THE RIGHT HON. KEITH HOLYOAKE, C.H., PRESIDING IN COUNCIL Pursuant to the Local Government Commission Act 1967, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. This order shall come into force on the 1st day of April

1. This order shall come into loree on the lot day of 15.1... 1968.

2. The districts of the City of Napier, and the Borough of Taradale, are hereby united to form one borough and the council of the Borough of Taradale is hereby dissolved.

3. The united borough shall be called the City of Napier (hereinafter called "the said city").

4. Subject to the provisions of section 53 (2) of the Municipal Corporations Act 1954 the council of the said city shall consist of 12 members exclusive of the Mayor.

5. The first elections of members of the council and the Mayor of the said city shall be held on the day prescribed by law for the first triennial general election of members of local authorities to be held after the 1st day of April 1968.

6. Until the members of the council of the said city elected at the said first triennial general election shall come into office the council of the said city shall consist of 15 members, exclusive of the Mayor of the said city, being the 12 members of the former council of the city of Napier, the Mayor of the former Taradale Borough Council and two of the members of the former Taradale Borough Council to be chosen by that council, and for the purpose of making that choice but for no other purpose, the members of the former Taradale Borough Council shall, if necessary, continue in office after the 31st day of March 1968.

7. Until the Mayor to be elected at the said first triennial general election shall come into office the Mayor of the said city shall be the Mayor of the former City of Napier.

8. For rating purposes only, the said city shall be divided into two divisions as follows:

into two divisions as follows:

comprising the area of the

(i) The Napier Division, comprising the area of the former City of Napier;
(ii) The Taradale Division, comprising the area of the former Borough of Taradale;

and such divisions shall exist for a period lasting until the total rate in the dollar levied in the Napier Division shall equal the total rate in the dollar levied in the Taradale Division or until the 31 March 1978, whichever shall be the

earlier.

9. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Act 1954 and subject to the provision of clause 8 hereof for the financial years in the period ending 31 March 1973, the total of all rates levied annually in the Taradale Division shall be 4 cents in the dollar of unimproved value and when the area of the said city is revalued and the new valuations are used for rating purposes as from 1 April 1973, the 4 cents in the dollar total rate levied in the said Taradale Division shall be reduced to such a total rate as will yield the same sum as would have been yielded on the basis of a total rate of 4 cents in the dollar on the valuation previously in force. previously in force.

10. For the purpose of levying the total rate in the said Taradale Division the council of the said city shall strike a consolidated rate on the said division consisting of:

(i) A consolidated special rate for the purposes of servicing loans secured over the Taradale Division only; and

only; and consolidated general rate of an amount in the dollar equal to the difference between the aforementioned consolidated special rate and a total rate of 4 cents in the dollar or such other total rate as may be levied on the above-mentioned new valuations valuations.

11. Until the expiration of the period prescribed in clause 8 hereof the provisions of sections 93, 93A, and 94 of the Municipal Corporations Act 1954 shall not apply to the said

city.

12. From the expiration of the period prescribed in clause 8 hereof the council of the said city shall consolidate all rates over the said city.

12. The first Town Clerk of the said city shall be the Town

13. The first Town Clerk of the said city shall be the Town Clerk of the former City of Napier.

14. All existing staff of the councils of the former City of Napier and the former Borough of Taradale shall be taken over by the council of the said city under and subject to the provisions of the Local Authorities (Employment Protection) Act 1963. This provision shall be in extension of and subject to the provisions of that Act.

15. Except as otherwise provided herein, or in the Local Government Commission Act 1967, the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Act 1954 shall with the necessary modifications and so far as they are applicable apply to the union hereby effected as if the former City of Napier and Borough of Taradale had been united under that Act and the District Land Registrar of the Hawke's Bay Land Registration District is hereby directed to make such entries in his register, and to do all such other things as may be necessary to give effect to the provisions of this clause.

THE RIGHT HON. KEITH HOLYOAKE, C.H., PRESIDING IN COUNCIL PURSUANT to the Local Government Commission Act 1967, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order:

ORDER

1. This order shall come into force on 1 April 1968.

2. The County of Halswell and the County of Paparua are hereby united and the councils of the said counties are hereby dissolved.

3. The united county shall be called the County of Paparua (hereinafter called the "said county").

4. For representation purposes the said county shall be divided into 12 ridings as follows:

(i) The Sockburn Riding, comprising the Sockburn Riding of the former County of Paparua.

(viii) The Broadfield Riding, comprising the Broadfield Riding of the former County of Paparua.
(x) The Ladbrooks Riding, comprising the Ladbrooks Riding of the former County of Paparua.
(x) The Halswell County Town Riding, comprising that area of the former County of Halswell described in the First Schedule hereto.
(xi) The Halswell Rural Riding, comprising the area of the former County of Halswell described in the Second Schedule hereto.
(xii) The Tail Tanu Riding, comprising that area of the

Schedule hereto.

(xii) The Tai Tapu Riding, comprising that area of the former County of Halswell described in the Third Schedule hereto.

5. The council of the said county shall consist of 15 members as follows:

6. The first election of members of the council of the said county shall be held on the date prescribed by law for the next triennial general elections of members of county councils.

7. Until the members of the council of the said county elected at the said first election shall come into office, the said council shall consist of:

(i) The 12 members of the former Paparua County Council, and

(ii) Three of the members of the former Halswell County
Council to be chosen by that Council from among
its members and for the purpose of making that
choice, but for no other purpose, the Council of
that County shall, where necessary, continue in
office after the constitution of the said county.

8. The Halswell County Town Riding of the said county shall be a county town having the name of Halswell County Town and the provisions of the Counties Act 1956 shall apply in all respects as if the said county town had been constituted under section 417 of that Act.

9. All bylaws in force in the former County of Paparua shall become bylaws of the said county and except as hereinafter provided, all bylaws in force in the former County of Halswell shall be deemed to have been revoked on the constitution of the said county, provided however that the High Pressure Water Supply Bylaws of each of the former counties shall become bylaws of the said county and shall apply in the respective High Pressure Water Districts of the respective former counties. respective former counties.

10. Except as otherwise provided herein or in the Local Government Commission Act 1967 the provisions of section 10 of the Counties Act 1956 shall apply to the union of counties hereby effected as if the former counties of Halswell and Paparua had been united under that Act.

11. All existing staff of the councils of each of the said former counties shall be taken over by the council of the said county under and subject to the provisions of the Local Authorities (Employment Protection) Act 1963. This provision shall be in extension of and subject to the provisions of the said Act.

12. The first County Clerk of the said county shall be the County Clerk of the former County of Paparua.

13. In accordance with the provisions of subsection (2) of section 28B of the Town and Country Planning Act 1953 it is hereby directed that the said county shall not proceed to prepare a new district scheme for the whole of its district but that it shall continue to administer the proposed district scheme of the former County of Paparua and the draft district scheme of the former County of Halswell.

14. Until such time as a revised valuation of the whole of the said county shall come into effect the following provisions shall apply:

(a) The council of the said county shall, under the provisions of section 110 of the Counties Act 1956, make and levy all rates separately in each of the former counties provided that section 107 of the said Act shall not apply to the said county.
(b) The provisions of Part IX of the Rating Act 1967 shall, where applicable and with the necessary modifications, apply to the said county as if, for the purpose of section 159 of the said Act, the said county were a "special-purpose authority" within the provisions of Part IX of that Act and, for the purpose of section 160 of that Act the districts formerly comprising the counties of Halswell and Paparua were "constituent districts" within the provisions of the said Part, and all rates made and levied by the said county shall be calculated on the adjusted valuation of the said county.

15. So far as they are applicable and with the necessary modifications, the provisions of section 99A of the Land Transfer Act 1952 shall apply to the union hereby effected.

Notes on the Weather for February 1968

General-In the North Island this was the driest February since 1946 and one of the driest months on record. The weather was also sunny over both Islands. Northern districts were experiencing and sumify over both shands. Northern districts were experienced and their second successive month of very dry weather. In these areas dairy production was dropping and in some places feed was very scarce. Elsewhere in the North Island and also in Nelson the dry weather was beginning to affect pastures and crops; but February was a good month for harvesting. In Canterbury, Otago, and Southland the supply of feed was somewhat better than in the North Island.

the North Island.

Rainfall—Rainfall was mainly only one third of the average value over the North Island. In Gisborne and parts of northern Northland it was less than a tenth of the average. Many parts of the North Island received little or no rain after the 9th.

Other dry months over the North Island with about the same rainfall as February 1968 were February 1915, March 1931, January 1955, and January 1957. However, in February 1946 the North Island rainfall was only about half as much as in February 1968.

Over the greater part of the South Island rainfall was close to average. It was only about two-thirds of the average value in most of Nelson, Marlborough, coastal North Canterbury, Otago and eastern Southland; and it was considerably lower—less than half—in the Waimea Plains of Nelson, around Kaikoura, and in parts of inland North Otago. On the other hand, in Westland and Northern Fiordland rainfall was more than 50 percent above average. average.

Temperatures—Temperatures were 1-3 degrees warmer than usual over the South Island, except on the West Coast, where they were cooler than average by 1-2 degrees. In the North Island they were mainly close to average. The second half of the month was warmer than the first half; and from the 20th onward some eastern districts recorded maximum temperatures of 90-98°F at

times.

times. Sunshine—Sunshine was above average, except on the West Coast, where it was close to average. The surplus was mainly 30-60 hours and was greatest in Northland and Auckland, in Gisborne, and in Nelson, Marlborough, and Canterbury. Weather Sequence—At the beginning of the month a deep depression lay far to the south and another depression passed to the south-east, with an associated trough of low pressure crossing New Zealand. Rain affected western districts as far north as Taranaki. A change to southerlies on the 2nd brought rain to remaining districts of the South Island; and this persisted on the

3rd and spread to southern districts of the North Island as a small depression from the Tasman crossed the South Island. However, the weather improved in Fiordland and South Westland. With increasing pressures and an anticyclone over the Tasman Sea the 4th and 5th were mainly fine.

During the next two days the anticyclone moved on to the

During the next two days the anticyclone moved on to the North Island while a deep depression passed to the south and the associated trough of low pressure crossed the South Island. Heavy rain was reported on the West Coast and in the Alps. Scattered falls also extended to Southland and some inland districts of Otago and Canterbury. Rain became fairly general on the 8th and 9th as winds changed to southerly with the passage of another trough. This was the last rain of any consequence in February for many districts, and there was very little of it in parts of Hawke's Bay and Gisborne.

By the 10th a ridge of high pressure extended over New Zealand.

By the 10th a ridge of high pressure extended over New Zealand from an anticyclone over the Tasman Sea. A trough of low pressure crossing the South Island affected the West Coast on this and the rossing the South Island affected the West Coast on this and the following day; and on the 12th the rain also extended to Southland and Otago. From the 13th to 16th the anticyclone was centred just to the west of the country, while a second centre developed east of the South Island. The weather was mainly fine and cool. However, a weak southerly change affected the east coast of the South Island at first; and showers were reported later in northern districts. As the anticyclone moved further northward, from the 17th to 19th, the only rain reported was on the West Coast and in some southern districts of the South Island. During the week 20-26 February an extensive belt of high pressure was stationary over New Zealand and surrounding areas, with highest pressures over the central Tasman Sea and to the east of the North Island. The only rain reported apart from isolated brief showers was in Gisborne and parts of Bay of Plenty on the 23rd and 24th. Temperatures were warmer than previously, especially in Canterbury.

By the 27th a trough of low pressure associated with a depression far to the south-west was moving on to the South Island. Heavy rain set in over Fiordland and South Westland with lighter falls over the remainder of the West Coast and in Southland. The rain in these areas persisted on the following day as the trough moved

in these areas persisted on the following day as the trough moved slowly north-eastward, and showers were also reported in Otago and Canterbury. As pressures rose behind the front on the last day of the month there was a clearance on the West Coast, but light rain affected some western districts of the North Island.
