thence easterly generally along the southern boundary of the said section, along the western and southern boundaries of Section 10, Block XIII, Rotorua Survey District, along the western boundary of Section 2, Block I, Horohoro Survey District, along that boundary produced across a public road which forms the northern boundary of Section 8, Block I, Horohoro Survey District, to and along the southern side of that public road to the eastern boundary of the Matamata County as described in *Gazette*, 1950, page 277, and southerly along that boundary to the middle of the Mokaihaha Stream; thence generally westerly down the middle of that stream, down the middle of the Opakau Stream to and northerly along the eastern boundary of Te Ranga No. 2, and that boundary produced to the middle of the Whakapiwai Stream; thence down the middle of that stream and the Ngutuwera Stream to and southerly along the middle of the Te Rere Road to the middle of State Highway No. 1 in Block III, Patetere South Survey District; thence again westerly generally along the middle of the aforesaid highway to and along the middle of the Wiltsdown Road to a point in line with the western boundary of Waotu South No. 14 in Block I, Patetere South Survey District; thence southerly along the said western boundary, to and westerly, southerly, and easterly along the northern, western, and southern boundaries of Lot 1, D.P. 22069, to and southerly and westerly generally along the eastern and southern boundaries of parts Matanuku No. 3, comprised in certificates of title, Volume 47, folios 216 and 217, to and southerly along the western boundary of Lot 1, D.P. 21949, to and westerly along the northern boundaries of parts Matanuku 2B 2, 2F 2, 2G 2, and 2E 2, shown on D.P. 21718, and the production of the last-mentioned boundary to the middle of the Waikato River (Arapuni Lake) in Block VIII, Wharepapa Survey District; thence northerly generally down the middle of the Arapuni Lake, Waikato River, Karapiro Lake and again the Waikato River, to a point in line with the western boundary of an area reserved under Section 58 of the Land Act 1948 situated in Block IX, Cambridge Survey District; thence northerly along a right line to and along that boundary and the western boundary of Section 21, Block IX aforesaid, to and along a right line across State Highway No. 1 to and again northerly along the western boundary of Lot 2, D.P. 14436, and its production to the middle of the Karapiro Stream; thence generally easterly up the middle of that stream to a point in line with the generally western boundary of part Section 9, Karapiro Settlement; thence generally northerly to and along that boundary and a right line across French Pass Road to and northerly along the eastern boundary of part Lot 2, D.P. 3569, to the easternmost corner of that lot; thence generally northerly along the generally eastern boundaries of part Allotment 336, the abutment of Smarts Road and Allotment 287, both allotments of Hautapu Parish, to the southernmost corner of Section 6, Block VI, of the aforesaid Survey District; thence generally north-easterly along the generally south-eastern boundaries of Section 6 aforesaid, part Section 3, Block VI aforesaid (Maungakawa Scenic Reserve, *Gazette*, 1940, page 1536), the generally south-eastern side of a public road, part Section 3s and Section 76s, Te Miro Settlement, a right line across Whitehall Road, Section 6s, Te Miro Settlement, Sec-

*Price Order No. 2074 (Island Oranges)*

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act 1947, I, Geoffrey Harold Datson, pursuant to a delegation from the Secretary of Industries and Commerce acting under a delegation from the Price Tribunal, hereby make the following price order:

1. This order may be cited as Price Order No. 2074 and shall come into force on the 5th day of April 1968.

2. (1) Price Order No. 2035\* is hereby revoked.

(2) The revocation of the said order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this order.

3. References in this order to metropolitan areas are references to the metropolitan areas described in the Schedule hereto.

**APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER**

4. This order applies with respect to all Island oranges sold by way of retail in New Zealand.

**MAXIMUM RETAIL PRICES**

5. (1) Where, in this price order, prices are expressed both in decimal currency and in existing currency, the prices expressed in decimal currency shall be the prices applicable unless, because of difficulties relating to machine conversion, a trader continues to deal during the transitional period exclusively or principally in existing currency, in which case the prices applicable shall be those expressed in existing currency.

(2) In this clause the terms "decimal currency", "existing currency", and "transitional period" shall have the same meaning as in the Decimal Currency Act 1964.

6. (1) Subject to the provisions of this clause, the maximum price that may be charged or received by any retailer for any Island oranges shall be—

(a) When sold by a retailer carrying on business in any of the metropolitan areas of Auckland, Wellington, Christchurch, or Dunedin, or in any of the Cities or Boroughs of Whangarei, Takapuna, Hamilton, Tauranga, Rotorua, Gisborne, New Plymouth, Stratford, Wanganui, Palmerston North, Napier, Hastings, Blenheim, Nelson, Greymouth, Timaru, Westport, Oamaru, Balclutha, Gore, or Invercargill—

15 cents or 1s. 6d. per pound.

(b) When sold by a retailer carrying on business elsewhere—

1s. 6½d. per pound, or

1 lb, 16 cents;

2 lb, 31 cents;

3 lb, 47 cents;

4 lb, 62 cents.

Fractions of a pound shall be calculated at 16 cents per pound. Quantities in excess of 4 lb shall be calculated at the rate of 15½ cents per pound.

(2) If in respect of any lot of oranges sold by a retailer the maximum price calculated in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this clause is not an exact number of pence or half-pence or cents, the maximum price of the lot may be computed to the next upward halfpenny, or to the nearest whole cent.

**SPECIAL PRICES WHERE EXTRAORDINARY CHARGES INCURRED**

7. Subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any retailer, may authorise special prices in respect of any Island oranges to which this order applies where special circumstances exist, or for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are incurred by the retailer. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a specified lot or consignment of oranges or may relate generally to all Island oranges to which this order applies sold by the retailer while the approval remains in force.

**DUTY IMPOSED ON RETAILERS**

8. Every retailer who offers or exposes any Island oranges for sale in any shop shall keep in a prominent position in such proximity to the oranges to which it relates as to be obviously descriptive thereof, a ticket, placard, or label on which shall be stated in legible and prominent characters the following particulars:

(a) The retail price per pound of the oranges:

(b) The word "Island".

A special order made by the Geraldine County Council at a special meeting of the Council held on the 18th day of December 1967 and after public notice duly given confirmed at a subsequent meeting of the said Council held on the 5th day of February 1968, namely:

That, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 23 of the Counties Act 1956, the Geraldine County Council resolves, by way of special order, as follows:

(1) The present division of the County of Geraldine into three ridings is revoked, and in lieu thereof the said county shall be divided into six ridings, to be called respectively Geraldine Riding, Kakahu Riding, Mount Peel Riding, Rangitata Riding, Temuka Riding, and Waitohi Riding, which said ridings are respectively described in the Schedule attached hereto.

(2) The said Geraldine County Council shall consist of nine members, who shall be elected as follows:

- (a) The electors of the Geraldine Riding, Kakahu Riding, and Temuka Riding shall each elect two Councillors.
- (b) The electors of the Mount Peel Riding, Rangitata Riding, and Waitohi Riding shall each elect one Councillor.

(3) The alteration hereby made shall take effect on and after the 12th day of October, 1968.

SPECIAL ORDER

THE Auckland Regional Authority in exercise of the powers vested in it by the Auckland Regional Authority Act 1963, sections 45 and 24, and in pursuance of the authority conferred upon it under the Local Authorities Loans Act 1956, and in exercise of all other powers enabling it in that behalf doth hereby resolve by special resolution intended to operate as a special order to borrow the sum of \$200,000 (two hundred thousand dollars) as a special loan to be known as Property Loan No. 2, 1965—\$614,000: 3rd Issue \$200,000 for the purpose of providing sufficient loan finance to cover progress construction costs, architects fees, and other incidental expenses in connection with the Authority's new building in Wellesley Street West, Auckland.

The foregoing special order was made by way of special resolution passed at a special meeting of the Authority held on the 19th day of February 1968. It was publicly notified in the *Auckland Star* on the 23rd day of February and the 8th day of March 1968 and confirmed at the ordinary meeting of the Authority held on the 18th day of March 1968.
