PURSUANT to section 4 of the Waikato Valley Authority Act 1956, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby revokes the Orders in Council dated the 28th day of June 1961 and the 7th day of November 1962, and published in *Gazette*, 29 June 1961, No. 41, p. 915, and 8 November 1962, No. 70, p. 1935, respectively, and hereby provides for the constitution of the Waikato Valley Authority to be amended as follows:

- (a) The one member referred to in paragraph (a) of subsection (2) of the said section 4 shall be elected to represent the combined district comprising so much of the County of Franklin and the Borough of Pukekohe as lies within the valley, the County of Franklin to be the principal local council of the said combined district;
- (b) The one member referred to in paragraph (e) of subsection (2) of the said section 4 shall be elected to represent the combined district comprising so much of the Counties of Otorohanga, Taumarunui, and Waitomo as lies within the valley;
- (c) The one member referred to in paragraph (f) of subsection (2) of the said section 4 shall be elected to represent the combined district comprising so much of the Borough of Putaruru and the Counties of Piako and Matamata as lies within the valley;
- (d) One member shall be elected to represent so much of the County of Rotorua as lies within the valley;
- (e) Two members shall be elected to represent the combined district comprising the Borough of Taupo and so much of the County of Taupo as lies within the valley, the County of Taupo to be the principal local council of the said combined district.

The Waitara Harbour Order 1969

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 24th day of March 1969

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL
PURSUANT to sections 8A and 165 of the Harbours Act 1950, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and, in relation to clause 3 (b) of this order, on the request of Waitara Borough Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Waitara Harbour Order 1969.

(2) This order shall come into force on the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.

2. In this order—

“The Act” means the Harbours Act 1950:

“The Council” means the Waitara Borough Council:

“Foreshore” means such parts of the bed, shore, or banks of a tidal water as are covered and uncovered by the ebb and flow of the tide at ordinary spring tides:

“Minister” means the Minister of Marine, and includes any officer, person, or authority acting by or under the direction or authority of the Minister.

3. There is hereby granted to the Council for a period of 21 years from the commencement of this order, subject to the provisions of sections 8A and 165 of the Act and to the conditions specified in the Third Schedule to this Order,—

(a) the control of the foreshore described in the First Schedule to this order:

(b) the control of the waters specified in the Second Schedule to this order.

SCHEDULES

FIRST SCHEDULE—FORESHORES

ALL those parts of the foreshore of the Waitara River within the boundary of the Borough of Waitara and all those parts of the foreshore of the sea fronting the Borough of Waitara.

SECOND SCHEDULE—WATERS

ALL that area of water in the Waitara River having as its inner limits the boundary of the Borough of Waitara and having as its outer limits a right line drawn between the seawards ends of the training walls.

THIRD SCHEDULE—CONDITIONS

1. Her Majesty or the Governor-General, and all officers in the Government service acting in the execution of their duty, shall at all times have free ingress, passage, and egress into, over, and out of the said foreshore and waters described in the First and Second Schedules to this order, without payment.

2. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the Council to do or cause to be done anything repugnant to or inconsistent with any law relating to the Customs, or with any regulation of the Minister of Customs, or with any provision of the Harbours Act 1950 or its amendments, or any regulations made thereunder that are or may hereafter be in force.

3. The rights, powers, and privileges conferred by this Order in Council shall not apply to those portions of the foreshore required for securing the shore ends of any telegraph cables that are at present or may be at any time laid down within the area of foreshore described in the First Schedule to this order.

4. The Council may enclose any part or parts of the foreshore described in the First Schedule to this order for the purpose of holding athletic sports or games and may by bylaw fix a charge for admission to such enclosed part or parts:

Provided that the total number of days on which such enclosures are made shall not exceed six in any one year.

5. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the Council to remove or cause to be removed any stone, sand, shingle, or shells without the consent of the Minister being first obtained.

6. Subject to the provisions of section 8A of the Act, the Council for and within the area of waters described in the Second Schedule to this order—

(a) may by bylaw do anything which a harbour board may do by bylaw under section 232 of the Act, and

(b) may appoint harbourmasters and/or officers and define or limit their powers or duties.

7. The said rights, powers, and privileges may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the Council 6 calendar months' notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last-known address of the Council in New Zealand.

Timber Preservation Regulations 1955—Branding and Identification of Preservative Treated Timber

PURSUANT to regulation 12 of the Timber Preservation Regulations 1955*, notice is hereby given that, subject to the exemptions provided herein, timber which has been preservative treated as provided in the said regulations shall be branded or identified in the manner herein described.

1. End Branding—All preservative treated timber shall be branded on or at one end with a clearly legible brand in block letters not less than $\frac{3}{8}$ in. high. The brand shall include the registered number of the plant allocated by the Timber Preservation Authority. Timbers exempt from this requirement are:

- (a) Fence battens or droppers;
- (b) Timber in sizes 2 in. by 1 in. section and less;
- (c) Timber to be treated to Commodity Specification C. 8 (Low Hazard Building Timbers) which is to be dressed or planer-gauged and branded in accordance with clause 4 at or adjacent to the treatment plant at which it is treated.

2. Commodity Branding—

- (a) In the case of timber for use in contact with sea water, to comply with TPA Commodity Specification C. 1, an additional brand in the form of an "S" is to be placed immediately after the plant number as required in clause 1 above.

- (b) In the case of timber treated for ground contact use, to comply with TPA Commodity Specifications C. 2 and C. 3, an additional brand in the form of an "X" is to be placed immediately after the plant number as required in clause 1 above.
- (c) In the case of timber treated for use as exterior joinery, to comply with TPA Commodity Specification C. 6, an additional brand in the form of a "J" is to be placed immediately after the plant number as required in clause 1 above.
- (d) In the case of timber treated for building timbers in high decay hazard situations, to comply with TPA Commodity Specification C. 7, an additional brand in the form of an "H" is to be placed immediately after the plant number as required in clause 1 above.
- (e) In the case of timber treated for use as beehive timbers, to comply with TPA Specification C. 9, an additional brand in the form of a "B" is to be placed immediately after the plant number as required in clause 1 above.

3. Colouring—Each piece of timber treated with a preservative which does not colour the timber shall have its surfaces coloured by a colouring material, approved by the Authority, added to the treating solution.

4. Face Branding—

- (a) All scantlings and framing timbers which are dressed or planer-gauged on at least one surface shall be continuously branded on at least one face.
- (b) All weatherboards and flooring shall be continuously branded on the back of the board. All other dressed lines shall be either continuously surface branded or surface branded within 6 in. of the end.
- (c) All surface branding shall be incised or branded with a permanent ink approved by the Authority and shall be in block letters not less than $\frac{3}{8}$ in. high embodying the word "TREATED" together with, as a minimum, the number or trade name approved by the Authority for the organisation performing this branding and may include the type of treatment and other information.

5. Posts, Poles, and Piles—All posts, poles, and piles shall be branded with an incised brand on one end or with a disc approved by the Authority and fixed above ground line.

6. Dispensations—Notwithstanding anything in the provisions of this notice, the Authority may, if it thinks fit in special circumstances, grant dispensation from any of the foregoing provisions.

7. Effective Date—The provisions of this notice shall come into force on the day after the date of its publication in the *Gazette*.

8. Previous Notice Cancelled—The previous notice, published in the *Gazette*, 14 April 1966, is hereby revoked.

Tariff and Development Board Notice No. 90—New Zealand - Australia Free Trade Agreement—Elimination of Margins

1. In an exchange of letters associated with the New Zealand - Australia Free Trade Agreement, the New Zealand Government expressed the intention of eliminating the margins by which the rates of duty applicable to certain goods imported from Australia exceed those applicable to goods imported under the same Tariff item from other countries.

2. The Minister of Overseas Trade has requested the Tariff and Development Board to make recommendations from time to time on the progressive implementation of this policy and, in this regard, the Board now intends to consider the goods listed in the following Schedule.

3. If no representations are received to the contrary the Board proposes to recommend that, in respect of these goods, the rates of duty applicable to imports from Australia be reduced to the level of the present British Preferential Tariff rates or of such lower rates as are indicated in the notes to the Schedule. Any person or firm desiring to make representations regarding an item or items should send their representations to the under-named not later than 30 June 1969. Such representations should be in the form in which it would be intended to submit them as evidence under oath at a public inquiry, and the "Notes for Guidance of Witnesses", prepared by the Board, may be found of assistance. Copies of these notes may be obtained from the under-named.

4. If public inquiries are found to be necessary in respect of any item or items, notice to this effect will be given.
