Decision and Report of Indecent Publications Tribunal

IN the matter of the Indecent Publications Act 1963 and in the matter of a reference to the Tribunal under section 12 (1) of the said Act by the Magistrate's Court at Auckland for a decision and report in terms of the said section in respect of certain books, the titles and particulars of which are set out in the decision and report hereunder:

DECISION AND REPORT

THE books were seized under a search warrant issued under section 25 (1) of the Act, and Waverley Publishing Co. Ltd., of Auckland, was summoned before the Magistrate's Court at Auckland to show cause why the said books should not be destroyed. The question of their indecency having arisen in these proceedings, the Tribunal is required to make a decision and report in terms of section 12 (1) in respect of each of the said books.

At the hearing before the Tribunal the police were represented by Mr Savage and Mr Neazor of the Crown Law Office, and Mr Campbell, the managing director of the Waverley Publishing Co. Ltd., represented his company.

In respect of each book the Tribunal decides and reports as follows:

A History of Eroticism, in five volumes, published in hard-back at U.S.\$6 each, by Brusendorff and Henningsen, Copenhagen, 1963. Lyle Stuart Inc., New York.

The title is pretentious for so slight and stretched-thin a series as this. Each volume has about 90 pages of letterpress and 32 of black-and-white reproductions, some of which, although relevant to the theme, are not mentioned in the text, and would seem to be chosen for their indecency rather than for any support they might give to a social or historical view.

Each volume is mainly a collection of quoted passages from erotic writings of the period; serious works so treated lose proportion by unwarranted emphasis on isolated sections. There is no breadth of treatment, no penetration in the comments, no comparison of period with period. Other deficiencies are equally obvious—the material is limited to Europe; there are no acknowledgments or foreword; titles to illustrations include pseudo-humorous inventions of the authors; and no details of source or present whereabouts of works of art are given.

The style is neither scholarly nor popular, but is a readable compromise. The tone is satirical, light, and, in the main, unexceptionable; adults should be free to spend their money on it if they wish. But even if the theme were of interest to children, its poor quality makes this series unworthy of their attention.

We classify these volumes as indecent in the hands of persons under 18 years of age.

Aphrodisiacs and Love Stimulants, with other chapters on the "Secrets of Venus", by John Davenport, edited by Alan Hull Walton. Hardback, with illustrations; printed in the United States for Luxor Press, of London. U.S.\$6.

Written in the early nineteenth century, this book is of academic rather than practical interest. The editor, himself a writer on these subjects, has done something to correct the limited knowledge of earlier times, but it remains essentially a museum piece and, as its publishers claim, is intended only for those with a serious and genuine interest in the subject matter; namely, the history of superstition, knowledge, and practice in the use of stimulants and in the treatment of various sexual phenomena. We do not think the information is reliable enough to be put into the hands of adolescents and accordingly classify it as indecent in the hands of persons under 18 years of age.

Sex, Pornography, and Justice, by Albert B. Gerber. Lyle Stuart Inc., New York. U.S.\$10.

The author, a man of law who has closely studied American law, local and state, on pornography and legal actions resulting, has here assembled his evidence and conclusions and produced a valuable study of the subject up to 1965, the year of publication. Necessarily, the book is illustrated with pictures as well as with extracts from works concerned, some of them likely to offend the casual reader; but it is to the student that the book is primarily directed. The Tribunal decides that the book is indecent in the hands of readers under 18 years of age.

Sex and the Single Man, by Dr Albert Ellis. Lyle Stuart Inc., New York. U.S.\$4.95.

This book, sent to us in the comparatively rare and expensive hard-cover edition, is a manual of advice on sexual behaviour and is directed particularly to young men. The tone of the writing in this wolves' handbook is satirical and informal. Some of its advice is wise; but much of it gives casual, not to say cynical, sanction to patterns and codes of behaviour not acceptable in our society. The flippant approach of so practised a pleader as Dr Ellis may adversely influence those whose standards are not established, and we therefore think this book should be restricted to those of maturer minds. We therefore classify the book as indecent in the hands of persons under 17 years of age.

The Love Elite, by Arthur H. Hirsch, Ph.D. Julian Press, New York. U.S.\$5.95.

The so-called research behind this book is based on intimate letters and conversations of various American women. These are quoted in isolation from their subsequent development and from objective comment. There seems little taste and less point in publishing them.

The author is an advocate of greater freedom in sexual matters, and the use of the word "Elite" in the title is intended to signify that women belonging to the upper levels of society, wealth, prestige, and professional eminence are participating in the process of the sexual emancipation of women. This is hardly borne out by the fact that the quoted writings do not reach a very high level of literacy or of good sense. It is impossible to resist the conclusion that Dr Hirsch's chief object has been to embellish his thesis, honest as it may be, with exciting extracts from personal records of erotic experience. The book is a jibe at the value of integrity and as such could be a corrupting influence. We decide that it is indecent in terms of the Act.

The Cult of Desire, by Kanwar Lal. University Books Inc., New York. U.S.\$10.

This is a second edition of Kanwar Lal's essay on the erotic element in Indian religious art, exhibited in statuary decoration of Hindu temples. Comparatively few of these remain after destructive invasions and the dilapidations of time, but enough to illustrate the author's theses in photographs by Darshan Lal and the Department of Archaeology of the Government of India. These illustrate the author's historical account of the change in which India abandoned the early asceticism of Buddhism and, indeed, reversed its teaching which had rejected desire and women. This swing from one excess to the other is interpreted in the author's essay, not everywhere quite coherent, and exhibited in the plates. Those that belong to the late orgiastic period are often indecent; but as a whole they have a value and sometimes a beauty that compensate for the indecency. The publishers expressly restrict the sale of the book to "members of the medical and legal professions, and to scholars and research students of Indology, psychology, and social sciences". The Tribunal decides it is not indecent except in the hands of persons under 18 years of age, unless they are certified students of art, archaeology, philosophy, or religion.

The Anatomy of Dirty Words, by Edward Sagarin. Lyle Stuart, New York. U.S.\$4.95.

This is a series of short essays, ethical, social, and semantic, on so-called dirty words. The key to them lies in a sentence from Professor Allan Walker Read's introduction "Obscenity emerges out of unhealthy attitudes towards sex and the bodily functions. Not only are 'dirty words' a symptom of these attitudes but they serve to perpetuate the attitudes". Mr Sagarin's essays range widely, he treats his various subjects slightly but with an ironic and stimulating thoughtfulness, and his theme is a proper one for inquiry. The Tribunal decides that this book is not indecent within the meaning of the Act.

Bizarre, compiled by Barry Humphries. Elek Books Ltd., London. U.K. 63s.

This is a collection of articles, poems, and illustrations dealing with the grotesque in body, thought, art, and customs. The editor says it is intended as a "relief from the newspapers", as "essentially a family book" and "full of merry japes". Somewhat inconsistently, he further claims it is "addressed frankly to the jaded palate, to those who find a literary diet of steak and eggs insufficient, and the works of great painters necessary but savourless roughage". There seems very little point in this book: the illustrations are in many cases monstrous, the text is perverse, and the humour is sick. We see nothing of value to offset this general decadence and accordingly judge the book to be indecent within the definition contained in section 2 of the Act.

The Secret, by Karl Saller. Lyle Stuart Inc., New York. U.S.\$10.

This book, subtitled *The Miracle of Procreation*, gives a comprehensive and clear account of all the processes leading to the normal birth of a human being. The treatment of the subject is matter of fact, but is not confined to its purely biological aspects; it is detailed, and assisted by diagrammatic drawings and photographs, including some of positions (not acts) of intercourse. These photographs are rendered inoffensive by a sand-graining technique which gives a blurred, impressionistic effect; they are intended to explain, not excite.

The author, in his preface, says the book is not intended only for medical specialists, and that "it belongs on the bookshelves of every young woman who wants to become a mother and of every young man who hopes to become a father". The elegant format of the book lends added dignity to its theme. Its language is not geared to the very young, but it could be valuable as an aid to teaching such persons. Accordingly the Tribunal classifies this book as not indecent except in the hands of persons under 16 years unless such persons are being instructed by a parent or other proper adviser.

Ecce Homo, by George Grosz, with foreword by Henry Miller. Grove Press Inc., New York. \$16.

This book reproduces the collection of Grosz's drawings originally published in Berlin in 1923. They record and foreshadow the sordid and fearful aspects of life in Berlin and the provincial cities of the Kaiser's Germany and after. The manner is suitably ugly, the tone satirical, and the intention is to expose greed, hate, and exploitation in something approaching the tradition of Hogarth and Goya. The book may be shocking, as indeed it is intended to be, but it is not indecent, and the Tribunal so decides. The Tribunal is assisted in coming to this decision by the fact that the price of the book will impose some limitation on its circulation.

Shunga (erotic elements in Japanese art), Charles Grosbois (former Director of the French-Japanese Institute in Kyoto). \$38.

Kama Kala (philosophical basis of Hindu erotic sculpture), Mulik Raj Anand (Indian art historian and critic). \$20.40.

Eros Kalos (erotic elements in Greek art), Jean Marcade (Professor of Archaeology, University of Bordeaux). \$26.

Roma Amor (erotic elements in Roman and Etruscan art), Jean Marcade (Professor of Archaeology, University of Bordeaux). \$26.

Saru e Naz (love and the representation of erotic themes in ancient Iran), Robert Sarieu. \$38.

Checan (erotic elements in Peruvian art), Rafael Larco Hoyle (Director of Museum of Lima). \$38.

The six handsome and expensive volumes listed above belong to a luxury series published by Nagel of Switzerland and deal with the erotic elements in the art of Greece, Rome, Japan, India, Iran, and Peru. All of them are scholarly works of high quality in content and format, material for which has been supplied and compiled by reputable world authorities and institutions of learning. The text in each case is informative, in no way offensive, is entirely suitable to the dignity and artistry of the whole production, and is of undoubted value as a contribution to art and learning. The illustrations are always relevant to the study and are excellently reproduced, they of necessity include representation of the phallic motif, of various postures and practices of sexual intercourse, and of some activities which our society condemns as perversions, but which were prevalent and acceptable in other times and cultures. Some few are startling in their crudity and exaggeration; these are essential to the investigation and are far outweighed by the elegance and beauty of subject, line, colour, and composition in most of the pictures.

These books are of interest and benefit to all persons interested in art, archaeology, history, and religions; they contribute to knowledge in several fields; they are what they purport to be; only if grossly misused could they be harmful to any; their price will place some restriction on their circulation.

The Tribunal classifies this series as not indecent except in the hands of persons under 18 years, unless they be certified students of art, archaeology, or ancient history.

NATURIST OR NUDIST BOOKS AND MAGAZINES

One thing is common to all these journals: they are composed of, or primarily feature, photographs of the nude form; entirely or predominantly of the nude female form.

We were addressed at length by Mr Savage, Crown Counsel, and by Mr Campbell, the managing director of the Waverley Publishing Co. Ltd. Mr Savage called two witnesses and Mr Campbell put in numerous photostatic exhibits.

At an early stage an interim order was made prohibiting publication of the names of parties or the titles of the publications.

Mr Savage first called Mr Cousins, for the last 16 years president of New Zealand Sunbathing Inc. Mr Cousins gave evidence that certain of the journals were acceptable within his movement, but that others featured photographs too posed to be regarded by his members as bona fide from the point of view of naturism.

The Crown's next witness was Senior Sergeant Lark, of the New Zealand Police, who said that "girlie" magazines were part of the stock-in-trade of the pervert bent on seducing boys or younger men. He was not asked to give specific titles, but indicated that the journals were some which clearly indicated genital areas.

We have given careful attention to this evidence and have considered the argument put forward: we have perused the photostats and journals presented to us.

We take notice that there is in the community widespread scepticism, which we share, as to how far printed matter conduces to the commission of offences against the law. Subsection (1) (a) of section 11 requires us, in determining indecency, to take into account the likelihood of corruption; but in the case of a document which is not otherwise excep-

tionable this falls short of a direction that we should assume it to be inherently indecent because it may be used in a particular way. Nude photographs may no doubt be used in an attempt to corrupt young people; but so may old masters, or pictures of famous statuary, or even holy writ. We question whether certain of the photographs which have come under our notice would provide the would-be seducer with very much assistance. It is the spotlighting of the unfamiliar nude form that gives reproductions of photographs any special attraction they may have for the curious. If pleasant and unretouched nude pictures were as common in the community as it appears they are in the nudist clubs, then it is likely that their production would be greeted with no more unseemly excitement than it is there.

We are inclined to deprecate the practice of painting out public areas in health or naturist magazines, and we do not believe the Act requires that young people should be kept in ignorance of the appearance of the adult form.

We do not agree with the suggestion that was made to us that members of naturist clubs should form a special class of persons privileged to see publications not available to other people, nor with another suggestion that practising nudists (or naturists), whether in clubs or not, should form such a class.

We are of opinion that natural and straightforward nude photographs or collections of them in reproduction constitute a first category of publications and we regard them as unexceptionable.

We consider that other pictures or collections may fall into a second category, in which nature combines with art to produce pictures which are not unacceptable; perhaps a little more posed and with greater emphasis on the beauty of the nude human body, but in no way unpleasant or exaggerated, and without undue emphasis on genitalia or reproduction of detail. We consider that in absolute terms publications in this class could do little harm; but, taking into account, as we must, the situation in the community, we can only take what steps we may to restrict the flood of borderline publications which we believe would follow too great relaxation. To allow unrestricted entry to any great number of journals in this class would, from sheer over emphasis, be contrary to the public interest. A classification which will operate as a restriction on display will best give effect to the intention of the Act as far as publications of this kind are concerned.

There is a third category of photographs, often very skillfully produced by celebrated photographers, which appear to be deliberately unnatural or artificial, and occasionally ugly, grotesque, or contrived. These we believe to be indecent.

Because Counsel for the Crown has at this hearing spoken at some length on the process by which, in his view, we should arrive at our decision, it is proper that we should address ourselves to this point; what we have to say is of general application and may be taken to govern all the conclusions at which we arrive.

Mr Savage contended that the question of indecency is first to be determined in the light of the ordinary dictionary definition of the word; but then in terms of the enlarged definition of section 2, which extends the meaning to include "describing, depicting, expressing, or otherwise dealing with matters of sex, horror, crime, cruelty or violence in a manner that is injurious to the public good"; but with the proviso that the determination was to be made by an objective assessment of the standard of the community.

As to the ordinary dictionary meaning of the word "indecent", counsel claimed that the word means unacceptable by the current standards of the community.

We have consulted dictionaries. The definitions given in the *Oxford English Dictionary* are of considerable authority and, in the case of this word, are similar to the definitions in other dictionaries. Of the three meanings given we think the third is the most apposite:

1. Unbecoming, highly unsuitable or inappropriate; contrary to the fitness of things; in extremely bad taste, unseemly.
2. Uncomely, inelegant in form (obs.).
3. Offending against the recognised standards of propriety and delicacy; highly indelicate, immodest; suggesting or tending to obscenity.

We read these definitions in the light of the derivation of the word decent, which means what is fitting—indecent means by derivation what is not fitting.

Counsel has suggested that our function is to assess and apply the standards of the community, as far as we can objectively do so, and has added that this may be an impossible task.

Despite the misgivings expressed by Gresson P. in the *Lolita* case (1961 N.Z.L.R. (C.A.) 542) as to the difficulty of assessing contemporary community standards, we feel that we are bound by the decision of the Full Court in *Robson v. Hicks Smith and Sons Ltd.* (1965 N.Z.L.R. 1113) to do our best in this regard. We have regard to the words of Woodhouse J., at p. 1124, in which he says, after discussing section 11:

"For these reasons, in order to ascertain the standard against which any true assessment can be made of some given material, I think it must be relevant to look to see what is currently acceptable in the community and what

other material in the form of literature or otherwise is already freely circulating or available."

and, again, on the same page:

"All these statutory considerations presuppose, in my opinion, that the Tribunal will have available to it a suitable mirror of contemporary standards and affairs, and will evaluate these matters themselves and also the overall issues before it with a balanced and proper understanding of those contemporary standards."

As members of the community, we are conditioned by its standards and would not find it possible, if we wished, to disregard them; yet we should state clearly our conclusion that the statute itself modifies the view that if a document is simply "highly indelicate" or "immodest" by current standards, it is therefore indecent within the meaning of the Act.

This is indicated by the fact that subsection (2) of section 11 provides that, notwithstanding the considerations the Tribunal is required to take into account under subsection (1) of the section, where the publication of any book or the distribution of any sound recording would be in the interests of art, literature, science, or learning, and would be for the public good, it shall not be classified as indecent. In addition to the task of classifying books and sound recordings imposed upon the Tribunal by section 10 (b), the duty is also cast upon it, in the case of books and sound recordings coming under subsection (2), of also deciding, first, if they would be in the interests of art, literature, science, or learning, and, secondly, if they would be for the public good. These are considerations overriding those set out in subsection (1) and go far beyond requiring the Tribunal to consider such material merely in terms of whether it is "highly indelicate" or "immodest". The definition of "indecent" in section 2 also requires the Tribunal, in carrying out its classifying functions under section 10 (b), to go beyond the ordinary dictionary meaning of the word.

If it is suggested that, judged by the yardstick of community standards, a document is highly indelicate or immodest and should therefore be held to be indecent in terms of the Act, we are unable to accept this narrow interpretation. To do so would be to ignore the provisions of subsection (2) of section 11 and the extended meaning of the word "indecent" in section 2, which, in our view, show that it was not the intention of the Act that anything which is no more than highly indelicate or immodest should be held to be indecent.

This Act proceeds upon a basis different from that of earlier Acts governing indecency in literature and, by section 3, it sets up a Tribunal of five members.

By section 10 it entrusts to this Tribunal the function of determining the character of any book or sound recording submitted to it for classification. This task is to be undertaken in the light of subsection (1) of section 11, which sets out six criteria to be held in mind, and of subsection (2) of section 11, the effect of which has been mentioned above.

In our view the committing of this determination to a Tribunal, together with the requirement in subsection (2) (b) of section 3 that at least two members shall have special qualifications in the field of literature or education, makes it clear that the Tribunal is required to arrive at its judgment partly by subjective processes, or at the least is not precluded, in arriving at its judgment, from having recourse to its own views on the matter. The words of Woodhouse J., quoted above, reinforce this view. In simple words, we assert that the Tribunal may say: "As members of the community chosen to make the decision, we think it is not fitting that this book should circulate through the community"; we do not have to substitute such a formula as: "Whatever our views, we think on balance that more people would think this book indecent in terms of the Act than would not". That the statute so specifically directs our attention to overriding considerations of public interest and aesthetic value enormously strengthens this view.

The standards which at present appear to be acceptable to the community are, of course, constantly changing. We are aware also that these vary from group to group within the community.

We do not think the public interest requires suppression merely on the grounds of unorthodoxy, either in argument or in presentation, and we do not think that the community desires it.

We are aware of the present tendency towards the acceptance of more liberal standards and we are also aware of the dangers of too rapid change. It is our view that the Act as well as the community requires us to keep a balance between necessary protection and individual liberty.

With these considerations in mind we proceed to classify the documents before us.

All those in the first group we declare to be not indecent: they come within the first category.

All those in the second group are within the second category, and we declare them to be indecent in the hands of persons under 18 years of age.

The books in the third group we place in the third category, and these we declare to be indecent within the meaning of the Act.

We now discharge the interim order prohibiting publication of the names of parties or titles of publications.

Decision of Indecent Publications Tribunal

IN the matter of the Indecent Publications Act 1963 and in the matter of an application to the Tribunal for a decision in respect of the book *Why was He Born so Beautiful and Other Rugby Songs*, an anthology published by Sphere Books Ltd., London.

DECISION OF THE TRIBUNAL

THIS book has been submitted to the Tribunal, by leave of the Minister of Justice, for classification. Submissions were made in writing by Mr Thom, of Counsel for the publishers.

This is an anthology of bawdy songs, said to be popular among players of Rugby union football. Some are diverting; many are crudely indecent. The question for the Tribunal is not whether footballers should amuse themselves by bawling these songs off the field, but whether their text should be given a wider circulation in what may be called the decent licence of print; and the Tribunal decides that it should not. It is accordingly declared to be indecent.

Decision of Indecent Publications Tribunal

DECISION OF THE TRIBUNAL

THIS book has been considered by the Tribunal upon the application of the Comptroller of Customs. No submissions were received from the Comptroller, nor on behalf of the publishers.

The bibliographical history of this book is a curious one, now completed in this shoddy paperback issue, introduced by Paul G. Gillette in a long essay, and illustrated by many badly printed reproductions of drawings and decorations by this master draughtsman of the nineties. His style on the drawing board was elaborated by his pen, but not with advantage. This phantasy, though erotic, only in a few phrases and incidents reaches indecency; and it does not seem to the Tribunal that these are likely to corrupt any reader inclined to taste the elaborations of Beardsley's style. It is accordingly decided that the book is indecent in the hands of persons under 18 years of age.
