(1) This order may be cited as the Thames Valley Electric Power Board Electric Lines Licence 1963, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Thames Valley Electric Power Board Electric Lines Licence 1963* (hereinafter referred to as "the principal order").

(2) The principal order is hereby amended by deleting subclause (a) of clause 2 of the Schedule thereto and substituting the following:

"(a) A line running in a southerly direction through the Thames Branch Railway Reserve; thence easterly along Williamson Street and generally southerly along Queen Street and Jellicoe Crescent to the southern boundary of the Borough of Thames, as the said line is more particularly shown by means of a broken red line on the plan marked N.Z.E.D. 744 deposited in the office of the New Zealand Electricity Department at Wellington."

8. Nothing in this licence shall of itself be deemed to confer upon the licensee any right to water.

9. This licence shall, unless it is sooner lawfully determined, continue in force until the 31st day of March 1989.

ALL that area in the Canterbury Land District, situated in Blocks XIV and XV, Pigeon Bay Survey District, being part of the foreshore of Akaroa Harbour commencing at Timutimu Head and proceeding northerly, easterly, and southerly generally around the said Harbour to Truini Point, as the same is more particularly delineated on plan M.D. 12871, and deposited in the office of the Marine Department at Wellington, and thereon edged blue.

SECOND SCHEDULE

ALL the waters of Akaroa Harbour, the outer limits of which were defined by the Order in Council of 20 November 1868* as being a circle of 3 nautical miles radius from Boat Rock.

6. Suitably worded signs shall be erected at main public access ways to the foreshore described in the First Schedule to this order indicating that control has been granted to the Council pursuant to sections 8A and 165 of the Act and that bylaws are in force.

7. Subject to the provisions of section 8A of the Act, the Council for and within the area of water described in the Second Schedule to this order—

(a) May by bylaw do anything which a Harbour Board may do by bylaw under section 232 of the Act.

(b) May appoint harbourmasters and other officers and define or limit their powers and duties.

(c) Shall have all the powers, functions, duties, and authorities of a Harbour Board under the Act as if it were constituted a Harbour Board.

8. All money received by the Council in respect of Akaroa Harbour in the exercise or performance of the powers, functions, duties, and authorities conferred on it by this order shall, subject to the deduction of any expenditure incurred by the Council in the exercise or performance of those powers, functions, duties, and authority, be applied to the construction, repair, or improvement of harbour works in or in respect of the Akaroa Harbour and not otherwise.

Amendment to the Rules of The Royal Society of New Zealand

PURSUANT to the Royal Society of New Zealand Act 1965 the Fellows of the Royal Society of New Zealand, at the annual general meeting held on 15 May 1968, passed a resolution amending the rules of the Society published in the *Gazette* on 22 December 1965, the effect of such resolution being:

SECTION L—FELLOWS

Rule L. 6 was amended to read:

L. 6. Nominations may be made by member bodies or by groups of fellows. Nominations by fellows must be signed by not less than three fellows. Each of the member bodies may nominate as many persons as it thinks fit. Each nomination must be accompanied by five copies of a *curriculum vitae*, full bibliography, a statement of up to 500 words indicating the reasons why the candidate is worthy of election, supported by one set of significant publications, and an indication of the appropriate advisory panel or panels that should consider his candidature. When a candidate is nominated by more than one member body or group of fellows it shall be sufficient to utilise the information supplied by one member body or group of fellows. Where a candidate was also nominated in the previous year the statement utilised with that nomination may again be used. The consent of the candidate must be obtained in writing when he is first nominated. All nominations must reach the General Secretary before 15 November in the year preceding the year of election.
