WHEREAS the Trade Practices and Prices Commission has received from the Examiner of Trade Practices and Prices (hereinafter referred to as “the Examiner”) a report, pursuant to section 17 of the Act, relating to an investigation by the Examiner of a complaint that during the month of August 1965 the Wellington District Wholesale Wine and Spirits Merchants' Association had collectively increased the price at which whisky was sold by its members;

And whereas the Examiner reported that he had further inquired into the pricing arrangements adopted by the said Association for the sale of other spirits and beer;

And whereas the Examiner reported that he had formed the opinion that:

- (a) there existed a trade practice as defined in section 2 of the Act, in that there existed a demonstrable arrangement between members of the Association; and
- (b) the said trade practice was substantially within the categories (b) and (c) of section 19 (2) of the Act, in that the said arrangement was that members of the Association would sell beer and spirits only at prices or on terms agreed upon between them; and
- (c) the effect of the said practice was contrary to the public interest in terms of section 20 (1) (d) of the Act, in that its operation unreasonably reduced or limited competition in the sale of beer and spirits.

And whereas the Examiner reported that, in accordance with the requirements of section 16A (1) of the Act, he had notified the said Association of the aforesaid opinions and that the Association, whilst in effect rejecting these opinions, agreed to enter into consultations for the purpose of reaching agreement as to the recommendation to be made by the Examiner to the Commission as to an order under section 19 of the act;

And whereas at the conclusion of these consultations the Examiner reported, pursuant to section 16A (3) of the Act, that agreement to the form of the order had been reached, and recommended that the Commission should make an order in the terms recommended in the report;

And whereas the Commission is satisfied that all persons who would be bound by any order pursuant to the recommendations have concurred with the recommendations, and the Commission has accordingly dispensed with an inquiry under section 18 of the Act;

And whereas the Commission has decided that an order of the nature recommended by the Examiner in the said report should be made under the Act;

Now, therefore, the Trade Practices and Prices Commission hereby orders and directs the Wellington District Wholesale Wine and Spirits Merchants' Association and its members:

(i) To discontinue any practice of collectively fixing, or making specific recommendations, whether express or implied, as to the prices or terms or conditions on which members shall sell beer or spirits;

(ii) Not to repeat any practice as aforesaid in any form, whether as members of the Association or otherwise howsoever.

Decision of the Indecent Publications Tribunal

No. 114

In the matter of the Indecent Publications Act 1963 and in the matter of an application to the Tribunal for a decision in respect of the book *Querelle of Brest*, by Jean Genet; translated from the French by Gregory Streatham, and published by Anthony Blond Ltd., London. NZ\$3.10.

DECISION OF THE TRIBUNAL

THIS book has been considered by the Tribunal upon the application of the Secretary for Justice. No submissions were received from the applicant, but written submissions from the distributor, Whitcombe and Tombs Ltd., of Christchurch, were considered.

Genet is a writer whose prestige is very high in his own country, France, and whose work in translation has had a wide influence abroad. His autobiographical book *The Thief's Journal* has long been available here in paperback; his semi-novels *Our Lady of the Flowers* and *Miracle of the Rose* have been published in an edition uniform with the present volume; at least two of his plays, *Death Watch* and *The Maids*, and possibly others as well, have been performed in New Zealand theatres; in any event their texts are freely accessible in paperback editions in our bookshops and libraries. And despite the sordid nature of his subject matter, in particular his pre-occupation with crime, prostitution, and homosexuality, this

is as it should be. Genet is a writer of international stature whose work offers a penetrating commentary on the ills of western society. The world he presents is described so vividly and with such an eye for beauty even in the most sordid contexts that he has been called "the poet of evil of our times". He is, rightly, the subject of serious academic study.

An artist of Genet's intelligence and insight has a right to be read in his entirety, for each new work must modify our understanding of his total achievement. Nor do we consider it necessary to establish that a book by such a writer should possess exceptional literary merit: an artist also has the right to fail from time to time and yet be heard. There is in our view no comparison to be drawn between the serious literary work of a man like Genet, whose affinities are with such writers as Lawrence, Joyce, Nabokov, and Baldwin, and the mass of cheap, cynically commercialised periodical and paperback pornography which the Tribunal is properly concerned to keep under strict restraint.

We must concede that *Querelle of Brest* contains incidents and language which, if taken out of context, many might consider indecent. The descriptions of homosexual relationships in particular, the glorifications of murder, and Genet's vivid depiction of the depravity which pervades the naval base of Brest, are undoubtedly shocking. One's initial reaction might well be disgust. Yet such unwelcome knowledge is suppressed at our peril; and, taken as a whole, the book leaves one impressed with the nature of evil which, far from asking to be realised by imitation, must be faced, understood, and overcome. Such tactics have a long and honourable tradition in religious teachings.

In this book Genet writes complexly. Technically it is said to be "Genet's highest achievement in the novel". There is a new acknowledgement of the role of women and subtler characterisation; there is a complex pairing and patterning of characters, deeds, time past and time present, fantasy projections and actual experience. Genet deflates the beauty of his own rhetoric by opposing to it a sordid, miserable, and subhuman reality in which the incidents are horrid and revolting: his own vision embraces both. Little in the book is left simple. The self-awareness of the main character Querelle, together with the intimate meditations of Seblon, are matched by the comprehensive awareness of the author himself in his writing. It is this characteristic of complex qualification that inhibits the intelligent reader from simplifying the book and misapplying its content; it is this elaboration of motive and intricacy of relation that must frustrate the simple-minded reader who might otherwise be tempted to translate fantasy incidents into real-life actions. It is impossible to be absolute about such matters, but the Tribunal believes that this book is unlikely to promote any desire for realisation; rather, on a more abstract level, it leaves one to grapple with the problem of evil. And that is not a problem to be solved by evasion.

The author of *Querelle of Brest* is important, and this is one of his substantial works. It may suffer somewhat in translation but it evinces an uncompromising honesty of intention and artistic integrity. There is no attempt whatever on the publisher's part to force sales by vulgar methods to a wide and possibly immature readership; the present edition is in unadorned hard covers with a sober dust-jacket; its paper and typography are of high quality; and its price, while not dear, keeps it well above the cheap paperback range. Such considerations merely lend support to our view that there is little risk in allowing the book to find its natural readership. Accordingly we declare it to be not indecent.

DECISIONS OF THE TRIBUNAL

THE following books were submitted to the Tribunal by the Comptroller of Customs for classification. In respect of the first four books, Mr Downey appeared as Counsel for the distributor, Seven Seas Publishing Proprietary Ltd., of Wellington, and made submissions. No submissions were received from the Comptroller of Customs, nor were any submissions received in respect of *My Secret Life*.

Francon Duclos: the Memoirs of a Paris Madame, by the Marquis de Sade. Translation and introduction by Paul J. Gillette. Paperback edition, published by Holloway House Publishing Co., Los Angeles, 1967.

The present book is a free translation of parts of a larger one by de Sade entitled *The 120 Days of Sodom*, written in 1785. The plan of the work provides for four sections, one for each month covered by the action. During this time each of four brothel-keepers, of whom Madame Duclos is one,

is expected to recite 150 perversions, 600 in all, to be enacted by the participants in illustration of the narrative. Most of the victims are killed in the final section and only the 4 psychopaths and 12 other persons survive.

This outline will sufficiently indicate the depraved nature of the full work. In its unrevised, incomplete, and textually crude form, it has no literary interest to redeem it, and it contains none of the philosophic content which may be found in some of de Sade's later writings. The most that can be said is that the recital of perversions might be of interest to those professionally concerned with abnormal psychology, and that the phenomenon of de Sade can only be seriously studied if the necessary raw materials, in the form of fundamental texts, are available.

But we cannot believe that the serious concerns of scholarship in any of its forms are honestly promoted by the present edition. Its physical form—a cheap paperback, the paper and print of which leave much to be desired—place it in a quite different category. The text is part only of de Sade's larger work; the editor's avowed refashioning of the narrative must be taken substantially to alter the form given by de Sade; the normal scholarly apparatus which would permit a check to be made on the authenticity of the text presented is lacking; the introduction is brief and superficial and the commendations of de Sade there cited apply to works other than that printed.

Were the edition under consideration an accurate one like that of Maurice Heine (three volumes, 1931-5), or a faithful translation of it, a restrictive classification might reasonably be applied. Mr Downey, of Counsel for the distributor, said his client did not wish to be heard in support of the book. We can see no redeeming virtue in the present volume and accordingly decide that it is indecent.

Ladies on Call, by Lee Francis, Holloway House Publishing Co., Los Angeles. Paperback for adults, \$1.15.

Ladies on Call is the autobiography of Lee Francis who operated some of the most famous clubs and holiday houses of Hollywood. It is adult reading of a second-rate kind, but avoids the grossness often associated with such stories. There is a good deal of detail in the accounts of sexual practices, many of which are aberrant; and this over-all emphasis makes the book unsuitable for general reading by young people. We judge it to be indecent in the hands of persons under 18 years of age.

Lesbianism and the Single Girl, by Roger Blake, PH.D., Century Books, K.D.S., Cleveland, Ohio. NZ\$1.15.

This book deals with sex in an extravagant and irresponsible manner which we consider to be injurious to the public good. Although it purports to be a serious study, the paucity of scientific comment leaves it far short of being justifiable on that ground. It is not redeemed on the grounds of literary merit and the Tribunal decides it to be indecent.

Satyricon: Memoirs of a Lusty Roman, by Titus Petronius Arbiter. A reconstruction in modern English by Paul J. Gillette. Paperback edition, published by Holloway House Publishing Co., Los Angeles, 1965. NZ\$1.15.

Like most classical texts, the *Satyricon* of Petronius frankly accepts the physical side of life and readily admits homosexual as well as heterosexual love. Indeed this natural acceptance of the sexual instinct and its need for gratification paradoxically creates the norm which gives the book its moral tone as a satire on the follies and vices of Nero's Rome. But the virtues of the original go beyond such social satire to include literary parody and imitation, and the narrative itself appears to be an original attempt to create the quite new literary form of a realistically based novel of comic incident, verbal wit, and psychological observation. The most recent scholarly study of Petronius (by Professor J. P. Sullivan) speaks of the *Satyricon* as a "highly original work, unparalleled in ancient literature, which seems comparable only to such individually unique productions as *Tristram Shandy* and *Ulysses*".

The text of the book, however, presents formidable problems to the scholar. In the present edition the editor has attempted a reconstruction of the text and offers an interesting prefatory justification of his method. The result is a highly readable narrative which preserves the spirit of the original. Given the classical status of the text, the moral tone inseparable from the satiric purposes of the book, and the degree of responsibility shown in this instance by the editor, the Tribunal decides that the book is not indecent.

My Secret Life, abridged but unexpurgated. Introduction by G. Legman. Grove Press, New York. Paperback at US\$1.75.

This is another edition of the anonymous autobiography of "Walter", a wealthy Victorian who lived entirely for sexual experience. It is 700 pages long (mercifully abridged from the original 11 volumes) and, apart from a most competent introduction by G. Legman, is allowed to stand alone, with no softening of the blunt language. In most cases publication of a text is preferable to publication of extracts that are toned down and commented on, as in the edition by the Kronhausens already submitted to this Tribunal. But here the

nature of the work itself affects this general principle. There is in this autobiography nothing but unrelieved obsession with sex and sexual incidents described in full and repetitive detail. The picture which it presents of contemporary scenes and people is not comparable with that in "Frank Harris", and there is no pretence of a story and characterisation as in "Fanny Hill". What documentary value "Walter" may have for the general reader is brought out by the Kronhausen's commentary in the edition already passed for adult readers. We judge this edition to be indecent except in the hands of those persons over 18 years of age whose professional or academic studies properly extend into the field covered by this book.

DECISIONS OF THE TRIBUNAL

THE following books were submitted to the Tribunal by leave of the Minister of Justice. Mr Downey appeared as Counsel for the applicant, Seven Seas Publishing Proprietary Ltd., of Wellington, and made submissions.

The Young Tempresses, by Steve Harding.
Small Town Sex Today, by Victor J. Banis.
Hollywood's Sexual Underground, by Roger Jordan. Medco Books, Los Angeles. Paperbacks at NZ\$3.15.

All three books deal with sex in a manner we deem to be injurious to the public good. They display no honest purpose in that all, while purporting to be serious studies of social phenomena, are in fact collections of doubtful case histories salaciously over-written and with only minimal "psychological comment". They have no compensating merit, either as literature or as a contribution to knowledge. They offer "probing detail, blistering pages"; the third one listed above provides "actual photographs", and is complete with map and "annotated guidebook to where the action is"; all of which is sufficient indication that these publications are designed as a guide and stimulus to the exploitation of the practices, perverse as well as normal, dwelt on in the text.

We judge all three to be indecent.

Oriental Love in Action, by Giovanni Comisso, illustrated by Mahlon Blaine; Luxor Press, London. Paperback at 9s. 6d.

This is a translation of the record of a journey through the East undertaken by a correspondent of the Milan *Corriere Della Sera*, who was awarded the Italian literary prize Premio Bagutta for an earlier work. It is a readable tale of average merit and does not really deserve the cover by which the publisher seeks to promote sales. We decide that it is not indecent.

Twilight Women around the World, by R. Leighton Hasselrodt, M.A., Luxor Press, London. Paperback at 9s. 6d.

This is a factual account of lesbian activity, past and present, in some 20 countries. It seems a serious study, though we have no means of judging how accurate its facts and figures are. Its final sentence claims: "It is to help all people understand the problem of female homosexuality so that a solution to it may eventually be found that this report was compiled and is being presented to the public". In our opinion, this intention is genuine. The honesty of the publisher's intention, however, is left in doubt by the lurid nature of a cover which misrepresents the tone of the book. To allow unrestricted display of the book in these circumstances would be to encourage a dubious commercial motive from which the young, at least, should be protected. We therefore classify the book as indecent in the hands of persons under 18 years of age.

Lesbian Love Old and New, by Dr Walter Braun; Luxor Press, London. Paperback at 9s. 6.

Walter Braun, M.D., emeritus professor of Breslau University, deals with lesbianism as it occurs in history, art, and literature and in ordinary life today. The subject is treated in a scholarly and objective fashion (attested by careful chapter notes, bibliographies, and index) calculated rather to

increase understanding than to pander to prurience. The outside appearance of this book does not indicate its real nature and is not suitable for general display. We therefore judge it to be indecent in the hands of persons under 18 years of age.

Secret Techniques of Erotic Delight, by Dr Vyvyan Howarth; Luxor Press, London. Paperback at 9s. 6d.

The cover of this book does disservice to its content: the title is falsely suggestive (and perhaps the cover drawing too); the back-cover review begins in a misleading tone; the term "illustrated" refers merely to four photographs of sculptures by Artists such as Auguste Rodin. The book is written by a sociologist and consultant sexologist who, from wide experience of case histories in clinics in various countries, discusses with sanity, sympathy, and some humour the problems and possibilities of sexual love. There is no doubt that the information and counsel offered would be of help to many persons, in middle age as well as in youth, who wish to achieve a satisfying sex relationship. We judge the book to be not indecent.

Venus in Furs together with *The Black Czarina*, by Leopold Sacher-Masoch, translated by H. J. Stenning.

The Cruel and the Meek, by Dr Walter Braun. Luxor Press, London. UK9s. 6d.

The publishers claim that *Venus in Furs* is translated directly from the first German edition; the derivation of the text of *The Black Czarina* is not shown. The cover is highly coloured and claims that *Venus in Furs* is a famous classic of the relationship between sex and cruelty; although it lacks literary merit it is, indeed, well known. It contains a useful biographical note, largely relating the life of the author to the perversity he illustrates in his books.

The same subject and its obverse, sadism, is dealt with in non-fictional form by Dr. Walter Braun in *The Cruel and the Meek*. The content here is responsibly presented, but again the cover illustration is clearly designed to promote sales on the least respectable grounds.

Since it appears to be established in psychiatric teaching that the seeds of both sadism and masochism exist in all normal people, it is in the public interest that people should be allowed the opportunity of confronting and understanding these tendencies. *The Cruel and the Meek* promotes such understanding. The fictional presentation of a history of masochism which *Venus in Furs* provides is not, we consider, objectionable in adult hands, and the relatively trifling story *The Black Czarina* is no more so. We doubt, however, that any good purpose would be served by making these expositions of extreme and unusual conduct available to younger persons, and, accordingly, we classify this edition of these two works, and *The Cruel and the Meek*, as indecent in the hands of persons under the age of 18 years.

Woman and the Sea, by Richard Tregaskis; Elysium Inc., Los Angeles. NZ\$7.45.

This is a collection of unexceptionable poems and capable photographs, the latter with a good deal of contrivance and unnatural emphasis. In terms of our decision published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of 25 July 1968, which dealt with nudist magazines, we classify this collection in the second category; that is to say, indecent in the hands of persons under 18 years of age.

Nudist A.B.C., published by Elysium Inc., Los Angeles. NZ\$3.

This is a collection of photographs portraying indoor and outdoor activities of nude males and females, some including children, to portray family life. It is because a few of these photographs are posed so as to draw undue attention to the genitalia that we consider them to be unsuitable for unrestricted distribution and display. For this reason we place the publication in the second category mentioned in our decision published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of 25 July 1968, and decide that it is indecent in the hands of persons under 18 years of age.

In the matter of the Indecent Publications Act 1963 and in the matter of an application to the Tribunal for a decision in respect of the magazines *Squire*—Vol. 3, No. 12, October 1967, A40c; Vol. 4, No. 2, A50c; and Vol. 4, No. 3, A50c.

DECISION OF THE TRIBUNAL

THESE magazines were submitted to the Tribunal for classification by the publishers, Gareth Powell Associates Pty. Ltd., of Sydney, New South Wales, with leave of the Minister of Justice. Mr Heron, of Counsel, appeared for the publishers and made submissions.

Mr Heron conceded that the articles in these magazines deal with matters of sex almost to the exclusion of other topics, but standing by themselves it is doubtful if these articles could be said to be indecent in the sense that they are injurious to the public good. It is rather upon the ground of the

inclusion of posed photographs of nude and semi nude female figures that we feel some doubt about the unrestricted distribution and display of these magazines. Occasional photographs in each of the magazines come close to the second category mentioned in our decision of 25 July 1968; but, taking them as a whole, we decide that these three magazines are not indecent.

Decision of the Indecent Publications Tribunal

No. 132

In the matter of the Indecent Publications Act 1963 and in the matter of an application to the Tribunal for a decision in respect of the book *Myra Breckinridge*, by Gore Vidal; published by Anthony Blond Ltd., London, 1968.

DECISION OF THE TRIBUNAL

THIS novel was submitted to the Tribunal by Whitcombe and Tombs Ltd., of Christchurch, with leave of the Minister of Justice. Written submissions were made by the applicant.

The novel is a highly sophisticated, witty, and up-to-the-minute satire of the vapidity of life and values in a commercialised culture. Its comic deflation leaves little untouched: academies, TV, film mythology, overpopulation, fantasy living, psychoanalysis, big business, pop culture, communications science, fashionable theories of literary expression, and, most important of all, the oversexed novel. Like most parodies, it makes its points effective by a witty, allusive style and by exaggeration of incident. The main character, who is also the narrator, has undergone a sex change (and suffers a reversion), and sexual aberrations abound; but their presentation is openly amusing, not pruriently erotic, and forms a necessary part of the author's attack on the greater social evil of mindless vulgarity generated by commercialised "art" forms. Given this general theme and purpose, passages which might offend if taken out of context fall naturally into place and are quite consistent with the imaginative purposes of the book as a whole.

The edition submitted (in proof form) is not the full text of the novel, certain excisions having been made by the author to enable publication in the British Isles. The book has literary merit and the Tribunal decides that, in this text, it is not indecent within the meaning of the Act.

right line across the aforementioned road and the Tahekeroa Stream to and along the eastern boundaries of Lot 2, D.P. 20898, and the part Allotment 185, Makarau Parish, shown on D.P. 18176, and along a right line crossing the Newmarket-Opua Railway, the Tahekeroa-Puhoi Road, Kohekohe Stream, and Lot 4, D.P. 11758, to and along the eastern boundary of the part Allotment 188, Makarau Parish, shown on D.P. 2543, to and westerly along the northern boundaries of that allotment, Lot 3, D.P. 11758, parts Allotment N. 187 and Allotment N. 186 shown on D.P. 3068, to and north-westerly along the north-eastern boundary of Allotment N. 64, also shown on D.P. 3068, in Block III, Kaipara Survey District, all the aforesaid allotments being of Makarau Parish, and the last-mentioned boundary produced to and south-westerly generally down the middle of the Rauhori Stream and the middle of the Makarau River to the Kaipara Harbour in Block II, Kaipara Survey District; thence north-westerly and north-easterly generally along the shores of that harbour and along the left banks of the Oruawharo and Topuni Rivers to and up the middle of the Hakaru River to a point in line with the northern side of a public road forming the southern boundary of Allotment 193, Oruawharo Parish, in Block IV, Otamatea Survey District; thence south-easterly generally along a right line to and along that northern side and the generally northern side of the public road forming the southern boundaries of Allotments 31, 30, 29, 242, part Allotment 22, crossing the intervening Pritchards Road, part Allotment 21, and part Allotment 18, to a point in line with the south-western boundary of the part Allotment 18 shown on D.P. 26309, and along a right line to and along the south-western and north-easterly generally along the south-eastern boundaries of the said part of that allotment to and continuing along the public road forming the south-eastern boundaries of that Allotment 18 and the generally southern boundaries of Lots 4 and 3, D.P. 42988, and the last-mentioned roadside produced across Valley Road to and easterly generally along the northern side of that road and the generally northern side of a public road forming the generally southern boundaries of Allotments 12, 11, and 10 to the south-eastern corner of the last-mentioned allotment in Block I, Pakiri Survey District, all the aforesaid allotments being of Oruawharo Parish; thence north-easterly generally along the eastern boundary of that Allotment 10 to and easterly and northerly along the southern and eastern boundaries of Allotment 50, Mangawhai Parish, to and easterly along the southern side of Cames Road to a point in line with the eastern boundary of Allotment E. 78 and along a right line crossing the said Cames Road to and northerly along the last-mentioned boundary and the eastern boundary of Allotment 16 to and easterly along the southern boundary of Allotment 31, all the aforesaid allotments being of Mangawhai Parish, and that southern boundary produced to the middle of the Mangawhai Stream; thence continuing north-easterly generally down the middle of that stream to and along the right bank of the Mangawhai Estuary to the point of commencement, and including therein Kawau Island, situated in Blocks III, IV, V, and VI, Kawau Survey District, but excluding therefrom Warkworth Town District, as described in *Gazette* 1960 p. 988.
