4. The Minister of Education may from time to time, by notice in the *Gazette*, amend the list of school districts to which paragraphs (b), (c), and (d) of clause 2 of this order apply.

Exchange Control Regulations 1965—Determination by the Reserve Bank of New Zealand in Respect of Proceeds of Sale of Goods Exported from New Zealand

IN terms of regulation 7 of the Exchange Control Regulations 1965, the Reserve Bank of New Zealand makes the following determination:

1. The persons who are required to make payment of the proceeds of sale of goods exported or re-exported, or intended for export or re-export, from New Zealand pursuant to the said regulation 7, shall be the persons who are licensees in terms of the Export Licences Regulations 1966, or, where there is no licence required, the persons exporting or intending to export the goods from New Zealand, whether acting as principals, agents, or independent contractors.

2. The currencies and the manner in which payments are to be made shall be as specified in the attached Schedule as appropriate for the country to which the goods are consigned at the time they are exported from New Zealand.

3. The period within which payment shall be made for goods exported or re-exported, or intended for export or re-export, from New Zealand shall be 6 months from the date of exportation of the goods from New Zealand, except for goods consigned to Rhodesia, for which payment must be received prior to the date of exportation of the goods from New Zealand.

4. The proceeds of sale of all such goods shall be paid to the Reserve Bank by the persons who are required to make payment within 14 days after they receive or become entitled to receive such proceeds of sale.

5. The trading banks have been appointed as the authorised agents of the Reserve Bank for the purposes of regulation 7.

6. Any departure from the provisions of this determination and the attached Schedule is permissible only with the written approval of the Reserve Bank of New Zealand.

7. This determination replaces the determination published in the *New Zealand Gazette* on 18 July 1968.

NOTES ON THE WEATHER FOR JUNE 1968

General: Barometers were low over New Zealand in June, and several depressions crossed the country. It was an exceptionally cloudy month over the North Island. It was also very wet in both islands—too wet for many farmers. However, there was still some growth in places, and in the less muddy areas stock were reported to be wintering well.

Coromandel and the nearby islands were buffeted by very severe gales on 13 June as a deep depression passed to the north-east of Auckland. The coaster *Maranui* was lost off Coromandel in this storm.

Several local tornadoes were reported. The worst damage was done by one at Te Horo Beach, Manawatu, on the 7th, and one at Opuia, Bay of Islands, on the 29th.

Rainfall: Rainfall was above normal, except in Westland, Southland, and parts of Otago. In Coromandel, Gisborne, and Hawke's Bay, central Marlborough, South Canterbury, and North Otago it was mainly at least double the average value. Greatest excesses were recorded in parts of central Hawke's Bay and North Otago. In North Otago and Dunedin flooding was reported on the 8th following heavy rain on the 6th and 7th; parts of Canterbury were also affected at this time. In Hawke's Bay flooding occurred on the 22nd around and to the north of Napier following heavy rain on the 21st.

Temperatures: Temperatures were 1-2 degrees warmer than normal in the North Island and in Nelson, Buller, and parts of Marlborough. Over the remainder of the South Island temperatures were mainly cooler than normal by about a degree.

Snow was reported in the Mackenzie Country on the 8th. However, the main period of snowfall was the last four days of the month, during a period of winds from a westerly quarter, when

there were considerable falls on the high country of both islands and down to low levels in parts of Otago and Southland. The Queenstown district was badly affected. These falls of snows continued into the first week of July.

Sunshine: Over the North Island and in Nelson sunshine was the lowest of any month on record, and many stations received 50-70 hours below the average value. Some record low values were: Kaitaia, 76 hours; Auckland, 79 hours; New Plymouth, 69 hours; Nelson, 84 hours.

Over most remaining South Island districts sunshine was also somewhat below average; but coastal districts of Otago and Southland were favoured with 15 hours above average.

Weather Sequence: For the first two days a depression was centred to the south-east of Southland, while an anticyclone was centred far to the north. Rain was reported in western areas of both islands and in Northland. On the next day rain became fairly general with the passage of a depression from the Tasman Sea across the country near Cook Strait. There was a temporary improvement in many districts on the 4th and 5th as the depression moved away. However, rain became general again on the following day with the passage of another depression on to the Cook Strait area from the west. Two centres soon developed, the main one to the east of the South Island, while pressures rose rapidly at Campbell Island. Easterlies set in over the South Island, with heavy rain on the 7th and 8th in coastal Otago and Canterbury causing serious flooding, especially in North Otago. Temperatures were cold, with snow in the Mackenzie Country.

As the depression moved away on the 9th and pressures rose over New Zealand the weather improved in many districts. For the next two days fair weather prevailed during the passage of an anticyclone across the country.

The weather deteriorated in the north on the 12th with the approach of a depression from the subtropics, while pressures remained high over the South Island. On the 13th the depression was centred just east of North Cape, and some very severe gales with high seas were reported, on the east coast of Northland and also off Coromandel, where the freighter *Maranui* was lost. Rain spread over the greater part of the North Island, becoming heavy in parts of Northland, Coromandel, and Gisborne, with some flooding. Conditions remained somewhat similar on the following day with the depression off the west coast of Northland and weakening, causing a decrease in the winds.

Pressures remained low over New Zealand while the anticyclone over the South Island moved eastward. In the north-easterlies of the 15th and 16th rain was still reported in the east and north of the North Island and in Nelson. During the following three days another anticyclone moved on to the South Island from the west, while another depression was developing north of Lord Howe Island. Conditions improved generally but scattered rain was still affecting some areas, especially in the North Island.

The anticyclone over the South Island moved away to the north of the Chatham Islands, and the depression to the north-west commenced to affect northern districts on the 20th. During the next two days the depression moved past North Cape, south-eastward along the east coast of the North Island. Rain spread over the whole island besides Marlborough and North Canterbury,

with heavy falls in most eastern districts causing serious flooding in Hawke's Bay, especially in Tangoio and the Napier-Hastings area. This depression remained to the east while another was moving on to the eastern Tasman Sea; and during the 23rd and 24th conditions remained unsettled over the North Island and the northern half of the South Island.

By the 25th a complex depression covered the New Zealand area. Pressures rose over the western Tasman Sea and also to the north, and the complex depression moved south-eastward, while another and very deep depression passed far to the south. From the 25th to the 30th winds were mainly between north-west and south-west, and becoming strong, while temperatures became colder, and several troughs crossed the country from west to east. Precipitation was concentrated mainly in western districts at first, but later spread over nearly the whole country; however, it was very light on the Canterbury coast. Some considerable falls were reported in the Alps and on the West Coast on 28 June, and in Bay of Plenty on the 29th. Thunderstorms and hail were unusually frequent, especially in the North Island. Snow was reported falling on the high country of both islands from about the 27th, and down to low levels in places. The Queenstown area was particularly affected.
