Declaring Areas to be Access Lanes in Lake Taupo for the Purposes of the Motor Launch Regulations 1962

Returns of Insurance Premiums Required from Persons, etc., Insuring Property Against Fire Otherwise Than With an Insurance Company Carrying on Business in New Zealand

THE attention of all persons, firms, companies, and Associations being owners of property in respect of which premiums are paid to an insurance company not carrying on business in New Zealand is drawn to section 52 of the Fire Services Act 1949 (as amended by the Fire Services Amendment Acts 1953, 1956, and 1959) and furthermore the attention of all persons, firms, companies, and associations in possession of funds for insurance purposes is drawn to section 52 (2) of the Act which is quoted as follows:

“For the purpose of this section where an owner of any property within a united urban fire district, urban fire district, or a secondary urban fire district makes a payment in respect of that property to any fund established for insurance purposes either within or beyond New Zealand, the person in possession of the fund shall be deemed to be an insurance company and every amount paid to the fund shall be deemed to be a premium”.

Price Order No. 2070 (Australian Oranges)

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act 1947, I, Geoffrey Harold Datson, pursuant to a delegation from the Secretary of Industries and Commerce acting under a delegation from the Price Tribunal, hereby make the following price order:

1. This order may be cited as Price Order No. 2070, and shall come into force on the 19th day of January 1968.

2. (1) Price Order No. 2034* is hereby revoked.

(2) The revocation of the said order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this order.

3. References in this order to metropolitan areas are references to the metropolitan areas described in the Schedule hereto.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

4. This order applies with respect to all Australian oranges sold by way of retail in New Zealand.

MAXIMUM RETAIL PRICES

5. (1) Where, in this price order, prices are expressed both in decimal currency and in existing currency, the prices expressed in decimal currency shall be the prices applicable unless, because of difficulties relating to machine conversion, a trader continues to deal during the transitional period exclusively or principally in existing currency, in which case the prices applicable shall be those expressed in existing currency.

(2) In this clause the terms "decimal currency", "existing currency", and "transitional period" shall have the same meaning as in the Decimal Currency Act 1964.

6. (1) Subject to the provisions of this clause, the maximum price that may be charged or received by any retailer for any Australian oranges shall be—

(a) When sold by a retailer carrying on business in any of the metropolitan areas of Auckland, Wellington, Christchurch, or Dunedin, or in any of the Cities or Boroughs of Whangarei, Takapuna, Hamilton, Tauranga, Rotorua, Gisborne, New Plymouth, Stratford, Hawera, Wanganui, Palmerston North, Napier, Hastings, Blenheim, Nelson, Greymouth, Timaru, Westport, Oamaru, Balclutha, Gore, or Invercargill—

16 cents (1s. 7d.) per pound.

(b) When sold by a retailer carrying on business elsewhere—

1s. 7½d. per pound, or
1 lb, 17 cents;
2 lb, 33 cents;
3 lb, 50 cents;
4 lb, 66 cents;

Fractions of a pound shall be calculated at 17 cents per pound. Quantities in excess of 4 lb shall be calculated at the rate of 16½ cents per pound.

(2) If in respect of any lot of oranges sold by a retailer the maximum price calculated in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this clause is not an exact number of

cents, pence or half-pence, the maximum price of the lot may be computed to the nearest whole cent, or the next upward half-penny.

SPECIAL PRICES WHERE EXTRAORDINARY CHARGES INCURRED

7. Subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any retailer, may authorise special prices in respect of any Australian oranges to which this order applies where special circumstances exist, or for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are incurred by the retailer. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a specified lot or consignment of oranges or may relate generally to all Australian oranges to which this order applies sold by the retailer while the approval remains in force.

DUTY IMPOSED ON RETAILERS

8. Every retailer who offers or exposes any Australian oranges for sale in any shop shall keep in a prominent position in such proximity to the oranges to which it relates as to be obviously descriptive thereof, a ticket, placard, or label on which shall be stated in legible and prominent characters the following particulars:

(a) The retail price per pound of the oranges. Retailers to whom clause 6 (b) of this order applies shall state at least the prices for 1 lb and 2 lb lots.

(b) The word "Australian".

NEW ZEALAND LAW SOCIETY

THE LAW PRACTITIONERS ACT (DISCIPLINARY) RULES 1968
MADE by the Disciplinary Committee of the New Zealand Law Society under section 47 of the Law Practitioners Act 1955.

PART I—CHARGES AGAINST PRACTITIONERS

1. Where a charge is made by the New Zealand Law Society or by a District Law Society under section 34 of the Law Practitioners Act 1955 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") against a practitioner any such charge shall be in writing, and shall be lodged with the Clerk to the Committee (hereinafter referred to as "the Clerk").

2. Before fixing a date for the hearing, the Committee may require the Society concerned to supply such further information and documents relating to the charge as it thinks fit, and in any case where, in the opinion of the Committee, no prima facie case is shown, the Committee may, without requiring the practitioner to answer the charge, dismiss the charge. If required so to do, either by the Society or by the practitioner, the Committee shall make a formal order dismissing such charge.

3. If the Committee is of opinion that the charges should be heard, the Committee shall fix a date, time, and place for the hearing, and the Clerk shall serve or cause to be served notice thereof on the Society and on the practitioner and shall serve or cause to be served on the practitioner a copy of the charges and of all affidavits in support thereof. The notice shall be served not less than 21 days before the day of hearing.

4. The notices may be in the forms in that behalf set out in the Schedule hereto and shall require the Society and the practitioner respectively to furnish to the Clerk and to each other a list of all documents and copies of all affidavits on which they respectively propose to rely. Such list and copies unless otherwise permitted by the Committee shall be furnished by the Society and by the practitioner respectively at least 10 clear days before the day of hearing.

5. Either party may inspect the documents included in the list furnished by the other; and a copy of any document mentioned in the list of either party shall, on the application and at the expense of the party requiring it, be furnished to that party by the other within three days after the receipt of the application.

6. If either party fails to appear at the hearing, the Committee may, upon proof of service of the notice of hearing, proceed to hear and determine the charge notwithstanding the absence of such party.

7. Unless otherwise permitted by the Committee all evidence shall be given by affidavit.

8. Where the Committee makes an order under section 34 of the Act, the Clerk shall serve forthwith a copy of the order on the Society concerned and on the practitioner. In the case of an order to be filed under section 49 of the Act such order shall be filed forthwith after the making thereof.

PART II—APPLICATIONS AT THE INSTANCE OF PRACTITIONERS

9. An application at the instance of a practitioner under section 38 of the Act shall be in writing supported by affidavit setting out the reasons for the application and shall be lodged with the Clerk and a copy of the application and affidavit shall be lodged with the District Law Society of which the practitioner is a member.

10. If the Committee is satisfied that the District Law Society concerned does not oppose the application, the Committee may consider the same without requiring any further evidence; and in any other case shall fix a date, time, and place for the hearing of the application.

PART III—APPLICATIONS FOR RESTORATION TO ROLL

11. An application by a practitioner for restoration of his name to the roll pursuant to section 39 of the Act, shall be in writing and shall be supported by affidavit setting out the grounds upon which the application is based.

12. The application and affidavits in support shall be lodged by the applicant with the Clerk. Upon receipt thereof by the Clerk, the Committee shall fix a date, time, and place for the hearing and the Clerk shall serve or cause to be served notice thereof on the applicant and on the Law Society of the district in which he last practised.

13. Unless the Committee otherwise directs, the applicant shall give notice of his application and of the date appointed for the hearing through the Secretary of the District Law Society to all practitioners practising in the district in which the applicant last practised. The Committee may, if it thinks fit, require the applicant to give notice as aforesaid to all practitioners practising in any other district and to advertise his application in such manner and in such form as it directs. The Committee may modify, vary, or revoke any direction made under this rule and substitute any other direction therefor.

14. If any person desires to object to the application, such person shall give notice in writing to the Clerk and to the Secretary of the said District Law Society at least seven days before the day fixed for the hearing, specifying the grounds of his objection.

15. The New Zealand Law Society and any District Law Society may appear at the hearing of any such application.

16. The Committee may refuse to consider any application for restoration to the roll until any order for costs and/or expenses made against the applicant in respect of any proceedings under Part III of the Law Practitioners Act 1955 and its amendments whether before any Court or before the Disciplinary Committee shall have been paid or complied with.

PART IV—GENERAL

17. Whenever any charge affidavit or application is lodged with the Clerk under these rules there shall be lodged with it 11 additional copies and such copies shall be printed, cyclostyled, or produced by some similar process.

18. The Committee shall hear all applications in private.

19. At any stage of the proceedings, the Committee, may, if it thinks fit, appoint Counsel to represent the applicant or the practitioner charged, and may order that the costs of such Counsel be paid out of the funds of the New Zealand Law Society.

20. No application shall be withdrawn after it has been sent to the Clerk, except by leave of the Committee. Application for leave to withdraw shall be made on the day fixed for the hearing unless the Committee otherwise directs. The Committee may grant leave subject to such terms as to costs or otherwise as it shall think fit, or it may adjourn the matter under the next succeeding rule.

21. The Committee may of its own motion, or upon the application of either party, adjourn the hearing upon such terms and conditions including any order as to costs as to the Committee may appear just.

22. If upon the hearing, it shall appear to the Committee that any charge ought to be amended, or added to, and that such amendment or addition is not within the scope of the original charge, the Committee may permit such amendment or addition provided always that if such amendment or addition shall in the opinion of the Committee be such as to take the practitioner by surprise, or prejudice the conduct of his case, the Committee shall grant an adjournment of the hearing, upon such terms as to costs or otherwise as to the Committee may appear just.

23. Shorthand notes of proceedings may be taken by a person appointed by the Committee; and any party who appeared at the proceedings shall be entitled to inspect the transcript thereof. The shorthand writer shall, if required, supply to the Committee and to any person entitled to be heard upon an appeal against an order of the Committee, and to the New Zealand and/or District Law Society concerned, but to no other person, a copy of the transcript of such notes on payment of his charges. If no shorthand notes be taken the Chairman shall take or cause to be taken a note of the proceedings and the provisions of this rule as to inspection and taking of copies shall apply to such note accordingly.

24. Service of any notice or document required by these rules may be effected either personally or by registered letter addressed to the last known place of abode, or business, of the person to be served, and proof that such letter was so addressed and posted shall be proof of service, and such service shall be deemed to have been effected at the time at which the letter would be delivered in the ordinary course of post.

25. Any notice or document required to be given or signed by the Clerk may be given or signed by him or by the Secretary of the New Zealand Law Society, or by any other person duly authorised by the Committee.

26. The Committee may dispense with any requirements of these rules respecting notices, affidavits, documents, service, or time, or any other matter in any case where it appears to the Committee to be just so to do.

27. The Committee may extend the time for doing anything under these rules.

28. All affidavits and other records shall be filed and kept by the Clerk. The Committee may order that any books, papers, or other exhibits, produced or used at a hearing, shall be retained by the Clerk until the time for appealing has expired, and, if notice of appeal is given, until the appeal is heard or otherwise disposed of.

29. The several expressions to which meanings are assigned in the Law Practitioners Act 1955, shall have the same meanings in these rules.

30. These rules shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1968 and may be cited as "The Law Practitioners Act (Disciplinary) Rules 1968".
