THE above book was seized under a search warrant issued under s. 25 (1) of the Act and Bernard Graham Lockhart trading as Jim's Bookshop was summoned before the Magistrate's Court at Dunedin to show cause why the book should not be destroyed. The question of its indecency having arisen in these proceedings the Tribunal is required to make a decision and report in terms of s. 12 (1) in respect of the said book said book.

At the hearing before the Tribunal the Police were represented by Mr Neazor of the Crown Law Office. In respect of this book he submitted that it should be classified as indecent, or indecent in the hands of persons under 18 years of age. No submissions were received by the Tribunal by or on behalf of Mr Lockhart.

The Tribunal decides and reports as follows:

The Tribunal decides and reports as follows:

"This book is one of the same series as Eros Modern Style which has already been considered by the Tribunal. It is a heavily illustrated translation and adaptation from a French work. There is no statement about the extent of the adaptation nor whether all, or to what extent, the illustrations appeared in the original edition. It is a scholarly work with quotations from classical and later writers, and with footnotes. The illustrations are not always related to the text and portray acts of indecency and even bestiality. It is a serious study, and the question for the Tribunal is whether its historical and literary value for unrestricted reading are outweighed by these matters. In the opinion of the Tribunal it is not suitable for unrestricted reading and it is therefore classified as indecent except in the hands of professional students of medicine, psychology, sociology, and fine arts."

Tariff and Development Board Notice No. 66-Public Inquiry into Import Duties and Import Licensing Affecting Diamond Tools, Etc.

- 1. The Tariff and Development Board has been requested by the Minister of Customs to investigate and report on an application for tariff protection in respect of a range of tools (for hand and for machine use) set or impregnated with diamonds and/or with tungsten carbide particles or shaped inserts.
- 2. The tools concerned comprise drilling bits (including coring bits), reamer shells, dressers and truers, saws (circular and other) and segments for mounting on saw blades (circular and other), and scribers for marking glass and other materials.
- 3. Price Order No. 2080 (Bread)

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act 1947, the Price Tribunal hereby makes the following price order:

PRELIMINARY

- 1. This order may be cited as Price Order No. 2080 and shall come into force on I June 1968.
- 2. (1) Price Order No. 2043* shall be revoked on the coming
- into force of this order.

 (2) The revocation of the said order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this order.
 - (3) Notwithstanding the revocation of Price Order No. 2043:
 (i) any approvals given under clause 11 of that price order shall continue to have effect as if the said order had not been revoked.
 - (ii) the provisions of Price Order No. 2061 (Bread—Recovery of Extraordinary Charges) shall continue to have effect as if Price Order No. 2043 had not been revoked.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

3. This order applies to all bread referred to in clauses 4, 5, and 6 of this order sold in New Zealand by a wholesaler or by a retailer, but does not apply to bread sold on Stewart Island or to bread sold as part of a meal.

Fixing Maximum Wholesale and Retail Prices of Bread to Which This Order Applies

- Subject to the provisions of this order, the prices set out in the First Schedule to this order shall be the maximum prices which may be charged or received for any bread to which this order applies and which is customarily known as:
 - (a) Standard white bread. (a) Standard white bread.
 (b) Standard brown bread.
 (c) Wholemeal bread.
 (d) Vienna bread.
 (e) Wheat-germ bread.
- 5. Subject to the provisions of this order, the prices set out in the Third and Fourth Schedules to this order shall be the maximum prices which may be charged or received for any bread to which this order applies and which is customarily known as starch reduced bread, that is, bread in the making of which there is for each sack of flour (160 lb) used not less than 6 lb of dry gluten, or 18 lb of wet gluten, and no less than 6 lb of fat with either dried milk or condensed milk.
- 6. Subject to the provisions of this order, the prices set out in the Second and Fourth Schedules to this order shall be the maximum prices which may be charged or received for any bread described in clauses 4 and 5 of this order which is sliced or unsliced and enclosed and securely wrapped at the bakehouse in clean unused paper.
- 7. The wholesale prices fixed by this order apply to bread delivered to the retailer's premises. In any case where bread is not so delivered the prices shall be such as are agreed upon between the baker and the retailer, or failing such agreement, as may be approved by the Tribunal.

GENERAL

- 8. A booking fee at the rate of one quarter cent (‡c) per loaf for loaves of not more than 1 lb weight and one half cent (‡c) per loaf for loaves exceeding 1 lb weight may be made for any bread sold by a retailer to which this order applies, provided that payment for the bread so sold has not been made prior to, or at the time of, the customer's taking delivery of the bread at the shop. the shop.
- 9. The maximum retail selling prices provided for in this order shall include the service of wrapping where this service is provided by the retailer.

SPECIAL PRICES WHERE EXTRAORDINARY CHARGES INCURRED

10. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing provisions of this order, and subject to such conditions, if any, as it thinks fit, the Tribunal, on application by any wholesaler, or retailer, may authorise special maximum prices in respect of any bread to which this order applies where special circumstances exist or for any reason extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) are incurred by the wholesaler or retailer. Any authority given by the Tribunal under this clause may apply with respect to a specified lot or consignment of bread or may relate generally to all bread sold by the wholesaler or retailer, while the approval remains in sold by the wholesaler or retailer, while the approval remains in force.

The "normal" refers to the present site of the instruments. The standard periods for normals are: for temperature 1931-60, for rainfall 1921-50, and for sunshine 1935-60. No normals are available for stations with only short records.

Notes on the Weather for April 1968

General—The weather for April was dominated by a tropical storm which originated near New Caledonia. It crossed the North Island on the night of 9–10 April and moved down the Canterbury and Otago coasts on the 11th. Violent gales caused damage over the greater part of the North Island and the northern half of the South Island. The greatest destruction from wind was reported in and around Wellington, where southerly winds averaged as much as 80 miles per hour on the morning of the 10th, with gusts to 120 miles per hour; while on exposed hilltops gusts were recorded to 150 miles per hour. Thousands of trees were uprooted, and roofs were blown off houses. During the storm the inter-island ferry Wahine ran aground at the mouth of Wellington Harbour. Flooding occurred in many areas, notably around Christchurch and Banks Peninsula on the 12th and in Southland and West Otago on the 15th.

Rainfall—Rainfall was above average or close to average over almost the whole country. It was more than double the average value on the east coast of the South Island and up to about 50 miles inland from Balclutha to Blenheim; north of a line from Hamilton to Tauranga; and also over the greater part of the North Island south of a line from Stratford to Waipukurau. Around Lyttelton and Banks Peninsula some stations recorded 5–8 times the average value, the highest totals there being 27.69 in. at Hickory Bay, on the eastern tip of Banks Peninsula, and 20.46 in. at Purau, on Lyttelton Harbour. In these areas at least two-thirds of the monthly total was recorded during the 10th and 11th, amounting to 16.21 in. at Hickory Bay and 14.33 in. at Purau; while many other stations had more than 8 in. for these two days.

The highest total rainfalls for the month were recorded at two stations in central Northland, Tau's Falls with 31.05 in. and Puketi with 30.71 in. At Puketi the total for the first 3 days of the month was 11.86 in., for the first 9 days 28.52 in. and for the 14-day period 27 March-9 April 33.8 in. Flooding was reported in Northland on the 3rd and again on the 9th and 10th.

Heavy rain caused serious flooding in Buller and North Westland on the 9th.

The Southern Lakes district received less than half the average rainfall, and it was also appreciably drier than usual in Fiordland and over the greater part of the Alps.

Temperatures—Temperatures were 1-2 degrees below average over the South Island and 1-2 degrees above average over the southern half of the North Island. The first 9 days were exceptionally warm for April.

Sunshine—Sunshine was below average over most of the country. Greatest deficiencies of up to 50 hours were recorded in Canterbury and Nelson, also in parts of the central North Island. Nelson, Hanmer, Christchurch, and Lake Tekapo all had their lowest April sunshine since 1938.

Weather Sequence—A depression which had developed near North Cape at the end of March remained stationary there during the first 4 days of April. In Northland these were 4 very wet days, with some flooding. Pressures were high near the Chatham Islands. On the 1st the passage of a weak trough brought fairly general rain to the remainder of the North Island, except for Hawke's Bay and Wairarapa, and also to the northern half of the South Island. From the 2nd to the 4th the easterlies brought rain to eastern districts from Cape Palliser to East Cape. As the depression lost intensity during the 5th and 6th, the rain in Northland became temporarily lighter; and a trough of low pressure brought rain to Southland, the West Coast and Nelson. Temperatures were for the most part unusually warm during these first 6 days.

On the 7th an anticyclone was still centred to the south-east

On the 7th an anticyclone was still centred to the south-east of the Chatham Islands, and a tropical storm over New Caledonia was moving southward. Temperatures remained warm, and it was still raining in Northland. On the following day, in the warm moist north-easterlies rain spread to the West Coast and Bay of Plenty. By the 9th the tropical storm had reached Northland, while a cold front moved on to the South Island. Rain spread over the whole country, with many heavy falls on this and the following day; flooding being reported especially in Northland, Auckland, Bay of Plenty, Nelson, and Buller. The tropical storm moved rapidly southward and by early morning on the 10th it was centred near Napier, while the cold front had reached Cook Strait. Strong

gales buffeted many districts, with exceptionally violent and destructive southerlies around Wellington. As the centre of the storm moved along the coast towards Dunedin the weather cleared except in Canterbury, Otago and Southland, where the rain became heavier. Flooding was soon reported in parts of Canterbury and snow fell on the high country there.

Pressures remained low over New Zealand and a second centre which developed over the North Island moved south-eastward from the 12th to the 15th. The weather remained unsettled, with bright intervals at times in most districts. Rain was fairly general on the 15th, with some considerable falls in parts of Otago. Widespread flooding was reported from the Mataura River in Southland.

On the 16th the depression now lying to the east of Otago moved away, and on the following day an anticyclone moved on to Campbell Island. These 2 days were more settled in most districts. However, there was another fairly general deterioration on the 18th with the passage of a trough of low pressure across the country from north-west to south-east. As this trough moved away to the east during the 19th and 20th, further rain was reported in some areas, especially Canterbury. However, for the next 2 days rain affected mainly the West Coast and northern districts of the North Island as a depression moved southward past western Southland.

On the 23rd a depression crossed the South Island, and the associated trough of low pressure brought general rain. Some heavy falls were reported in Taranaki, with thunderstorms there and in Auckland. As the depression moved away to the east on the 24th a ridge of high pressure extended to the southern half of the South Island from an anticyclone over the Tasman Sea, with fair weather. Further north, cold southerlies set in, with rain soon affecting eastern districts from Christchurch to Gisborne besides Wellington. This occurred as a depression developed east of Auckland and moved slowly south-eastward from the 25th to the 27th.

During the last 3 days of the month conditions were rather more westerly. An anticyclone was centred to the north and pressures were low to the south-west of Campbell Island. A shallow depression developed over the Tasman Sea and associated frontal system extended on to the North Island. Rain was reported first in Southland, Fiordland, and South Westland, soon spreading to most other western districts of both Islands.
