Society Ltd., and the Rural Co-operative Society Ltd., provided that the said societies conform with the conditions for payment of supplies as set out hereunder, or on such other terms as may be agreed upon from time to time between the company and any of the said societies.

TERMS FOR PAYMENT

IN this order the word "price" means:

- (a) In the case of phosphatic fertiliser, subject to the provisions of a price order, the price stated in the price order; or
- (b) In the case of fertilisers which are subject to the approval of the Department of Industries and Commerce, under authority delegated by the Price Tribunal, the price so approved by the department in accordance with the formula approved by the Price Tribunal and duly notified to the department as directed by the Price Tribunal.

Orders will be placed by each society with the company.

Not less than seven days before delivery of the fertiliser is made or required the society concerned shall deposit into a bank account nominated by the company an amount calculated at the rate of £10 per ton of fertiliser or in the event of price increases the £10 per ton is to be adjusted to the nearest 10s. increase.

The fertiliser will be delivered or dispatched to the member of the society concerned.

The company will debit the account of the society with the value of the fertiliser delivered calculated at the prices fixed by the price order as applicable to farmers' organisations as defined in clause 4 (1) (e) of the current price order, or as in (b) above.

Not later than the 25th of the month following delivery of the fertiliser the balance standing to the debit or credit of the society on account of each month's deliveries will be

paid either by the society to the company for debit balances, or by the company to the society for credit balances.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR JULY 1967

General: As in June, barometers were unusually high over New Zealand in July. It was marked by a comparative absence of wind and was also the third successive month with rainfall well below average. Conditions were favourable for stock and for lambing. However, the ground was unusually dry for July. It was too dry for some farmers, especially in parts of the North Island, where there were complaints about both the frequent frosts and the shortage of feed. In Hawke's Bay and South Canterbury the very dry conditions were partly responsible for the increase in Porina and grass grub infestation, causing serious damage to some pastures.

Rainfall: In the North Island rainfall was mainly two-thirds of the average value. In eastern districts of the South Island from Central Marlborough to South Otago up to about 30 miles inland, rainfall was less than half the average; near the coast and on Banks Peninsula it was less than a quarter.

The last July as dry as this one in the North Island was in 1952, and in the South Island in 1958.

Rainfall was above average in only two areas. The first consisted of parts of Nelson and Marlborough Sounds. The second included Westland and Fiordland and extended over the Alps into parts of Central Otago and the Canterbury high country. In South Westland rainfall was mainly more than double the average, largely as a result of falls of 7-13 inches there on the 2nd.

Temperatures: Over the greater part of the South Island and in Northland temperatures were 1-3 degrees warmer than average. Elsewhere they were close to or a little colder than average.

In the South Island there was a noticeable lack of snow on the ranges.

Sunshine: Sunshine was mainly close to or somewhat above average. However, over most of Northland it was 30-50 hours below average.

Weather Sequence: At the beginning of the month an anticyclone was centred to the east of the North Island while a depression passed to the south. In the northerlies rain was restricted mainly to the West Coast. On the 2nd a trough of low pressure became slow-moving over the South Island while a new depression formed in mid-Tasman. Rain became very heavy in South Westland and spread over the whole country, except for Hawke's Bay. However, on the following day a southerly change followed by rising pressures brought improved weather over the South Island, though there was still light rain in many places. The depression in mid-Tasman was now becoming complex, and one centre soon crossed Northland. As a result, in the North Island the rain persisted from the 3rd to the 5th, with some considerable falls in Taranaki and Coromandel.

The first centre of the depression moved south-eastward, and the second centre moved from the north Tasman to a position just north of Northland, where it remained stationary from the 6th to the 8th. During these three days an anticyclone extended on to the South Island. In many districts the weather was settled. However, Northland and Gisborne received rain; and at first Wairarapa, Hawke's Bay, and parts of Auckland were also affected. The main centre of high pressure now moved further south, to the west of Southland, and winds changed to southerly. As the anticyclone moved slowly eastward, the weather was again settled in many districts from the 9th to the 13th. However, some showers were reported in Southland, Wellington, Wairarapa, Gisborne, parts of the Canterbury coast, the Manawatu-Wanganui area, and Buller.

On the 14th a small depression from the Tasman Sea crossed the North Island, where nearly all districts received some rain. During the next two days an anticyclone was centred over the North Island and the weather was settled.

From the 17th to the 19th a slow-moving trough of low pressure crossed the North Island, followed by westerly to north-westerly winds. Rain was restricted mainly to western districts at first, but gradually became widespread over the North Island, except for Hawke's Bay. In the South Island, in addition to western districts, northern districts were affected, besides parts of the Southland and Otago coast. During the next two days a small depression crossed Northland, bringing rain to the northern half of the North Island; while a weak trough affected Fiordland and the Southland coast. A large anticyclone now moved on to the South Island from the south-west. With the change to southerly winds light rain was recorded in Southland and most eastern districts on the 22nd and 23rd.

The anticyclone now moved to a position just east of Cook Strait and remained there from the 24th to the 29th. Like the 6th to the 13th, this was a period of predominantly settled and at times sunny weather. However, Northland and Gisborne received some rain from the north-easterlies on several days; Auckland and Bay of Plenty were also affected at times. In the south the passage of a weak trough caused considerable rain in Fiordland and Westland on the 25th and 26th.

On the 30th and 31st a depression passed close to Campbell Island, and the associated trough of low pressure brought considerable rain to western and northern districts of the South Island. Some rain extended also to Southland, the Canterbury high country, and parts of the North Island.
